



In the Rabbit Show, Braden Graves' Holland Lop Rabbit was named the Best of Show.





## Lockney Police release crime stats to council

Lockney Police Chief Jerry Edwards has released crime statistics for the year 2004 to the Lockney City Council.

The statistics show during the year of 2004 the Lockney Police investigated 26 motor vehicle accidents, up from 21 the previous year.

The Department investigated 141 criminal offenses that were either reported to the department or observed by officers. This is a decrease from the 167 offenses in 2003.

Incident reports were down to 79 compared to 114 in 2003.

During 2004 the Lockney Po-

During 2004 the Lockney Police Department arrested 33 adults and placed them in jail. In 2003, 41 adults were arrested.

During 2004 the Lockney PD detained 9 juveniles and placed them in either the PAC or turned them over to the Juvenile Probation Office. In 2003 there were 23 juveniles detained.

"I firmly believe the lack of detention of juveniles is aided very heavy by the fact that we have the Lockney Youth Activity Center, which gives the youth something to do. Since the building of this facility there appears to be a steady reduction in youth problems."

There were many visitors touring the Museum, viewing the Coronado artifacts, early Floyd County exhibits and researchers using the materials in the Mary Lou Bollman History and Genealogy Center.

Pat Anthony from Amarillo was at the Museum four days the first week of this month looking for information on her ancestors: William Henderson Brown and wife Mollie Margaret Stewart Brown; Luther Richard Brown and wife Zephra Beatrice Morrison Brow; and George Thomas Morrison and wife Sarah Elizabeth Ross Morrison. She left with a packet full of information.

Joyce Quarles from Farwell came in looking for information on her great grandparents James T. Fish and wife Lu Fish. Her grandfather Jack Fish, who married Henrietta Jones, was their only child. Jack Fish homesteaded in Quay County, New Mexico in the early 1900's. The James T. Fish family is in Floyd

County on the 1900 census. James T. Fish died in 1911 and is the sky. buried in the Flomot Cemetery in Motley County.

Where were your ancestors in 1790 through 1930? The Federal Census is one of the best research tools available. The 1850 census is the first census to list complete households. Prior to 1830 only the head of the household was named and the rest of the family grouped together by ages. Almost all of the 1890 census was destroyed by fire. The 1930 census is the last that has been released because of the Privacy Act. If you would like to search the census records the staff and volunteers at the Museum will assist you.

The educational video about Coronado in Blanco Canyon is in the process of being edited. The video will be a great asset to the Museum for tours, programs, and special events.

Rallying world prices and an a set of modules there is one imupsurge in the Adjusted World. Price has many growers pondering whether or not to lock-in the LDP rate on cotton still in mod-

While there are no clear signs that the recent price surge will find the support necessary to translate into a steady increase in the AWP in the coming months, this week's (January 14-20) 2.16 cent decrease in the Loan Deficiency Payment (LDP) payment rate is certainly getting a lot of grower attention.

The Adjusted World Price in effect for the week of January 14-20 has been announced by the Secretary of Agriculture at 36.16 cents which translates into an LDP payment rate of 15.84 cents per pound. This is down 2.16 cents from last week's LDP rate of 18 cents per pound.

A continuation of this tend could prevent producers who don't have all their cotton ginned from gaining the level of LDP benefits they might have otherwise been able to receive under different circumstances.

A big 2004-crop, and an extended harvest and ginning season, has created the possibility that a steadily increasing AWP calculation could cause the current high Loan Deficiency Payment rates to disappear.

That is why the option to lockin the higher LDP rate has attracted the interest of producers in recent days. The module lockin process is fairly straightforward, but producers need to understand that they must stay on top of the process once the modules that were locked in start getting ginned.

Modules that are pledged as collateral for a recourse Seed Cotton Loan are eligible for the Module Lock-in option.

Using the Module Lock-in provision of the Marketing Loan Program is not a common practice for growers on the High Plains. If a decision is made to ... information on file 10 tq2236 lock-in the current LDP rate on

portant concept that must be at that top of a growers list to avoid unnecessary complications later on. Beneficial interest must be

maintained. For purposes of the marketing loan program a producer is required to have title, control and risk of loss in order for the commodity to be eligible for benefits offered through the marketing loan program. By meeting all three of these requirements the producer is said to have "Beneficial Interest" in the commodity.

For the producer, and those who market cotton on their behalf, it is important that a close accounting of the amount of LDP benefits are kept and that beneficial interest is not transferred. Maintaining beneficial interest is the only way to insure that cotton released when the LDP payment limit is reached can further utilize remaining components of the marketing loan program.

Producers who market cotton before they determine if it has received LDP benefits run the risk of the cotton being ineligible for any marketing loan benefits because beneficial interest was

The extra care taken to keep track of the LDP status of bales resulting from locked-in modules will insure that loan benefits are not lost due to a loss of beneficial interest.

Once a producer hits the \$75,000 payment limitation subsequent bales from locked-in modules become fully eligible for loan program participation other than the LDP program.

One complicating factor, which FSA has established a procedure to handle, is how to deal with crop share landowner LDP's payable as a result of the module lock-in request.

When the producer operator reaches the LDP pay limit maximum, subsequent bales will be divided according to the share

The crop share landowner will

continue to receive LDP payments on their share of the bales based on the module lock-in rate until they reach their individual pay limit ceiling.

The take home message for anyone who decides on the module lock-in option is to stay on top of their LDP payment limit status and to be careful to market bales only after LDG benefits have been paid

Getting too far ahead of the process could result in some bales being ineligible for loan benefits because beneficial interest was transferred too soon.

**New SRA limits some services** agents can perform on behalf of producers

New "Conflict of Interest" rules, included in the recently negotiated 2005 Standard Reinsurance Agreement between insurance providers and the USDA Risk Management Agency, will change the way many crop insurance agents and producers do business in 2005.

One of the most immediate impacts of the new rules involves reporting 2004 crop yields to the insurance company for purposes of updating APH yield records.

In the past, one of the standard services provided by the insurance agent was the collection and recording of yield data for the producer. Now agents are prohibited from seeking yield information on behalf of the producer and it is the producer's responsibility to submit necessary

To avoid problems, producers are encouraged to submit yield data, or give instructions to their gin to do so on their behalf, as soon as it becomes available on individual farms or insurance units and not wait until all their cotton is ginned.

This is especially important this year since some yield data might not become available until after the March 15 sales closing date for 2005 policies.

#### Cotton Market Weekly Aservice provided by Plains Cotton Cooperative Association

Cotton futures on the New York Board of Trade settled on firmer ground for the third conearlier in the week

reflected a predictable drop in sales due to the Christmas and New Year's holidays, but the figures still were considered "healthy" by the market. USDA reported net export sales of U.S. cotton in the week ended Dec. 30 totaled 141,000 bales. The figure was 42 percent less than the previous week and the prior fourweek average. Primary buyers included Turkey, China and South Korea.

U.S. export sales for the season have remained ahead of the pace set last year. For the 2004-05 season to date, export sales total 3.0 million bales while commitments total 8.0 million bales.

Export shipments of 243,400 bales were 64 percent more than the previous week and 37 percent better than the four-week average. Major destinations included China, Turkey, and Thailand.

Cotton prices were slightly higher this week, ad spot cotton sales were active as more cotton became available for sale. Texas, Oklahoma and Kansas producers sold 132,149 bales online in the week ended January 6 compared to the previous week when 67,411 bales were traded. Prices received by producers selling their cotton online ranged from 34.69 to 36.33 cents per pound versus the previous week's range of 33.77 to 34.69 cents per pound.

Meanwhile, the International Cotton Advisory Committee (ICAC) now projects world cotsecutive session on Thursday in ton production to hit a record high response to an improvement in of 114.2 million bales in 2004-05, the technical outlook for cotton a 20 percent increase from the previous season. The committee The week's export sales report also expects consumption to rise to an alltime high of 103.5 million bales in the upcoming year.

As if to help bring to fruition the reports of higher world cotton production, sources in Pakistan now say the crop there will reach a record 13.7 million bales this year, 3.0 million bales more than USDA's estimate, due to timely rains, increased acreage and improved water supplies.

Closer to home, misty and foggy conditions, coupled with subfreezing temperatures and high humidity levels, halted harvest progress on the Texas High and Rolling Plains this week. Despite the adverse weather, the retrieval of modules from fields continued where possible, and ginning activities remained constant. Drier weather is expected over the upcoming weekend. Although the vast majority of the crop already is off the stalk, producers would welcome a prolonged period of dry weather to allow them to complete harvest-

Regional observers report approximately 10 percent of the High Plains crop remains to be harvested, but if the weather cooperates, work should be completed by mid-month. Ginning and classing activities, however, remain well behind normal. Local analysts say approximately

55 percent of the region's crop has been ginned. Some gins may be finished by early February while many larger, higher capacity gins are unlikely to complete work before mid to late March.


