## State Elections

WASHINGTON (AFNA) - Elections for statewide offices will be held in only four states in 1977. However, there will be many local elections conducted by towns, counties and municipalities.

In these local elections there is no uniform schedule of election dates or offices to be filled.

Kentucky, New Jersey, Virginia, and Wisconsin will hold elections for state officers during 1977. In every case, the Federal Post Card Application for Absentee Ballot (FPCA) should be used to register and request absentee ballots. The FPCA is the absentee voter's only contact with state or local elections officials. It must be prepared and addressed completely and correctly.

## Bob Hope Honored

EGLIN AFB, Fla. (AFNS) - Bob Hope was the star, but the celebrities were the widows of the Air Force Enlisted Men's Widows Home (AFEMWH) during a special three-hour performance here recently.

Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force Thomas N. Barnes, accompanied by his three retired predecessors, presented Mr. Hope with a certificate making him an honorary chief master sergeant of the Air Force. The certificate read "In recognition of sincere personal interest, dynamic leadership and outstanding support of non-commissioned officers and airmen of the United States Air Force."

Sponsored by Air Force Association (AFA) Chapter 365, proceeds from the more than 6,000 tickets sold will be donated to the AFEMWH. The home is located at the Teresa Village Apartments, Ft. Walton Beach.

## Instructors Needed

MAXWELL AFB, Ala. (AFNS) - Air Force Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (AFJROTC) officials announced that more than 100 instructor positions will be available to retired Air Force members this fall at high schools throughout the United States.

Instructors teach the curriculum of the AFJROTC program in high schools and are employed as members of the local faculty. Those interested in applying for the instructor positions must be under 65 years of age, be retired within the last four years, and have had at least 20 years' active duty.

Officers must have a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution. Noncommissioned officers must be high school graduates or the equivalent. Air Force members on active duty and interested in making application should be within one year of a planned retirement date.

## Safety Awards

Randolph AFB, Tex. (ATCPS) - The 14th Flying Training Wing (FTW), Columbus AFB, Miss., was awarded the command's Undergraduate Pilot Training To Promote Safety (TOPS) Trophy and the Commander's Award for 1976. This is the first time one unit has won both awards in a single year.

The TOPS trophy is presented each year to the UPT wing which has the lowest aircraft accident rate. The 14th FTW was the only UPT wing in the command with a zero aircraft accident rate in 1976.

Additionally, the wing exceeded its Programmed Reduction Objectives (PRO) in ground accidents by 35 per cent to win the Commander's Award.

## Consultants arrive to help supervisors

A team of consultants from the Leadership and Management Development Center (LMDC) will visit Reese next week to conduct leadership and management seminars and provide management consultation services for the installation.

The series of seminars will run throughout the week-long visit and is for military and civilian supervisors at all levels of the organization. Each seminar includes the most current leadership and management philosophies and techniques.

Seminars will be given at the following times:

- Monday: 1 - 5 p.m. for Executive seminar in Wing Conference Room; E-8 and E-9 seminar from 1 - 5 p.m.
- Tuesday: 8 a.m. - noon for squadron commanders/first sergeants; 1 - 5 p.m. for E-4s and E-5s and equivalent civilians.
- Wednesday: 8 a.m. - noon for E-6s through E-8s and equivalent civilians.
- Thursday: 8 a.m. - noon for E-4s and E-5s and equivalent civilians.
- Friday: 8 a.m. - noon for E-6s

through E-8s and equivalent civilians; 8 a.m. - noon for 0-1s through 0-5s and equivalent civilians in Officer's Open Mess.

Unless noted, all seminars will be in Room 11 of Bldg. 820.

As management consultants, the team members will work throughout the base to assist commanders and supervisors in detecting and solving attitudinal problems. All such consultation service is confidential, with no upchannel reporting beyond the base. Rather than providing a functional inspection, the LMDC consultants will work with supervisors and commanders to solve problems at the lowest levels possible.

The LMDC is an Air University organization which was activated at Maxwell AFB, Ala. in October 1975 to serve as the Air Force focal point for leadership and management research and education. The center has also assumed responsibility for leadership and management training for all officers and enlisted Professional Military Education.

## DoD employees gather to hear remarks by commander in chief

WASHINGTON (AFNS) - President Jimmy Carter paid a "get-acquainted" visit to the Department of Defense (DoD) March 1 to speak to an estimated 8,000 military and civilian DoD employees gathered in the Pentagon courtyard.

The commander in chief set an informal tone for his remarks, referring to his own service in the Navy and commenting about coming to the Pentagon as the senior officer.

The pay is good as the commander in chief, Mr. Carter said, and the quarters are adequate. But, he pointed out, he doesn't get a uniform allowance.

### Dedication Lauded

The President lauded DoD personnel for their dedication.

"There is no other department in government which consistently demonstrates such a superb level of courage and dedication, and quite often, personal sacrifice," Mr. Carter said.

"We are partners," he said, "and every one of you is important in the process of insuring our nation's safety."

"I feel very strongly, and personally, the responsibility on my shoulders as the leader of our country, and as the commander in chief of the armed forces. I'll do the best I can not to disappoint you in any way," he promised.

"I think all of you know as well as I do," Mr. Carter explained, "that there is always a limited amount of

financial capability for any nation to provide for military weapons and the personnel to use those weapons if necessary.

### Second to None

"But within that limit, there is always the opportunity for us to use those limited resources in the most efficient and effective and predictable way. And that's a challenge for us all," he stated.

"... whatever might come in the future," the President said, "we will ensure the American people, with and through you, that our military strength and our capability to defend freedom will be second to none in all the world, and you can depend on that," Mr. Carter emphasized.

The comments drew rapid and lengthy applause from the audience which ranged from enlisted personnel to general officers, and from the lower to the supergrade civilians.

Mr. Carter's remarks were followed by a question-and-answer session. The chief executive followed a pattern of fielding questions with enthusiasm.

### No Union

The President said he doesn't favor unionization of the military. He said he doesn't know of any strong move, even among national labor leaders, in that direction.

The President also said he doesn't know yet what changes, if any, he will propose to the military retirement system. Military pay,

privileges and retirement will be reassessed, he says, probably by a DoD study group.

"... I have been particularly concerned at the excessive retirement benefits that are available to those who serve the military, who then retire and get fulltime jobs working for the government itself. This is too expensive," he said.

Questioned about the merit promotion system for civil service employees, the President pointed out he is concerned about equal employment opportunities. He said he is in the process of selecting the Civil Service Commission board of directors and his prerequisites in making the selections would be honesty, integrity and open communications.

Military and civilian questioners alike were concerned with their image with the American people. Separate questions were put to the President about a general attack on the military by a member of Congress, and about low morale of career civil service employees.

"I have the greatest possible admiration for those of you who have been willing to give your own life in civilian or military service for the defense of our country," Mr. Carter said in brief. "I appreciate what you're doing and I want to make that clear to everyone."

### Pardon Questioned

The President was also questioned about the effect his pardon for selective service viola-

tors would have on military personnel and potential service members in the future.

Mr. Carter said he knew his decision about the pardon was not easy for many Americans to accept. He said, however, that he doesn't feel the patriotism of American servicemen and women is based on whether or not the pardon was granted.

"... I believe that we can count on the full support of Americans, in time of trial or in time of danger, to defend our country," the President said.

To a question related to military responsiveness, the President said a decision hasn't been made whether to reinstitute the draft to fill requirements for either active or reserve forces.

### No plans for Draft

Mr. Carter admitted concern for the recruitment of reserve forces, but said he has no plans at present to return to a mandatory draft. He did say he would not hesitate to call for a draft law if it becomes evident that the United States cannot adequately defend itself without such a measure.

In closing, the President said, "I'll do whatever I can not ever to disappoint you; and I know, that based on your past record and your constant commitment, that you will never disappoint me or the American people as we try to exemplify the finest aspects of the greatest nation on earth."

# Teresa Village helps care for AF widows

Have you ever wondered what your circumstances will be in later life? Perhaps you would have to face life as a widow with few home ties. Enlisted Men's Widows and Dependents Foundation—Teresa Village—may some day be just what you would need.

Teresa Village, located at Ft. Walton Beach, Fla., was founded to provide a residence for widows of Air Force enlisted retirees and a number of retired couples. Presently, the living accommodations consist of 80 two-bedroom apartments. Plans are being studied to provide a new 200-unit facility nearby that will be designed especially to accommodate

specific needs of residents.

Each apartment has one bath, a kitchen/dinning-room combination, and a living room. Heating and air conditioning are individually controlled by thermostats within each unit and all appliances are electric. Residents pay for electricity and their own telephone and cable television, but sewage and garbage pickup is furnished by the foundation.

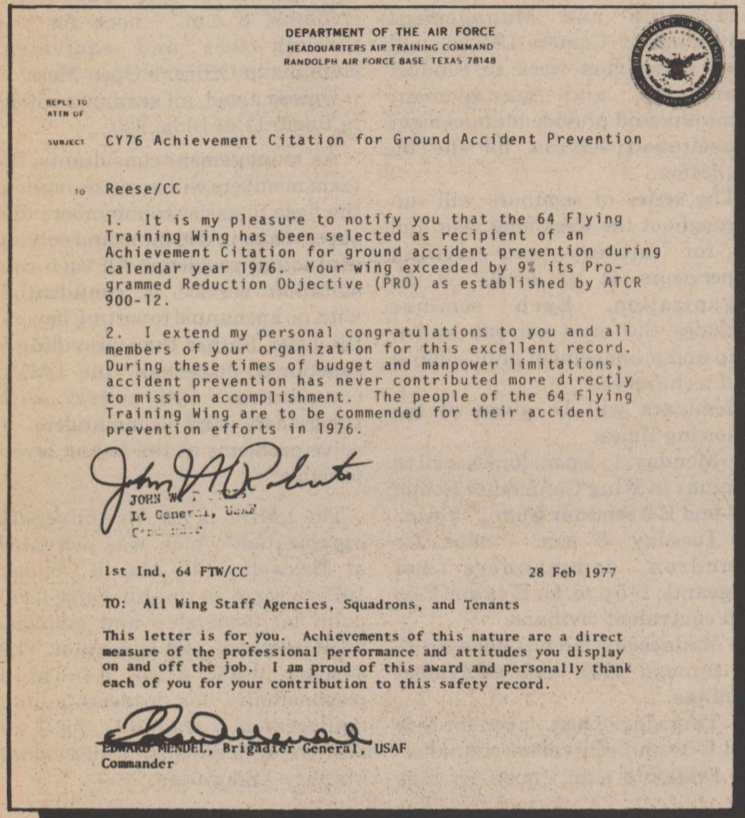
Teresa Village has a modern laundry on the premises and residents have free use of the swimming pool, tennis court, library and television room. Plans call for a game and craft room. Churches of

most denominations are nearby. Eglin AFB is only five miles from the front door for convenient exchange and commissary shopping.

Thanks to the NCO Wives Club at Keesler AFB, Miss., Teresa Village has a modern van to transport residents on a regular basis to Eglin and to take them on recreation tours.

The Air Force has a proud history of doing things for people. Teresa Village, in providing housing and services for older members of our Air Force family, is an illustration of that tradition.

# Employees should ensure that beneficiary is correct

(AFNS Editorial)

As a Federal employee, you should make sure that benefits under the retirement, Federal Employees' Group-Life Insurance and leave laws will be paid according to your wishes.

From time to time, there may be changes in your family status—marriage, death, births—that might affect your preference as to who should receive these benefits following death.

If you haven't designated a beneficiary, payment of lump-sum retirement benefits, group-life

insurance, unused annual leave, and unpaid salary will be made in the following order:

- To your spouse.
- If there is no spouse, to your child or children in equal shares, with the share of any deceased child distributed among the descendants of that child.
- If none of these, then to your parents in equal shares, or the entire amount to the surviving parent.
- If none of these, then to the executor or administrator of your estate.

• If none of these, then to the other next of kin entitled under the laws of the state in which you lived.

It isn't necessary to designate a beneficiary unless you wish payment to be made in a way other than the order of precedence indicated above.

You should review your situation. If there have been changes in your family status that would affect your preference for a beneficiary, you may want to make a change in designation. If so, contact your personnel office.

The 1976 theme was, "Human Goals — Foundations of Our Heritage."

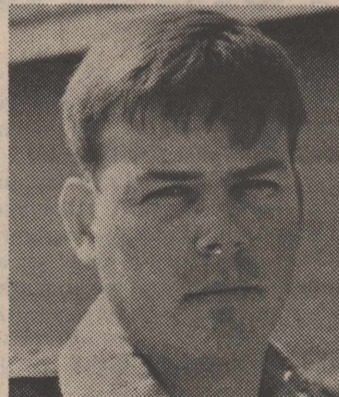
The theme for the 1977 contest is "My Responsibilities in Keeping My

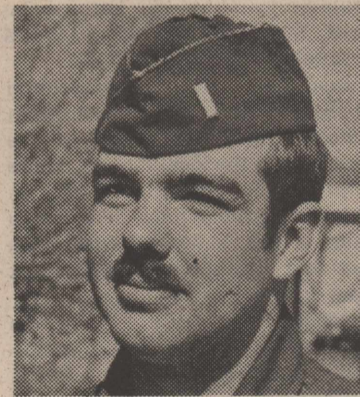
Entries should relate to an understanding of the spirit and philosophy of the Constitution, the Bill of Rights and the American Credo.

What areas do you think need improvement on Reese?



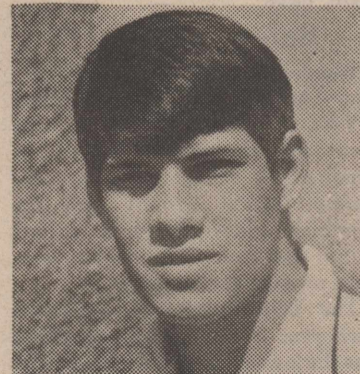

**Commander's CARE Line**

(Editor's Note: THE ROUNDUP will publish Commander's CARE Line calls which are of basewide interest. Names of callers will not be published, but callers should leave their name and duty extension in case their problem needs clarification. All calls are reviewed by Wing Commander Brig. Gen. Edward Mendel. Reese people are urged to use their chain of command or the office of primary responsibility to air complaints or comments, if possible. If not, call the CARE Line by dialing C-A-R-E. (Ext. 2273). Please provide your name and duty section when calling.)

I have been informed that this was the procedure followed concerning your original complaint. Although the milk was not old (according to the code date) several cartons did have an off-flavor. As a result all the milk was replaced by the vendor.

All machines dispensing perishable products are serviced daily by the vendor. All sandwiches are replaced and any milk that exceeds its code date is removed. As it is impossible for us to check the vending machines themselves on a daily basis, we ask that anyone who has a complaint concerning out-of-date or unwholesome food items in vending machines contact Veterinary Services, Ext. 2535, so they can follow up on the complaint.

Thanks for the call and incidentally, we couldn't identify anyone who became sick from this milk.

**Busy Telephone Line**

On five different occasions I have tried to reach the Wing Dining Hall, however, the phone is always busy. Two of these occasions were emergency situations where I needed to notify a person about a sick baby. Can something be done about this?

Thanks for your call, we also got several other calls on this subject. The Wing Dining Hall has one Class C telephone and one commercial pay telephone. The Class C telephone is furnished to the contractor for conducting official business as specified in our Food Service contract. The problem with employees using the telephone for personal business has been discussed with the Food Service Project Manager by our contractor monitor. The employees are aware that personal calls must be held to a minimum and be of short duration. The one employee at fault in the instance you cited has been counseled.

If a call is placed to the Wing Dining Hall (Ext. 2226) and the line is busy, you may call the commercial number (885-9986) and an employee or patron will answer and attempt to assist you. I'm sorry about this problem but thanks for caring enough to help us with it.

There is a parking problem in the area of Bldg. 126 and I have a suggestion that would probably be good for a majority of the sections on base.

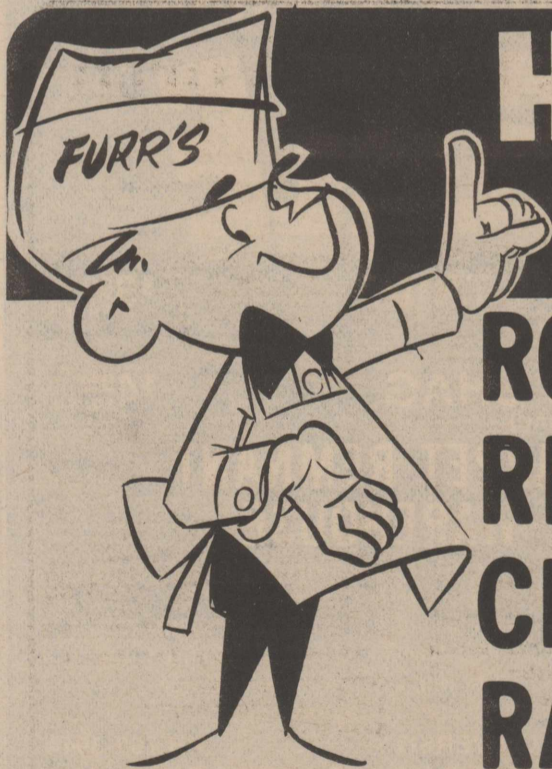

# Toll-free number helps veterans obtain answers

WASHINGTON (AFNS) - If you have a question concerning veterans' benefits, chances are you can use a toll free telephone line to the Veterans Administration (VA) to get your answer.

VA officials said more than 950 toll-free telephone lines are maintained across the country for just that purpose. Telephone numbers for the network can usually be found in the "U.S. Government" section of local telephone books under "Vet-

erans Administration-Benefits Information and Assistance."

Because the service is so popular, VA officials ask callers to have at hand as much VA-related information about themselves as possible when making a call.

Specifically, VA counsellors can provide faster service when the veteran's VA claim number, military serial number or social security number is provided.

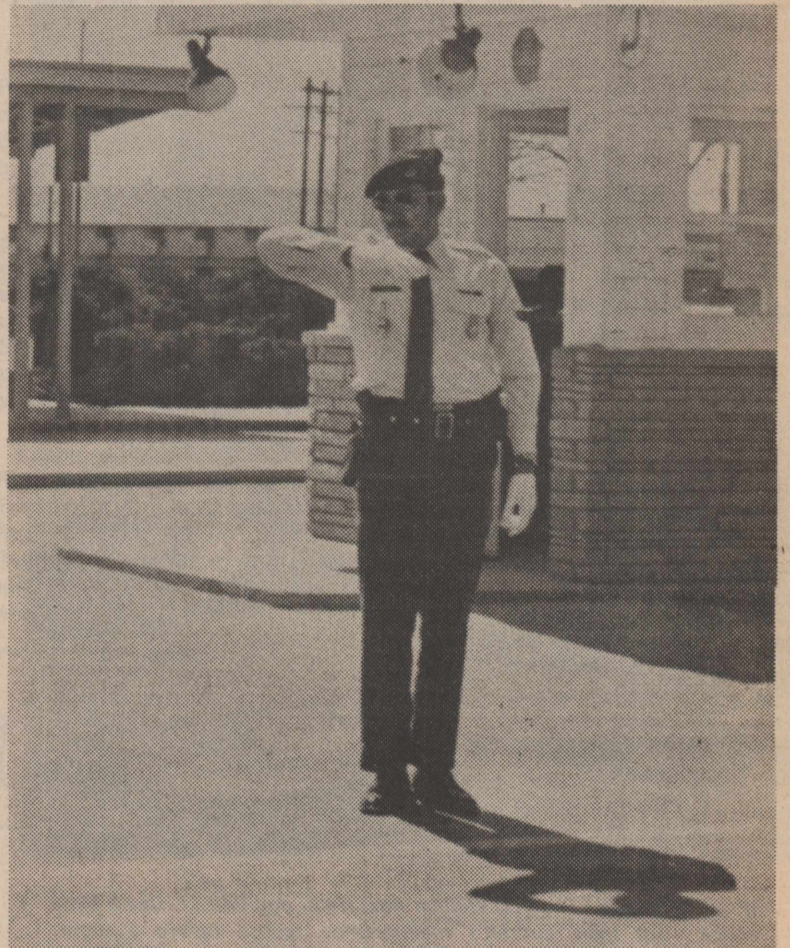

The squadron has also recruited a new social chairman. Capt. Joe

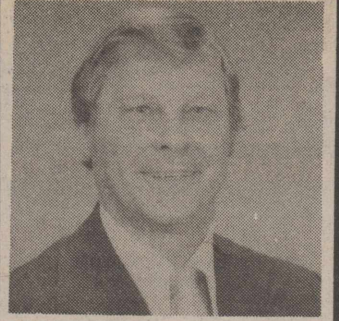

## TAC Academy receives College accreditation

LANGLEY AFB, VA. (AFNS) - The Tactical Air Command (TAC) Noncommissioned Officer (NCO) Academy has been accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Active duty NCOs can now convert the professional military education they received at the academy to college credit.

More than 6,500 people have graduated since July 1967 and are eligible to receive the credit. Course work completed prior to July 1967 or through correspondence, was not accredited.

Individuals should contact their local education office for help in filling out an application for evaluation of experiences during military service (DD Form 295) which acts as a transcript of an individual's military record.

For those retired, or close to retirement, the accreditation also means that many companies will now accept the academy's vocational management training to satisfy certain supervisory position requirements.

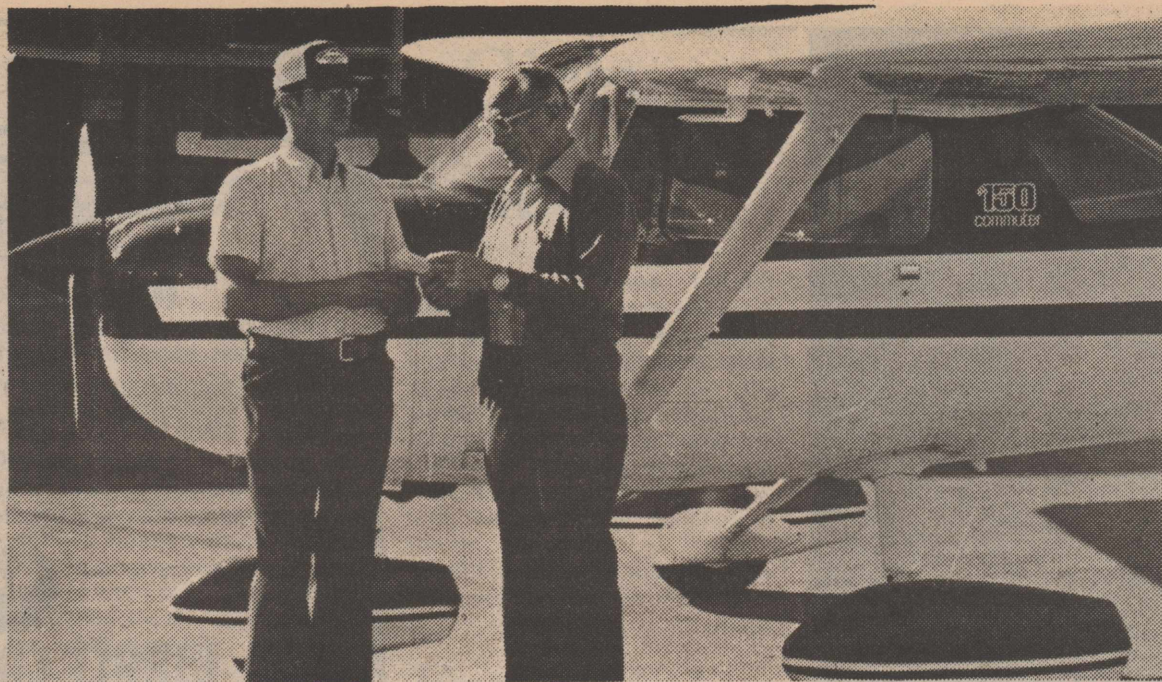

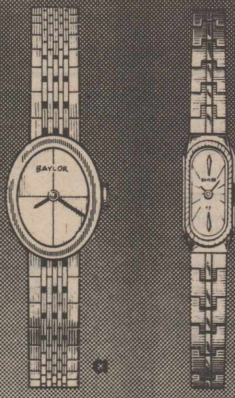

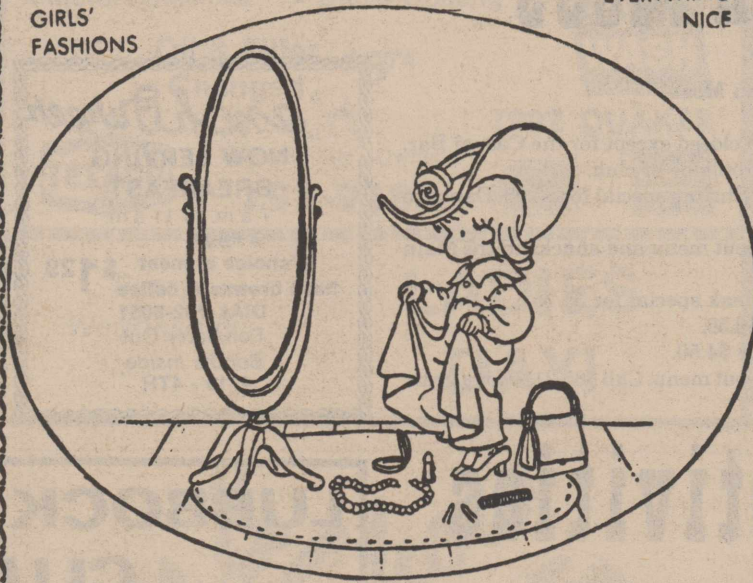

## Frenship's Fair hits on history

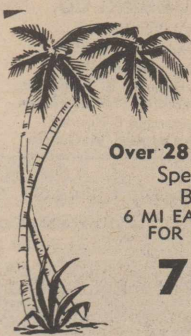
Frenship High School and Junior High students will display exhibits during a History Fair at the Frenship High School from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. tomorrow.
