Saturday, August 7th Homecoming for Ex-Students

A bustling coal mining town of yesteryear will once again come to life when ex-students and ex-residents from over the United States return to Newcastle, Saturday, August 7. Main street will again be a beehive of activity. The many visitors expected are children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren of miners, and early day business persons who once lived in the town and who once attended Newcastle Schools.

Registration will take place at the Community Center located on main street with other buildings being used for the crowds, the City Hall, Post Office, Newcastle Register, Farmers National Bank and Community Center will serve as gathering places for visiting. Hometown folks are planning for the comfort of the crowd as typical Texas weather is expected on that date.

Homecoming was inaugurated by a group of interested ex-grads in 1961. As many as 675 persons have registered at previous homecomings. More are expected this year.

Young county residents will receive increase in benefits

Joe Nesbitt, field representative for the Graham area, said today that more than 2690 persons receiving social security benefits in Young County will receive a 7 per cent increase in benefits. This increase will amount to about \$11,000 per month for persons receiving benefits in Young County. Payments will be retroactive to January 1, 1965.

Nesbitt states that no contact with him will be necessary as all increases will be automatic. The first payments should reach beneficiaries in late September or early October.

Nesbitt states that several other important changes in the social security law will be reported on at a later date.

\$301,548.67 construction contract goes to Graham firm

A contract for 2,018 miles of construction on SH 254 in Young County has been awarded to a Graham firm, it was announced in Austin this week by the State Highway Commission.

Zack Burkett Co., & W. C. Graham submitted the low bid of \$301,548.67 on the project. Grading, structures, flexible base and two course surface treatment and asphalt concrete paving from First Street in Graham to FM 1287 is expected to take 180 working days, according to L. B. Dean, District Highway Engineer at Wichita Falls.

T. H. Sutherland, Resident Engineer at Graham will be in active charge of the project while it is under construction.

PUBLIC NOTICE

Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER TEN ON THE BALLOT

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 2, 1965.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 47 proposing an Amendment to Section 4, Article III, Constitution of the State of Texas, to provide four-year terms of office for State Representatives.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Section 4, Article III, Constitution of the State of Texas be amended to read as follows:

"Section 4. The members of the House of Representatives shall be chosen by the qualified electors for the term of four years; but a new House of Representatives shall be chosen after every apportionment, and the members elected after each apportionment shall be divided by lot into two classes. The seats of the members of Class A shall be vacated at the expiration of the first two years, and those of Class B at the expiration of four years, so that one-half of the members of the House of Representatives shall be chosen biennially thereafter. Representatives shall take office following their election, on the day set by law for the convening of the Regular Session of the Legislature, and shall serve thereafter for the full term of years to which elected and until their successors shall have been elected and qualified. Except in case of an election to fill a vacancy, and except in the first election following each re-apportionment, a person who has been elected to the House of Representatives shall not be eligible to be a candidate again for membership in the Legislature until the term for

which he was elected has less than one year remaining."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified voters of the state at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1965, at which election all ballots shall have printed on them the following:

"FOR the Constitutional Amendment to provide for a four-year term of office for State Representatives."

"AGAINST the Constitutional Amendment to provide for a four-year term of office for State Representatives."

Sec. 3. The Governor of the State of Texas shall issue the necessary proclamation for the election and this Amendment shall be published in the manner and for the length of time required by the constitution and laws of this state.

Sec. 4. In the event the Constitutional Amendment proposed in this Resolution is adopted by the people of Texas in the election in November, 1965, the Governor of Texas is directed not to issue a proclamation for the election and not to publish notice thereof for the Constitutional Amendment proposed by House Joint Resolution No. 1 of the 59th Texas Legislature, since the provisions of said House Joint Resolution No. 1 are included in this Resolution. But, should this proposed Amendment be rejected by the people of Texas in the election in November, 1965, then the terms and provisions of House Joint Resolution No. 1 shall be and remain in full force and effect and shall be proclaimed and published and submitted to the electorate in November, 1966, as provided in said House Joint Resolution No. 1.

PUBLIC NOTICE

Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER SIX ON THE BALLOT

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 2, 1965.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 11 proposing an Amendment to Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas authorizing loans to students at institutions of higher education; creating the Texas Opportunity Plan Fund and making provisions relating thereto.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding a new Section to read as follows:

"Section 50b. STUDENT LOANS. (a) The Legislature

may provide that the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, or its successor or successors, shall have the authority to provide for, issue and sell general obligation bonds of the State of Texas in an amount not to exceed Eighty-five Million Dollars (\$85,000,000). The bonds authorized herein shall be called 'Texas College Student Loan Bonds,' shall be executed in such form, denominations and upon such terms as may be prescribed by law, provided, however, that the bonds shall not bear more than four per cent (4%) interest per annum; they may be issued in such installments as the Board finds feasible and practical in accomplishing the purposes of this Section.

(b) All moneys received from the sale of such bonds shall be deposited in a fund hereby created in the State Treasury to be known as the Texas Opportunity Plan Fund to be administered by the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, or its successor or successors to make loans to students who have been admitted to attend any institution of higher education within the State of Texas, public or private, including Junior Colleges, which are recognized or accredited under terms and conditions prescribed by the Legislature, and to pay interest and principal on such bonds and provide a sinking fund therefor under such conditions as the Legislature may prescribe.

(c) While any of the bonds or interest on said bonds authorized by this Section is outstanding and un-

paid, there is hereby appropriated out of the first moneys coming into the Treasury in each fiscal year, not otherwise appropriated by this Constitution, an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on such bonds that mature or become due during such fiscal year, less the amount in the sinking fund at the close of the prior fiscal year.

(d) The Legislature may provide for the investment of moneys available in the Texas Opportunity Plan Fund, and the interest and sinking funds established for the payment of bonds issued by the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System, or its successor or successors. Income from such investment shall be used for the purposes prescribed by the Legislature.

(e) All bonds issued hereunder shall, after approval by the Attorney General, registration by the Comptroller of Public Accounts of the State of Texas, and delivery to the purchasers, be incontestable and shall constitute general obligations of the State of Texas under this Constitution.

(f) Should the Legislature enact enabling laws in anticipation of the adoption of this Amendment, such acts shall not be void because of their anticipatory nature."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this State at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1965, at which election all ballots shall have printed on them the following:

"FOR the Constitutional Amendment authorizing the Legislature to provide for loans to students at institutions of higher education to be known as the Texas Opportunity Plan."

Postal efficiency plan announced by Postmaster Hankins

Postmaster Hankins announced today that all Newcastle Post Office employees will be asked to take part in the new Postal Efficiency Plan announced Wednesday, July 22, by Postmaster General John A. Gronouski.

"The Postal Efficiency Plan includes comprehensive programs for improving postal service and reducing costs," Postmaster Hankins said. "It is our way of helping President Johnson fulfill his pledge to provide more effective and economical

government services."

In Washington, Postmaster General John A. Gronouski termed the plan's twin objectives of economy and service betterment "a matter of highest priority" and called for total involvement of all employees through the Post Office suggestion program.

Semi-annual reports will be made to the President, Mr. Gronouski said, and realized savings will be reverted to the Treasury or applied to improving postal service.

A local committee will be organized to fulfill the two purposes of the plan: (1) Reduce costs; and (2) Improve services. Postmaster Hankins will be chairman of the local

committee to implement PEP.

Ideas generated by individual employees will be taken up by the committee. Accepted ideas will be passed on to Washington for possible application on a national level. Employees whose ideas are adopted national-wide will be given national awards. The Postmaster General will personally oversee the Programs.
