

AF outlines cutbacks; Goodfellow will close

Goodfellow AFB, Texas, will close and operations at three other bases in the United States will be reduced.

Those bases include Loring AFB, Maine, Rickenbacker AFB, Ohio, and Kingsly Field, Ore.

Also deactivated will be the 17th Defense System Evaluation Squadron at Malstrom AFB, Mont., and study withdrawal of active-duty forces from Duluth International Airport, Minn., and Hancock Field, N.Y.

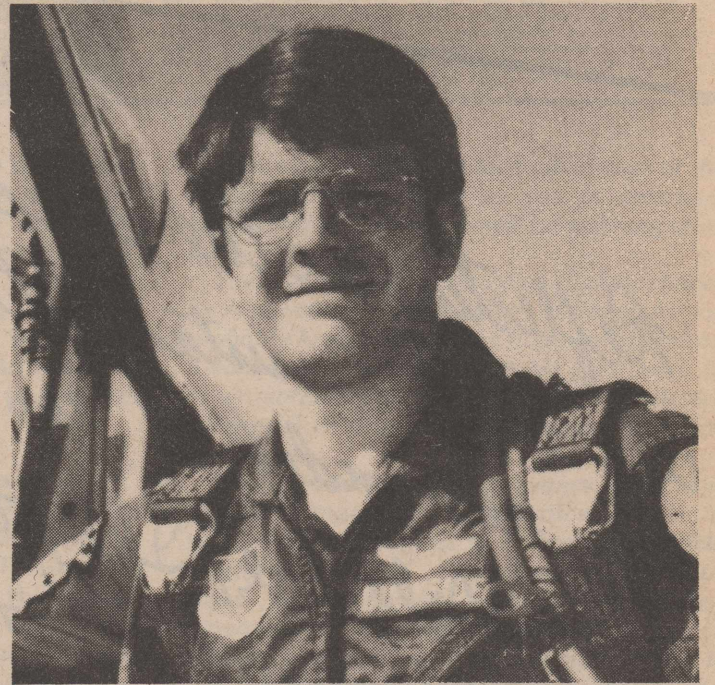
In addition, three installations previously identified for closure will remain open and will continue to perform their current missions. These are Chanute AFB, Ill., Lowry AFB, Colo., and Los Angeles Air Force Station, Calif. The Air Force will also study converting additional jobs to civilian contract at various bases in the United States and Guam.

These actions were among the realignments and reductions announced March 29 by Secretary of the Air Force John

C. Stetson. They are part of an overall plan which will enhance Air Force readiness and produce cost avoidance figures of nearly \$140 million annually.

The Goodfellow decision confirms an earlier, April 1978, announcement to close the Texas base.

Active-duty Air Force units will also be removed from Kingsly Field and the base will be reduced to an alert site for a detachment of Air Defense fighters.

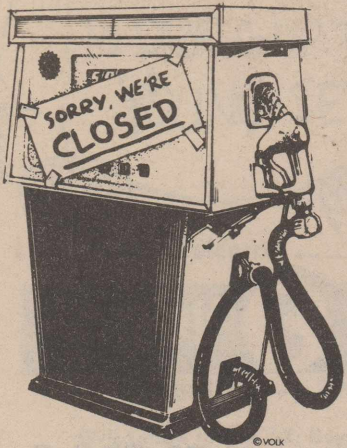

Allocation drops

BX restricts gas sales

Reese personnel continue to feel the sting of the "energy shortage" this week with Base Exchange officials announcing



daily rationing of gasoline at the base service station.

According to Dan Arias, BX manager, gasoline sales at the

base station will have to be restricted because of a cutback in allocations by Shell Oil Company.

Arias explained that the allocation cuts force the station to make two major gas stretching moves. Hours of operation (at the gas pumps only) will be shortened by 12 hours per week. In addition, only a specified amount of gasoline will be sold through the pumps each day.

"The Shell allotment for April is approximately 31,000 gallons below what we sold here in March, says Arias. "At our present sales rate, the entire allotment (55,000 gallons) would be exhausted sometime in mid-April."

In order to make sure that at least some gas will be available here throughout the month,

Exchange officials elected to ration the April allotment and set a daily limit on total gasoline sales.

"We don't anticipate any other form of rationing," noted Arias. "Patrons will be able to fill their tanks as long as the daily supply lasts."

By cutting back on operating hours, Exchange officials hope to ease the problem. At least through April, the service station will sell gas from 9:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, and from 9:30 a.m. until 1:30 p.m. on Saturdays. The station will remain closed on Sundays.

"We realize that the shorter sale hours may cause some congestion at the pumps," admits Arias, "but, we will keep all lanes open from 9:30 a.m.

aeronautical, astronautical, civil, electrical, industrial, and mechanical engineering.

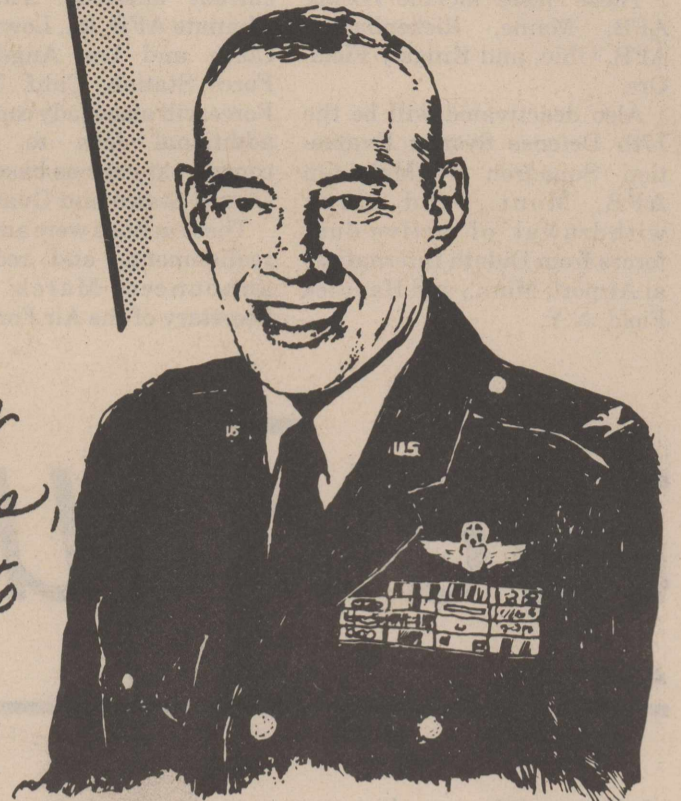
The next AECP selection board will meet in August. Details concerning the August board will be available in May at the Classification and Training Office here, Ext. 3384.

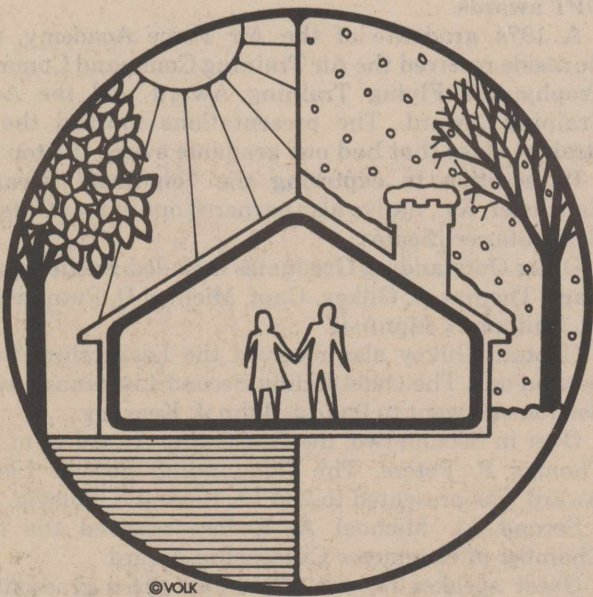

Conservation efforts increase

Don't be temperamental on energy

Are you temperamental about the temperature in your home or work area? Must it be an even 75° for you to be comfortable?

If so, you'd better prepare for the worst! The new Air Force policy for energy conservation requires thermostats to be set no higher than 65 degrees for heating and no lower than 80 degrees for cooling. Additionally, Air Force has directed that, during the spring and fall months, neither heating nor cooling systems are to be operated.

Therefore, on Monday the Civil Engineers began shutting down

heating systems. The first to be shut down were Civil Engineering, Wing Headquarters, and the Flying Training Squadron buildings. Housing facilities (dormitories and family housing) will be among the last to be shut down.

The reason for this drastic action is an urgent need to reduce our energy consumption, below what we actually used during the same period last year.

If you'll watch the weather forecast and dress accordingly, we can all live with this small inconvenience now in order to have necessary energy supplies later."

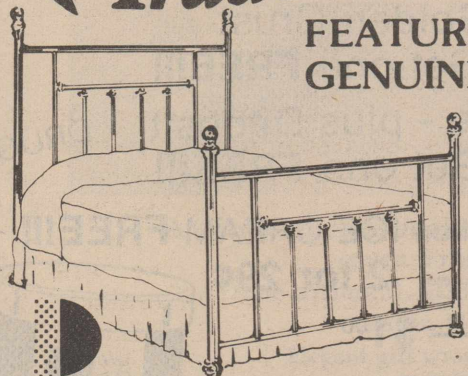

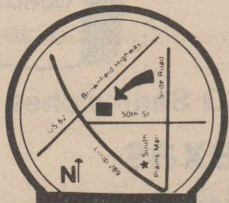

Davis takes ATC reigns; pledges support of people

Lt. Gen. B.L. Davis assumed command of Air Training Command Sunday.

General Davis, at 50, became the Air Force's youngest four star general the same day he succeeded Gen. John W. Roberts as the highest-ranking Air Force officer in the Southwestern United States.

On being named commander of the Air Force's second largest command with 110,000 members, 15 installations and worldwide training detachments, General Davis said he was looking forward to the challenge. "ATC influences virtually every person entering the Air Force through either basic training or officer

training school and Air Force reserve officer training corps commissioning programs. That influence continues throughout their Air Force careers through professional education."

He added that he would be visiting all ATC bases shortly, beginning as soon as his schedule permits.

In General Davis, ATC members can expect, as General Roberts recently described him, "a people-oriented general who will work extremely hard on their behalf."

A glimpse of the general's philosophy was revealed in a recent speech before an Air Force Association chapter. Speaking on "quality of life",

General Davis emphasized, "I've fought for it in the budget process. I've argued for it as a witness at congressional hearings. I intend to keep on doing so."

While acknowledging his concern for people, he stressed that his primary concern is for the well-being of the country and the successful accomplishments of the Air Force mission.

"A military career is not just another job," he said. "It calls for self-sacrifice, not self-interest. It calls for self-discipline, not self-indulgence. National defense is not a business that opens its doors at 8 a.m. Monday and shuts off its lights at 5 p.m. Friday."

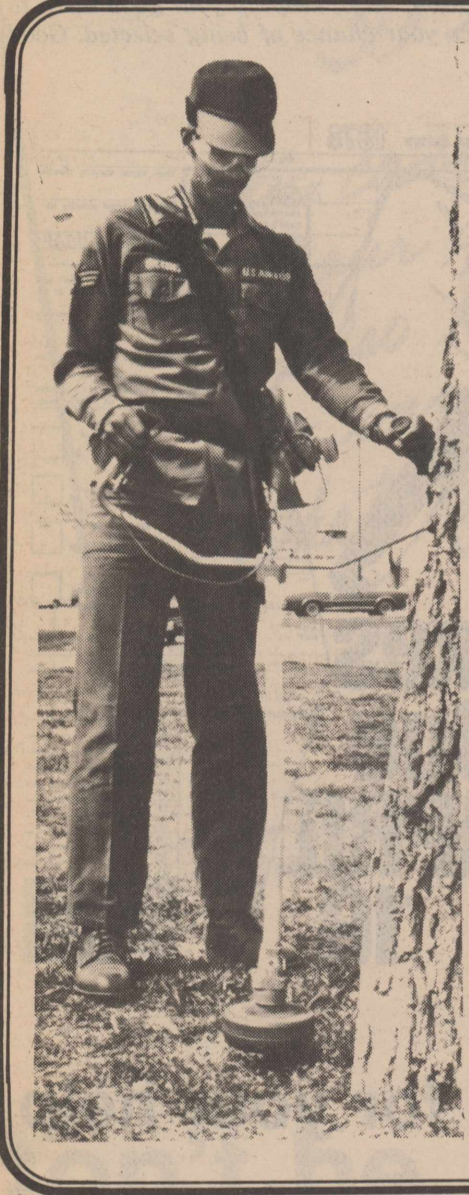

Air Force studies contract support

Air Force officials have announced it plans to study various base-level support activities during Fiscal Year-80 that have a potential for conversion to private contract rather than being performed by Federal civilian employees and military personnel.

As a budget planning assumption, approximately 6,000 manpower authorizations have been programmed out of the President's FY-1980 budget by the Air Force in anticipation of conversion to contract.

Proposed conversions include: family housing maintenance, automatic data processing equipment support, shelf stocking, communications operations maintenance, transient alert maintenance, range maintenance and operations. Also being studied are: grounds maintenance, hospital maintenance, hospital food services, aircraft maintenance, refuse collection, vehicle operations and maintenance, closed circuit TV maintenance, lumber reclamation and packing, box manufacturing, custodial services, duplicating services, structural maintenance, laundry/dry cleaning and mess attendants.

At Reese, four functions have been identified for possible conversion to private contract. They include family housing maintenance; grounds maintenance; instrument flight simulator operations and communications operations maintenance. If these functions are converted to civilian contracts, 53 civilian and two military positions would be affected.

In each case, in-house versus contract cost studies will be performed, firm bids will be solicited, and conversion to contract will take place should the results of the cost studies indicate it to be the most cost effective alternative.

A decision to convert to contractor support will only come about if detailed studies indicate that the private sector can satisfactorily perform the functions and that savings of tax dollars can be achieved. If studies result in contract conversions, civil service employees adversely affected will be provided placement assistance under the DOD Program of Force Stability for Civilian Employment. Military members affected will be accommodated by established reassignment policies.

Donations top \$11,500 as AFAF drive ends here

It's all over. The 1979 AFAF campaign is history and thanks to a record setting effort, Reese donations topped the \$11,500 mark.

Contributions totaled \$11,525 during the month and a half long drive. Reese exceeded its \$7,663 target weeks ago. This year's campaign netted nearly \$700 more than the 1978 drive record.

Air Base Group led all squadrons in percentage over goal with 155 percent (\$1,623), while operations turned in the

most money, \$4,614 (137 percent). Maintenance was the only other organization over 150 percent, although all major organizations at Reese surpassed their individual targets.

A special basketball game and bowling tournament added \$256 to the total. More than half of Reese military donated to the campaign while civilians pledged \$200.

Under the new format, donors directed how much of their contributions went to the three

AFAF agencies. The Air Force Aid Society will receive 60 percent, the Air Force Enlisted Widows Home will receive 25 percent and the Air Force Village will get a 15 percent slice of the \$11 thousand-plus total.

All reports are not in from the other Undergraduate Pilot Training Wings, but if trends hold, Reese's contributions will rank second among command UPT bases. Laughlin leads all UPT wings at present with 151 percent of its goal.

Wing time line

(Continued from page-1) until 1 p.m. and that should keep lines from getting too long."

After 1 p.m., one self-service and one full-service line will remain open.

Arias pointed out that the cutback is an extension of allotment reductions made by Shell late last year. The cut is based on the 1978 April sales figure (reduced by 25 percent).

"One of the reasons why the cutback is hurting us more this month than over the past few months," said Arias, "is that rapidly rising gasoline prices off base are prompting more and more people to buy gas on base."

Gasoline sold through the base station is generally lower than that sold off base. In fact, regulations call for gas sold here to be two cents below the average off base price (according to a survey of 20 self-service and 20 full service stations).

"We don't know when or if our allotment will be raised," added Arias. "Local Air Training Command and Army and Air

Force Exchange officials are working on the problem, but how much they will be able to do isn't known."


For the present, Arias suggests that Reese personnel use every gas conserving measure they can.

"Carpool, ride the bus, walk, ride bicycles or whatever else you can do to save gas," advises Arias. "Saving energy is something we are going to have to learn to do as part of our daily routine."

week's action, dropped a pair to fall to 7-2. The loses slipped RM back into a sixth place.

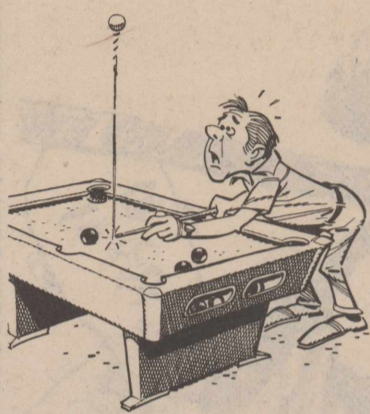

Player coach Mike Bradford, a three time all ATC performer, was picked up by the Ramblers for the command championships at Lowry this week. Bradford guided the Rattlers to

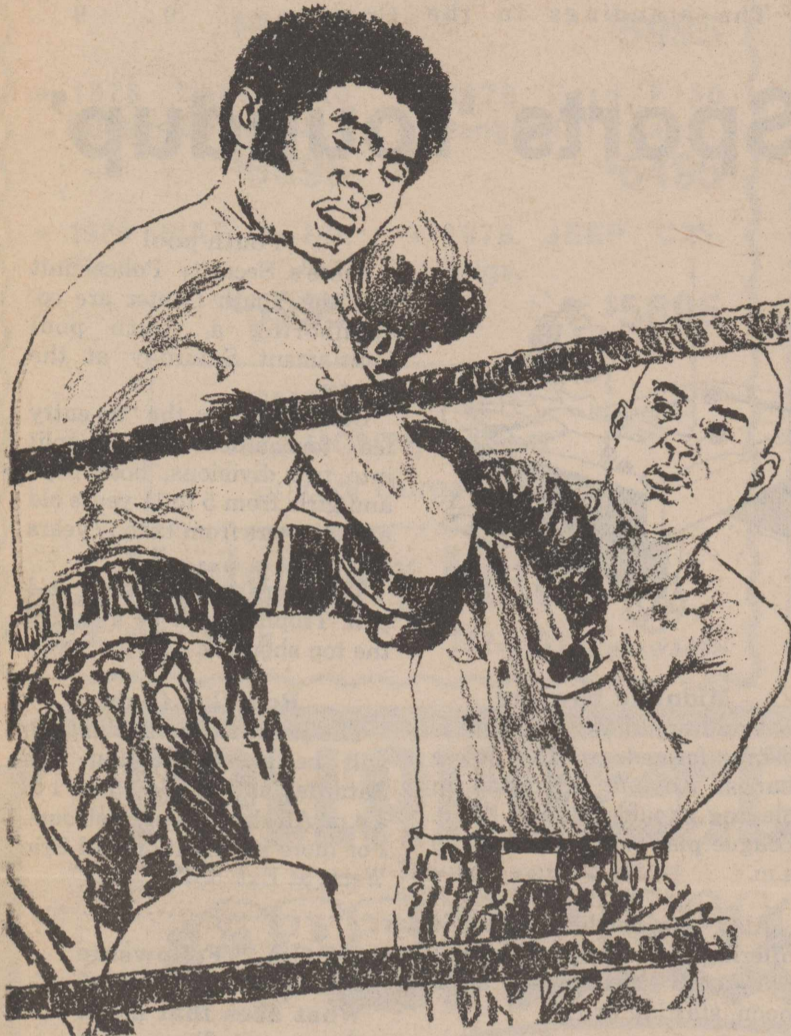
a 5-5 mark in regional action and a second place finish. It was the best performance by a Reese volleyball squad in several years.

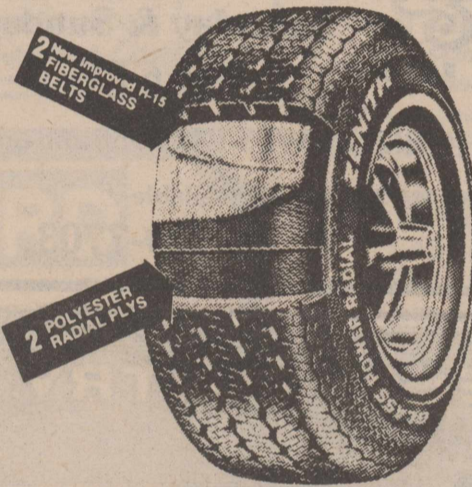
