

# Reese slates seminar for dependents

## ATC head says Angel Dust kills

"Users and dealers call it 'Angel Dust.' I call it a vicious killer. Angel Dust has killed a lot of people, maimed others, and caused the user to do some crazy things . . . Like the girl who chewed off her fingers or the young man who actually punched out his own eyes with a stick while under the influence of the drug."

These were the words of Gen. John W. Roberts, Air Training Command Commander, on the subject of phencyclidine (PCP), commonly called Angel Dust.

"For some the drug is a drug of choice, but others frequently get Angel Dust from unscrupulous dealers who cut the more expensive drugs with Angel Dust. So those who think they are getting THC, mescaline, or cocaine may be actually buying PCP."

The only legal use for Angel

Dust, or killer weed, supergrass, crystal cyclone, elephant tranquilizer, hog or peace pill, as it is commonly known on the street, is as a veterinary tranquilizer.

Indicators across the country point to a higher and higher usage since the drug first surfaced in San Francisco in 1967. In some cases Angel Dust usage directly results in death to the user. In fact, related deaths may be occurring at a greater rate than previously suspected. For example, in San Antonio, five deaths that were initially attributed to such causes as scorpion bites, alcohol abuse and suicide were later attributed to the drug.

"Every individual in the command, and in the military, for that matter, must be made aware of the dangers of Angel Dust. It's a killer."

## CFC donations near base target

As of Wednesday morning, the 64th Flying Training Wing was more than three-quarters of the way toward reaching its 1978 Combined Federal Campaign goal with 10 days still left in the campaign.

According to Maj. Bobby Clark, CFC project officer, Reese units have totaled \$51,145.10 through the first week of the drive. That is 77.5 per cent of the base target of \$66,000.

Several units have already gone over their individual goals. Field Maintenance was the first to top the century mark with the unit going over the top on the opening day of the drive. Wednesday, FMS stood at 109.7 per cent and Organizational Maintenance was at 108.5 per

cent. The 54th Flying Training Squadron had totaled 127 per cent, the Wing staff was at 387 per cent, the Hospital was at 120.8 per cent and the Reese Credit Union had topped their goal by 10 per cent.

The FMS, OMS donations gave Maintenance 109.3 per cent of its goal. Operations stands at 90.3 per cent, the 1958th Communications Squadron has 82.7 per cent. Lagging behind the leaders early in the campaign are Resources Management (31.9 per cent), Air Base Group (31.1 per cent) and the combined tenant units (3 per cent).

CFC officials hope to wrap the campaign up by today, but, the official deadline is Sept. 29.

## Men must know women's 35-10

When it comes to 35-10 standards for women, supervisors have traditionally taken the back seat. It is time to get more involved!

Generally speaking, men in particular have either not dared or have not bothered to venture very far into women's 35-10 territory. Beyond the basics, male supervisors just aren't familiar with the book as it applies to women. Everyone knows that a man's hair must not touch his ears or collar; ask most male supervisors about hair length restrictions for women, and they will probably point to the back of their collars and mumble incoherently. The consensus of opinion seems to be that the women will monitor themselves and/or each other for 35-10 compliance; therefore, male supervisors needn't be concerned — after all, who knows more about women than other women?

Admittedly, the wide variety of uniform combinations for women is enough to discourage even the most diehard bookworm. Nevertheless, supervisors need to become more familiar with women's 35-10 standards. Supervisors can't be sure that their female

troops are in compliance if they don't know what they are supposed to comply with! The women may be assuming that their supervisors know what the book says and will inform them if they are out of standards, while, at the same time, the supervisors are probably assuming that the women have read the book and complied accordingly. Although the women are more likely to know the fine points of standards in 35-10, they are not necessarily any more inclined to correct other women for infractions than men are.

One major problem for some supervisors is their reluctance to actually speak up to correct a woman. Men who are quick to jump on young male troops often hesitate out of embarrassment, or may not say anything at all, when required to counsel a female. If a woman's skirt is too short, hair too long, pants too tight, shoes unpolished, TELL HER! Even if you personally think that her skirt looks great as it is, the two-inch limit still stands.

Do your part to insure that our military women continue to "look great in '78!" Read AFR 35-10 and support its intent — equally!

# How to handle service calls?

The military family housing brochure restricts call-in work requirements to emergencies only. Routine maintenance and repair should be requested via AF Form 1135; new work on AF Form 332.

In the past, as a convenience to our customers, we have violated policy by accepting both emergency and routine work requests over the telephone. Several reasons force us to now follow policy and only accept emergency work requirements over the telephone, including complaints from customers about not being able to call in bonafide emergencies because the telephone was tied by accepting routine work.

For routine work the AF Form 1135 gives you a written record of the status of your work request. Phoning in your routine work requirement does not mean it will be done any sooner. The priority for routine

work is either FAST (5 days or less) or HOPPER (30 days or less) depending on the availability of materials and, in some cases, manpower.

can delay both yours and other customers work accomplishment. It means CE visits the same job twice. When this happens, someone else job is delayed and it could be another one that you have in the system.

Remember that our standby personnel has already worked a full day — calling him out on non-emergency work degrades his productivity the following duty day when he can best serve you with a better availability of materials, equipment and additional help required.

Failure to provide your job order or work order number when checking on work status also creates an additional unnecessary administrative workload. If you can't give the job order or work order number, we have to search through several hundred work requirements. The time expended is at the expense of processing job requests for other customers.

Your cooperation and patience in this matter will enable us to better serve you.

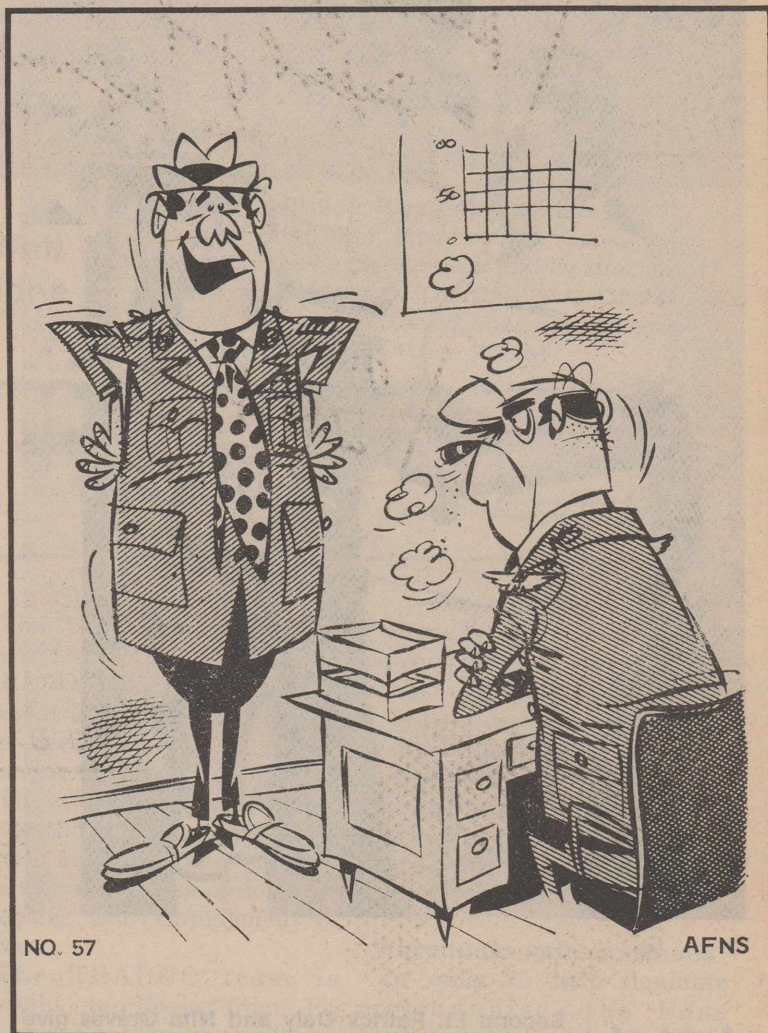

# Health officials concerned about home medication use

Americans are the world's most liberal utilizers of self-medication.

Health Professionals and Government officials alike expend vast amounts of energy and tax-payers dollars to constantly refine the distinction between prescription and non-prescription drug products.

Unfortunately, the Human body makes no such distinctions. While the lay-public often believes that non-prescription may be used at will, without concern or risk, the fact remains that some non-prescription medications are potentially more hazardous than some prescription drugs. Conversely, some prescription drugs are less effective than certain non-prescription drugs are for their respective indicated uses.

The Food, Drug and

Cosmetics Act defines a non-prescription drug as a drug for which directions for safe use by the public can be written. It does not necessarily follow that these drugs are without danger. A degree of hazard is involved in the use of all non-prescription drugs.

Approaching the situation logically, if non-prescription drugs are effective, that is, if a function of the body is altered, then non-prescription drugs possess an element of danger to those who use them.

That danger might arise from: (a) The use of the agent according to instructions. There is always a possibility of an adverse drug reaction in the patient taking the medication. (b) The use of the drug in combination with other drugs, alcohol included. Non-prescription drugs can interact with both other non-prescription and prescription

drugs. (c) The overuse of excessive use of the drug. This is referred to as toxicity of the drug and can be a serious, even life threatening consequence. (d) The use of the drug according to the instructions, but for inappropriate purposes such as conditions which have been misdiagnosed by the patients. (e) The common side affects such as drowsiness, associated with a variety of non-prescription drugs that can hinder a person's ability to carry-on normal activities.

Self-Medication is each individual's responsibility and one that should not be taken lightly. Read labels and adhere to the directions and be aware of the possibility of one or several of the above mentioned "hazards" of self-medication. If you have the slightest doubt about taking any medication, contact your physician or pharmacist.

# GS salary average here must drop in four-years

A special four-year program designed to reduce Reese's General Schedule (GS) salary grade average to within Office of Management and Budget guidelines has begun here.

Allen Ourada, classification and labor relations specialist said Tuesday, "The position Structuring and Salary Management program (more commonly referred to as GS salary grade control) is not a new program, but, is a result of new emphasis on one that has been in effect since 1971. The one thing I want to make clear," he stressed, "is that no one on base will be adversely affected by the program."

What it all boils down to is that Reese currently has a GS salary grade average of 5.9726. By the end of 1982, that average (according to the Office of Management and Budget) must be down to 5.4169. Although it will mean reducing some 156 position grade points, Ourada is confident that most of the reductions can be handled through attrition and restructuring.

"There will have to be some sacrifices made and reaching the target won't be the easiest thing we have ever done," admitted Ourada, "but, with proper management we should be able to reach the target

without causing too many headaches for our people."

One thing many GS employees may be wondering about is what will the reduction of the grade average mean for promotion opportunities?

"We will continue to promote our deserving people, make no mistake about that," added Chief of Civilian Personnel Tom Ireland. As vacancies occur and allow us to reduce positions, some by more than one grade, we will be able to develop sort of a reserve that should allow us to maintain normal promotion opportunities.





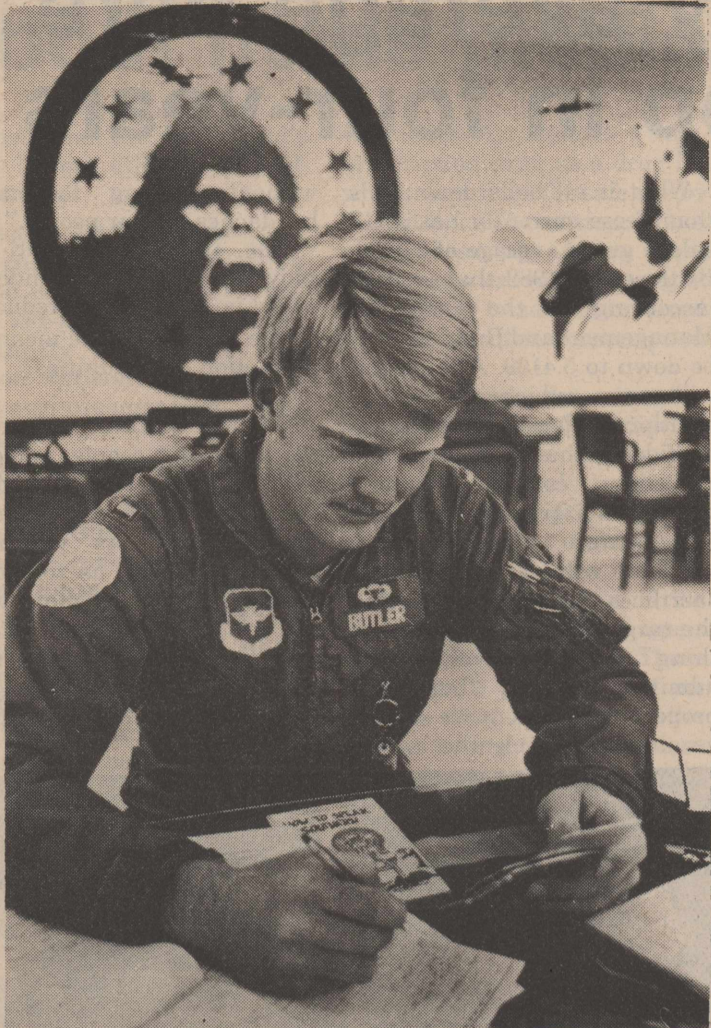

General manager Steve L. Lewis said Sept. 25 would be the traditional "area school day" to coincide with the "Parade of Bands," set for downtown Lubbock at 10 a.m. on that day.

Lubbock school days are Sept. 26-27. Classes will be suspended early on Sept. 27 to allow the city's students to attend the fair. However, free passes also may be used on Sept. 26, although classes will not be suspended early.

Approximately 160,000 tickets have been distributed to city and area schools and teachers, enabling them to gain free entry onto the fairgrounds.

Senior citizens (60 and older) with identification will be admitted free on Sept. 27. College and military day is Sept. 29 and college students and military and civilian personnel at Reese AFB will be admitted free on Sept. 29 upon presentation of IDs.

Although these dates have been designated as "special" days, fair officials said the public also is welcome on those dates.

A spate of free entertainment is on the menu for all fairgoers. On the outdoor stage, Lubbock mime Ruth Rubin and magician Bob Ford will perform at 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. daily along with Vandermeide, billed as Europe's fastest hypnotist (7:15 p.m. and 9 p.m. daily).

In addition, a double sway pole act featuring the Swaying Bilros will perform at 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. each day.

Six shows are set for Fair Park Coliseum, including: the Charley Pride show, with Dave and Sugar, 5 p.m. and 8 p.m. Sept. 24; the Statler Brothers, 5 p.m. and 8 p.m. Sept. 25; the Johnny Rodriguez show, with Linda Hargrove, 8 p.m. only Sept. 26; the Jim Ed Brown show, with Helen Cornelius and Wendy Holcombe, 8 p.m. only Sept. 27; Eddie Rabbitt and Jerry Clower, 8 p.m. only Sept. 28; Mel Tillis, 8 p.m. only Sept. 29 and 5 p.m. and 8 p.m. Sept. 30.

All seats are reserved and tickets are \$4, \$5 and \$6. Tickets may be purchased at the Fair Park Coliseum box office (744-9557), Sears and Hemphill-Wells stores in South Plains Mall, Ed's Wagon Wheel, Dunlap's and Luskey's Western Wear.

Dave and Sugar, Brown and Miss Cornelius, the Statlers and Tillis all have been nominated for honors by the Country Music Association this year. Winners will be announced Oct. 9.

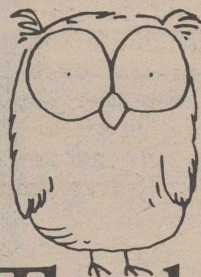

Tuition is \$200 per month per program — \$128 for evening classes — or \$50 per month per individual course, plus a \$25 registration fee (\$5 for individual courses). However, financial aid is available to those who qualify.

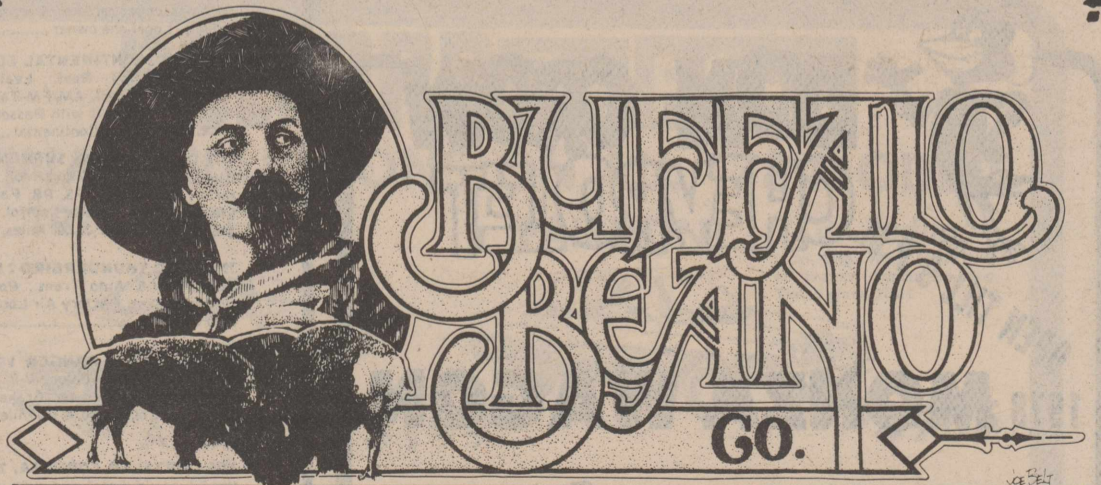

The varsity gridgers will find it hard going against the Wildcats, who have reeled of 13 straight regular season victories, including impressive wins in the first two games of the '78 campaign.

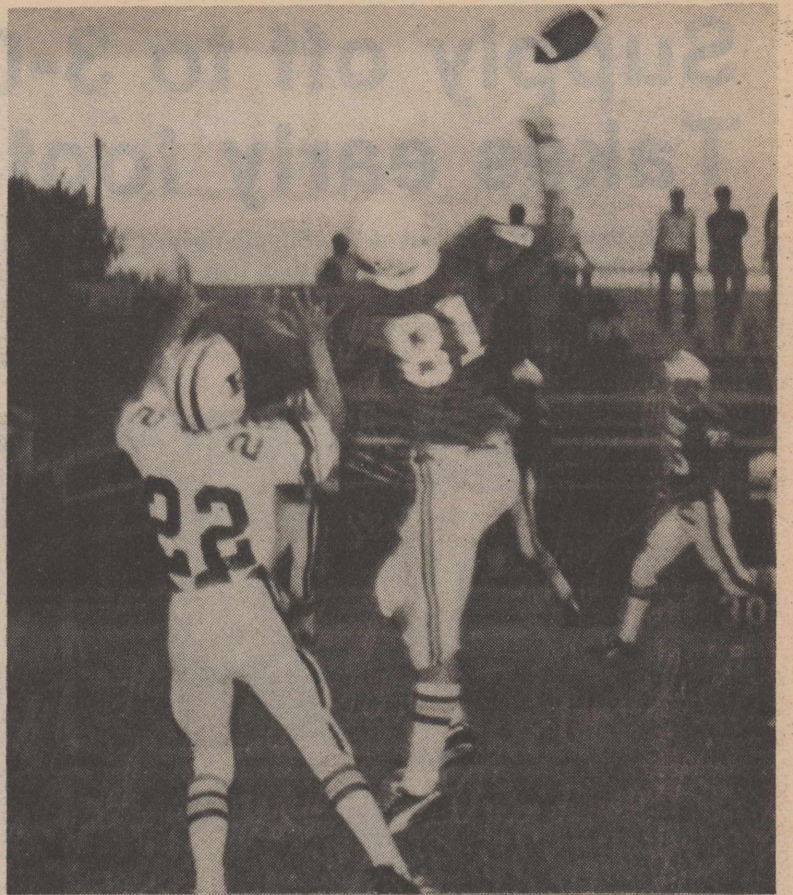
