#### Shortcake, Anyone? by Betty Crocker

Who needs spring flowers to get in the mood for fruit shortcakes! And, who needs fresh fruit! Not with today's wonderful frozen and canned fruits, Now glamorous shortcakes come and glow on winter menus, too. I solo the fruit . . . or use them in combination, like raspberries mixed with blueberries. When I'm lucky enough to have cranberries left from the holidays, I heat them up and spoon over shortcake biscuits. Very colorful for a winter day's dessert! Fun to vary the toppings, too, with fresh cream, whipped cream, sour cream or ice cream. And some snowy night, I hope you'll try this summertime thought that's all peaches and cream.

SHORTCUT SHORTCAKE 2 cups Bisquick 34 cup light cream or 1/2 cup milk plus 1/4 cup butter or margarine,

2 tablespoons sugar 1 can (1 pound 4 ounces) peach pie filling Whipped cream






