- The board's Committee on Long-Range Planning will develop the new Long-Range Plan on the basis of public hearings and board discussions. The board will vote on the committee's recommended Long-Range Plan before transmitting it to the Texas Legislature in January 1995.
- A schedule of the public hearings is attached. Educators, parents and family members, students, representatives of professional associations, service providers, business people, and members of the community are invited to present testimony to the committee at the hearings.
- Individuals who testify will be asked to speak to the following elements of the Draft Long-Range Plan for Public Education, 1995-1999, as listed in the attached draft document Proposed Goals and Results for Public Education:
- GOALS: Are the proposed goals adequate and valid? What other goals should be considered?
 RESULTS: Are the proposed results the best ways to neasure progress toward the goals? What other results should be included?
 ACTION PLANS: What actions should occur at the campus, community, district, and state levels in order to achieve the goals?
- Individuals wishing to testify are asked to register by calling the Texas Education Agency Office
 of Policy Planning and Evaluation, at (512) 463-9701, by 5:00 p.m. on the last working day prior
 to the public hearing at which they wish to speak. Speakers will be asked to testify in the order in
 which they register. Speakers are asked to limit their testimony to the committee to three minutes.
- Speakers may also register on-site the day of the hearing. These individuals will be allowed to
 give testimony on a first-come, first-served basis following those who have pre-registered.
- Speakers needing translation services or other special accommodations should notify the Office of Policy Planning and Evaluation by 5:00 p.m. at least five working days prior to the public hearing at which they wish to speak.
- Speakers are encouraged to provide 15 written copies of their testimony for distribution to the committee. Written information for the committee can be sent to the Office of Policy Planning and Evaluation at any time.


