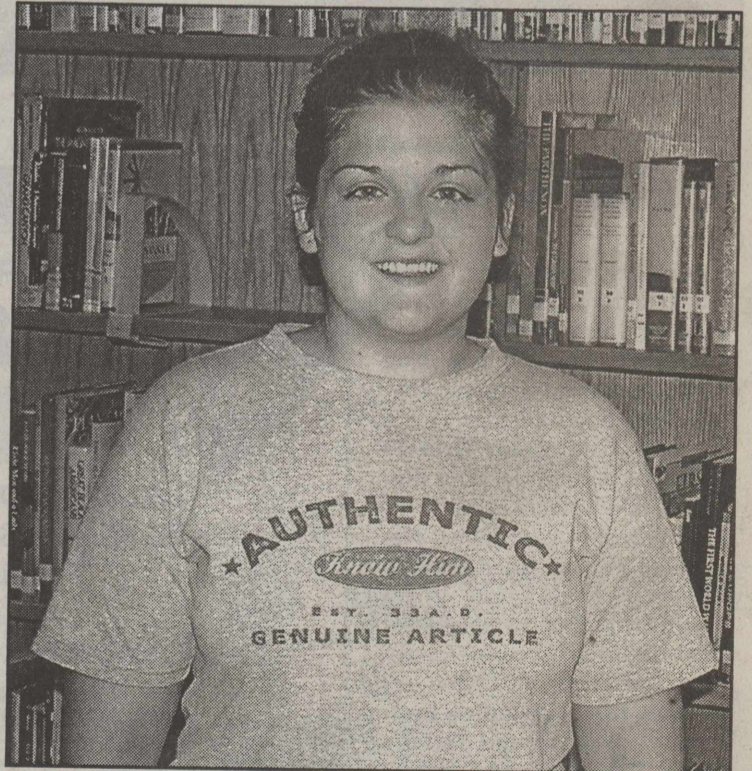
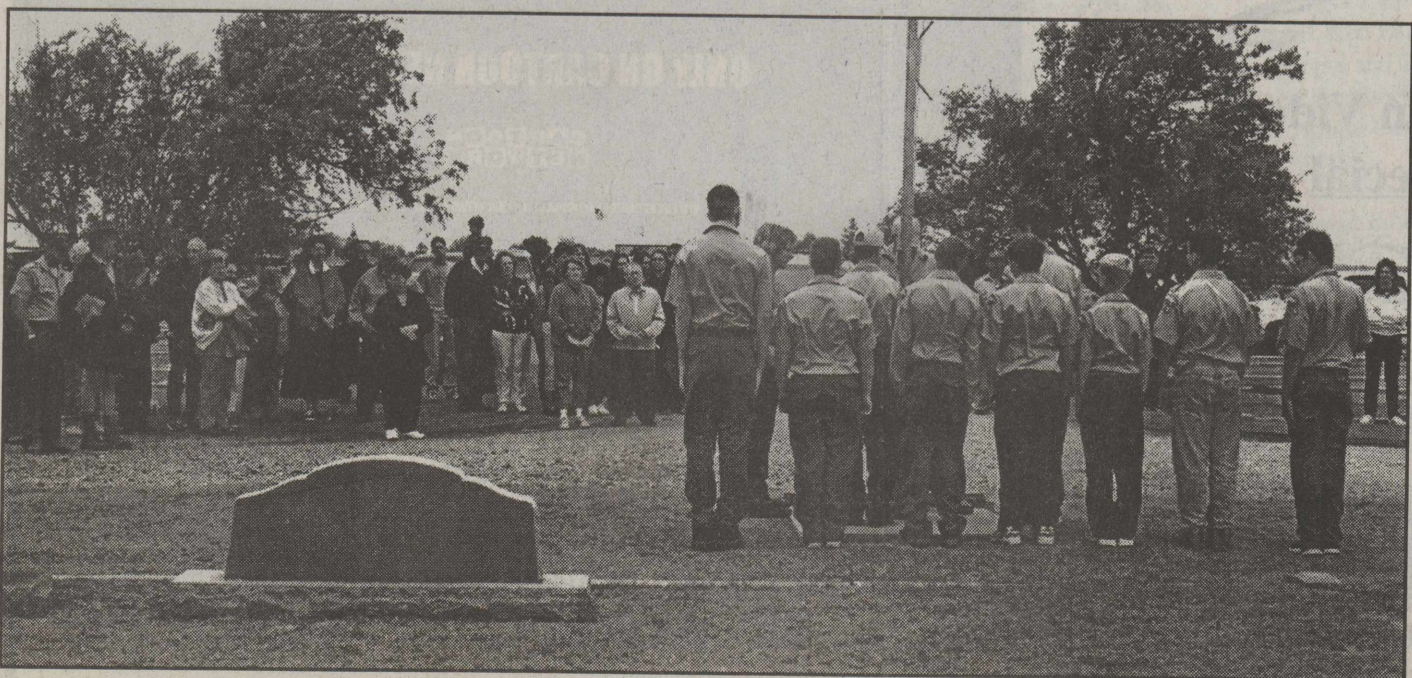

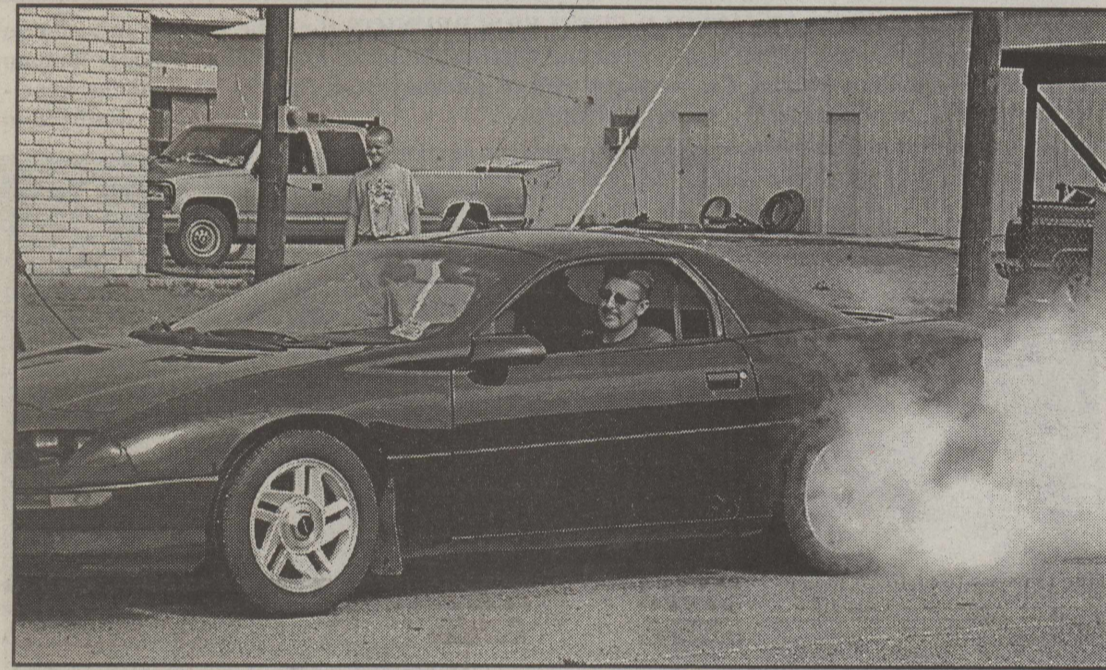
### Special Graduate Sections Inside

# The Lamplighter

Strange things are going on in the world of Texas politics. Both Molly Ivens and Dave McNeely say nice things about the rich Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst, which is against their nature, along with their usual vitriol about House Speaker Tom Craddick and Governor Rick Perry, all Republicans.

If one did not know both Ivens and McNeely to be such kindly souls, albeit devoted, foot-washing Democrats on the order of Liz Carpenter, one might get the idea they are trying to foment some kind of political war among Republicans, now that they have lost their champion, Tony Sanchez.

It's not as if there is no friction between Craddick, of Midland, and Dewhurst, of Houston. Of course there is. Craddick runs the House of Representatives, where he has served since Hector was a pup, while Dewhurst runs the Senate, where he is a relative newcomer. Perry is Governor. Dewhurst would like to be Governor. (So would Carole Keeton Strayhorn and a host of others.) Occasionally there is bound to be differences. That is built into the system.

But right now there is a difference, a vast difference, between Dewhurst on the one hand

and Craddick and Perry on the other, over substantive issues. Craddick and Perry haven't wanted this session of the Legislature to get in a hassle over how to fund Texas' public schools, since the issue is so divisive, and since the Legislature continues to wrestle over the budget. Dewhurst takes the position that the decision ought to be made now, and that the answer is simply to reduce property taxes by one-half and add a penny to the state sales tax. That additional sales tax is what causes us to wonder about Ivens and McNeely, and to suspect they have ulterior motives. As a general rule Democrats are opposed to sales taxes, calling them "regressive", as opposed to property taxes, which they call "progressive," and are thus to be desired.

The theory, of course, is that only rich people own property, and therefore any tax on property is a tax on rich people, which is good, in the general thinking of both Ivens and McNeely. In their defense, however, it should be noted that the Ivens-McNeely praise of Dewhurst came before he unveiled his tax plan with its heavy emphasis on "regressive" taxation.

Craddick and Perry take the position, as we understand the

differences, that funding schools is, a very complicated issue, one that needs to be tackled in a special session of the Legislature devoted primarily, if not solely, to that purpose. If we were a betting man, we would bet on Perry and Craddick, despite the enviable position held by the Lt. Governor as czar of the Senate.

Personally, we are in favor of the Legislature setting aside an entire special session to wrangle over this state's tax structure. Perhaps during a special session someone might decide the state ought to look at how the local sales tax is returned to which communities. Still, it is difficult to fault the approach taken by Dewhurst. Nothing will get done unless someone in authority makes a move, whatever it is and whoever it is. Perhaps, just perhaps, something good might come of a special session devoted to school finances. We might find out, for instance, where our State Representative, Pete Laney, stands on the issue of school finances. Should "Robin Hood" be kept, or abandoned? Should property taxes be increased, kept the same, or decreased? Should the bulk of school funding be moved to the state level? Should the sales tax be altered and allocated differ-

ently?

Pete has managed to keep a low profile on the whole subject of taxation. He did not need to vote, of course, while he was Speaker of the House (which was a long time), but his wishes guided the actions of the House. During that time the general subject of taxation also kept a low profile. Now Pete is a member of the common herd, with responsibilities common to the herd. That is, he will have to vote on an issue that his District has differing views about. We don't envy his position, but that's what being a State Representative is all about. That's why, theoretically, people go to Austin in that capacity, to represent home folks and solve problems affecting home folks. And we've never seen a Texas problem that could be, or can be, solved in Ardmore, Oklahoma.

In the meantime, and with particular reference to McNeely and Ivens, our advice is simple: if your purpose is to throw eggs, hold your fire until the session is over. That way you won't have egg on your face, caused by praising someone who advances positions you don't, and can't, agree with.

Cunningham Hill and the Pioneer Man is Kenneth Bain Jr.

The Carthels have lived in Floyd County for over 70 years as a couple--Cecil for 79 years and Charlotte for 75.

The Carthels were married in New Mexico, May 12, 1942 and went into farming. Except for 2 years in the Marines, Cecil continued farming. He was also a blacksmith, and had a custom harvest business.

Charlotte was a licensed beautician, baked wedding and birthday cakes, and worked in the Floyd County Cannery. She is also an artist.

Both are now retired and raising cows and buffalos. They also do woodworking for the family, and Charlotte is writing a western novel.

They have 2 children, Lavona and Bill Pitchford, of Denton, and Barbara and Charlie Carthel, of Lockney; and 6 grandchildren and 8 great grandchildren.

The Pioneer Woman, Lillian Hill, was born Dec. 9, 1912 in Oklahoma. She came to Floyd

County in 1924 in a covered wagon with her parents, a younger sister, and 2 younger brothers.

She married Clyde Franklin Hill, July 19, 1930.

Mrs. Hill and her family moved to Amarillo in August 1941 where Clyde worked in the smelter during WWII. In August 1946 they returned to Lockney where she worked with her husband as a painter and a carpenter for 40 years.

Clyde died on March 9, 1984.

Mrs. Hill is a long time member of the First United Methodist Church in Lockney, a member of the Builders Sunday School Class and the Women's Missionary Society, and the Pollyanna Club.

She has a daughter Clydelle, who lives in Lockney and is married to Delton Jack.

Lillian and Clyde also had a

son, James Arthur, who is now deceased.

Mrs. Hill has 6 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.

Pioneer Man Kenneth Bain Jr. was born on June 4, 1919 in Floydada. He graduated from Floydada High School in 1936.

He entered the Army in 1942 and served approximately 4 years with the Finance Department of the 90th Infantry Division.

After his release from the Army, he entered the University of Texas Law School and graduated January 31, 1949.

Bain practiced law with his father in Floydada until his father's death in 1964, and only recently retired himself.

In addition to his private practice, he served as county attorney from January 1, 1959, until October 1989.

He has been a longtime member of the Floydada Lion's Club and is a member of the First United Methodist Church.

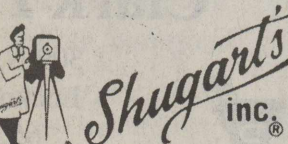

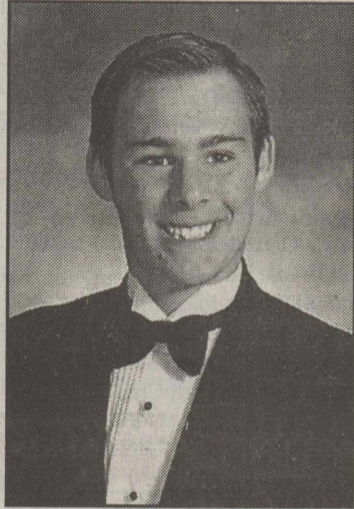
School honors he has received include Most Studious and Most

Dependable. He was a candidate for Mr. LHS and a regional qualifier in UIL Current Issues and Event. He has also qualified for All-Region Band for 2 years.

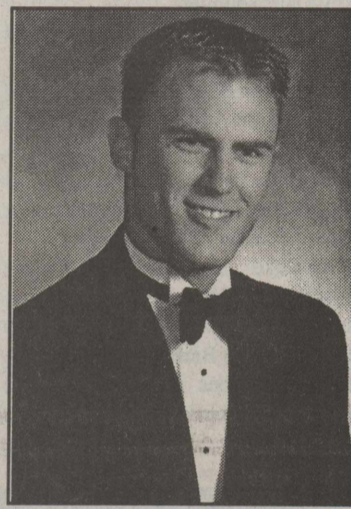
Garrett is president of Lockney 4-H, Floyd County 4-H Council, and District 2 4-H

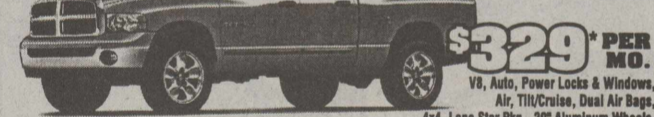

Whereas, today we have beautiful places of worship and have trained ourselves to demonstrate and exercise faith more readily.

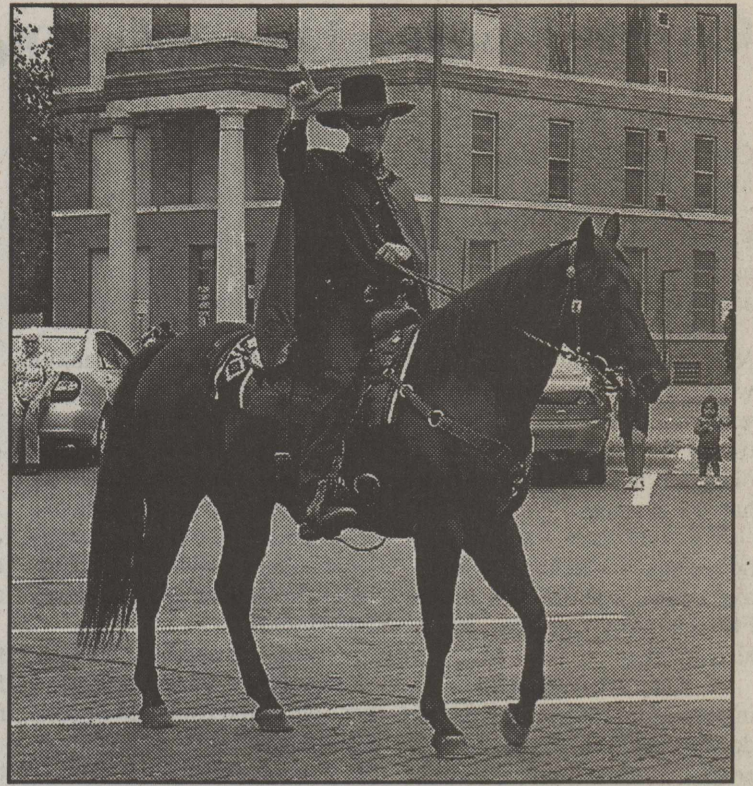
The pioneers knew the possibility that during their travel there would be deaths and loved ones would be left behind in graves. This is just one example of the hardships that would face our pioneers, but they pressed on

with the lasting thought that no one owed them anything - one must work hard for what he gets.

One could not conceive any thought other than the Pioneers to our area had faith, determination, strength and stamina which was exercised before, during and after their trek to Floyd County and the surrounding area.

In closing, I wish to dedicate these words to the names of 160 persons related in some manner to our area and whom passed away since last May.

This benefit began when Todd Holly's cousin, Woody Miller, was killed in an industrial fire at work, and left behind 5 children. Todd organized a fundraiser for the family that year. It has been carried on in Woody's honor ever since.

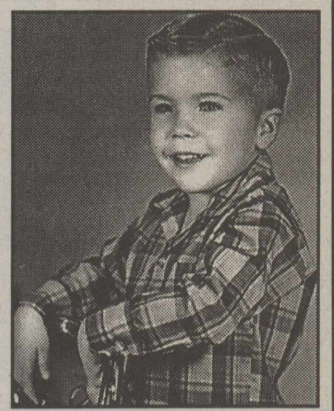
Each year, 100% of all money raised has gone to a different burn victim from our area. Last year's Woodstock was a huge success in benefit of little Levi Cantrell who was flown into UMC as an unfortunate burn victim and later adopted by his UMC nurse, Lori Cantrell.

This year, Woodstock is in coordination with UMC's Occupational Therapy Dept. and Lubbock Firefighters to send area children to Camp Amistad. It is the mission of Camp Amistad to provide a free summer camp experience to children ages 6-16 who have sustained a burn injury.

Woodstock is a weekend-long camp-out full of live music, camping, fishing, various contests, and a silent auction.

Although, there is no charge to be a part of Woodstock, donations are the heart of the fundraising efforts and a state permit is required.

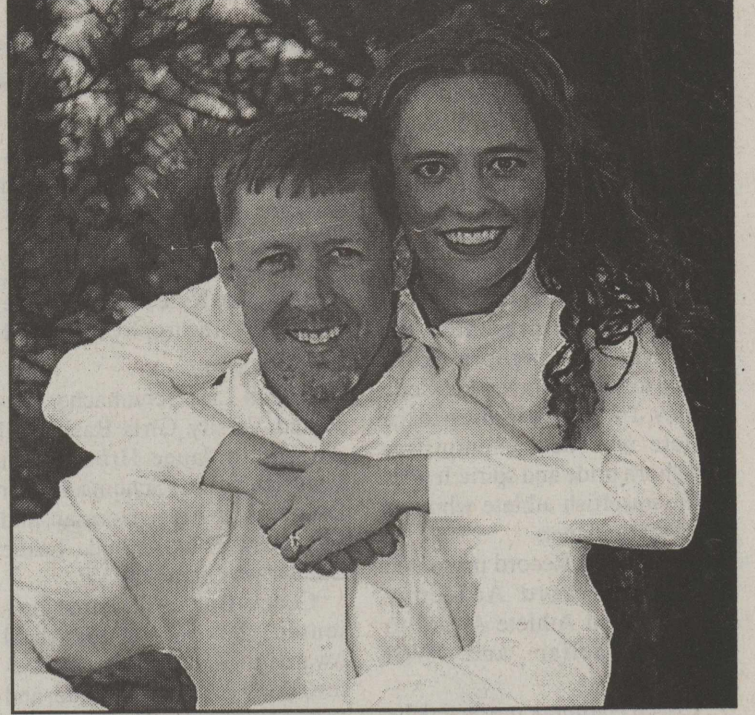
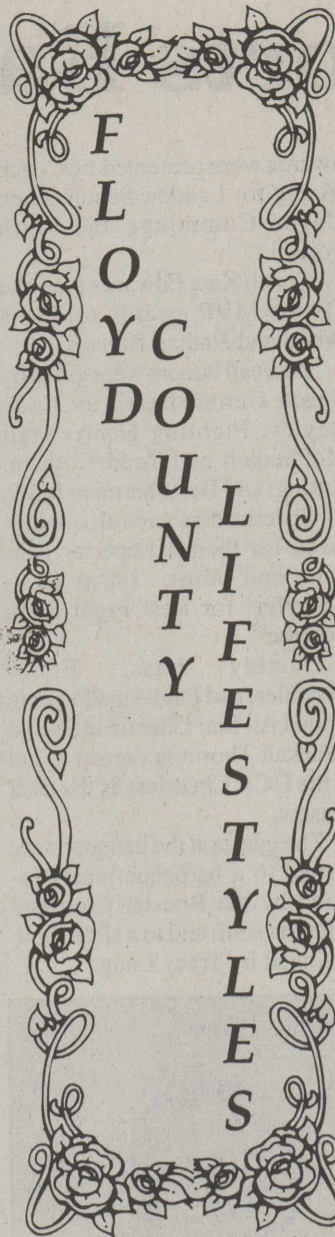
Eula Bramlet is this week's Senior Citizen Eula Savage was born 12/4/1908 at Tulia Texas to John and Annie Savage.

## South Plains Hobby Club News

The South Plains Hobby Club went on the road again on Wednesday, May 12, 2003, courtesy of Virginia Taylor, who once again provided transportation in her "Doodlevan." This time the trip was to Memphis, Texas. The travelers meeting at the South Plains Baptist Church at 9:00 a.m. included Virginia Taylor, Peggy Roberts, Ann Hartman, Barbara Cawley, Betty Deavenport, Carolyn Marble, Donnie Bowman, Sandra Lass and Sandy Humphries, Betty's friend from Greenville, and Bonnie Graham, Virginia's friend from Floydada.

The purpose of the trip was to do a little shopping in the morning, have lunch at "The Back Porch", and after lunch, tour the Presbyterian Building, which was designated a Texas Historic Landmark in 1980.

During lunch, Peggy Roberts, President, read thank you notes from guests at the April, 2003 meeting.

After lunch, the group placed orders for homemade pie, cake and ice cream (specialty items for which the cafe is renown), to be eaten later in the afternoon after the tour.

Marjorie Howard, a volunteer for the Preservation Foundation, provided the tour. Mrs. Howard said that the church was established in 1890 by Reverend A.W. Rogers and began with 13 members. The place of worship was built in 1911 from brick fired in the Memphis kiln and "featured neoclassical revival detailing in the use of arched windows and a domed roof" as described in the Foundation's brochure.

Mrs. Howard pointed out to the group that the building's exterior is round in shape like St. Peter's in Rome and that there are 78 stained glass windows, "both plain and portrait," which are the

originals imported from Europe and that all of the windows had been dedicated in memory of the parishioners. The bottom portion of many of the stained glass windows can be raised and lowered to allow for air circulation on warm days, but are kept closed since the building now has air conditioning. She said that all of the interior wood surfaces, including the organ and furniture are made of solid oak that had been paid for by local ranchers at the time the church was built.

Originally, the church had two organs, of which only one remains, a huge pipe organ, originally powered by water pressure, from water obtained from a well in the basement. Now electrified, the organ once required two men to operate.

There is a banquet room and a kitchen on the second floor that has the original linoleum on the floor. The kitchen has the original cupboards and kitchen sink as well as "Buffalo China", old cafe dishes popular in the early 20th century. Sometime in the 1920's a little church was built in the basement for the children. The children's chapel is accessible only by a special spiral staircase.

In 1995, the church held its last service. At the time there were only eight elderly ladies left in the congregation. About a dozen of the Memphis community members formed a non-profit corporation with the express "purpose of caring for and restoring the church to its original natural glory." Since that time the foundation has raised over \$100,000 for repairs to the kitchen and a new roof. Mrs.

Howard said that the next project will be to refurbish the stained glass windows, an endeavor that will cost about \$85,000 and will be accomplished by doing one window at a time. In addition, Mrs. Howard said that the preservation foundation will have to deal with the problem of bats in the ceiling that was not resolved when the old roof was replaced.

When asked how money was raised for the restoration and maintenance, Mrs. Howard said that the foundation rents the building for weddings, banquets and concerts. She added that the church is especially popular for services held at Christmas-time as well as for organists to use for recitals to take advantage of the size, quality of sound, and uniqueness of the organ. She said that tours could be arranged by calling 806-259-2198, 259-2112, or 259-3100.

After the tour, the group followed Mrs. Howard's vehicle in the "Doodlevan" for a tour of the Fairview Cemetery, just outside of Memphis, where the group saw some very unique and elaborate grave sites. Some of the headstones had the names of parishioners honored with stained glass windows in the old Presbyterian Church. When asked, Mrs. Howard said that she didn't think any of the original parishioners' descendants were left in or around the Memphis area.

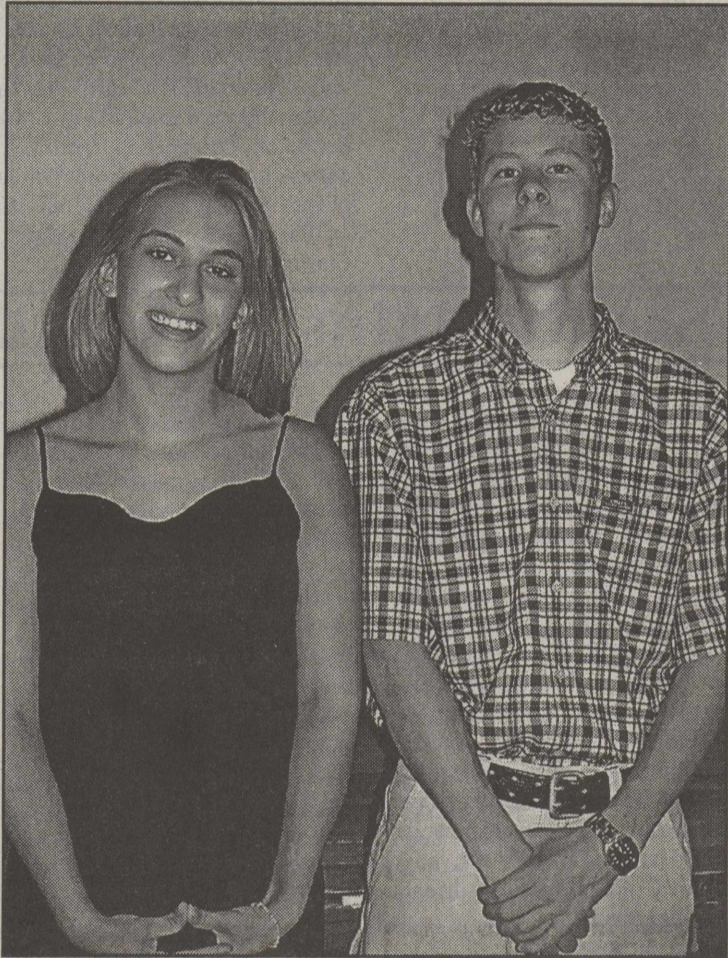

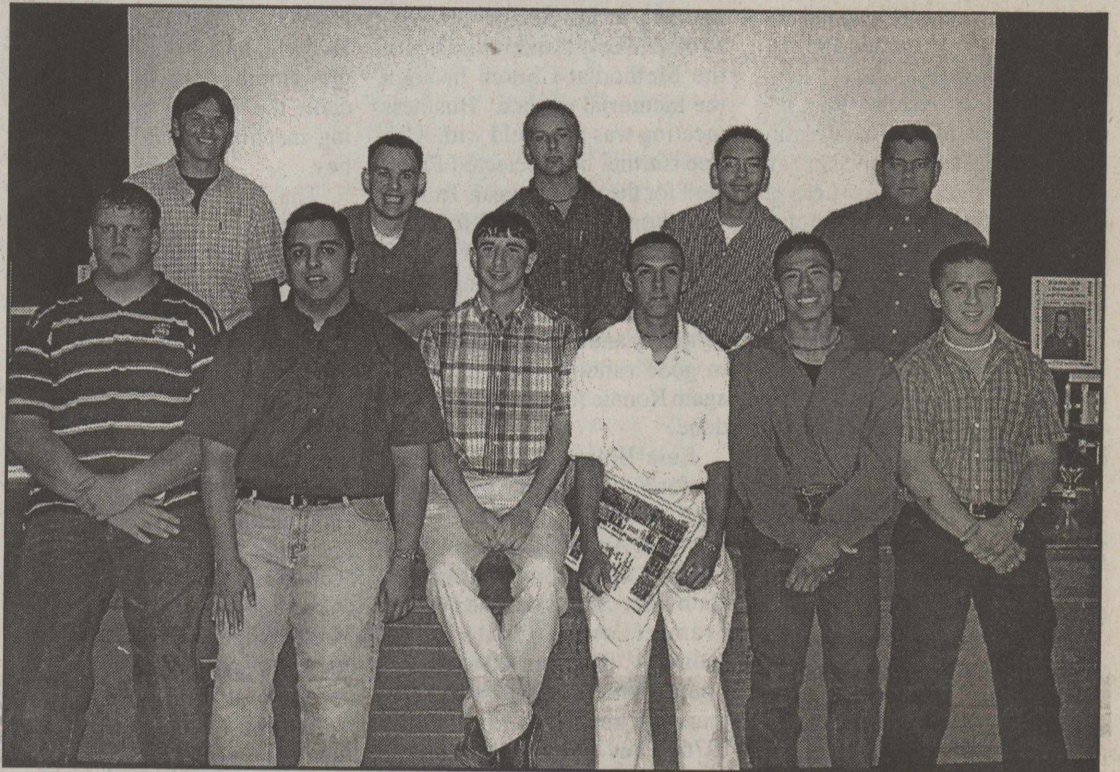

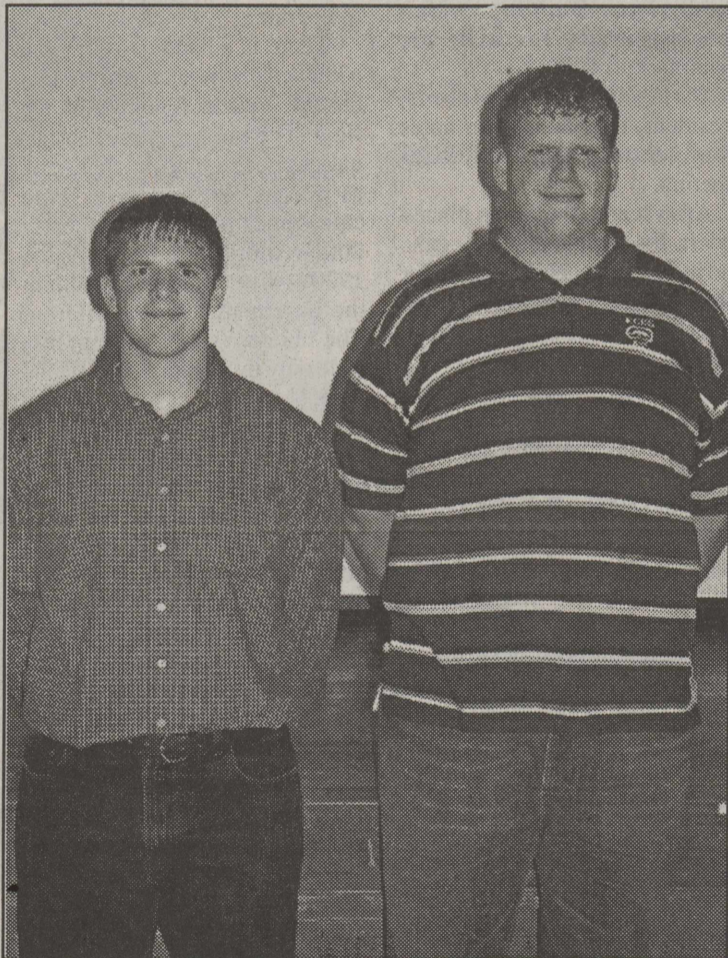
## Longhorns scalp the Comanches

## USDA extends CRP sign-up

Sign-up period for the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) has been extended from May 30, 2003 to June 13, 2003.

Interest in the general CRP sign-up has been strong. This extension gives busy producers more time to enroll in this highly successful, environmentally beneficial program.

CRP is the nation's largest private lands environmental improvement program—it protects millions of acres of topsoil from erosion, provides valuable wildlife habitat and safeguards America's ground and surface water quality. The 2002 Farm Bill authorized CRP enrollment up to 39.2 million acres. For fiscal year 2003, Floyd County CRP participants have received \$4,552,279 in rental payments as of May 2003, and approximately 117,673 acres are currently enrolled in the program.

CRP participants voluntarily remove environmentally sensitive land from agricultural pro-

duction by entering into long-term contracts for 10 to 15 years. In exchange, they receive annual rental payments and a payment of up to 50 percent of the cost of establishing conservation practices.

Current participants with contracts expiring this fall—covering about 1.5 million acres—can make new contract offers, which, if accepted, will become effective on Oct. 1, 2003. All other contracts awarded under this sign-up will become effective either at the beginning of the next fiscal year, Oct. 1, 2003, or the following year, Oct. 1, 2004, whichever the producer chooses.

FSA will evaluate and rank eligible CRP offers using the Environmental Benefits Index (EBI), a ranking of environmental benefits to be gained from enrolling the land in CRP. Decisions on the EBI thresholds will be made by the Secretary after the sign-up ends and after FSA analyzes the EBI numbers of all the offers. Those who would

have met previous sign-up EBI thresholds are not guaranteed a contract under this sign-up.

Producers who enroll acreage in CRP promote conservation and stewardship by protecting sensitive land for future generations and reduce production of surplus commodities. In return, producers receive needed income support through program payments and use of the land for recreational purposes.

Aside from the general sign-up, the CRP continuous sign-up program is available on an ongoing basis for private lands currently in production. FSA has reserved 2 million acres for the continuous sign-up program, which protects the most environmentally desirable and sensitive land. FSA is making a special effort to help enhance wildlife habitats and air quality by earmarking 500,000 of these acres for hardwood tree planting. Continuous sign-up for hardwood planting will start after the general sign-up.

## Trade reform difficult

To borrow a line from author Margaret Mitchell the message U.S. Trade negotiators ultimately gave to U.S. cotton and textile industry regarding the recently completed Vietnam Bilateral Textile Agreement was "Frankly my dear I don't give a damn".

Despite repeated assurances that the U.S. position was going to strictly hold the line in regard to a trade deal with Vietnam, the final agreement included unprecedented concessions.

The net result of these generous, and mostly last minute, U.S. concessions has the potential to be devastating, not just to the U.S. textile industry, but also to the cotton producers who supply them fiber.

In just the category for cotton trousers, which includes denim jeans, Vietnam will be allowed to bring in some 7,000,000 dozen, or roughly 84 million pairs of jeans. This figure is 9 times the 778,000 dozen that Vietnam actually exported in this category over the past year. This is the equivalent to giving away some 400,000 bales of U.S. domestic cotton consumption.

The final U.S. offer was some 240% higher than the already generous initial 2.9 million dozen quota offered at the beginning of negotiations in this area.

As hard as the final agreement is to swallow, perhaps the most disturbing part of the situation is the status of communication between U.S. industry and the U.S. Department of Commerce and the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative.

Even as the negotiations were being completed and the final U.S. positions being presented Under Secretary of Commerce Grant Aldonas was assuring the textile and cotton industry that the US Trade Representatives

office would hold the line and not give away their markets.

The clear, but unfortunate, translation of Mr. Aldonas and others' promises of "we will take care of you" actually meant "Frankly my dear I don't give a damn".

The new question for cotton and textile industry officials becomes what can we do to prevent another Vietnam debacle from occurring. Pointing out the devastating fallout of concessions granted in the Vietnam trade deal and pounding home the message that giving away the farm just to get a deal isn't the way to implement meaningful trade reforms and level the playing field of international trade.

The pending Central American Free Trade Agreement is the next obvious focus for our industry.

Calling attention to the antics of the USTR's office and reinforcing the idea that sometimes it is better to say "our first offer was more than generous and you can take it or leave it" is the only way to make sure a repeat performance doesn't happen.
