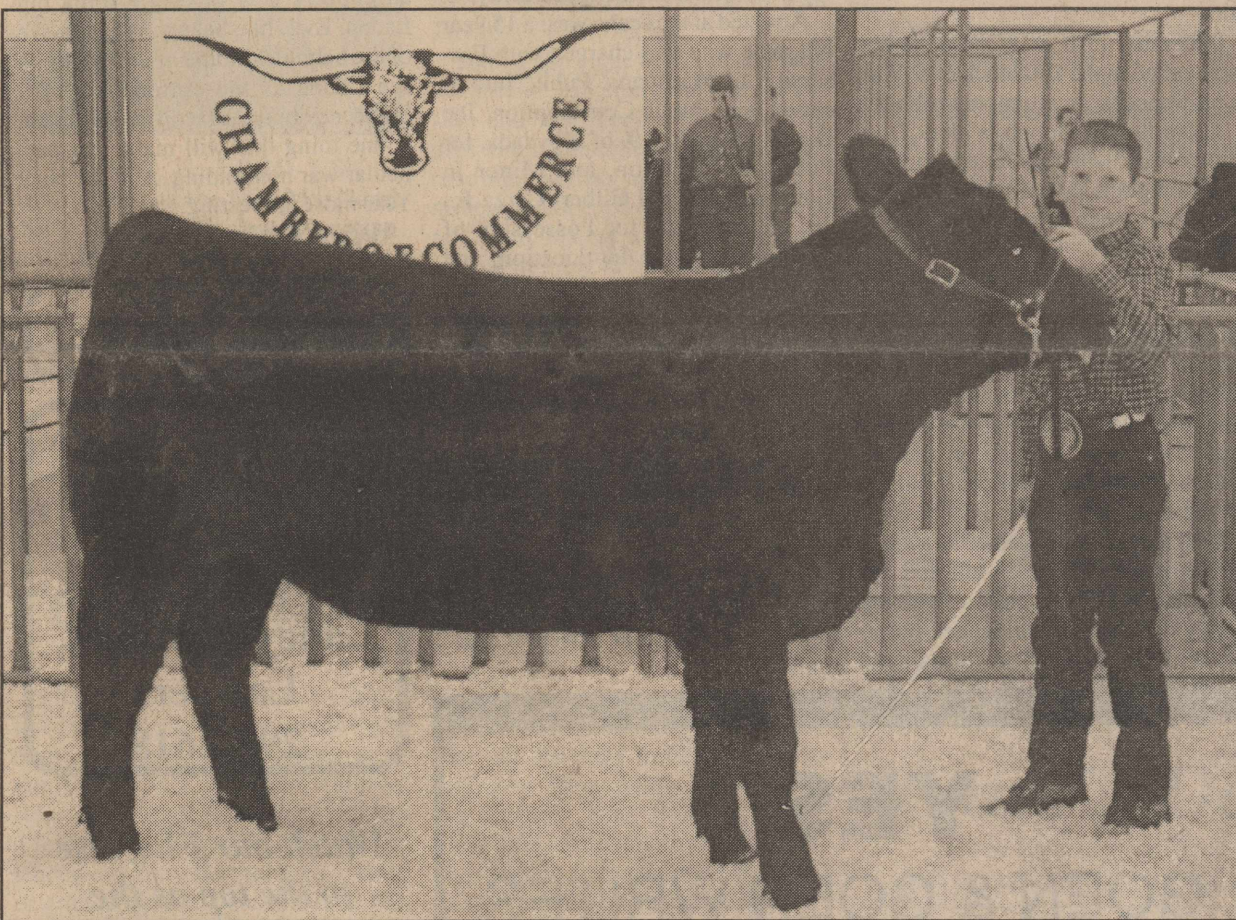

The final list of local and state candidates is as follows:

### March 12th Primary Races

There will be a race in the Democratic Primary between incumbent County Judge Bill Hardin and Gary Carthel.

The County Attorney position has also drawn a contested race in the democratic primary. Lex Herrington, of Floydada will face off challenger Kelly Dunbar, of Lockney.

Herrington is currently serving as County Attorney after being appointed to the position by the Commissioner's Court.

County Treasurer Mary Shurbet will not seek re-election. There will be a race for this office in both the Republican and Democratic primary. Jeannie Sanchez, and Elva Martinez, of Floydada, have both signed up as Democrat candidates for the position of County Treasurer.

On the Republican side, Loretta Nutt, of Lockney, and Christina Muse, of Floydada, have filed their intentions to seek the County Treasurer Position.

The winner of the Democratic primary will face off the winner of the Republican primary in the November general election.

General Election November 5th Tempie Francis, of Matador, has signed up to run against incumbent District Judge Randy Hollums, of Floydada.

Francis will run as a Republican candidate and Hollums will run as a Democrat.

Commissioners Jon Jones (Pct. 4), and Lennie Gilroy (Pct. 2) are seeking re-election on the Republican ticket. Both commissioners have no Republican challengers in the March

Old phones help victims of domestic abuse Help is phone call away

When in trouble, our first instinct is to reach for a telephone - especially since the proliferation of cellular phones - and dial 911.

"Cell phones are a wonderful tool for our clients," says Kay Harris, director of Hale County Crisis Center, which serves Hale, Floyd, Swisher, Briscoe, Motley, Hall, Castro and Lamb Counties.

"They can have them close by and, when threatened, dial 911 immediately.

"Isolation in rural communities is the main factor in continued domestic violence. Victims are safe in our safe house, but once they leave it, they are vulnerable," Mrs. Harris says. "I know of one client whose husband removed the phones from their farmhouse when he left as well as the car keys in order to isolate his wife from help. Particularly in instances like this, a cell phone gives them an avenue of keeping in touch."

With that light of hope, the sad fact is that many victims of domestic abuse don't have the means to buy and maintain cell phone service.

That's where Nelda Laney, First Lady of the Texas House of Representatives, comes in.

After a successful drive in Austin led by Legislative Wives and other entities that netted more than 10,000 cell-phones for crisis center in the Austin area, she has joined with the Covenant School of Nursing in Lubbock to provide cell phones for victims of domestic violence.

The Donate a Phone drive is part of the nationwide Call to Protect, a national educational and philanthropic initiative that began in 1996 to provide the security and mobility of wireless phones to victims of domestic violence.

Businesses and organizations involved in the project include

Motorola, the Wireless Foundation, Cingular and Cell Tone (Gary Thurman and Don Henderson of Plainview), as well as Covenant School of Nursing, the Women's Protective Service of Lubbock and Hale County Crisis Center.

"All types and brands of cell phones, working and non-working, can be donated," explains Mrs. Laney. "All will be sent to a Motorola factory in Minnesota where they are stripped and refurbished."

When the phones are stripped of information and repaired, they will be returned to the South Plains where, locally, they will be activated with two numbers, the universal 911 emergency number, and a non-emergency local number. Gary Thurman and Don Henderson of Cell Tone, have donated air time and programming to the project.

Mrs. Laney also explains that all types and brands of cell phones can be donated, reiterating that all information is stripped from the donated phones before they are reassigned.

"Many people ask if their numbers or accounts can be stolen," she says. "We can assure them that they cannot be. I describe it as gutting the phones and starting all over. They use broken phones and those without batteries or parts to repair the working phones, then when they are shipped back to us, two numbers are activated. The goal of the program is to provide safety, not a cell phone for normal use. The person receiving the phone will have access only to the two numbers, 911, and one assigned locally, probably the Hale County Crisis line."

Anyone wishing to donate their old phone should take the phone to the Floyd County Extension Service office or the Floyd County Hesperian-Beacon Office in Floydada or Lockney.

A view from The Lamplighter

Clinton was so arrogant about his own shortcomings, or what many regarded as his shortcomings. For crying out loud. They are lawbreakers by definition. They broke the law to get here. They break the laws every day they are here. But maybe he was talking about something else, like robbing banks or convenience stores.

And also on the immigration front, we note that a rather large proportion of the "security" folks manning security stations at our nation's airports are not even citizens of the United States. In still another short item, we note that some 80,000 Nigerians now live in the city of Houston alone. (Nigeria is one of those countries on the west coast of Africa from whence many former slaves embarked, having been captured and sold by their brethren.) Perhaps this explains why it is so difficult

to find a cab driver in Houston who can speak English.

All of which poses a question. Why even have an INS? Clearly, those officials in charge of the INS see no urgency in upholding the laws they are sworn to uphold. So why spend the money simply to furnish jobs for deservingly bureaucrats?

Speaking of old news with new faces, however, nothing could surpass Another old year is gone, and a new one is upon us. In a way the two kind of blur. The new merges with the old and the old becomes new.

I forget now exactly where it is in the Bible, or who said it, but somewhere in there is a passage saying "there is nothing new under the sun." I'm not sure the author of that Biblical comment is entirely right, but the longer we live the more apropos it seems. So much of what we see, or so much of what we read, merely places new faces and new dates on old things that have happened before. In a way, that is good.

Otherwise, the news of the day would be of little importance.

To wit: We see by the papers where Mr. Clinton, our former President, has embarked upon a venture to reinvent his place in history. He seeks, as it were, to create a "new" identity. He has called together a bevy of former flacks, urging them to do all they can to spread the word about all the good things his Presidency accomplished. He does not want history to remember him for his dalliance with Monica, or those other girls. Nor does he want history to remember him for renting out the Lincoln Bedroom to well-heeled contributors, or selling pardons to various felons, or his and Hillary's looting of the White House on their way out the door.

Participants in the New York meeting say Mr. Clinton did most of the talking, and everybody else did most of the listening. That's natural. Mr. Clinton is a good talker, and we can expect the meeting to bear fruit. Given a little time, Mr. Clinton's friends in the media can work wonders, in much the same way former President Lyndon Johnson's friends and benefactors erased the image of vote fraud in Jim Wells County that propelled Lyndon into a Senate seat and eventually the Presidency, and all but erased the image of a bumbling, unsure Commander-in-chief during the Vietnam war. After years of meticulous spinning, Lyndon has emerged as a civil rights champion. That's what one can do with a massive "library" funded by taxpayers.

Still, we think Clinton will have a little more trouble redefining himself than did Johnson, primarily because the current war on "evil." That war has been around forever, but now it has an entirely new face in Osama bin Laden. Evil, like beauty, is in the eye of the beholder. Some of us look upon bin Laden as the epitome of evil. Some, no doubt, see it differently. That is one thing that will make this particular war non-ending. And the New Year most interesting.

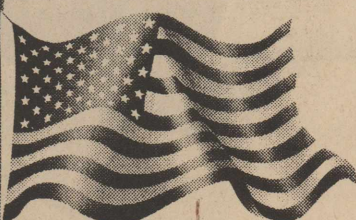

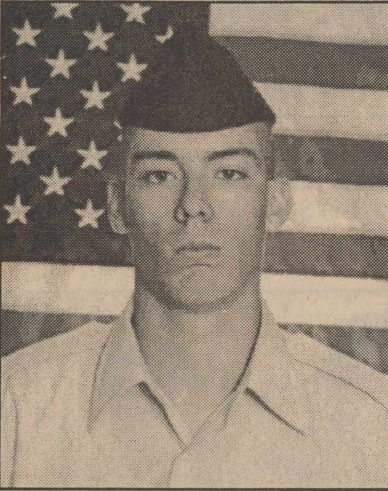

## Floyd County Fair remembers history

Memories of a county fair - exhibits of culinary skills, fancy craft work, home-grown vegetables, farm-raised animals, beauty pageants, carnival rides, and parade floats, just to name a few. Think of the first time you attended a county fair, took your child or grandchild to a county fair. If you have lived in Floyd County for awhile, it is likely that your county fair memories are tied to The Floyd County Fair.

The Floyd and Surrounding Counties Fair is part of our county's fabric that has a ninety-six year history which began in the early 1900's. The first known publication states that the 1912 Fair was the Seventh Annual Fair. This, along with other available information, indicates the first County Fair began around 1906. The Fair was canceled in 1930, probably because of the Depression, although this is not documented as the specific reason. After a 25-year absence, the Floyd County Fair tradition was revived in 1954. There have been several

changes to the fair over the last several decades, including its location. The fair was held in Floydada in its early years in various locations including the B.B. King Building on the north side of the square and the Floydada Rodeo Grounds, then it moved to Lockney to the abandoned Anderson-Clayton Company cotton oil mill, which was later donated to the Fair Association thus becoming the Floyd County Fair Grounds. In 2000, the fair moved to its new home, The Floyd County Friends Unity Center.

Floyd County can be proud of the fact that our community is one of the few counties in Texas that still has an annual county fair, but it is at a critical point of being able to continue. As with any community project, it takes many volunteers from throughout the county to plan and host the fair. Any volunteer efforts large or small make a difference and help in continuing the tradition, even if it is sharing suggestions and ideas.

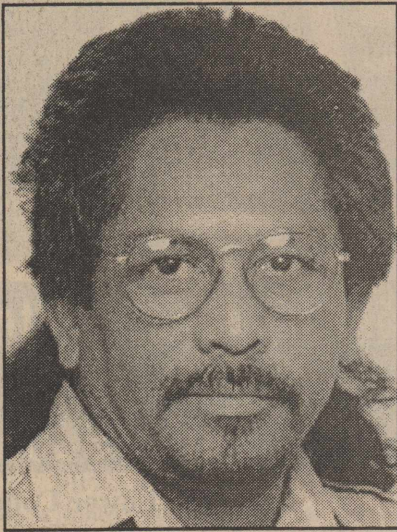
She married Arthur Hilton on December 16, 1919, in Lockney. He died December 5, 1955.

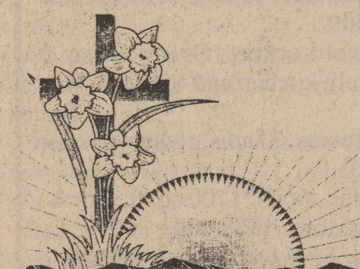
