



Retiring Judges The judicial retirement system was designed so judges could leave the bench for a few

years to rest before their death's. Statistics just worked up on the operation of the system by State Auditor C. H. Cavness reveals that there are 219 district and appellate judges paying into the retirement fund, and 31 who are on retirement.

During the last state fiscal year, five retired judges died and 11 retired. Of 62 judges who have retired, 31 had died as of the date of the audit.

But the retirement system may not have succeeded in keeping judges on the bench. During the year, 10 left the bench without retiring, to go into private law practices.


