if anyone questions that, we can provide chapter and verse. That sad fact is one thing we learned in many years of politics and government. On the subject of Israel, there is simply no
"give" among the American Jewish "give" among the American Jewish
elite. You either support unlimited American military aid and taxpayer funds for Israel, or you are an anti-
Semite. And if you are judged anti Semite. And if you are judged ant
Semitic, there are ways to correct you thinking.
After the people of Virginia ignored After the people of Virginiaignored overwhelmingly for Bush, Safire
came out with advice for McCain came out with advice for McCain.
Hang the support of the "religious Hang the support of the "religious
right" around Bush's neck and never let up. That was the route to victory That is the route McCain has taken. Mr. Safire's tirade against Gov. Bush has had its intended and desired
effect. John McCain seized the issue effect. John McCain seized the issue
and ran with it. Bush has now issued a "mea culpa" statement, apologizing for not being sufficiently sensitive while addressing the students at Bob Jones University. (The founder of Bob
Jones University, whoever he was Jones University, whoever he was,
said some things many years ago said some things many years ago
about the Roman Catholic pope, whoever he happened to be. He said, if reports are accurate, that he believed the Pope to be an "anti-Christ", or that
he represented the "anti-Christ", or erepresented the "anti-Christ",
some such thing. Bush did not hearsome such thing. Bush did not hear-
ken back to that comment, and condemn it. Bush's opponents, in politics took it.)

Heaven. That upset many Jews, in cluding those on the NY Times. They wrote a great deal about it at the time
and have evidently never forgotten it The more .we see of George W Bush's opposition, the more inclined we are to vote for him. That's a terrible way to make a decision on who 0 vote for, but for some of us it is
sometimes the only way. As reader of this column know, we have had our problems with Bush for quite some ime. We think he is wrong in being ommushy on affirmative action, on immigration, on the spending of pubaspects of foreign policy, on a num ber of issues where we had hoped he would exercise leadership. But on all we issues where we differ with Bush, e also differ with McCain. And
McCain Presidency frightens us far more than a Bush Presidency. McCain's "shoot from the hip" ap-
proach to all manner of problem proach to all manner of problems could well lead to disasters in both for eign and domestic policy. In all prob-
ability a McCain Presidency would see more U.S. Troops around the world, not fewer. McCain's propensity for sounding off without thinking, r caring, about the long-range effec f his words is deeply troubling to us, ference between a Clinton foreig policy and a McCain foreign policy. (Since the above was written, the NY Times has come out with its editorial endorsement. Predictably, the Times endorsed Gore in the Demo for the Republican primary. The en dorsements made national news. Why we don't know. But we have our suspicions.)

## Council adopts tax abatement program

APublic Hearing was held Tuesday City Councir 29 , by the Floydada by Energas for a rate change eques Energas representative, Rick Gonzalez, the Town Operator for Floydada, addressed the council "Energas company would like to thank both the steering committee and the city council for their effort
reviewing the rate case filing. "At this time, Energas is mending that the city council woul deny the rate case proposal. Energas will appeal to the Railroad Commis sion.
"The Railroad Commission will have 185 days to make their ruling on
it. Once they make the ruling the rate will go into effect," Gonzalez concluded.
No one else spoke on the issue. Councilman Clar Schacht made the meconded by Councilman Rube Barrientoz and unanimously passed. Councilman Sheldon Sue made the motion to adopt Resolution No. 264 on participation in a tax abatement program. It was seconded by proved. No. 264 Resolution states, "The city
of Floydada is electing to become eli-
gible to participate in a tax abatement
program in accord with the property redevelopment and tax abatement act and adopting guidelines and criteria
governing tax abatement for selected governing tax abatement for selected

section with East Price Street; thence East along East Price to its intersection with the City Limits; thence outh along the City Limits to the
intersection of the City Limits and East Houston; thence, West along East Houston to the point of beginning." The council also unanimously ap-
proved a request by the Planning and proved a request by the Planning and Zhening Committee for a variance on W. Tennessee.

The variance request involved the ocation of a fence erected in the city ight-of-way on the west side of the property, Lots 9
Home Addition.
