Fort Belknap archives receive valuable portrait

Mrs. John M. Perrigo of Abilene, a descendant of Young county's first chief justice, presented to the Belknap Archives on behalf of her family, a bust view portrait of Chief Justice Peter Harmonson. The presentation climaxed Mrs. Perrigo's paper given on the history of the Harmonson family at the bi-annual Genealogical meeting. Mr. Neighbors, archivist, received the frame portrait.

Mrs. Perrigo exhibited several documents belonging to the Harmonson family during her interesting talk. Among them was a certificate of appointment of Chief Justice Harmonson signed by Governor Sam Houston. This document hangs on the east wall of the fort museum, a previous gift of Dora Harmonson Dent of Newcastle.

The portrait is a valuable addition to the archival material accumulating at the fort. The Harmonson Family Echoes is a family newspaper published annually and distributed to descendants of the Harmonson family; past issues of the newspaper were placed in Harmonson files at the archives.

Many descendants of America's first Peter Harmonson, an immigrant from Holland landing in Delaware in the early 17th century, will congregate at Fort Belknap in August of this year. It is an annual affair.

The citizens of Young county are invited to the fort to see the recent gift from the Harmonson family.
