Base installs utility system

To further efforts reducing utility costs, Air Training Command is implementing electric demand deferment systems which will include Reese's family housing.

With this system, a radio controlled on-off switch, activated by a central transmitter, is installed on air conditioning compressors.

"None of the control units have been installed at Reese, as yet," says Lt. Col. Hirum West, 64th Civil Engineering Squadron commander, "but the units are on order. It may be a couple of months before they are installed."

At times of peak electrical use, usually mid to late afternoon, compressors of air conditioning units in different groups of family housing units will be turned off for periods of about seven minutes. During the period the compressor is turned off, family housing occupants will experienced a minor

increase in temperature. In almost all cases circulating fans will continue to operate.

"This is not a move to take control of air conditioning away from housing unit occupants or to cause discomfort, but an effort to avoid high commercial charges for electric power during peak demand periods, says Colonel West. "With this system in operation an annual estimated savings of \$367,000 in electricity costs is expected at ATC bases."

The electric demand deferment system is already operating at numerous Air Force bases and an increasing number of public utility companies are also operating such systems for private homes.

"Though this effort will reduce the ever increasing costs of utilities, continued cooperation of on-base residents is needed to support the ATC, Air Force and national conservation program," stresses Colonel West.

Officers receive 'job swap' nod

A permissive assignment exchange program, similar to the one in effect for airmen for several years, will be established for officers by late summer.

According to Reese personnel officials, it will provide opportunities for similarly qualified officers to initiate reassignment to more desired jobs or locations without expense to the government.

Covered by an upcoming change to AFR 36-20, Officer Assignments, the program will permit two officers of the same grade, specialty and, if applicable, special experience identifier, to ask to trade assignment locations.

Assignment exchanges will require approval of the unit

commanders concerned and the Air Force Manpower and Personnel Center.

If either officer requires training to qualify for the other's assignment, the application will not normally be approved.

Only officers based in the continental United States will be eligible. All moving costs must be borne by the officers making the exchange.

It will be up to the individual officer to "find" another officer at another CONUS base who is willing to exchange assignments.



Recently, I had the honor and privilege to be a member of the Wing Below-the-Zone promotion board.

Other members included a Senior Master Sergeant, two master sergeants and a colonel as President.

Let me tell you, we saw some of the sharpest airmen first class in the Air Force. Their preparation to meet this board was obvious and their Airman Proficiency Reports were outstanding.

They deserve it!



Summer heat dangerous warns Reese physician

Heat stroke has been known for a long time.

It is mentioned in the Old Testament as occurring in the hot fields after physical exercise. Hundreds of fatal cases of heat stroke happen every summer and these are largely preventable.

The first most important factor in preventing heat stroke is to know your limitations. Get acclimatized to heat before starting strenuous exercise.

After that, there are many many DO's and DON'T's.

Don't: exercise during the hottest part of the day, don't get overly tired. Don't exercise if you don't feel well. Even simple diarrhea will predispose to heat stroke. And don't take salt tables; the salt on your food is enough. You should drink plenty of fluids. You should drink "til you slosh" then drink a little more. Almost any liquid except alcohol or coffee is OK. Stop to rest often. Wear light clothing and a hat. And get plenty of sleep before exercising.

If someone "faints" while exercising in the heat, suspect early heat stroke. Get them in the shade, fan them and if possible keep them wet. Get them to the hospital as soon as

Remember, too, that people can sweat during early heat stroke so don't delay getting help just because they are still

Enjoy yourself this summer but don't overdo. Drink lots of fluids and stay within your capabilities.







FTD develops tomorrow's AF

FTD 429 conducts the Able Chief Program, handling training, from three-level to crew chief, for Reese, Kirkland, AFB, N.M. and Beale AFB, Calif. It also supplies area support for Laughlin and other ACE bases.

With seven instructors, the FTD provides comprehensive training in several areas including egress systems, aerospace ground equipment, engine mechanics and aircraft maintenance technology.

Earning merit badges in camping skills is not unusual for a Boy Scout, but doing it while confined to a wheel chair is another matter.

During the outing the two

men supervised retarded children and children severely cripped by muscular dystrophy through such activities as fishing, boating, archery, camp cooking, and nature studies.

"Some of these kids have never been camping in the country," said Airman Carter. "They're just amazed by some of the things they see out here."

Although some parents were reluctant to let their children go on the outing, Sergeant Schirmer said that he hopes last weekend's success will open the doors to many others. "They learned about camping, earned merit badges and got back in one piece," he said, "it's an experience they'll never forget."

The success of Troop 514 has made impressions in many places. Officials at Camp Post have indicated that many of the facilities there may be revamped to accommodate the handicapped.
