The Atmos amounted to 3.09 percent in crease for residential customer and 2.83 percent increase fo commercial customers. An ex ample given by Atmos was:
residential customer previously would have paid $\$ 13.94$ for 6 MCF usage of natural gas. Now that customer will pay $\$ 15.12$,
while a commercial customer's rates will increase from $\$ 32.25$ natural gas.

FEDC Executive Director Dor Ross, the council approved a revised set of FEDC tax abatement guidelines in order to broaden the businesses and possibly helping others to expand their facilities. Ross said, "I want to take out the $\$ 250,000$ minimum tax base and extend commercial develop allowed by law. We need to keep our tax abatement broad and include industrial and commercial so any business can expand by creating jobs and putting wealth on the tax base
