After a four-year drought of commissioning opportunities for active duty enlisted personnel here, selectees are pouring out of the Reese wood-work.

According to Bill Trafton, education services officer, five enlisted men have already been selected for commissioning since October and three more will become Air Force officers soon.


The latest selectee is TSgt. Prentiss Wedgeworth, from the

64th Civil Engineering Squadron. The 10-year veteran is slated for Officer Training School. He earned his Bachelors degree from Wayland Baptist College in December with a double major in Environmental Services Technology and Business Management. He also attended Jones Community College, Chapman College and Laramie Community Junior College.

As with many of the recent selectees, Sergeant Wedge-

worth used Community College of the Air Force (CCAF) credits, earned through his duty experience, to help get his degree. More than 50 per cent of the eligible people on Reese are currently enrolled in the CCAF program.

Others already selected include, TSgt. Charles Carney, 1958th Communications Squadron, and Amn. Larry Green, 64th Supply Squadron, — OTS; SSgt. James Weiser, Supply — Navigator training; (Continued on page-12)

## Commando Rock nears completion

Twelve Reese people are enjoying the wonderful, exhilarating and cold climate of South Korea as Exercise "Commando Rock" comes to a close.

The exercise, scheduled for completion this week, was designed to demonstrate the Pacific Air Forces (PACAF) capability to provide increased and sustained flying time and Air Training Commands (ATC) capability to augment combatant commands.

More than half of the 250 ATC personnel involved were in the aircraft maintenance field with contingents from munitions, supply, fuels, transportation, medical and operations.

The 8th Tactical Fighter Wing (TFW) at Kusan AB hosted the exercise with their F-4 pilots fly-

ing simulated wartime missions requiring quick turn-around and rapid employment. ATC augmentees were intergrated into PACAF organizations directly involved in launch and recovery, maintenance, loading and other support operations. At the mid-point of the exercise, 930 sorties had been flown and put the 8th TFW well on its way to achieving it's goal of 1224 sorties for the 15-day period.

Kusan officials say that despite the bitter cold, morale is high as the ATC augmentees, together with their hosts, quick turned aircraft after aircraft sending the F-4D's on their way to fly again and again at record paces.

Throughout the exercise, teamwork has been the key that has kept the machinery of the flightline and maintenance shops humming. To get the air-

craft launched has been the driving compulsion in the attitude of everyone involved, note officials at the exercise site.

Some of the comments heard about the exercise from those involved and those who have come to observe have expressed the positive feelings about this Kusan based exercise. "It is obvious that the ATC personnel came to work", said one supervisor. "Despite the cold weather everyone has maintained a cheerful and 'can-do' attitude," said another.

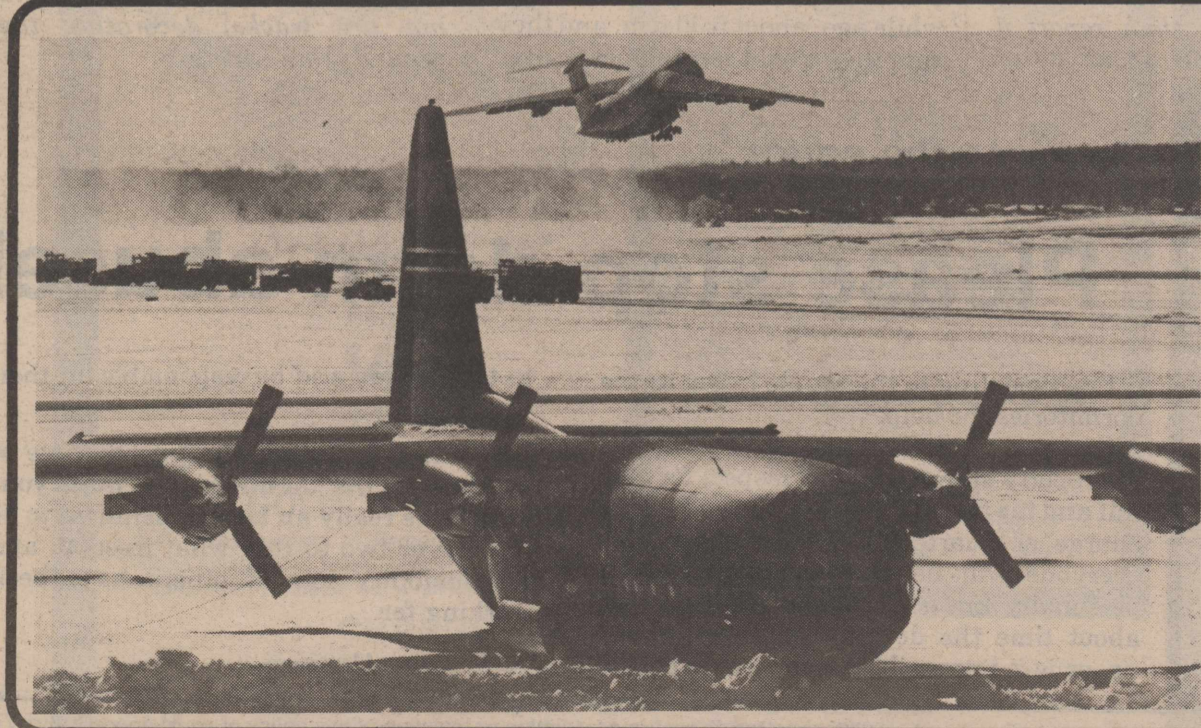

## Air Force aids blizzard victims

Military Airlift Command, Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve aircrews flew 127 blizzard relief missions in "Snow Blow II" Feb. 8-10.

More than 1,100 passengers and 2,504 tons of equipment were airlifted to Boston, Hartford, Conn., and Providence, R.I., during the three day operation.

Crews and aircraft came from Texas, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Illinois, Missouri, New York, Maryland, Massachusetts, Delaware, Washington, California, and North and South Carolina.

Cargo included scoop loaders, graders, wreckers, ambulances, trucks communication gear, compressors and generators.

They will be there should you ever need them. Further, should you die unexpectedly your widow and children may stay at the respective village for up to one year until your widow can make appropriate plans for the future. Also, the Air Force Aid Society has recently liberalized their policies for emergency assistance loans and grants; changes include an increase in loan limit and a new loan category for automobile repair and insurance.

Our wing goal this year is \$8,922. We can contribute through payroll deductions, which is both painless and effective, and at the same

### Barracks 420

I would like to know if there is anything possible to get barracks-420 into livable condition. The plumbing does not work, the rooms are extremely cold at night and it seems that nothing can be done. I have used the CARE Line once before, I have talked to everybody that should be concerned, but nobody seems to be doing anything. I was wondering if there was anything personal that I could do because I feel that the barracks are not livable.

A thorough investigation was made into the plumbing and heating problem in Dormitory-420 by the Base Commander, Base Civil Engineer, Chief of Services Division and numerous other personnel. It is our understanding that your specific complaints were that a urinal and sink in the latrine on the second floor were not working and that your room was cold. The plumbing problem had been previously identified and worked several times in the past two months. This investigation revealed that the problem was a faulty valve which failed intermittently. It has been changed. The

personnel who checked these problems could find nothing wrong with any of the sinks in the latrine. The heating problem had also been previously identified and checked. The problem was found to be that the fire exit door was propped open and cold air was getting in. As soon as the door was closed the temperature in both the hall and room came up to normal. Another check was made on the heating system and it is working properly.

Central Dormitory Managers and Civil Engineering (CE) inspect the dormitories each Monday for any required repairs. The work is then accomplished on Tuesday. Any additional discrepancies discovered or reported to the dormitory managers are called in to CE as they occur.

We are all greatly concerned with conditions in our dormitories. When a problem exists, it receives a great deal of attention. However, we need the total cooperation of the dormitory residents in properly and immediately reporting malfunctions to either their first sergeants or the dormitory managers and using equipment and resources in the manner in which they are designed. There are some who, rather than report a problem just gripe about it, or

worse yet attempt to perform self-help or "boot" maintenance. This causes more time spent on repairs, upsets those who have to make the repairs and takes away monies which would be used to make improvements. The dormitory residents are in control and only through their cooperation can this problem be solved.

### Cars killing grass

This problem isn't just mine, it's a problem for a number of airmen who live in Dormitory 420.

It seems that cars have been driving and parking on the grass area between 420 and 320. There is not much grass here and this spring and summer there will be no place to play football or throw a frizbee. It is all going to be sand.

For the past couple of months these cars, about 6 right now parked out between the dorm, that are not even in the lot area and are way up near the Chow Hall. This is not a parking area and never has been.

I would like to see something done about the parking area, at least by marking off the area. And, these cars should be cited now and then.

I called the Security Police a little while ago, about 5:30 p.m. and they said they would send someone over

just as soon as they could get to it. Well, no one showed up. It has been like that. If this is the case I would like to park my car out here too. Out in the middle of nowhere where I wouldn't have any car dents. I park my car over in the NCO parking lot.

I would appreciate it if you could look at it and see if anything can be done.

You've got a good point and I share your aggravation with those who insist upon parking in other than designated parking areas. The Security Police have issued more than a few parking citations during the past month for vehicles parked on the grass. I'm asking commanders to view the violators more critically.

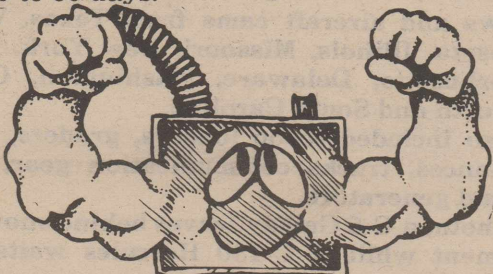
Your call to the Security Police came at a busy time, but they did respond after closing the golf course gate and after performing required fund escorts. There were citations issued as the result of your call.

# Drugs and you!

"Drugs and You" is a feature that will appear in the Roundup.

It is an attempt to answer your questions about drugs and their use. In effect, it might be titled, "Everything You Wanted To Know About Drugs . . . But Were Afraid To Ask".

### Stimulants

**Q. What is a Stimulant?**

A. Stimulants are drugs which increase alertness and body activity. They include caffeine, cocaine and amphetamines.

mines. Stimulants are often called uppers, pep pills, speed, bennies, cartwheels, dexies, hearts, crystal and meth. Amphetamines are the most abused stimulants.

**Q. Do stimulants have medical uses?**

A. Yes, but they are limited. Current medical use of amphetamines is restricted to treatment of narcolepsy (a rare disorder characterized by an uncontrollable need for sleep), hyperactive children, and for short term appetite control. Amphetamines may also be used for other disorders, like epilepsy or parkinsonism, although other drugs are considered better for treatment of these disorders.

**Q. What effects do amphetamines have?**

A. In small amounts amphetamines produce a sense of alertness and well-being for a short time. Hunger may be reduced and short term performance may be improved in a tired person. Taken intravenously in large amounts, amphetamines produce a euphoria (high) which decreases over a few hours. When the effects wear off the user feels depressed and sluggish. Reinjection of amphetamines relieves these symptoms; however, larger

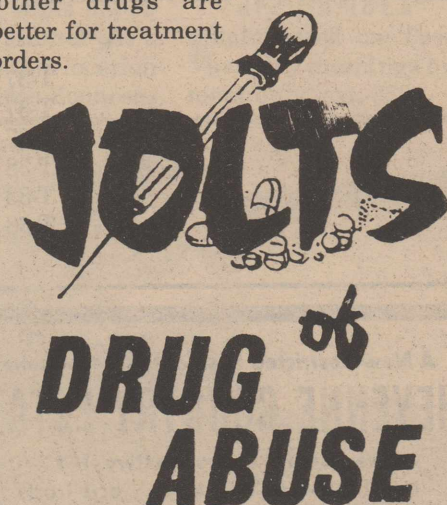

**Q. Who abuses stimulants?**

A. An occasional user may take the drug to push himself beyond his normal physical limits. He may want to stay awake to drive, cram for an exam, or do well in an athletic contest. This kind of abuse rarely leads to serious problems, but it can. A second type of abuser takes excessive amounts of stimulants for long periods of time. Such a person is drug dependent. Some abusers inject massive doses of stimulants intravenously once or up to a dozen times a day. This kind of use can cause death.

doses are needed to produce the same effects. This cycle can go on for days until a person is physically exhausted. Shakiness, itching, muscle pains and tension are common, collapse and death may occur.

**Q. What are the physical complications of amphetamine use?**

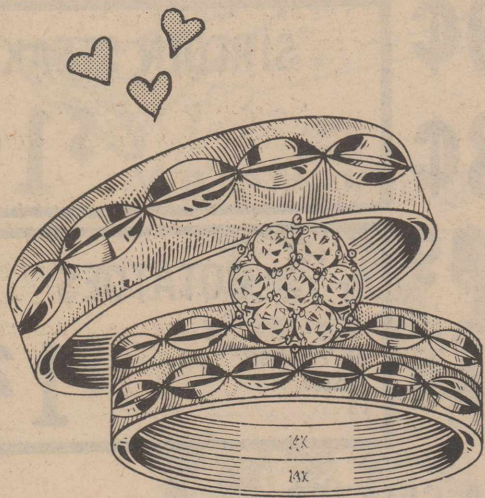
A. A marked increase in blood pressure is common and abnormal heart beats have occurred. Brain damage from large quantities has been demonstrated in animals. Many persons who abuse amphetamines may also neglect their body in various other ways. Kidney failure, hepatitis, drastic weight loss, malnutrition and infection from unsterile equipment are some physical hazards.

**Q. What are the psychological complications of amphetamine abuse?**

A. A person who uses large amounts of amphetamines may become overactive, irritable, suspicious and sometimes violent. A condition resembling paranoid schizophrenia, with severe delusions of persecution and hallucinations often occur in those who use high dosages of amphetamines.

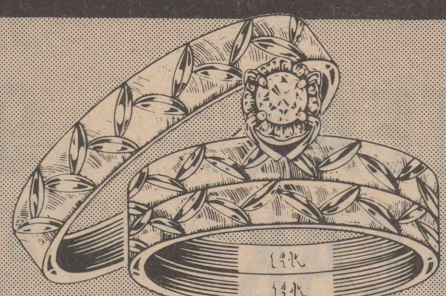

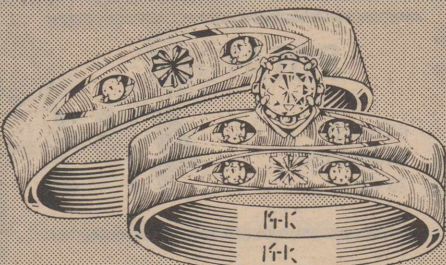

# Village pets due vaccinations

Recent review of records has shown that approximately 25 per cent of the dogs and cats in Reese Village have not had their annual rabies vaccination.

Reese regulations specify that all dogs and cats over the age of four months are required to obtain a rabies vaccination


followed by a booster every year. (Texas State Laws have similar requirements.)

All animals in Reese Village are required to wear a current Reese Rabies Tag while out-of-doors. Should an animal get a rabies vaccination at a location other than the Reese Zoonoses

Clinic, proof of vaccination should be brought to Veterinary Services, bldg.-631, so that a Reese Rabies tag may be issued.

Vaccinations are administered on Tuesday and Thursday mornings by appointment only, ext.-3534.

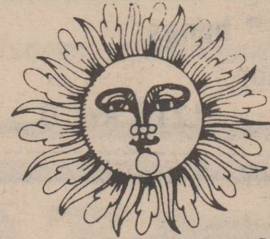

Joe Perron, Mathis Recreation Center director and a veteran of talent competitions, says that Reese stands a "good" chance of having at least two winners at the command level.

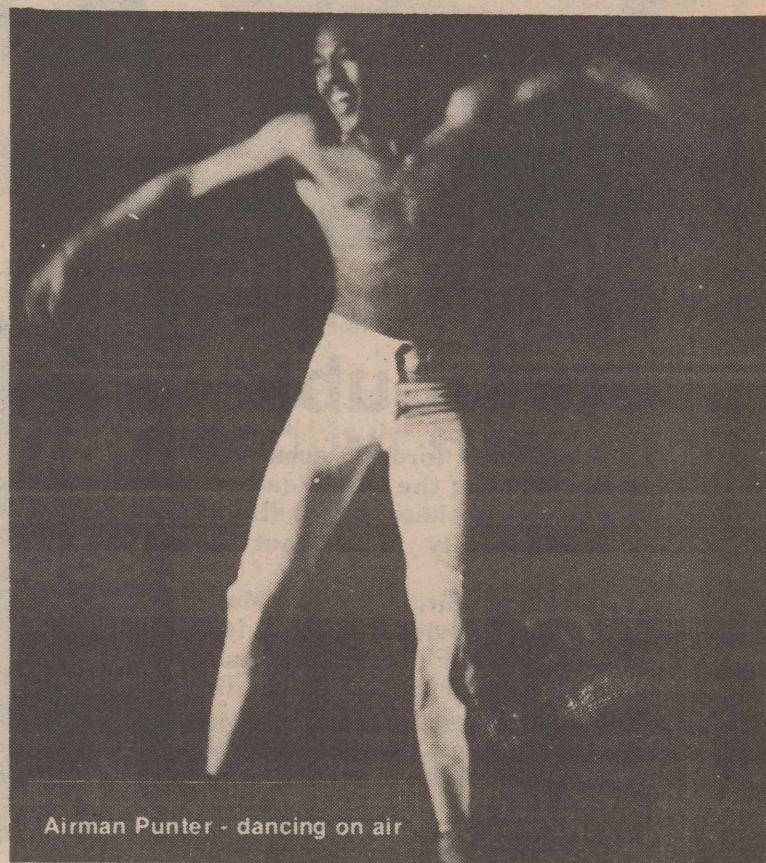

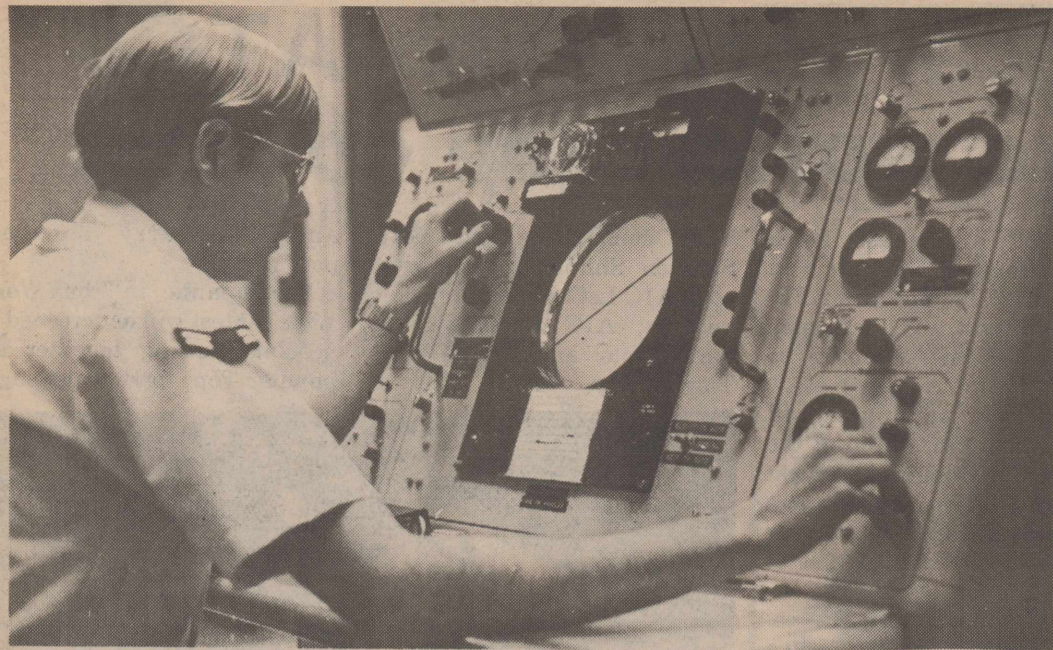

## Weather unit spots trouble

Riding a 90 per cent forecast accuracy rate, Detachment 11 of the 24th Weather Squadron manages to keep Reese fliers dry and occasionally helps out a neighbor.

The local weather unit, headed by Maj. Eugene J. Heald, provides Reese with round the clock wather observation and forecasts three-to-four times daily. In order to protect Reese fliers on cross-country flights, the unit charts potential weather trouble spots across the United States. A service used daily by transient aircraft as well.

When the National Weather Service at Lubbock Regional Airport shuts down a portion of its operation for maintenance, the base station feeds the needed information to it.

The 15-man crew (13 enlisted and two officers) is the first link in Reese's weather alert netork.

Although averaging better than 90 per cent on its forecasts, the local weathermen are still ducking one question. "When will the Winter of '78 lose its chill for good."

"For that one," laughed Major Heald, "even we have to wait for the ground hog."
