Base installs utility system

To further efforts reducing utility costs, Air Training Command is implementing electric demand deferment systems which will include Reese's family housing.

With this system, a radio controlled on-off switch, activated by a central transmitter, is installed on air conditioning compressors.

"None of the control units have been installed at Reese, as yet," says Lt. Col. Hiram West, 64th Civil Engineering Squadron commander, "but the units are on order. It may be a couple of months before they are installed."

At times of peak electrical use, usually mid to late afternoon, compressors of air conditioning units in different groups of family housing units will be turned off for periods of about seven minutes. During the period the compressor is turned off, family housing occupants will experienced a minor

increase in temperature. In almost all cases circulating fans will continue to operate.

"This is not a move to take control of air conditioning away from housing unit occupants or to cause discomfort, but an effort to avoid high commercial charges for electric power during peak demand periods, says Colonel West. "With this system in operation an annual estimated savings of \$367,000 in electricity costs is expected at ATC bases."

The electric demand deferment system is already operating at numerous Air Force bases and an increasing number of public utility companies are also operating such systems for private homes.

"Though this effort will reduce the ever increasing costs of utilities, continued cooperation of on-base residents is needed to support the ATC, Air Force and national conservation program," stresses Colonel West.

Officers receive 'job swap' nod

A permissive assignment exchange program, similar to the one in effect for airmen for several years, will be established for officers by late summer.

According to Reese personnel officials, it will provide opportunities for similarly qualified officers to initiate reassignment to more desired jobs or locations without expense to the government.

Covered by an upcoming change to AFR 36-20, Officer Assignments, the program will permit two officers of the same grade, specialty and, if applicable, special experience identifier, to ask to trade assignment locations.

Assignment exchanges will require approval of the unit

commanders concerned and the Air Force Manpower and Personnel Center.

If either officer requires training to qualify for the other's assignment, the application will not normally be approved.

Only officers based in the continental United States will be eligible. All moving costs must be borne by the officers making the exchange.

It will be up to the individual officer to "find" another officer at another CONUS base who is willing to exchange assignments.

Other members included a Senior Master Sergeant, two master sergeants and a colonel as President.

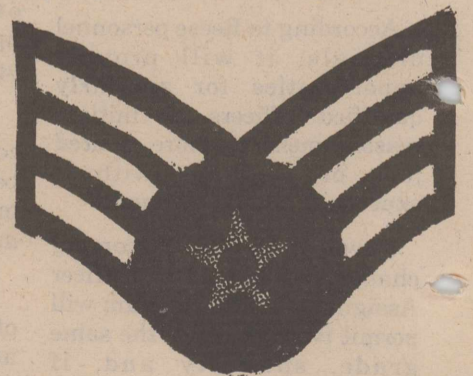

In this sort of competition, little things can become a big factor — such as collar brass being a little off, name tags not centered, dirty heels, etc. Also missing a question in current events or general military knowledge can be the difference between selection or non-selection.

Supervisors can and should play a part in the preparation process. Tell the nominees what to expect, inspect their uniform before the board (spot the little discrepancies)

and consider indicating a promotion recommendation in the APR.

A well written APR with promotion recommendation scores better than one that doesn't. Loyalty works both ways.



Supervisors expect motivated subordinates to do the work. I'm convinced we have them. Subordinates on the other hand expect and deserve their supervisors to care of and an interest in them.

Summer heat dangerous warns Reese physician

Heat stroke has been known for a long time.

It is mentioned in the Old Testament as occurring in the hot fields after physical exercise. Hundreds of fatal cases of heat stroke happen every summer and these are largely preventable.

The first most important factor in preventing heat stroke is to know your limitations. Get acclimatized to heat before starting strenuous exercise.

After that, there are many many DO's and DON'T's.

Don't: exercise during the hottest part of the day, don't get overly tired. Don't exercise if you don't feel well. Even simple diarrhea will predispose to heat stroke. And don't take salt tablets; the salt on your food is enough. You should drink plenty of fluids. You should drink "til you slosh" then drink a little more. Almost any liquid except alcohol or coffee is OK. Stop to rest often. Wear light clothing and a hat. And get plenty of sleep before exercising.

If someone "faints" while exercising in the heat, suspect early heat stroke. Get them in the shade, fan them and if possible keep them wet. Get them to the hospital as soon as possible.

Remember, too, that people can sweat during early heat stroke so don't delay getting help just because they are still sweating.

Enjoy yourself this summer but don't overdo. Drink lots of fluids and stay within your capabilities.

FTD develops tomorrow's AF

"Training tomorrow's Air Force today."

That is the motto that greets anyone who should walk in the north end of Hanger 92. Since October, Hanger 92 has been the location of Field Training Detachment 429, headed by SMSgt. William D. Nilsson.

FTD 429 conducts the Able Chief Program, handling training, from three-level to crew chief, for Reese, Kirkland, AFB, N.M. and Beale AFB, Calif. It also supplies area support for Laughlin and other ACE bases.

With seven instructors, the FTD provides comprehensive training in several areas including egress systems, aerospace ground equipment, engine mechanics and aircraft maintenance technology.

Before October, the 3785th Field Training Group had only

an Operating Location unit with four members here.

Field Training originally started in World War II when a shortage of maintenance personnel and rapid buildup and mobilization efforts precluded training mechanics at central locations. Training was taken to the mechanic in the field.

Field Training in the Air Force was consolidated under one management in May 1976 when the 3785th Field Training Group was established with headquarters at Sheppard AFB.

The 3785th FTG operates 89 locations in the United States, Europe, the Pacific and Alaska. All personnel are assigned to the 3751st Field Training Squadron, which is the world's largest squadron with 1,682 members.

Hospital schedules summer physicals

Because of the current physician staff shortage at the Hospital, two special dates have been set aside for summer physical examination of authorized personnel. Physicals will be given to meet the requirements for employment, school sports, college entrance, and summer camps.

Physicals will be given June 9 and Aug. 4, 8 a.m. to noon. Appointment for a June 9 physical should be made through the Central Appointment Desk, Monday through Friday, 2 to 4 p.m.

A urine specimen, a vaccination record, and the proper forms should be brought to the physical.

As this is not a treatment clinic, any conditions noted during the physical will have to be attended to by the regular clinics.

Information on the Aug. 4 physicals will be provided at a later day date. All persons under 18-years-old must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

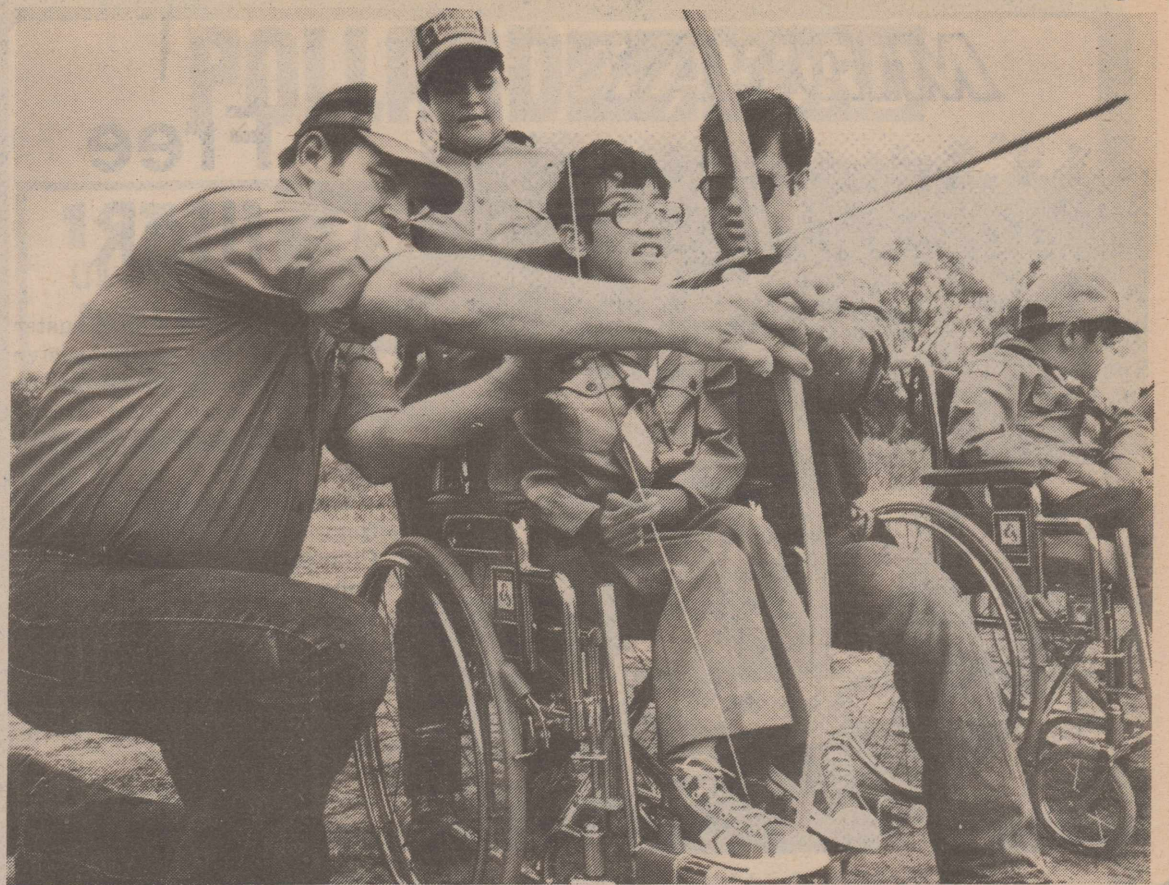

Handicapped enjoy camp

Earning merit badges in camping skills is not unusual for a Boy Scout, but doing it while confined to a wheelchair is another matter.

Boy Scout Troop 514 is the first troop in Lubbock set up especially for physically and mentally handicapped children. Last weekend the troop enjoyed its first camp-out: three days at Camp Post, a camping area for Scouts in the hilly canyons just off the West Texas Caprock.

Even a heavy rainstorm the second night out failed to dampen spirits, said TSgt. Harvey Schirmer, who organized the troop last November.

Another Air Force enlisted man who plays a major role in the troop is SrA Roger Carter. Both he and Sergeant Schirmer work in the T-37 Inspection Branch at Reese.

During the outing the two

men supervised retarded children and children severely crippled by muscular dystrophy through such activities as fishing, boating, archery, camp cooking, and nature studies.

"Some of these kids have never been camping in the country," said Airman Carter. "They're just amazed by some of the things they see out here."

Although some parents were reluctant to let their children go on the outing, Sergeant Schirmer said that he hopes last weekend's success will open the doors to many others. "They learned about camping, earned merit badges and got back in one piece," he said, "it's an experience they'll never forget."

The success of Troop 514 has made impressions in many places. Officials at Camp Post have indicated that many of the facilities there may be revamped to accommodate the handicapped.

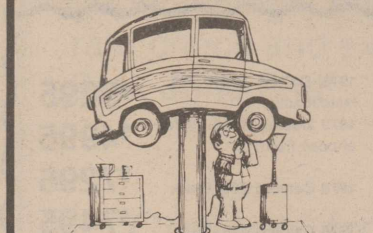

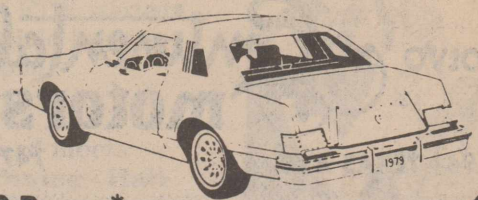

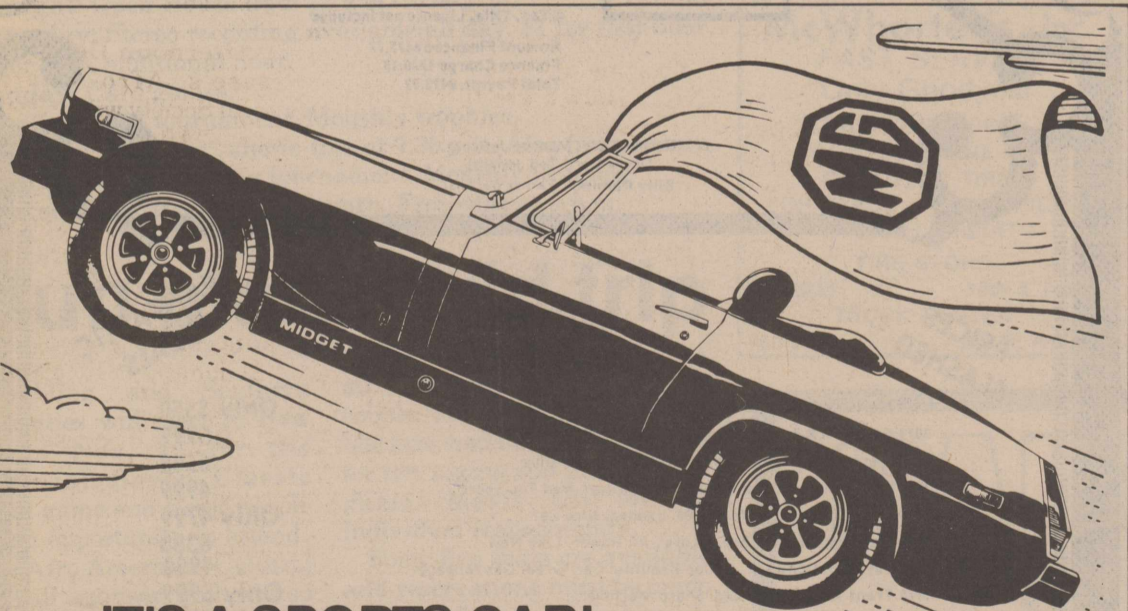

Family passes for all other swimmers are \$25 with individual passes going for \$7.50.

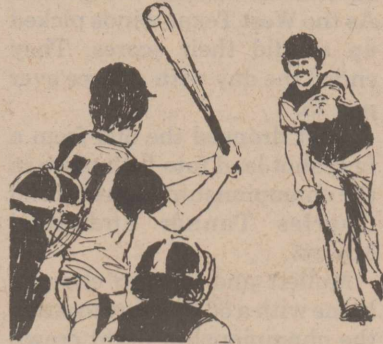
Daily swimming passes cost \$1 per person.

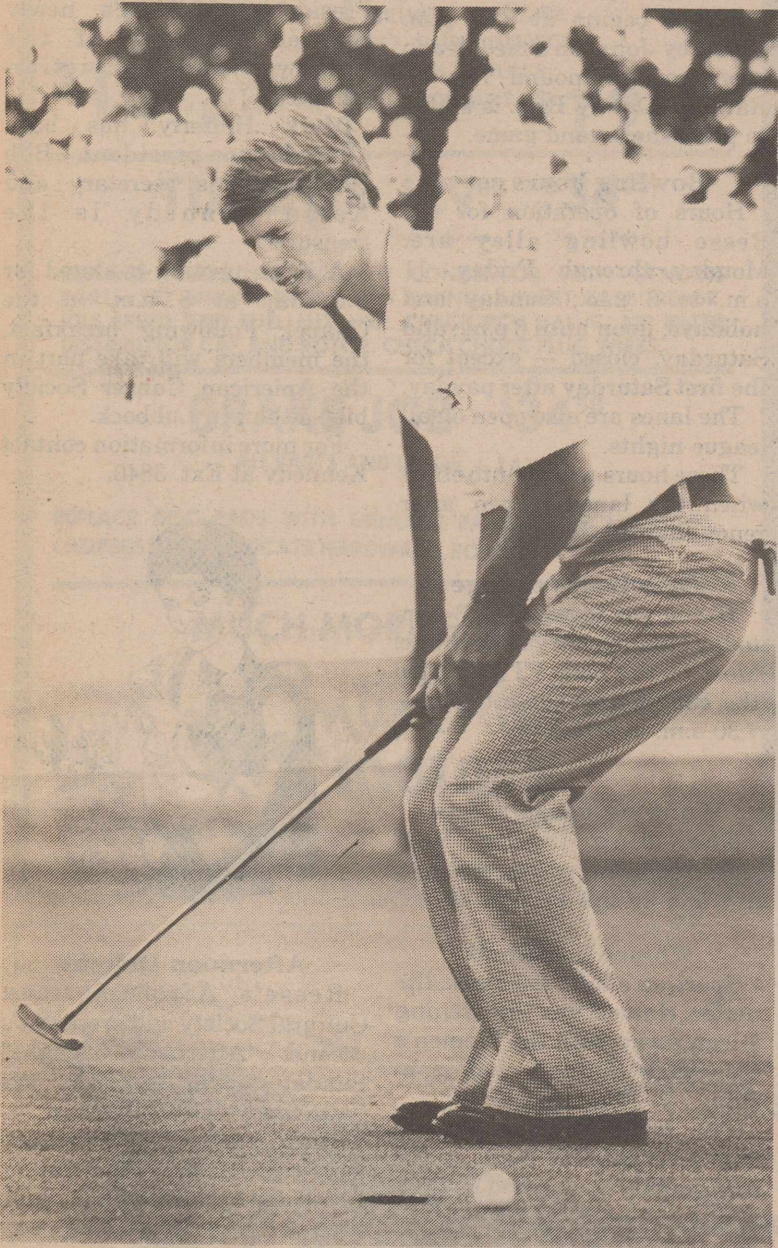


