Rain, rain go away — but even if it does, the homemaker is faced with these rainy day reminders:

Mud — one way to stop mud before it tracks is to place clear plastic matting at front door and back. These mais serve as storage areas for muddy overshoes before anyone enters the house. Clean-up's easy - just tote mats to the sink, shake off dried-up mud and wash the plastic with a pine oll cleaner. Dry raingear can go back into the closet - and so can the plastic mats for storing bit the next rains come.

Tar — There's nothing worse than tar unless it's wet tar. Recipe for instant tar removal: Scrub tar off shoes by using a strong pine cleaner solution. This same recipe works for tacks made by wet sneakers. Musty smells — Keen musty mells away by frequent pine denner treatments. For example, keep closets fresh by givng them a sponge off from op to bottom with a pine cleaner solution. Use a cedar pine dedorizer on hangers in your closets. Easement and altie mustiness can be held down by floor wabbing with pine cleaners. And a pine deodorant spray adds a good finishing touch any. Water, water everywhere f you have an umbrella stand, tock a miniature long handled clullose sponge mop among the umbrellas for instant mop-us. Then if the rain comes again nother day, you'l be prepared to keeping it outdors.
