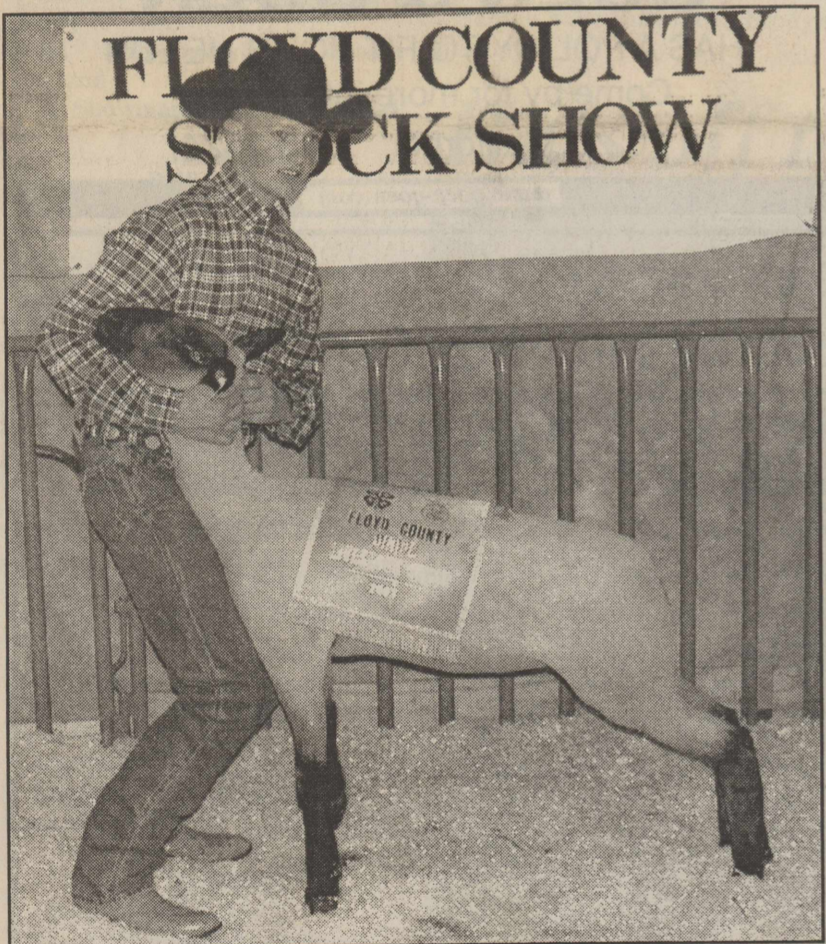

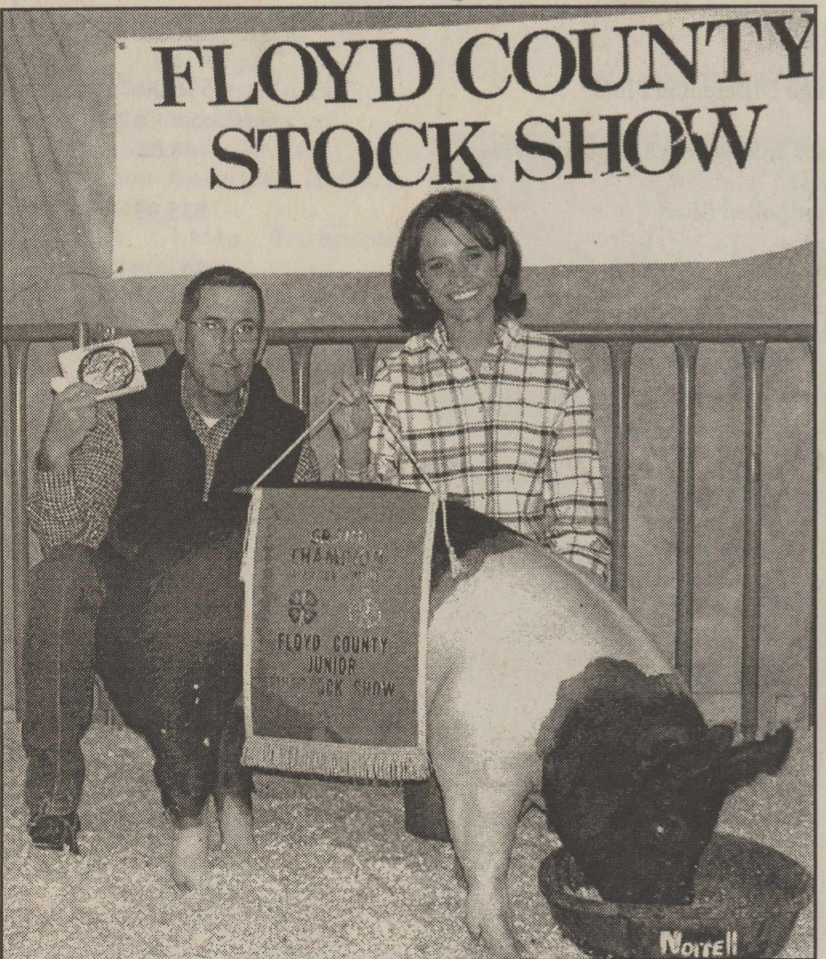

Rabbits and goats added a new twist to the Floyd County Stock Show this year.

Even though new problems cropped up with judging and showing new categories, the rabbit and goat shows were considered a success by participants and stock show observers.

Lockney youngster Anna Sherman won the "Best of Show" category with her Mini Rex rabbit, and Jay Ragland, of Lockney, won "Reserve Best In Show" with a New Zealand rabbit.

Goats also made their debut at the Floyd County Stock Show and Kortney Williams, of Floydada, earned the Grand Champion title with her 82 lb. medium weight goat.

Molly Long's 99 lb. heavy weight goat was named Reserve Grand Champion.

In the Lamb Show, Lockney 4-H'er Eddie Fortenberry's 127 lb. medium-heavy Medium Wool was named the Grand Champion.

Tasha Powell, of Lockney, won the Reserve Grand Champion title with her 117 lb. medium weight Medium Wool lamb.

The Swine Show Grand Champion was shown by Ashley Norrell, of Floydada. She won with her 246 lb. Hampshire.

The Reserve Grand Champion Swine was won with the 207 lb. Cross belonging to Taylor Beedy, of Floydada.

Floydada youngster Mason Lipham showed the Grand Champion steer--a 1,285 lb. Cross.

The Reserve Grand Champion steer, a 1,355 lb. Cross, was shown by Taylor Beedy, of Floydada.

Senee Foster, of Lockney, had the Overall Grand Champion Heifer--a champion European Heifer.

**Commissioners Court considers new computer programs for record keeping**

The Floyd County Commissioners met in regular session Monday, January 13, and heard two presentations concerning surge protectors for the courthouse and a new computer program for the County Clerk's office.

Winfrey Shipp of Plainview gave a follow-up presentation concerning energy saving surge protectors for the courthouse and the jail. Shipp said, "The devices will pay for themselves in about 15 months. They will also solve your light bulb replacement problem."

"The cost to get started will be \$4,814, not counting installation. There is a six month guarantee of saving ten percent on your electric bills, or your money will be refunded," Shipp said.

Commissioner Lennie Gilroy said, "My personal opinion is that it is a little high (in price)."

Commissioner Craig Gilly commented, "I do not think that is a necessity at this time."

No action was taken by the commissioners on the matter.

CourTech System, Inc. met with the commissioners regarding a new computer program for the County Clerk's office. County Judge William D. Hardin said, "We must change our book system because the old one is so out-of-date. This system will give us 'backup' on all our records."

"No action is needed today, but we do need to look at this new program. We do have some \$4,400 available in the maintenance fund for this purpose," Hardin said.

No action was taken concerning the new computer program.

The commissioners approved a request by Sheriff Royce Gilmore to put regular license plates on the new 2003 Crown Victoria Ford in order to save the expense of having to mark the vehicle.

An annual agreement with Allied Compliance was approved by the court to continue drug testing for the county's five commercial licensed drivers. The annual agreement fee is \$153 and there is a charge of \$40 per drug test, according to Judge Hardin.

Three farm contracts were approved by the court. One was in Pct. 1 for filling in washes for soil conservation by Rich Reddy, one mile south of McCoy. Another contract was in Pct. 3 for preparing fence replacement by Jay Lackey, three miles northeast of Cedar Hill and another farm contract was in Pct. 4 for cleaning out a drainage ditch by Marty Covington, two miles south of Dougherty.

The Financial Report for December, 2002 showed a Beginning Balance of \$341,003.26 and Receipts of \$164,956.77. Transfers In and Out were \$144,423.22, while \$165,304.28 was Disbursed, leaving an Ending Balance of \$340,655.75.

## Cotton Market Weekly

Cotton futures on the New York Cotton Exchange climbed higher Wednesday; however, the market "treaded water" the remainder of the week waiting to see what new information USDA's supply/demand report would bring.

Market observers were not disappointed as USDA's January supply/demand report released Friday morning was viewed as neutral to friendly.

The department lowered its U.S. crop production estimate for the 2002/03 season to 17.14 million bales from December's estimate of 17.38 million. Harvested acres also were ratcheted down to 12.41 million acres from the previous 12.86 million-acre estimate. The reduction primarily was due to adverse weather that affected the crop during the latter half of 2002.

The market's interest also was focused on U.S. exports which were left untouched by the department at 10.8 million bales. Although several sources are of the opinion that the department eventually will need to lower its export sales forecast, most analysts did not expect the change to come in the January report.

Recent export sales and shipment

data have been fairly healthy despite the Christmas and New Year holidays. Some traders say underlying support on the futures market from the trade is due to the export sales. However, several other analysts and traders say export sales and shipments need to increase much more to reach USDA's estimate, and figures still are lagging behind the number of sales and shipments made at the same time the previous year.

In line with market expectations, USDA left its 7.5 million-bale domestic consumption figure unchanged. It did, however, lower ending stocks to 6.3 million bales from 6.5 million.

World figures were relatively unchanged with production pegged at 87.40 million bales compared with 87.41 million in December consumption was marginally higher at 96.45 million bales compared to 96.39 million a month ago. World ending stocks were reduced again from 38.84 million in December to 37.92 million bales this month.

In other news, net new export sales of 2002/03 U.S. cotton fell 35 percent in the week ended Jan. 2 compared to the previous week. The 116,500 bale sales figure was lower due in part to

the holiday shortened week. Turkey was the main buyer of U.S. cotton for the week with purchases totaling 43,900 bales. Hong Kong and Colombia rounded out the list of top three buyers with acquisitions of 13,500 bales each.

Despite the holiday period, export shipments established a marketing year high as merchants rushed to meet end of the year shipping deadlines to China. Shipments, at 241,000 bales finally crossed the 200,000-bale mark for the first time since April 11, 2002. Major destinations included China at 81,100 bales, Mexico at 33,000, Turkey at 24,000 and Indonesia at 14,400 bales.

Meanwhile, spot cotton sales lunged higher in the first full week of trading in 2003. Sales of cotton online by Texas, Oklahoma and Kansas producers in the five trading days ending Jan. 9 totaled 72,730 bales, more than doubling the previous week's sales of 31,979 bales. The average price received by producers selling their cotton online ranged from 42.46 to 43.11 cents per pound compared to the previous week's range of 42.30 to 42.90 cents per pound.

# High Plains crop exceeds 3 million bales

Weekly reports from the Lubbock and Lamesa USDA Cotton Classing offices continue to creep further above the 3 million bale level. Season to date figures for the two offices now total just under 3.1 million bales reviewed.

Cotton continues to trickle into the offices as the final bales move from through the gin. Harvest activity is virtually completed except in isolated pockets.

Quality continues to be below the norm in many cases, especially in terms of Color and Leaf.

Most of the quality differences can be associated with weather patterns that brought beneficial rainfall, but kept growers out of the field for extended periods during the harvest period.

Predominant Color-Leaf grades recorded at both Lubbock and Lamesa have been 41-4 for the past couple of months and the season.

Other quality factors have also been affected during the harvest season and most noticeable is fact that 17 percent of the 2.5 million bales classed at the Lubbock have been "Barky" bales and incurred additional loan discounts.

Additionally, Micronaire readings have seemed to be a notch or two higher than normal as fully 50 percent or more of the bales classed at Lubbock have recorded Mike readings greater than 4.3. Some 250,000 or so bales have also been hit with Mike readings above 5.0.

Staple lengths have been holding their own throughout the year with the season average being 33.4. Staple lengths at the Lamesa office have average 33.31 so far.

Altogether the final numbers on the

2003 crop could easily move above the 3.2 million bale mark and rank the year as one of the best all-time.

## Beltwide provides glimpse of future

With the aftertaste of less than memorable markets and more than one unwanted hit from Mother Nature fresh on the minds of growers the 2003 Beltwide Cotton Conference delivered something somewhat unexpected - a glimpse of cautious optimism for the future.

One of the main purveyors of that view is none other than William B. Dunavant, Jr. of Memphis, TN.

Mr. Dunavant's comments to the 2003 Beltwide Cotton Conference included his thoughts on the importance of the U.S. Farm Bill to growers, as well as his current thoughts on the direction we may be headed in the marketplace in 2003 and beyond.

Not everything he said could be considered 100 percent positive, but at the end of the day it felt as if there might be some blue sky on down the line.

On farm policy he voiced his support for the U.S. Farm Bill as a key component of grower survival until market conditions right themselves.

Dunavant reiterated his position that, while he doesn't necessarily agree with many of the specific provisions of the U.S. farm program, he strongly supports its primary purpose of delivering critical support to U.S. farmers.

Dunavant also highlighted the positive direction in which U.S. and World carryover stocks were moving, pointed out an optimistic forecast for increased world consumption and cautioned growers to not move too quickly to cement 2003-4 marketing plans as the situation continues to change over the next few months.

Also being worked into the PCG trip will be meetings with key USDA personnel to discuss issues related to crop insurance, conservation programs, farm bill implementation and trade.

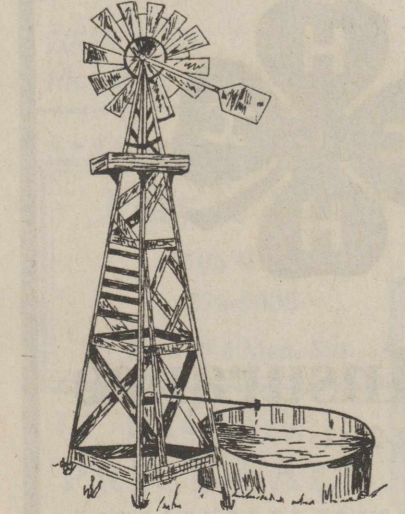

Jimmie graduated from LaAirosa High School in 1941.

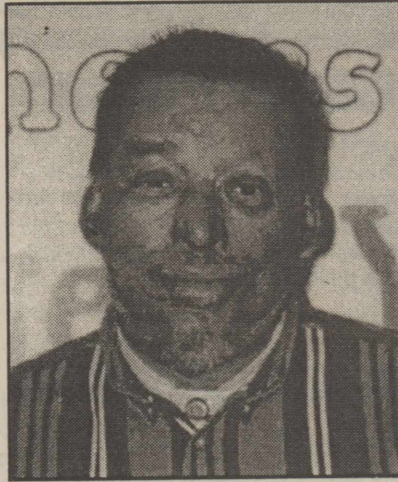
Jimmie and Ray Rhodes were married March 8, 1946, in Clayton, New Mexico.

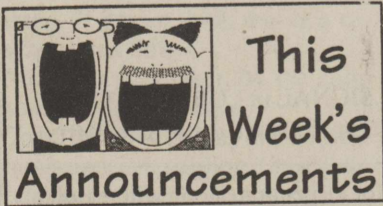

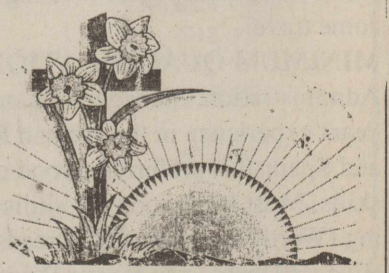
