

QUESTION: What makes the black stuff ooze up between the tiles of our kitchen floor? We put the tiles down ourselves and I'm wondering if we did something wrong. How can we eliminate the oozing?

ANSWER: There are two probable causes of the oozing between kitchen floor tiles-applying too much paste to the floor and not giving the paste sufficient time to set up. The only way to remedy the situation is to pull up the tile and start over again. Cleaning the tile doesn't get to the base of the problem and prevent continued

In relaying the tile, try these suggestions: If a notched trowel leaves too much paste, try using a trowel without notches to spread a thinner layer of paste. Allow the paste to set up and, before laying the tile, test the paste by notching it with your finger. If the paste doesn't stick to your finger, it has set up properly for application of

QUESTION: The door to our kitchen rubs against the floor when it is fully opened and I'm afraid it will mark the floor if not corrected. Is there any solution without removing the door and planing its edge?

ANSWER: Place a sheet of coarse sandpaper on the floor at the place where the door rubs. Hold the sandpaper with one foot and swing the door back and forth across the sandpaper until there no longer is contact. That way, you'll remove just the right amount of the sticking door-and you won't have to remove the door from its hinges. If the door begins to rub again, the chances are the hinges aren't holding it in position properly, in which case you then will have to remove the door and

For instance, some authorities estimate that, by the year 2000, world requirements for meats and animal products will be 190 per cent higher than today.

Livestock disease control is going to be one of the notable ways in which we can meet these increased meat production needs In fact, the current drive to eradicate hog cholera may point the way to drives against other diseases which are costing our farmers such a heavy toll of meat animals. In this cholera eradiction effort, farmers and veterinarians are jointly meeting a challenge which may have far-reaching
