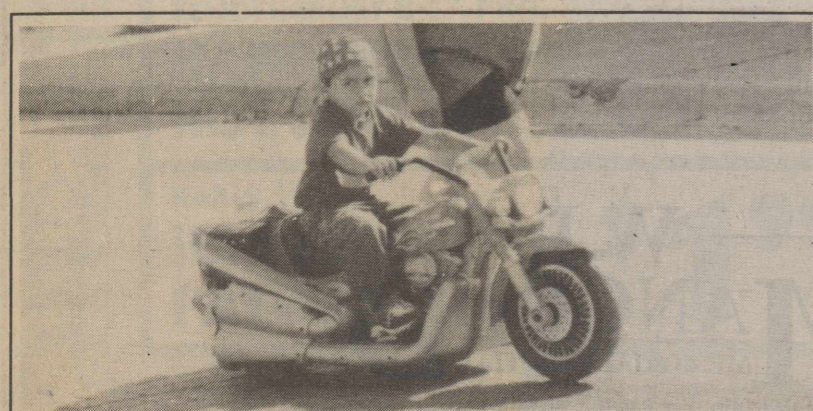

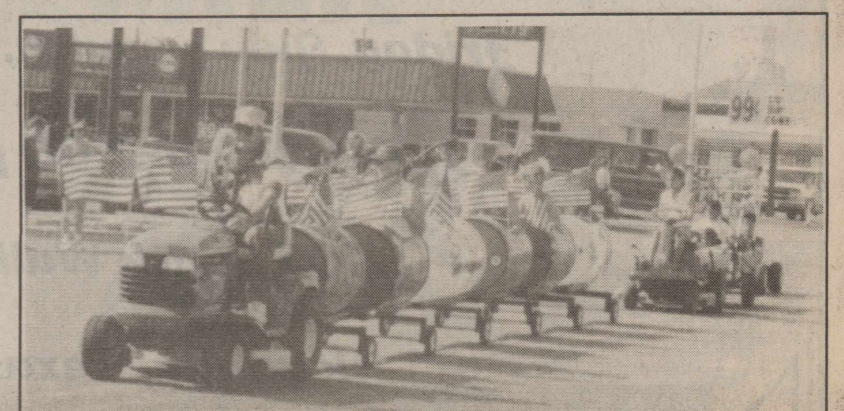

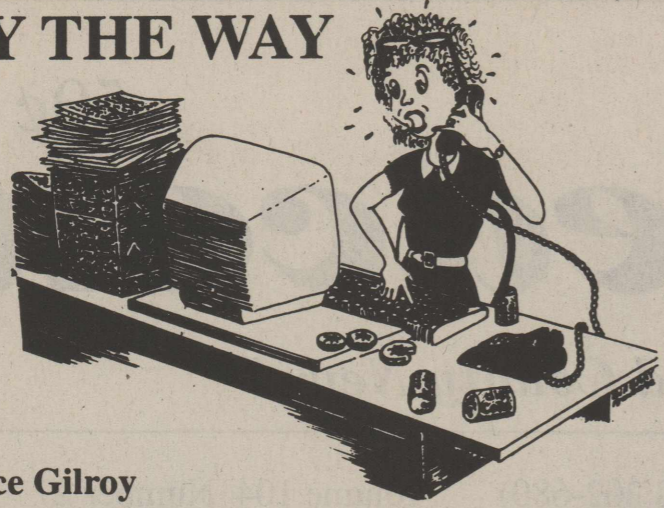

## Courtroom Activities

## LISD Superintendent Raymond Lusk explains school district's use of personal property taxes

In an effort to clarify LISD's stand on the taxation of personal property, and in response to last week's letters to the editor, Superintendent Raymond Lusk issued the following statement:

"The personal property tax issue has apparently received quite a bit of attention during the past week. Mayor Gary Marr and County Commissioner Lennie Gilroy have written excellent responses to this issue. I have been asked to comment on behalf of Lockney ISD.

"Unfortunately, property taxes are a necessary evil if we are to have public services, whether it be paved roads, sewer and trash service, police protection, public schools, community hospitals, and water, to name only a few. We many times take all services we receive for granted, but just as with anything else, they do not come free of charge. So there must be a source of revenue. The county, city and school have no source or means of revenue other than through taxes. (The exception would be our water bill, but this will not begin to pay the actual cost for our water, sewer and trash services, I suspect).

"Most readers probably agree that there must be some system of taxation in order to retain these entities. Now the real issue—should there be a tax on personal property, i.e., vehicles, boats, R.V.'s, and motorcycles?

"If one examines this issue with an open mind, it should be clear that this is the most fair and equitable tax we have. Why? Not everyone living in Floyd County owns real property (land or a house or a place of business), but almost everyone owns a vehicle. If the personal property tax

were eliminated, then the entire tax burden would fall only to those who own real property. For Lockney ISD, more than 1/3 of the tax base consists of personal property. The approximately \$375,000 this currently generates would by necessity be made up by home and landowners in this district. Those who do not own real property would pay nothing toward support and maintenance of the school, city, county, hospital district, or water district.

"Like Mr. Gilroy, I do not enjoy paying taxes. However, I do enjoy the fact that I live in a safe town, with paved streets, street lights, water service, sewer service, trash pickup, a Recognized school with qualified teachers for our children, comfortable and updated school buildings for our children's use and comfort, a state-of-the-art hospital with dedicated, caring doctors and nurses, and safe, clean, and plentiful drinking water. When I reflect on this, I realize that I could never afford to pay the actual cost for these services on my own, and I become much happier about paying my tax bill.

"Granted, every action taken or every service provided, whether it be from the school, city or county, may not please every person in the district. I don't believe this is possible. But the fact is that in an effort to keep taxes lower, the quality of services are sometimes compromised, making this process even more difficult.

"As for Lockney ISD, we do all in our power to eliminate waste and to utilize our funds wisely, while at the same time attempting to see to the educational, physical and emotional needs of our students. I know the other

The nation is awash in polls. It's that time of the year. Most show Gov. Bush with a rather substantial lead...at the moment. He's been leading in most of the polls most of the time, but it's still a while until election day. As we said when all this started, it's his to lose.

Those of us who have had experience with polls and polling know the questions asked, and how they are asked, have lot to do with how they come out. Still, an honest, objective survey done for the purpose of eliciting honest, truthful answers, can be very revealing.

We saw a poll (not our own) recently that seems to fall in that category. It was a survey of the nation's various Congressional Districts, including our own 13th District here in Texas, the district represented in Congress by Mac Thornberry of Clarendon. Mr. Curtis Clinesmith, a personal injury lawyer in Denton, is the Democratic nominee seeking the spot held by Thornberry.

We don't want to give free advice on how either gentleman should run his campaign, but judging from the survey's results it would be unwise for Mr. Clinesmith to claim a close relationship, or even a speaking acquaintance, with Al Gore or Hillary Clinton. In fact, if Mr. Clinesmith wishes to hitch his wagon to politicians who are popular in the 13th District, he will sing the praises of George W. Bush and Mac Thornberry.

The poll, reporting the attitudes of 400 randomly selected potential voters in the 13th District, showed Hillary with a "positive or somewhat positive"

rating at 37 percent and a "negative or somewhat negative" rating of 57 percent. That's not good, but then Hillary isn't running for anything here. She's running for the Senate up in New York, where her polling numbers are considerably better.

Al Gore, on the other hand, will be on the ballot here. His own combined positives are 33 percent, while his combined negatives are 55 percent. Among voters in this district, Gore fares even worse than Hillary.

Mac Thornberry scores even better than George W. Bush in the "negative" department, and slightly less than Bush in the "positive" response. Thornberry's combined negatives, that is, adding the "strong negative" with the "somewhat negative" amounts to only 10 percent, while his "positives" are 62 percent. The Governor's positives are a whopping 78 percent, while his negatives are 17 percent. The difference is that the "undecided" or "no opinion" was different in those two cases.

In Mr. Clinesmith's case, the results could not be encouraging. He had a positive rating of only one percent, a negative rating of only 3 percent, but 89 percent of the poll's respondents say they "have never heard of" him.

Clearly, Mr. Clinesmith has his work cut out. If he tries to gain identification by championing Mr. Gore's cause, he loses. If he abandons Mr. Gore and his ticket, he will anger (and maybe lose) the comparably few voters Mr. Gore has in the district. It is not an enviable position to be in. Still, Mr. Clinesmith knew that, or should

have known that, when he got in the race. That may be the reason we have heard so little from the Clinesmith camp since his initial, highly publicized, announcement tour before the Primary. On that tour, our readers may remember. Mr. Clinesmith made the point repeatedly that Mr. Thornberry was not well liked, that he seldom visited the communities of his District, and that he was too partisan.

This particular poll does not bear that out. Indeed, if the election were held today, many months after Mr. Clinesmith entered the race, 72 percent of the voters in the 13th District, according to this poll, say they would

vote to retain Thornberry in Congress, and only 15 percent say they would vote for Clinesmith.

It will take an awful lot of money for Clinesmith to overcome the 89 percent "never heard of" problem. He has said publicly that he anticipates no problem in raising the \$500,000 he estimates will be needed for that task. His first financial report indicates that he does indeed have friends with deep pockets, but that is still an awful lot of money. And, even if he is able to raise the money for television ads, there's no guarantee that everybody who hears his message, whatever it turns out to be, will buy it.

# Lockney Co-op Stockholders hold annual meeting and vote to sell elevator

Stockholders of the Lockney Cooperative Gin held their 43rd annual meeting June 27 and reviewed operations for the year ending March 31, 2000.

Net margins for the period was \$570,907.67 from the sale of farm supplies, fertilizer and ginning from 27,970 bales of cotton. Cash patronage of 45% and retired equities distributed that evening totaled \$456,380.89.

In his report, General Manager Charlie McQuhae noted a total of \$571,565.36 had been returned to patrons since January 1. McQuhae also reported that in the past 7 years, \$3.4 million had been paid back to the members, which is 78% of all earnings which total \$4.4 million for the same period.

McQuhae presented an overview of the annual operations and elevator operations for the past 15 years.

The elevator operations were discussed by Keith Phillips, which

showed a gradual and continued loss of profits. Phillips said several factors were responsible for the elevator not working, including: declining grain acres; a declining water table; low commodity prices; no commodity credit storage program; no rail access; increased costs of pumping water; more acres of wheat grazed out; less opportunity for outside storage and continued losses from grain handling.

"The elevator is the kink," said Phillips. "Over the past fifteen years our fertilizer and farm supply profits have been \$1,313,199 and it would have been higher except for the loss of \$1,273,829 at the elevator."

After review and discussion the members agreed with the recommendation of the Board to sell the elevators.

John Lee Carthel made the motion to authorize the Board to pursue the sale of the elevators and Joe Cunyus seconded the motion, which carried.

Nominated to fill the position of retiring director, G.L. Hight, was Dan Smith and Steve Johnson. A close ballot count showed Smith the winner in the election.

A new nominating committee was elected. They will be G.L. Hight, Claude Brown, and Jerry Ford.

In keeping with tradition of honoring a long time patron each time the association reaches another \$1 million in net margins, the Lockney Cooperative Gin Board selected John Lee Carthel to be named the recipient of the Lockney Coop Gin's \$14 Millionth Dividend Dollar. Mr. Carthel expressed his appreciation for the honor and reflected on his 9-year tenure as a Board member and representative of the PCCA Board.

Besides a steak dinner prepared by Mac and Robin Sherman, members also heard reports from various regional cooperatives and were treated to numerous door prizes.

# Patman optimistic about Cuba trade

Texas farmers and ranchers are pleased with the news that a compromise has been reached to ease U.S. economic sanctions on Cuba, according to the president of the state's largest general farm organization. The compromise would allow food and medicine sales to Cuba for the first time in nearly 40 years.

"This is a red-letter day for agriculture. Texas farmers and ranchers are

excited about the real possibilities of trading with Cuba," said Texas Farm Bureau President Donald Patman. "We have the supply of agricultural commodities that can be shipped to Cuba to help the people of that country improve their standard of living."

"We certainly encourage both the U.S. House and Senate to pass legislation very soon to lift the embargo.

The removal of sanctions on Cuba could result in \$1 billion of additional agricultural trade to the United States," Patman emphasized.

If and when the unilateral sanctions are lifted "Texas farmers and ranchers are ready to sell Cubans various commodities such as wheat, beef, poultry, dairy products and rice, the staple of Cubans' diet," said the Farm Bureau leader.

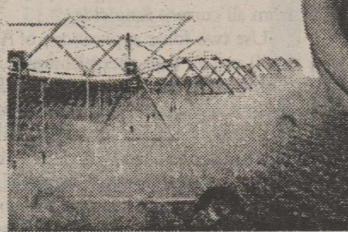

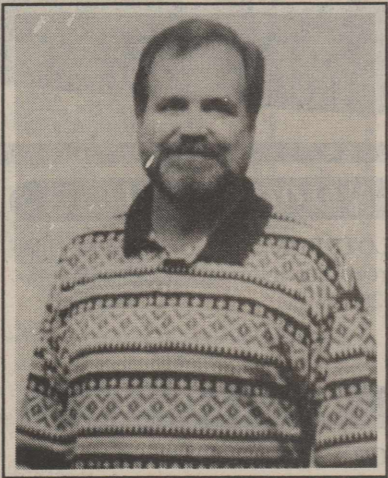
"My father, Cecil Golden, retired from Wayland two years ago," said Rev. Golden. "He was the head of the Foreign Language Department."
