## Computer Center open soon

The Floydada Economic Development Corporation is pleased to announce the opening of the new Technology Center. The Technology Center, located at 105 South 5th Street (in the old

PCA building), will host an open house Friday, April 11 from 3:30 to 5:30 p.m.

"The Technology Center is a place where everyone in the community will find a friendly, pres-

sure-free environment in which to learn computer programs and/or have the opportunity to develop personal skills and self-confidence, improve education levels, and gain job-related skills," said EDC Executive Director Dora Ross.

Beginning Monday, April 14, the Technology Center will be open Monday through Thursday, 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon and 1:30 - 5:00 p.m.; and Friday, by appointment. The Technology Center will be open some evenings when classes are in session or by appointment.

The Technology Center is equipped with 12 state of the art computers that have high-speed Internet access and will provide a place for computer training and business development for the entire community and surrounding areas. The classes will be offered free of charge and will be determined by the need of the people. "We anticipate adding a Distance Learning Lab in the near future," said Ross. "Through the Distance Learning Lab anyone can take a college course through any university or college in the United States and never leave Floydada. Also, we hope to utilize the Distance Learning Lab for business development and consultation."

The Technology Center concept began almost a year ago when the Caprock Hospital District partnered with the Floydada Economic Development Corporation. A \$250,000 community network grant from the Texas Infrastructure Fund Board was received in July, 2002. These

## Rolling "Meth lab" closed

High speed chase ends in arrests

A "rolling" methamphetamine lab was stopped at 10:20 p.m., Sunday, April 6, just outside the city limits of Lockney, by Floyd County Deputy Paul Raissez. A high speed chase ended with the apprehension and arrest of two men, Joe Brandon Hardison, 24, of Anadarko, Oklahoma; and Nicholas Chad Fowler, 23, of Childress.

According to Raissez the headlights of the suspect's car were seen off the road. Raissez proceeded to the area to investigate and observed the vehicle, a Mitsubishi Outlander, leave the area and head south on County Road 109. "The vehicle turned west on 97 and disregarded the stop sign," said Raissez. "I decided to follow it for awhile. You could tell they had no idea where they were going. I continued to follow them. They turned north on 378 and when I got behind them they threw a white container out the window. It broke

open and white powder went everywhere. I could smell the chemicals through the car vent as I drove past it."

Raissez turned on his emergency overhead lights and the suspects car stopped outside the city limits. Raissez said he got out of his vehicle and approached the Mitsubishi. "I ordered the driver out of the car," said Raissez, "but after I was away from my car the driver stepped on the gas and took off."

Raissez said the suspects fled and drove up and down county roads. "He would turn north, then west, then east. He was lost. Eventually he came to Hwy. 70 and turned north. When he got to

Hwy. 97 he turned toward Lockney and drove off into a large pit that is near the intersection of 70 and 97. He hit a dirt ledge and tried to come out of the pit. His vehicle 'high centered' and stuck."

According to Raissez the men "baled out" of the car and started running down into the dark pit. "One tripped and fell and I caught him and cuffed him," said Raissez.

"I took him up and out of the pit and back to my car."

Deputy Toby Brazee arrived and went into the pit to look for the other suspect. Brazee found the suspect hiding, arrested the man and brought him back up and out of the pit.

Inside the car, deputies found: rock salt, lithium batteries, starter fluid, acid, plastic hose and air hose. "They had their front windows open," said Raissez, "but even with the windows open I was nearly knocked over by the anhydrous fumes when I opened the back doors."

"The car was a mess. They have probably been living in it and drive place to place to sell the

## FISD attendance records audited

The FISD Board met Monday, April 7, and approved a Leaver Audit presented by Kenneth Robison, CPA representative of Robison Johnston & Patton of Lubbock. Robison told the board, "This audit is a procedure used when students leave the district. You (FISD) must identify who those students are with proce-

dures in place to identify them. You must have documents in the files about when those students left and why they left. This way they can't be considered drop-outs."

"The reason for this audit is because there have been some school districts that have been falsifying their dropout rates and falsifying their reasons for leav-

ing, such as Houston ISD recently in the news. There is a bill in place now to eliminate this audit."

"Out of 131 'leavers' in 2001-2002 (for FISD), we audited 78. Out of these 78 only three were not documented properly. This is not a serious situation," concluded Robison.

FISD Superintendent Jerry Vaughn explained, "Some students leave during the summer, or on weekends, and they do not report why or where they moved. It makes it hard to document these students."

In other matters, First National Bank, City Bank and American State Bank had turned in bids seeking to be FISD's depository for 2003-2005.

Mabry Greenhaw, President of City Bank branch in Floydada, and Tom Farris, President of First

We have a hometown hero. Last Saturday at Ralls, April 5, 2003, Floydada Junior Basketball 5th and 6th grade boys Allstars were in tournament play with Olton at 9:15 a.m.

Just after the halftime interlude, Mr. Bill Smith, an Olton player's grandfather, collapsed at the bottom of their stands.

Cell phones were not working well within the building, so son Kenny raced outside to talk to 911. This led to added confusion because some Floydada parents including Mr. Randy Lerma first thought the emergency was outside of the gym. But cries for help ensuing from Olton's crowd prompted Mr. Lerma to rush to Mr. Smith's aid.

Finding no pulse or breathing, and getting permission from the downed man's son, Mr. Lerma used CPR training he had received as an employee of Azteca Milling Plainview. Mr. Lerma was glad for Floydada School Resource Officer Ruben DeLeon to join the effort taking over the heart compression procedure. Randy backed up mouth to mouth by keeping the patient's airway open.

Tom Lipham also helped by

being available. It was awesome to see men in Floydada green shirts working so well to help Mr. Smith.

After about 10 minutes, Ralls paramedic arrived with a defibrillator. After being shocked, a faint pulse was gained. The patient was then transported to Crosbyton. This hospital stabilized him further, then he was flown by Aerocare to Covenant Methodist, Lubbock.

We can all be grateful, especially the Bill Smith family from Olton, that even though Randy had worked the night before, he was present for his son's basketball game.

Azteca Milling Plainview and their CPR instructor Veronica Wood can be proud that Randy Lerma's training really paid off. Randy's recertification was issued November 15, 2002.

The Ralls EMS and Crosbyton and Covenant Hospital doctors expressed that the quick response of Randy is a major contributing factor to Bill's being alive.

At this writing Mr. Smith is recovering well and hoping to go home soon.

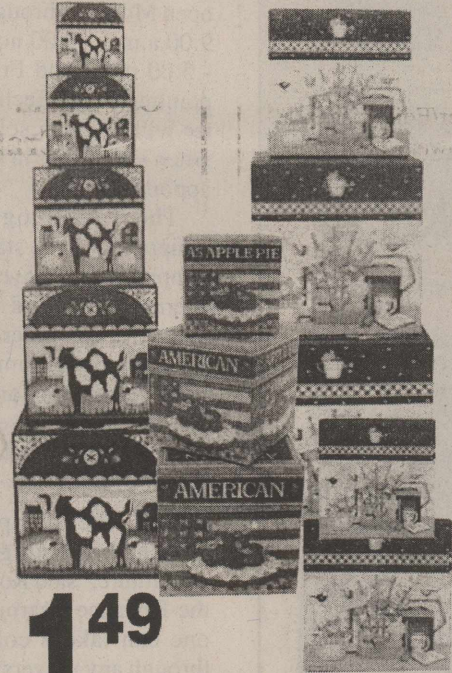

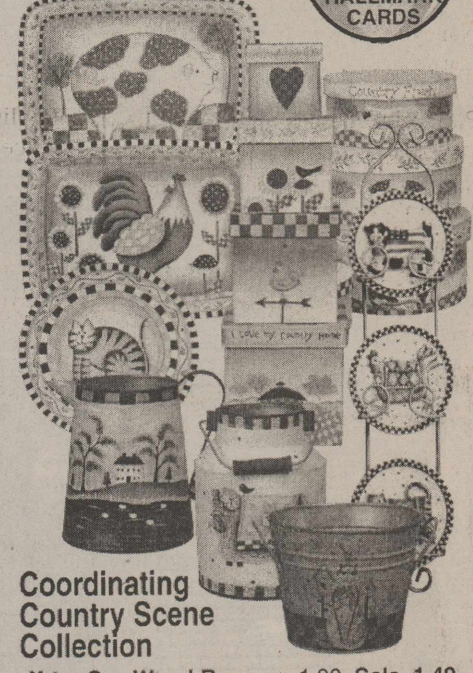

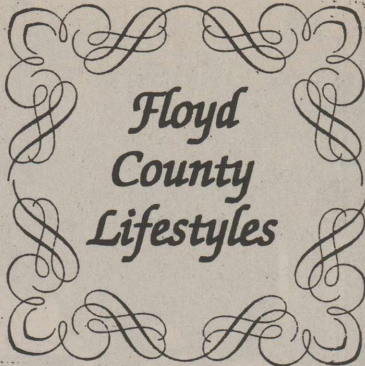

## Floydada and Lockney well represented in All Star games

Senior basketball players from Floydada and Lockney were selected to play in last week's 33rd Anniversary Golden Spread High School All-Star Basketball Games, held at Canyon's West Texas A & M Events Center.

Playing for the South girls' squad were Lockney's Laci Schumacher and Leslie Cueller and Ragan Beedy from Floydada. Floydada's Tyler Helms and Brady Rainwater were members of the South boys' team. The All-Star Games consisted of a three day basketball tournament designed to allow the area's top high school seniors to compete against one another. 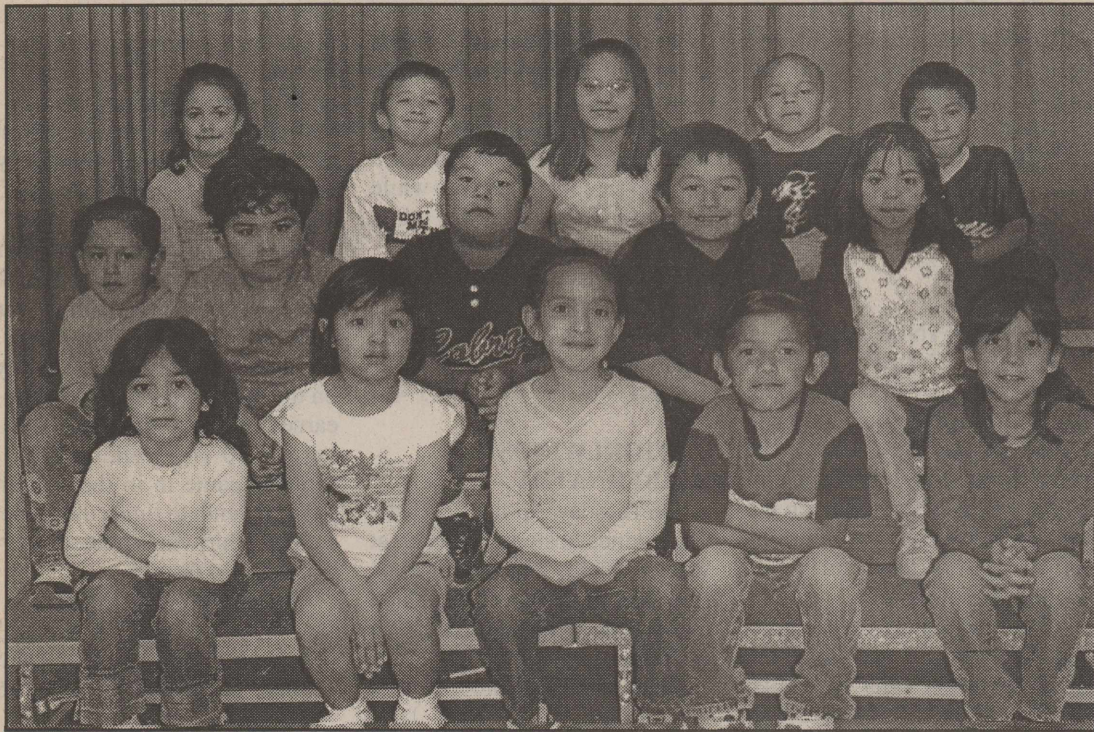
The final game of the tournament proved to be the most competitive of the weekend as the South boys pulled away from the North team with solid free-throw shooting and a balanced attack.

Seven players on the South squad scored in double figures in the 97-83 victory over the North in Saturday's championship game. Plainview's Zavier Hall (named the tournament's Most

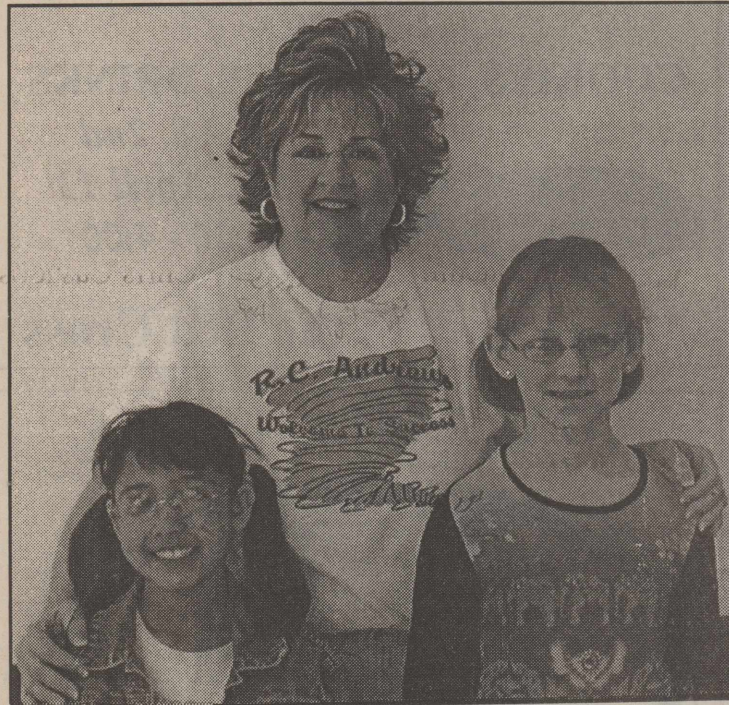

**Cotton Market Weekly** *A service provided by Plains Cotton Cooperative Association*

Despite a strong export report from USDA, cotton futures on the New York Cotton Exchange trended lower Thursday as buying interest failed to materialize, and locals pressed the market.

"Also working against the bulls was a slower tone in the cash markets, China's auction prices continued to ease, and Cotlook's quotes were all unchanged for the third consecutive day," a cotton market analyst explained.

A surge in export shipments in the week ended March 27 drove exports to their highest levels in more than four years as merchants took advantage of a temporary rise in the Step 2 payment rate. Shipments of 350,100 bales were the greatest since 382,800 bales were exported in the week ended Dec. 10, 1998. Primary destinations included China, Turkey and Mexico.

Total export sales for the latest reporting period easily remained above the level needed to surpass USDA's current 2002-03 marketing year forecast of 10.8 million statistical bales. Net export sales for the week totaled 353,300 bales, a 28 percent increase from the previous report and 7 percent more than the four-week average.

China, India and Pakistan, generally the largest U.S. export competitors, were three of the top

five buyers of U.S. cotton for the week. Due to the critical supply shortages in these countries and once the uncertainty of war clears up, a strong buying pattern could emerge, generating import interest from Pakistan and India, according to analysts.

In other news, USDA's 2003 prospective cotton plantings report released Mar. 31 was considered to be "on the low side" of analysts' expectations, providing some support for the market. The department estimated U.S. cotton plantings for the 2003 season at 14.25 million acres, up 2.0 percent from the 13.96 million acres planted in 2002.

Texas had been expected to see the largest increase in prospective plantings, and market participants were surprised that the anticipated rise is only 200,000 acres, bringing the state's total expected acreage to 5.8 million.

"That's a small increase for Texas considering good yields, a great quality crop and good moisture last year," one market observer said. "I would question that the number would be up only that much."

As expected, the Mid-South states of Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri and Tennessee are estimated to see a 220,000 acre rise in plantings. In

California and New Mexico, cotton acreage is expected to expand while Arizona will see a decrease in acres planted to the crop.

Additional fundamental news came from the International Cotton Advisory Committee (ICAC) as it forecast world ending stocks to shrink to 40.9 million bales by July 31, 2003, the lowest level since the 1994-95 season.

The committee estimated 2002-03 world cotton production to reach 87.7 million bales, down 11 percent from the record set the previous season, while global cotton consumption was pegged at 95.8 million bales. Additionally, the committee expects world production for 2003-04 to rise 9 percent to 95.8 million bales, and mill use was projected at 96.6 million bales.

Meanwhile, on the spot cotton scene, trading activity remained light due to producer reluctance to sell at current prices. Online sales by Texas, Oklahoma and Kansas cotton producers for the week ended April 3 totaled 1,823 bales, an increase from the previous week when 786 bales changed hands. The average price received by producers selling their cotton online ranged from 46.05 to 50.21 cents per pound compared to the previous week's range of 40.00 to 48.50 cents per pound.

**PCG annual meeting addresses broad range of industry concerns**

The 46th gathering of the Plains Cotton Growers, Inc. membership allowed growers the opportunity to hear the latest news from Washington, DC and get a better understanding of world trade issues and how they could affect producers in the future.

Featured speakers at the PCG meeting were John Maguire, Vice President-Washington Operations for the National Cotton Council; Ann Jorgensen, Director External Affairs for USDA's Risk Management Agency; and Dr. Mechel Paggi, Director-Center for Agricultural Business at California State University Fresno.

During the meeting PCG President Mark Williams, who also serves as Chairman of the American Cotton Producers, presented his report on PCG work over the past year. He noted the positive results achieved on PCG's priority issues such as passage and implementation of

the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002, which is designed to strengthen agriculture's economic safety net, and the Agricultural Assistance Act of 2003, which addresses yield disasters in the 2001 and 2002 growing seasons.

PCG President Mark Williams also presented Kerry Siders, Hockley-Cochran Integrated Pest Management (IPM) agent, with the 2002 Cotton Agent of the Year Award in recognition of his efforts on behalf of the High Plains cotton industry.

Following the PCG Annual Meeting, the PCG Board convened its scheduled quarterly Directors meeting to elect 2003-04 officers and to select the 2003-04 PCG Executive Committee.

During the meeting the PCG Board voted unanimously to reelect President Mark Williams, of Farwell, Vice President Rickey Bearden, of Plains, and Secretary-Treasurer Mike Hughes, of Lamesa, as allowed by the organization's By-Laws.

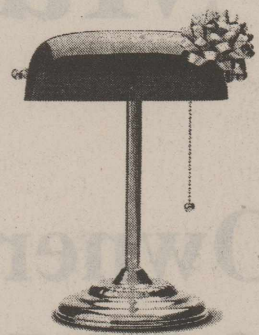

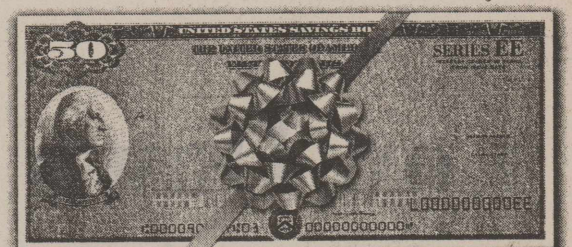

National Bank in Floydada, both spoke to the board.

Greenhaw said, "Our bid is simple. We will absorb all service charges and fees due to changing deposits. We will give you a \$500 credit toward your future check orders. We pledge sufficient collateral, on-line banking, wiring, stop payments and Direct Deposits. We will come and train employees. Our staff will be available to help anyone concerning Direct Deposits."

Farris told the board, "All three banks have the same services available to you (FISD). FISD has about 4 to 5 million dollars on deposit and you borrow very little money. So I believe interest rates on deposits is the most important thing."

"I agree that the interest rates are probably about as low as they will be going. This is good for changing home mortgages, but not for changing to fixed rates,"

Farris concluded.

Following a recommendation by Superintendent Vaughn to stay with FNB of Floydada as FISD's depository, the board voted unanimously to continue using FNB of Floydada as its depository for 2003-2005.

The board approved the taking of bids on purchasing a new activity bus and a new vocational pickup. Vaughn told the board, "The activity bus will cost between \$82,000 and \$90,000. It will have an underbelly storage, air-conditioned and it will be available and used by all departments on out-of-town trips," said

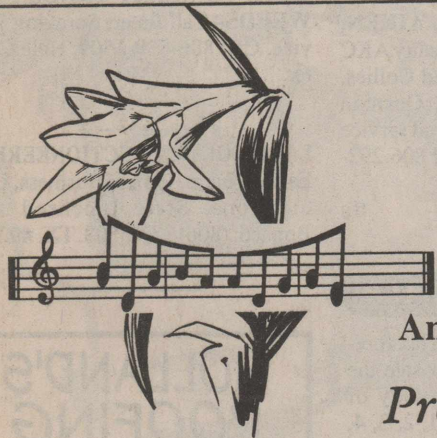
Vaughn.

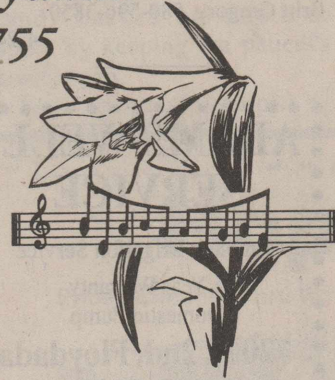
