

# Davis becomes ATC boss

Gen. John W. Roberts announced that Lt. Gen. Bennie L. Davis has been selected to replace him as Commander of Air Training Command, effective April 1.

General Roberts also said that Maj. Gen. Andrew P. Iosue, Commander of the Air Force Military Training Center at Lackland, will succeed Davis as the Air Force's Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower and Personnel in Washington.

President Carter has nominated both Davis and

Iosue for promotion, General Roberts said.

When Davis pins on his fourth star, he will succeed Roberts as the highest-ranking armed forces officer in the southwestern United States. A native of McAlester, Okla., Davis will head the second largest command in the Air Force.

There are 15 installations within ATC, all of them in the United States. In addition, the Command operates training detachments at virtually every

U.S. Air Force base in the World.

In March 1977, the ATC Commander's position was elevated to four-star rank in recognition of the Command's vital role in National defense.

Davis has been Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower and Personnel since July, 1978. At 50, he will become the youngest of the Air Force's four-star generals.

No stranger to San Antonio, he will be returning to Randolph for the third time. He

was a student pilot in B-29s there in 1953. He then came back in the early 1970s to hold two key positions.

General Davis served as Vice Commander of the Air Force Military Personnel Center there from June, 1972 to May, 1974. He then assumed command of USAF Recruiting Service and held that position until July, 1975. When he moved to Washington to become Director of Personnel Plans for the Air Force.

## AFAF drive on record pace

Donations to this year's Air Force Assistance Fund Drive have topped the \$10,000 mark with over two weeks remaining in the campaign.

As of Tuesday, the contributions totaled 135 percent of our goal of \$7,663 (\$10,388). According to local officials, there should be no problem in

surpassing last year's record setting contribution of \$10,800.

All units and organizations have surpassed 100 percent of their goals. Major organizations and their donations are: Maintenance, \$3,555 (167 percent); Air Base Group, \$1,497 (140 percent); Resources Management, \$723 (119 percent); Operations, \$3,699

(110 percent) and Hospital, \$521 (102 percent).

Individual units with their percentage are: Judge Advocate, 378 percent; Weather, 356 percent; Plans, 249 percent; Administration, 248 percent; Wing Staff, 242 percent; Organizational Maintenance, 218 percent.

Other units achieving 100 percent were: Civil Engineers, 204 percent; Field Training Detachment, 158 percent; Student Squadron, 155 percent; Air Base Group Staff, 152 percent; Security Police, 141 percent; Field Maintenance Squadron, 138 percent; and Operations Staff, 104 percent.

Another major event to raise

money for this campaign conducted solely by and for Air Force people will be a bowling shootout at Reese Lanes on Thursday at 7:30 p.m.

Donations from this annual fund drive benefit the Air Force Aid Society, the Air Force Enlisted Men's Widows Home and the Air Force village.

## CITIBUS briefing outlines proposed express service

Reese personnel looking for a break from driving to work may soon be able to ride the bus. That depends on how much interest is shown at today's CITIBUS briefing at the Mathis Recreation Center.

In response to a suggestion brought up at a meeting of the Base Advisory Council, Reese and Lubbock transit officials have worked out a plan that will provide morning and late

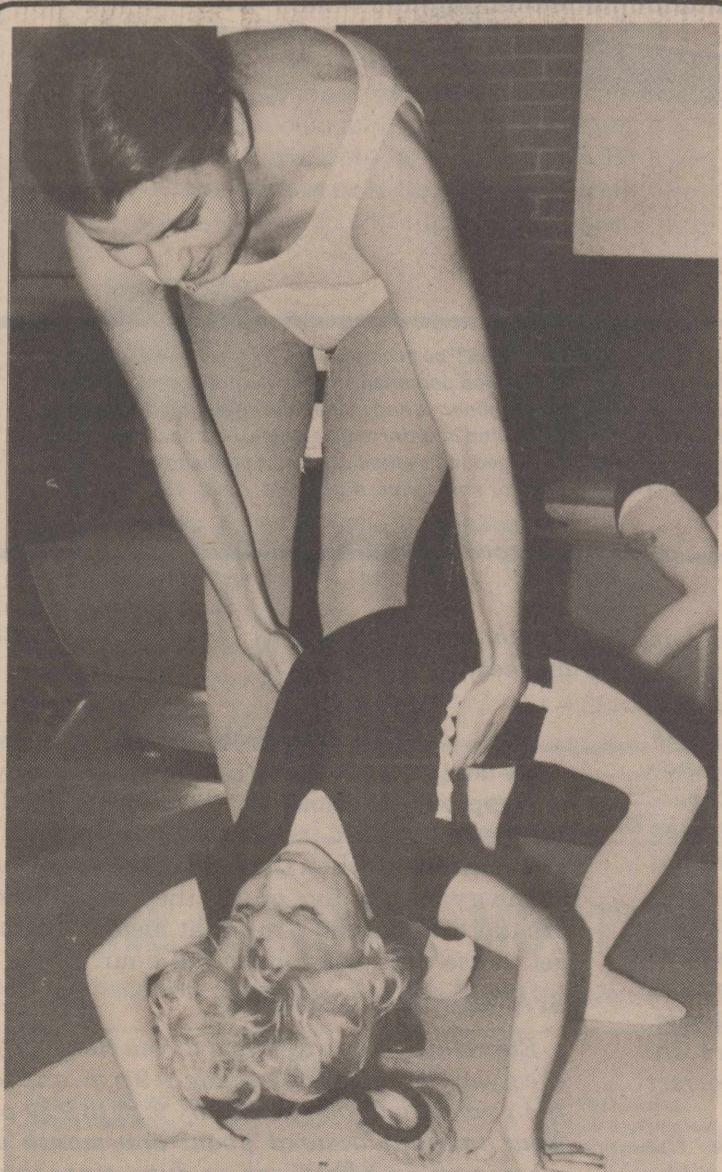
afternoon bus service between Lubbock and Reese.

According to base officials, CITIBUS is prepared to provide express service of one 42-passenger bus and driver two hours each morning and afternoon, five days per week. The final run in the morning (there will probably be two runs made each shift) will arrive here before 7:30 a.m.

In order to provide this

service, transit officials state that they must take in \$1,140 per month from Reese passengers. That means riders will have to buy monthly passes. One good thing about the passes is that they will be good for all other CITIBUS routes anytime of day.

Open to all Reese personnel, civilian and military, the briefing is scheduled to start at 1 p.m. in the recreation center.

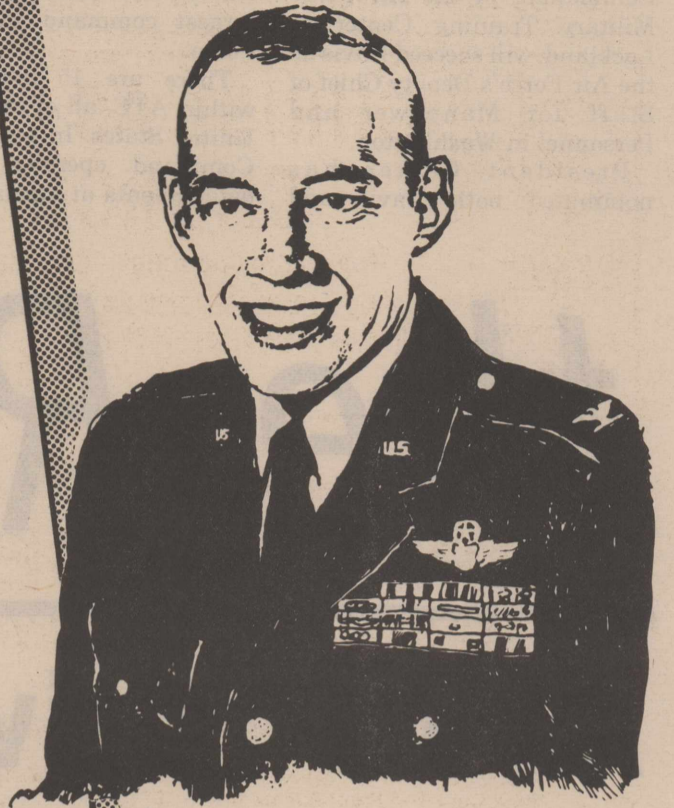

### Commissary prices

I was in the Commissary Feb. 14 buying groceries and they had dog food marked \$2.73 for a 25 pound bag so I picked up the 25 pound bag and went through the cashiers line.

When I was ready to pay they told me the dog food was erroneously marked and it was \$5 and something a bag and they said that if I wanted it I had to take it at that price.

I was just wondering if this was the base or Commissary policy to mis-mark something and then make you pay the higher price.

I regret the problem you encountered in the Commissary with the dog food which was mismarked. Our employees do make mistakes at times and unfortunately this can cause some inconvenience to the customer.

The Commissary operates on a cost plus 4

percent surcharge basis. All goods are sold at the price at which they are received in accordance with AFCOMS Reg 145-2. Should mismarked items be sold at that price, the loss must be absorbed within the surcharge. Since the surcharge pays for new stores, improvements and all other expenses associated with the Commissary, it cannot afford to absorb such losses.

AFCOMS has started a new system to help end problems such as you encountered, and to insure the customer pays only the amount which the Commissary pays for the goods. When merchandise is received, the cases are marked during unloading with the correct selling price.

Stockers then only need to mark the individual items as they are stocking. Should a mistake occur during stocking, action is taken immediately upon discovery to correct prices on

merchandise that has been stocked and marked.

### Gym closes early

My complaint is that Friday nights, the gym is supposed to close at 9 p.m. We had a racquetball court reserved at 8 p.m. The problem is that when there is not enough people at the gym (only five or six) they usually close around 8:15 or 8:30 p.m. That means we don't get to use the court for the full hour.

Earl Hutchings explained to you the policy of the gym, that last call is made at 9 p.m. and that the gym should be vacated by 9:15 to 9:30 p.m. Your incident occurred about one month ago when part-time help was on duty, since then a member of the gym staff has been assigned during week nights.

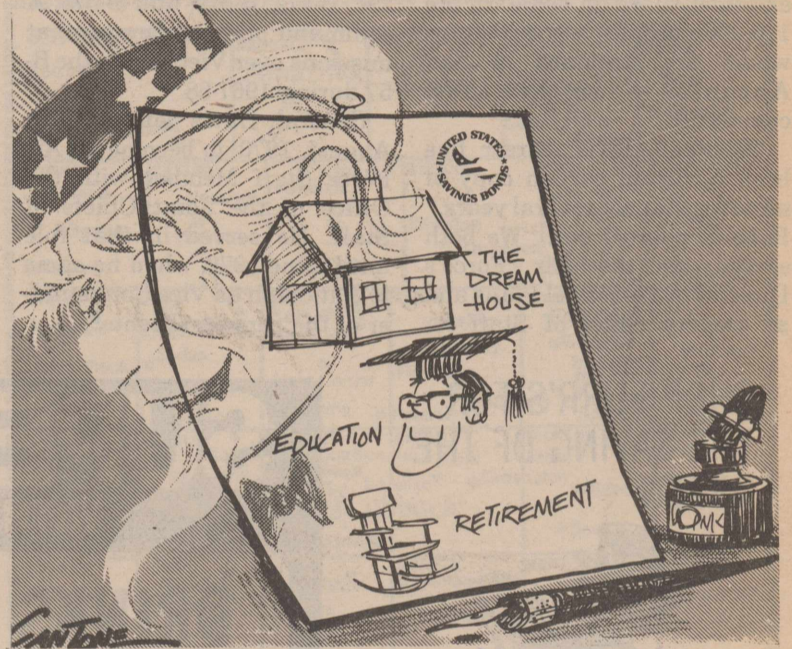

## Davis joins ATC...

General Roberts, who retires April 1, said he has known General Davis for many years and added, "I'm elated that the Air Force has chosen him as my successor." He noted that Davis is a "people-oriented general who will work extremely hard on behalf of the 110,000 people — 30,000 of whom are stationed in San Antonio — in his new command.

"General Davis' career has been a virtual carbon copy of mine for the past several years," Roberts pointed out. "We both served as the Air Force's Director of Personnel Plans and as Deputy Chief of Staff for

Personnel before taking the next step to Commander of ATC.

General Davis was graduated from the U.S. Military Academy in June, 1950. Much of General Davis' career has been spent with the Strategic Air Command, where he piloted B-29s, B-47s, B-52s, and B-57s. A command pilot, he flew combat missions over Vietnam in the B-57 during 1967-68.

General Davis left SAC in August, 1970, to become an Air Force Staff Member with the Office of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. He served in that role until June 1972, when he came to Randolph as Vice Commander of the personnel center.

# Tornado season arrives; keep alert for warnings

Although tornadoes can happen at any time of the year, tornado activity is heaviest in West Texas from March through June.

The key to surviving a tornado emergency is to plan ahead. Locate a suitable shelter in your home or place of business. This should be a center hallway or closet on the ground floor. If you live in a mobile home, plan to seek shelter elsewhere. Assemble a "storm kit" containing flashlights, battery powered radio, spare batteries, and other essentials. Be sure to instruct your family on actions to be taken in case of your absence.

Local radio and television will issue a **tornado watch** when conditions are right for the formation of tornadoes. This is the time to secure loose items outside your home or work area such as charcoal grill, bicycles, and yard tools. Have the children stay close to the house. You might also want to move blankets and even a

mattress to the area in your house which you plan to use for shelter.

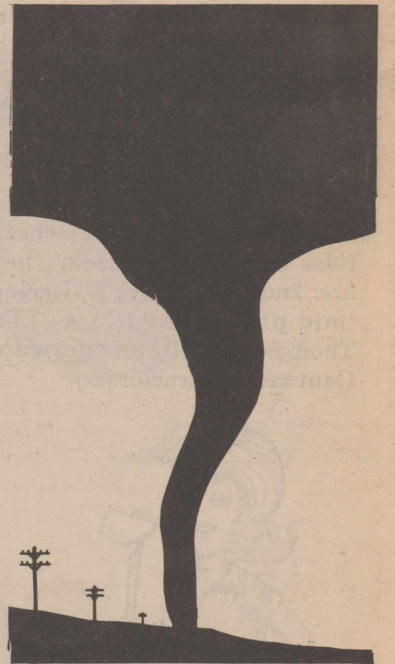
Watch to the sky. If there is a thunderstorm in progress, look for hail. Hail indicates heavy turbulence and is often the forerunner of a tornado.

Monitor local radio and television stations. Radio station KFYO—790 is a member of the Emergency Broadcast System.

If a tornado has actually been sighted a **tornado warning** is issued. At Reese, a steady tone on the base siren indicates that a tornado is within six miles of the base and is expected to hit.

Stay in your building, unless it is a mobile home or a metal hanger. A vehicle is not a good shelter. Go to the nearest substantial structure. If you are caught in the open, lie flat in the nearest ditch, ravine, or culvert with your arms protecting your head.

Avoid areas near doorways or windows as shattering glass is a definite hazard.

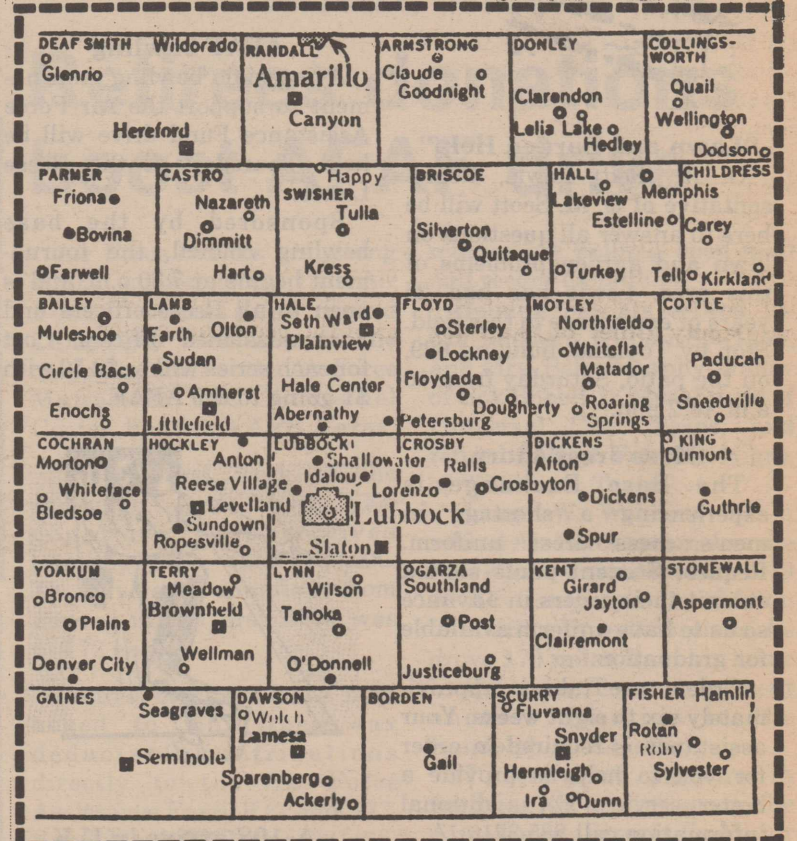

The action is the result of a Feb. 2, 1979, memorandum from President Jimmy Carter directing government agencies to save more energy.

### 238 people saved

A total of 238 passengers aboard 82 aircraft were saved from possible disaster by Air Force Communications Service air traffic controllers during 1978.

One hundred one controllers were recognized by Communications Service for either warning pilots of dangerous situations or guiding distressed aircraft to safe landings with radar or visual sightings.

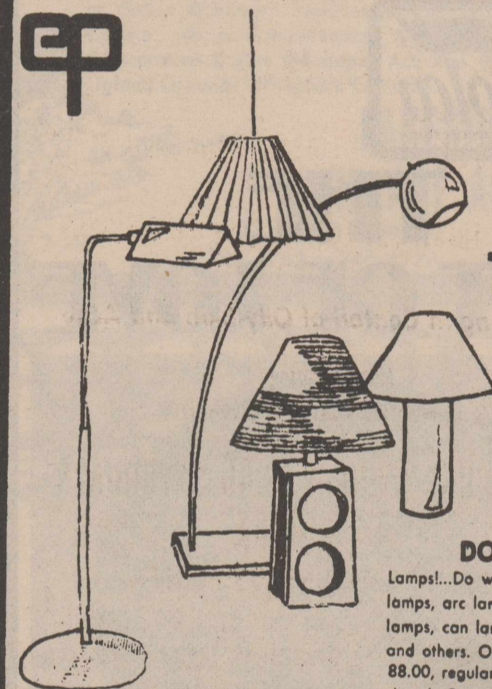

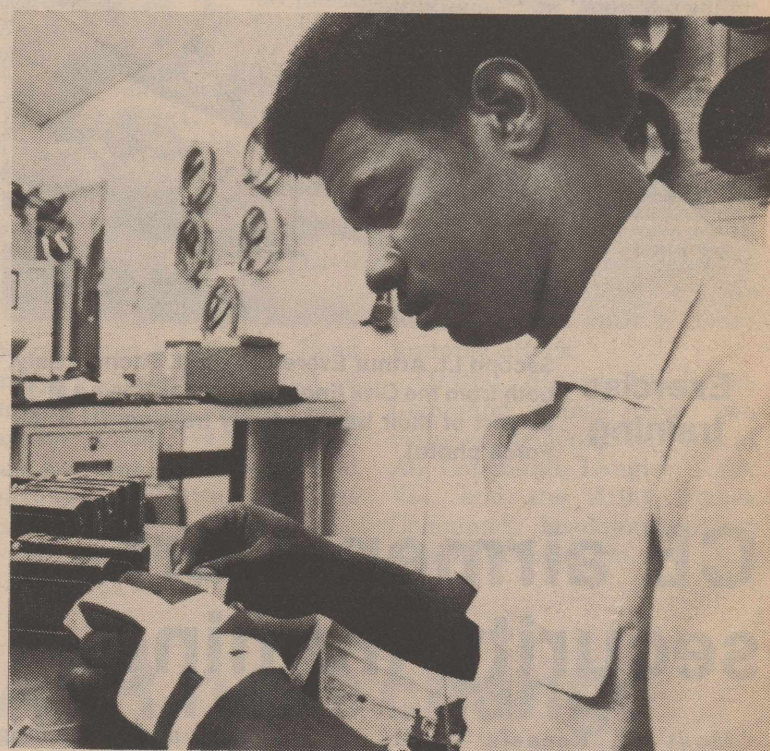
# Support branch finds new help resourceful

A1C Daniel L. Sauls has been working in the Aircrew Life Support Unit for only one week, but he has already saved the unit \$5,748.75.

Airman Sauls was assigned to the Synthetic Trainer Branch of Operations Division until that unit was terminated last week. He came to Life Support while he waits for retraining and another job.

According to MSgt. Ray Eldridge, head of Life Support, Airman Sauls volunteered to work on several condemned life support beacons which were to be replaced. The beacons are radio signal devices that are installed in a pilots parachute. Their purpose is to aid in locating downed pilots.

By 'cannibalizing' good parts on some beacons to replace faulty parts on other beacons, Airman Sauls was able to repair 35 of the formerly condemned items. Replacement cost for each would have been \$164.25.

# CE airmen start security training

Ground maneuver forces will be restricted to the Fort Hood military reservation and a small tract of leased land approximately five miles south of Lampasas, where search and rescue operations will be conducted.

# APR rules change for certain airmen

Airmen with less than one year of service will receive performance reports and letters of evaluation in the same time frame and under the same rules as the rest of the enlisted force, beginning May 1.

A change to Air Force Regulation 39-62, "Noncommissioned Officer and Airman Performance Reports," will expand the rules under which airmen receive their first performance reports.

The first report may be generated by a change of reporting official, be directed by the commander, or be a regularly scheduled annual report.

First-term airmen do not

currently receive their initial APR until they have completed 12 months of extended active duty. The only exception is when an APR is required with involuntary discharge actions.

According to Donna Shirley, Chief of Officer Effectiveness Reports and Airman Performance Reports Unit at Reese, most airmen will notice no difference in when they receive their first APR, since the projected date of the annual report will coincide with the date of the initial report.

The change is expected to broaden the scope of the airman evaluation system by allowing documentation of performance and potential at an earlier point in the airman's career.

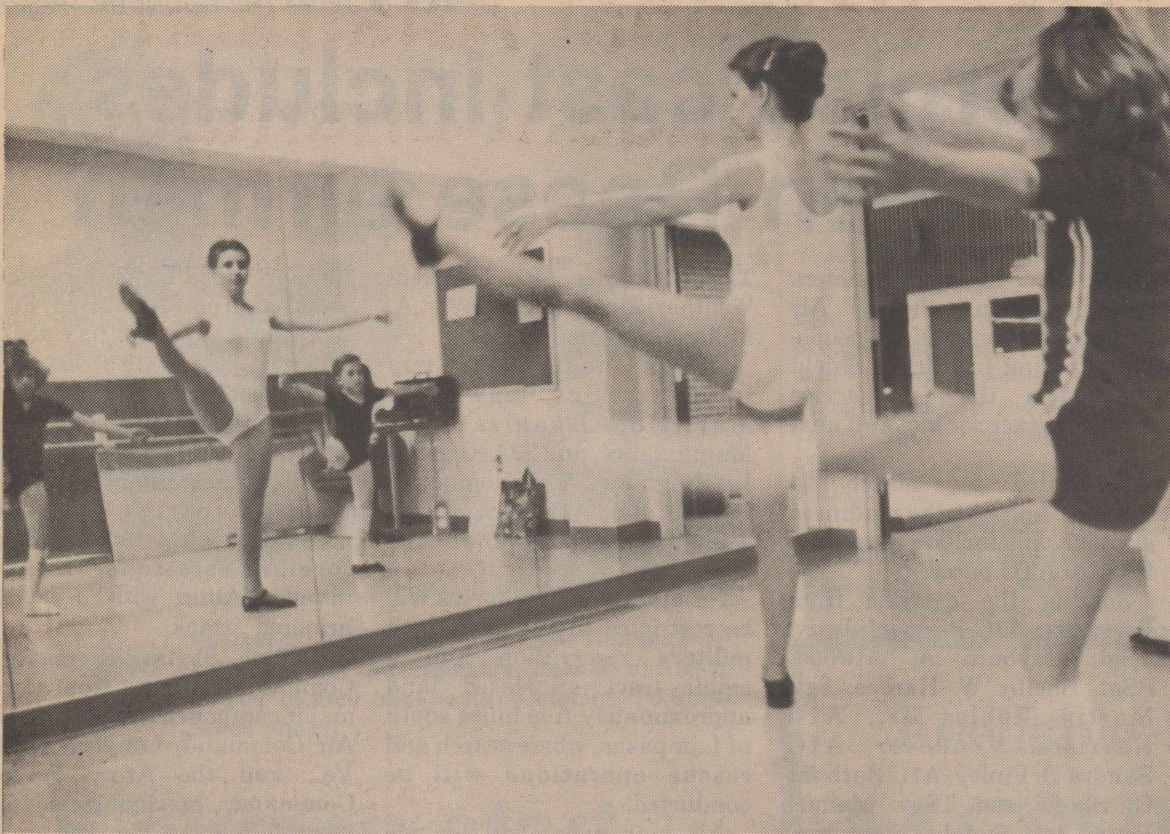

Sturon-2 jumped into the intramural volleyball league lead last week as the circuit's unbeaten list dwindled to four.

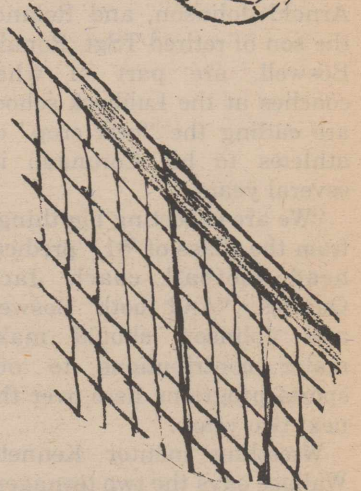

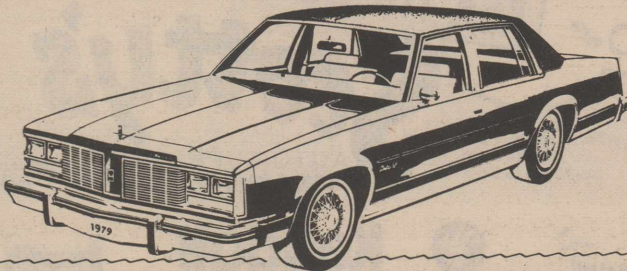

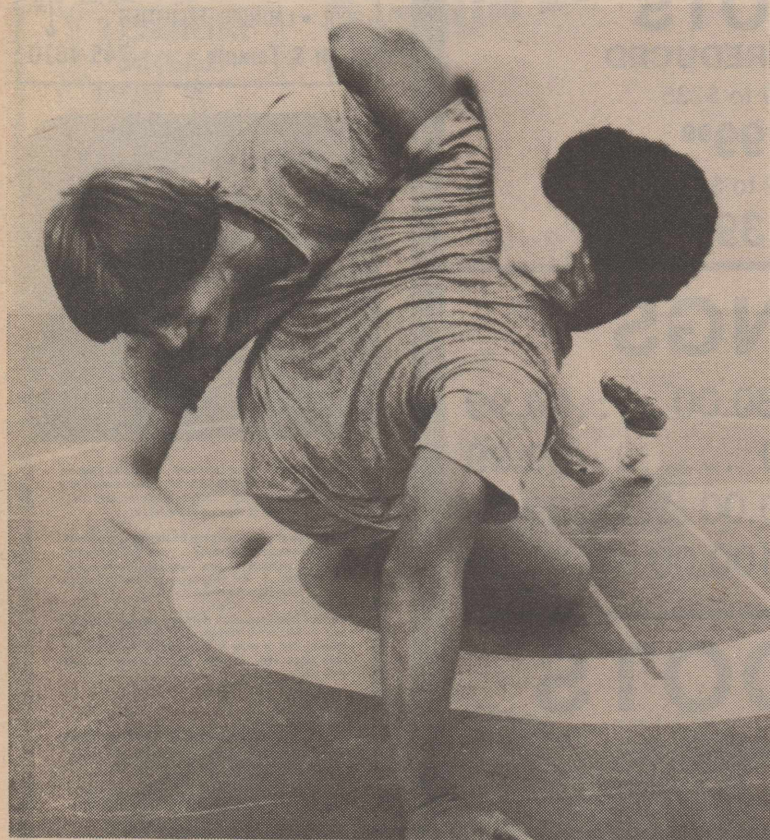
Roland also kicked extra points for the squad, posting a perfect conversion record during the season.
