be conducted to head off problems. If prussic acid is
detected, cattle should be removed until analysis shows
prussic acid has dropped.
Delay feeding hay or silage $4-6$ weeks to allow for breakdown of the prussic acid. A sodium nitrite-sodium
thiosulfate combination can be administered as an antidote. It must be injected intravenously
very slowly. The dosage, and administration are critical. The toxic principal works very rapidly,
