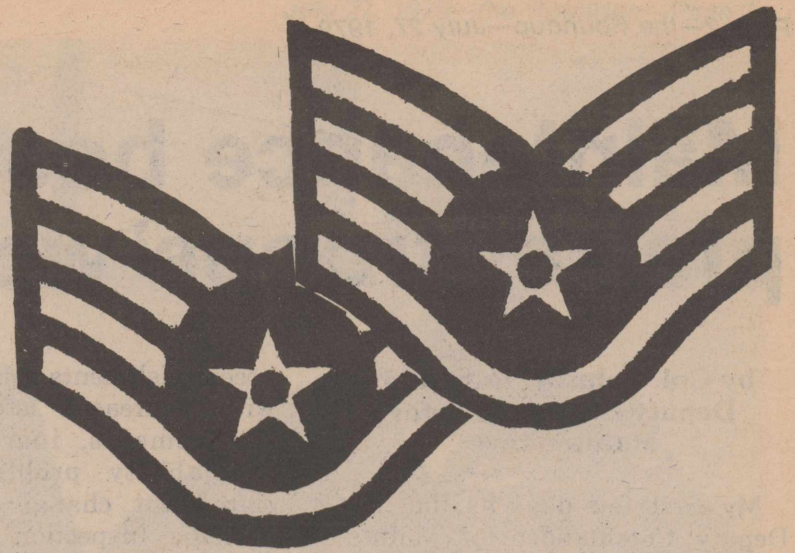

Reese plans spectacular open house

Jet age technology and the festive spirit of western pioneers will merge here next weekend when Reese hosts its annual open house and air show.

Performances by two of the military's top aerial demonstration teams and displays of some of the Air Force's most sophisticated aircraft and equipment will highlight flightline activities during the Aug. 4 and 5 spectacular.

Less than two blocks away at Founders Park, Reese salutes the people of the South Plains with special events such as a fiddlers contest, chili cookoff, moseying contest, barbecue dinner and street dance.

Flightline action

Headlining Reese's open house will be the soaring U.S. Air Force Thunderbirds. Slated for Aug. 5 at 3 p.m., the group's performance will feature precision flying by a four-ship squad and two solo pilots.

Performing both days of the open house will be the Navy's Parachute West Demonstration Team. Local Radio Controlled Model Aircraft will also be flown each day. On Aug. 4, local rocketeers will launch models in a scheduled 12:30 to 1 p.m. demonstration.

Hanger 82 will be filled with exhibits from various base organizations and area groups. Several military aircraft will be on static display in front of Base Operations. The two day civilian fly-in is expected to draw many civilian aircraft as well.

Family fun

Adding a holiday touch to the open house will be the family events slated for Founders Park.

A chili cookoff will be held from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Aug. 4. Deadline for entering the contest, which is worth qualifying points toward the World Championship at Terlingua, Texas later this year, is Aug. 3. My first few days as the new Deputy Commander for Maintenance for the 64th Flying Training Wing have more than matched my expectations that Reese is a super base with the best people in the Air Force.

I hope that everyone is as proud as I am to be a part of this wing and its mission. I have been part of maintenance organizations at other Air Training Command undergraduate pilot training bases in the past and the maintenance folks at Reese impress me as being among the most friendly, competent and dedicated I've met.

While I was still in-processing, I was briefed on the results of a two-day visit by members of the ATC logistics staff. They told me without hesitation that our aircraft were safe, reliable and in top condition.

All people within the maintenance work force should be justifiably proud of their

accomplishments this year. Faced with increased student sortie requirements, increased parts availability problems and a significant change in the T-38 Periodic Inspection System, our people achieved fine results.

For example, the T-37 ground abort rate in April, May and June was 1.6 percent or less. The T-38 Inspection Branch people and the Field Maintenance Squadron specialists who support them were required to complete twenty periodic inspections in June, five more than originally forecast. Self help programs are evident in many work centers and the biggest project will be evident when the DCM staff moves to Building 955.

These and future challenges require dedicated people who are not afraid to put forth that extra effort to improve an already great organization.

I am extremely proud to be at Reese. I want to be a part of the continued growth of this wing and welcome the opportunity to meet and work with all of you in the future.

Since there is a dispenser in front of the NCO Club and the Officers' Club for newspapers - I

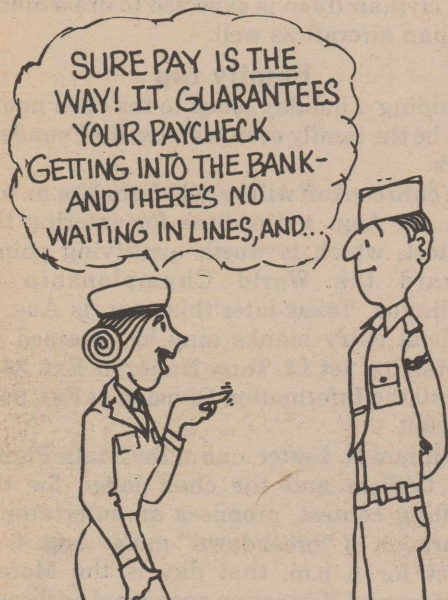
was wondering why there couldn't be one in front of the enlisted men's dining hall so that people going in for breakfast or whatever could buy a paper at that time.

Identification helps prevent many thefts

“Taking time to mark valuables may save money in the long run by greatly increasing the chances of regaining stolen property,” says SrA. Clay A. Reilly of the Security Police.

Operation Identification is sponsored by the Lubbock Crime Prevention Council in cooperation with Reese and Lubbock County law enforcement authorities.

Airman Reilly reminds Reese personnel that the SPs have many suggestions about protecting property from criminals. This information is particularly pertinent at this time of year when many people will be leaving home for vacations, points out Airman Reilly.

“There are a number of things you need to do,” he stressed, “but starting now (if you haven’t already), you need to participate in Operation Identification.”

“If you should be robbed and your valuables have been marked, the Security Police will enter the items with the National Crime Information Center which is very helpful in the recovery of stolen property,” says Reilly.

An engraver and an invisible ink marker may be obtained from the Security Police by calling Ext. 3614 or 3615. They will also supply the necessary forms to record what items have been marked and give “warning” stickers to be placed on doors and windows.

Carter sends Congress military retirement plan

A proposal to change the \$10 billion military retirement system and related compensation has been sent to the Congress by President Carter.

Defense Secretary Harold Brown said the proposal will reduce long-term military retirement costs by 25 percent, "will be fair to everyone" and produce the defense forces needed.

A key feature of the plan would give military personnel retirement rights after 10 years of service. The plan would also offer early withdrawal payments whether a uniformed man or woman remained on active duty or decided to leave. Severance pay would also be provided both officers and enlisted personnel. The current system provides severance pay only for officers.

Members on active duty at the time the proposals are approved would be permitted to choose either the old or the new system. Secretary Brown indicated many would choose the new system because of early withdrawal provisions and old-age provisions.

The current pay proposals grew out of recommendations made to President Carter in April 1978 by the President's commission on military compensation. The commission's recommendations have

been under review by the Pentagon and the White House and form the basis for the current proposal.

An outline of the present military retirement system and Department of Defense proposals for change follows.

Members currently get no retirement benefits unless they serve at least 20 years. Under the proposed changes, anyone who serves at least 10 years would become eligible for DoD old-age benefits beginning at age 60. Pensions would be comparable to those of the Federal Civil Service and would increase with length of service. Old-age benefits would be integrated with Social Security benefits similar to plans used in private industry.

Members completing at least 20 years of service would become eligible for retired pay immediately upon retirement. These rates are somewhat lower than levels in the current system, 37.5 percent compared to 50 percent for 20 years of service. The retiree would receive the retired pay adjusted for inflation until becoming eligible for old-age benefits at age 60. These benefits are approximately the same level as received today. At age 65 retirees would become eligible for Social Security benefits and adjusted military retired pay.

The early withdrawal option is considered one of the major attractions of the new system.

A member who has served 10 years could draw up to 10 months' "basic pay" against future retirement benefits whether remaining on active duty or leaving. This increases two months per year of service to a maximum benefit of 20 months.

A typical enlisted member could withdraw \$8,000 after 10 years or about \$20,000 at 15 years of service. However, the retired pay of those withdrawing the maximum amount and who eventually retire at 20 years of service would be reduced nine percent until age 60 when full old-age benefits would be received.

Persons leaving the service before 20 years have the choice of taking their earned early withdrawal or the old-age benefit. Individuals who make early withdrawals may pay back the amount within five years after leaving and have full benefits restored.

An option for the Department of Defense to change pay levels to meet personnel needs is also included in the proposal. Pay raises could be used to readjust the relative levels of pay among ranks as well as make changes adding pay and allowance under current law.

Additional travel time has been authorized people traveling on permanent-change-of-station moves in privately owned vehicles who experience delay enroute due to the gasoline crunch.

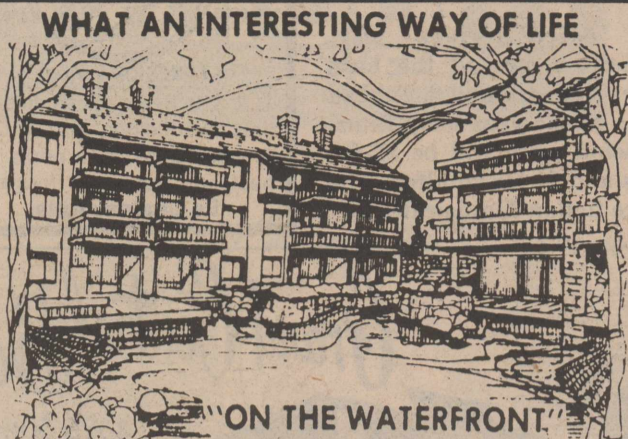
The change is effective immediately.

The Joint Travel Regulations now state, "Additional travel time may be authorized when

travel is delayed for reasons clearly beyond the control of the member, such as: acts of God, restrictions by governmental authorities, difficulties in obtaining fuel for privately owned conveyances or other reasons satisfactory to the member's new commanding officer.

"The amount of additional travel time so authorized may be the actual period of delay or

such shorter period as may be determined appropriate by the member's new commanding officer. The member will provide his new commanding officer with a full explanation of the circumstances which necessitated the delay and such explanation, together with the approval or disapproval of the commanding officer, will be appended to his travel voucher."

O'Neal earns degree; draws OTS selection

By day, SSgt. Darphus O'Neal, 64th Organizational Maintenance Squadron, works on the flight line. At night, he has been going to school and has recently completed a Bachelor of Science degree in business management from Wayland Baptist College.

"It hasn't been easy," he said, "especially for someone with a wife and two children, but it's been worth it."

Sergeant O'Neal began his college career five years ago by taking courses from the University of Maryland while serving in Europe. He completed 30 credit hours from Wayland Baptist at Reese and graduated with a 3.8 grade point average. From here he will travel to Lackland AFB for the 90 day OTS course, then go to Chanute AFB for Maintenance Officer School.

Sergeant O'Neal was one of eight graduates at Reese who were selected for Officer Training School so far this year. Fourteen have applied here and six are still pending before the selection board.

"That's one of the best selection rates ever here," say base education officials.

"OTS is more open than ever," said Education Services Officer bill Trafton. "The demand for degreed personnel has risen at an unprecedented rate after the almost complete shutdown of two years ago."

Educational opportunities at Reese are abundant. South Plains Junior College offers many technical courses plus courses in most general degree requirements. Wayland Baptist

College offers a diversified program in upper level courses toward a bachelor of science degree in occupational education. Community College of the Air Force offers a vast array of technical instruction. CCAF graduates gain associate applied science degrees.

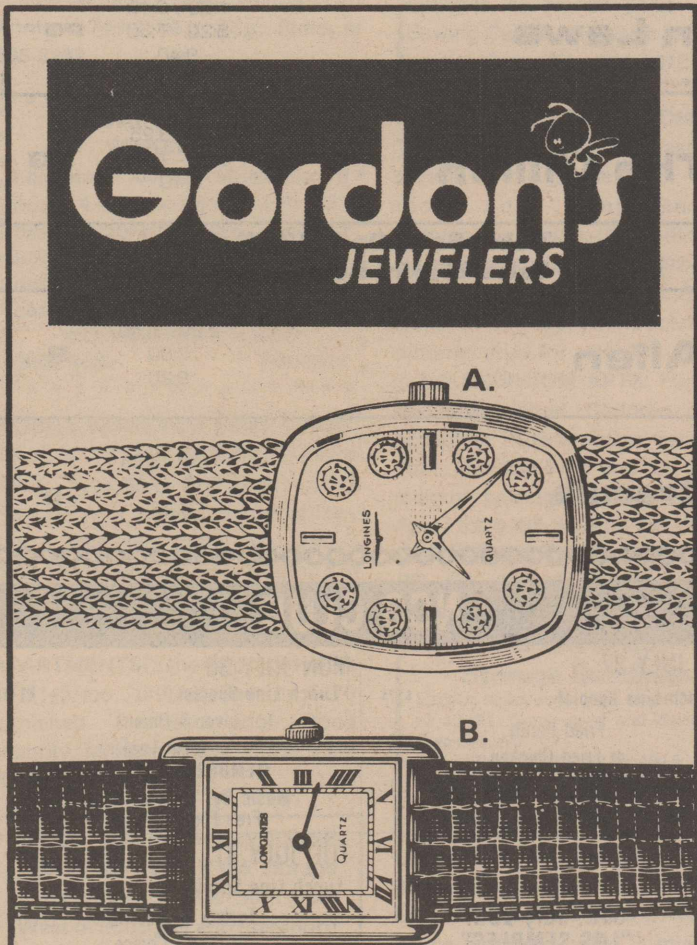
College work at the master's level can be done through the University of Northern Colorado. In addition, undergraduate courses are offered through the auspices of the University of Nebraska Medical School.

There are two major programs for financial support in education for Air Force personnel. Persons who entered the service before January 1, 1977, are eligible for benefits under the Veterans Administration GI Bill which will pay all tuition and fees. For those who do not qualify for the VA bill, three fourths of tuition can be financed by applying for Air Force Tuition Assistance.

their season mark to 12-6 by upsetting OMS, 14-13, in rain shortened league action.

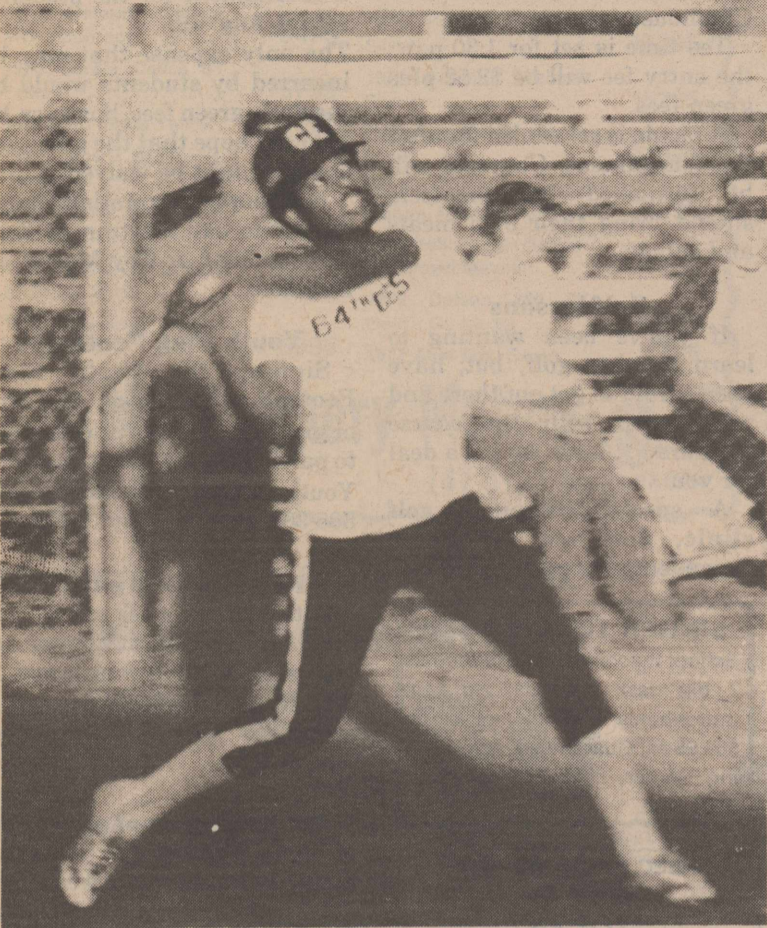
