## Taft tops UPT graduates

Second Lt. Dennis D. Taft, an Illinois Air National Guardsman, nabbed top honors during last week's graduation ceremonies for Reese Undergraduate Pilot Training Class 80-01.

The 24-year-old guardsman from Springfield, Ill., walked away with the Air Training Command Commander's Trophy, the Section-two Leadership Award and was named as one of five Outstanding Graduates. The ATC Commander's Trophy is presented to the top "all around" student in each class.

Lieutenant Taft is the first guardsman to win the prestigious Commander's Trophy since Second Lt. David P. Moffitt, Mississippi Air National Guard, did it when graduating with UPT Class 78-05.

Other award winners in last week's 51-member graduating class, the largest here in five years, included 2nd Lt. Dag N. Hogsveen and 1st Lt. William N. Herzog Jr. Lieutenant Hogsveen, a foreign student from Norway, earned the Flying Training Award and was named an Outstanding

Graduate. Lieutenant Herzog captured the Academic Training Award.

Rounding out the list of fledgling pilots named as Outstanding Graduates are 2nd Lt. Birger Austad, 2nd Lt. David S. Eidsaune and 2nd Lt. Dean G. Geig.

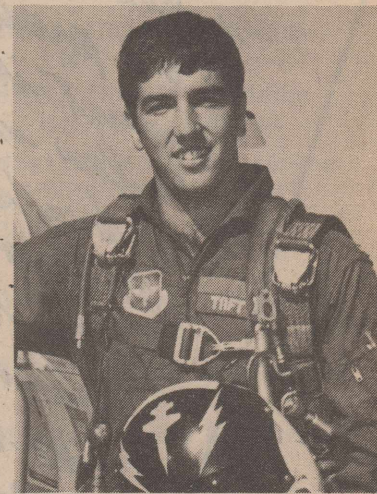
The Outstanding Second Lieutenant Award for Section-one went to 2nd Lt. Winston Churchill while 2nd Lt. Kevin J. Kennedy was named for the Section-two award. The Leadership Award for Section-one was presented to Capt. John M.

Byrne. Lieutenant Taft nabbed the Section-two honor.

Completing the parade of awards for UPT Class 80-01 was the presentation of the Outstanding Citizenship Award to 2nd Lt. Robert M. Huelskamp.

Lieutenant Huelskamp is one of 11 Class 80-01 grads who will remain at Reese as instructor pilots. Others are: 2nd Lt. Thomas A. Ball, 2nd Lt. Richard T. Deveraux, 2nd Lt. Gary L. Halbert, 2nd Lt. Marke F. Gibson, 2nd Lt. James H. Keaton II, Lieutenant Kennedy,

## Reese extends CFC campaign

Still holding out hope that Reese may yet reach its \$80,000 goal, Combined Federal Campaign officials have extended the drive's deadline through Wednesday.

According to Capt. Ron Bailey, CFC project officer, the local drive is holding at slightly more than \$72,000. The campaign was scheduled to end Nov. 2, but, because the base was still more than \$8,000 below the goal at the scheduled

deadline, the drive was extended 12 days.

Although Captain Bailey admits that the chances of reaching the goal appear slim, the thrust CFC workers are making now is to try and come as close to the target as possible.

Another point made by the project officer is that even though Reese hasn't reached this year's goal or the total donated by base people last year, contributions have

exceeded last year's goal by more than \$12,000.

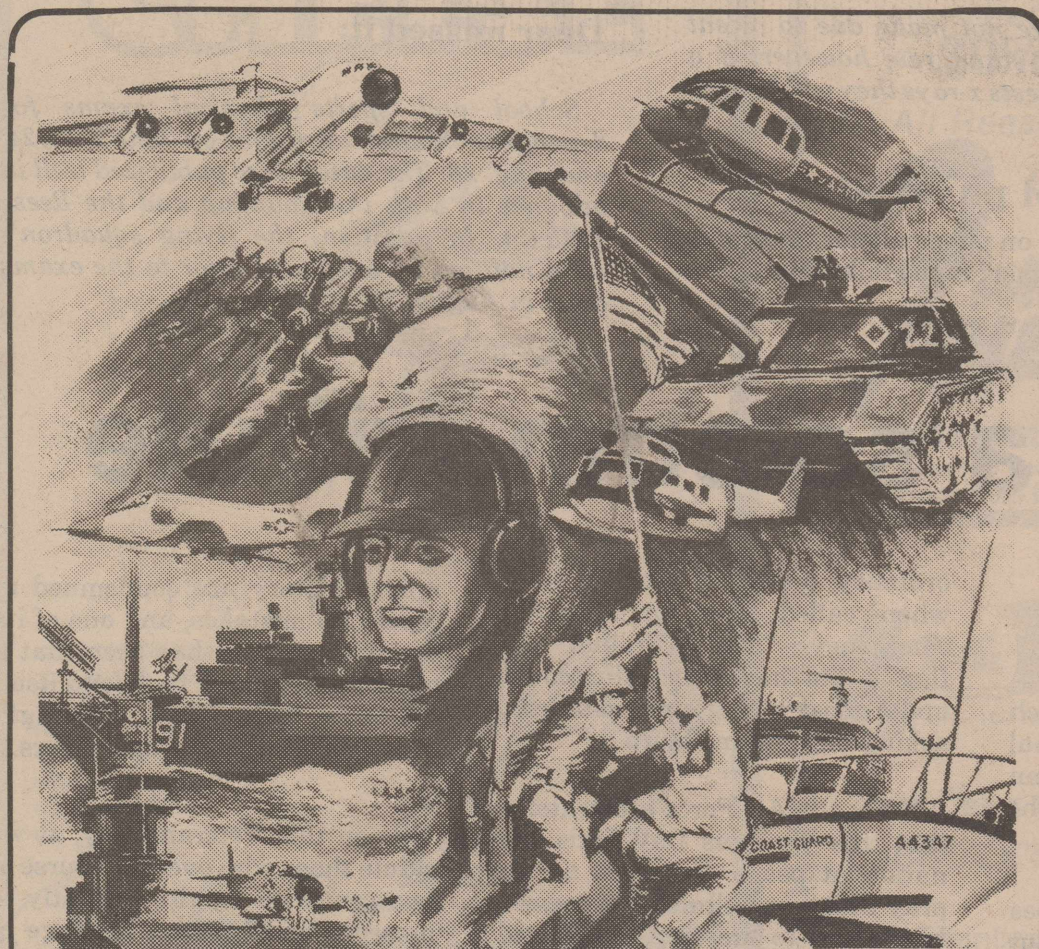
"When we set the unusually high goal this year we knew we were taking a big risk," explained Captain Bailey. "With inflation hitting each of us hard it's easy to understand why contributions tailed off this year."

For those who are interested in making or increasing a pledge in order to help Reese

over the top, loaned executives are available from each agency to take contributions. They are: Capt. Thomas W. Christensen — Maintenance and Field Training Detachment, Ext. 3424; Capt. (Dr.) Robert L. Crane — Hospital, Property Disposal and Office of Special Investigations, Ext. 3338; and Capt. Douglas Repaal, Air Base Group and the 1958th Communications Squadron, Ext. 3200.

Others are: 1st Lt. Stephen A. Headley—Wing staff, Ext. 3410; 1st Lt. Howard M. Johnson—Operations and Weather, Ext. 3354; and 2nd Lt. Glenn C. Jones—Resource Management, the Management Engineering Team and Base Exchange, Ext. 3299.

There are approximately 50 service organizations in the Lubbock area that benefit from the CFC.

## ATC declares November Alcohol Awareness Month

Gen. B.L. Davis, commander of Air Training Command, has declared November 1979 to be Alcohol Awareness Month in ATC. This annual observance is designed to make people more conscious of the problem caused by excessive alcohol consumption and by dependence on alcohol.

There have been many estimates as to the size of the problem. The most accepted estimate is that there are 10 million alcoholics in the United States today. In 1977, the Civil Service Commission and the National Council on Alcoholism agreed that of the approximately two million federal civilian employees, 6 percent or 120,000 "suffer from alcoholism or alcohol-related problems." The Rand Study conducted for the Air Force in 1977 estimated the problem as high as 14 percent of the Air Force population. Whatever estimate is used, the problem is large.

It is in response to the overall magnitude of the alcohol problem that the Air Force created its alcohol rehabilitation program. The heart of this program is early identification of those whose performance or conduct is adversely effected by their use of alcohol. Our experience shows that the earlier a person with an alcohol problem is identified, the better our chances of successfully treating that person.

The Saturday shuttle runs to the South Plains Mall will continue through Dec. 22.

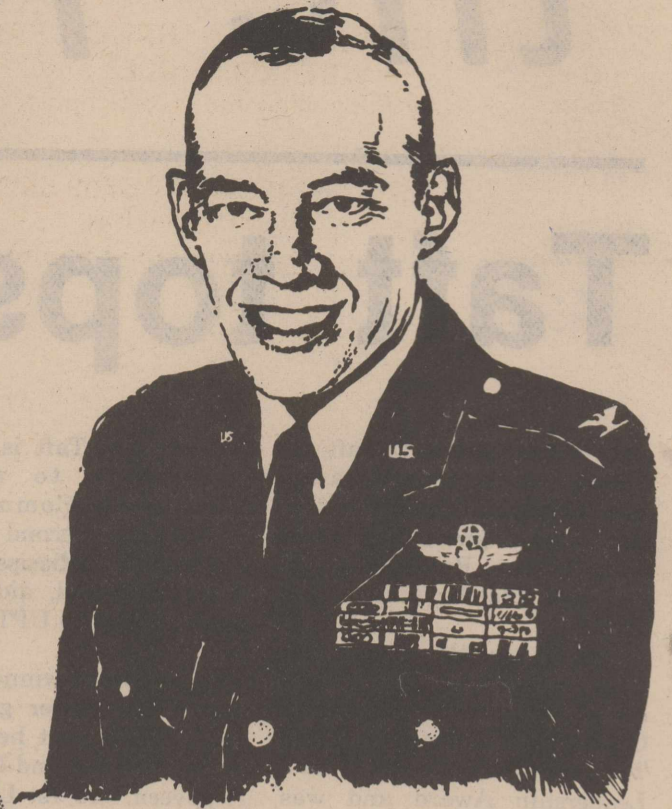

#### Dear dental care:

Dental care for dependents is provided as follows: All children between the ages of 5 and 18 (up to age 23 if in college) are seen on a yearly basis at which time complete check-up, cleaning, and fluoride treatment are given.

Routine x-rays are not made due to recent changes in OSHA standards; however, if a civilian dentist requests x-rays they will be done for any dependent.

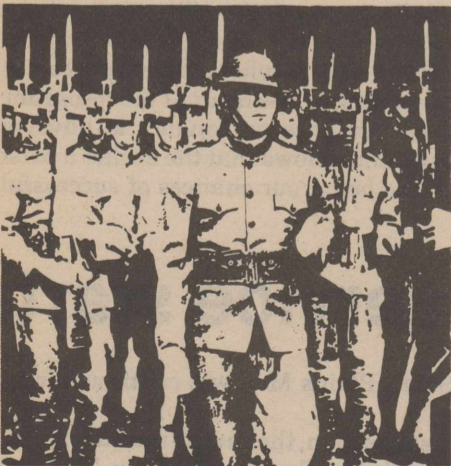
### School physicals

The Air Force Recruiter Assistance Program is keyed to finding and recruiting high quality people into the Air Force. It's a program that needs support from each Air Force member.

AFRAP leads can be potential enlistees, Officer Training School candidates, medical personnel or Reserve Officer Training Corps candidates.

Although the average bluesuiter doesn't have all of the specific information needed to provide counseling on the various Air Force programs, the recruiters do. The recruiter can fully explain the options open to future Air Force members. All recruiting officials ask is help in identifying prospective recruits. And recruiters have even made that easy for us. Lead Referral Cards are available in all units. The easy to fill out forms take only a few minutes to complete, and yet, the card may be one of the most productive recruiting tools the Air Force has.

The Air Force isn't asking anyone to peddle any phony hype about the Air Force. Just represent the Air Force openly and honestly to all of your friends and neighbors. Tell it like it is! ## What causes alcoholism?

November has been designated "Alcohol Awareness Month" for Air Training Command.

Awareness must be coupled with knowledge in order that any problem be recognized and

surmounted, this is certainly true of alcohol abuse:

What is Alcohol?

- Alcohol is a drug that depresses the central nervous system.

- Alcohol is ethyl alcohol - a colorless, inflammable liquid.

What affects does alcohol have?

- Alcohol first acts on those parts of the brain affecting self-control/learned behaviors.

- Large doses produce a dulling sensation and impairs: muscular coordination, memory and judgement.

- Prolonged use can damage: the liver, the heart and can cause permanent brain damage.

Why do people abuse alcohol?

- Drinkers use alcohol as an escape from the problems and stresses of everyday life and they depend on alcohol for relief.

Why does alcohol seem to affect different people differently?

- Individual physical, mental, and environmental factors such as how fast and how much a person drinks and their ability to structure their own drinking time vary from person to person.

How many Americans drink?

- About two-thirds of all adults drink at least occasionally.

- About half of all junior high school age children have tried alcoholic beverages.

Why do people drink?

- A variety of cultural, religious, medical, social, or personal reasons cause people to drink.

What can you do to prevent alcoholism?

- Become aware of your drinking habits, seek professional help and attend a local Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) Chapter.

I encourage everyone to visit the Base Library Alcohol Prevention and Information Display.

Our awareness, while focused during November, must extend through every day of every year. We here at Reese must help ourselves and others.

An Air Training Command program to prepare lieutenants for positions of increased responsibility is being tested at two command bases.

The program, Lieutenants' Professional Development Seminar, was conducted at Sheppard AFB, Texas last week and is scheduled for Chanute AFB, Ill., Nov. 26-30.

It was developed by the Lowry Technical Training

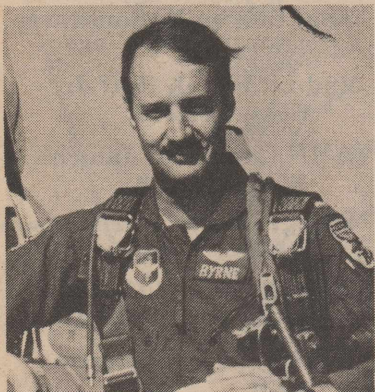
Center with the assistance of the Air University Leadership and Management Development Center. A recommendation for conducting such a base level leadership program was also made by the ATC commander's "Fresh Look" study group.

Need for the program was indicated since up to 40 percent of Air Force officers will be lieutenants in the 1980s.

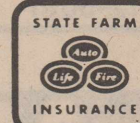

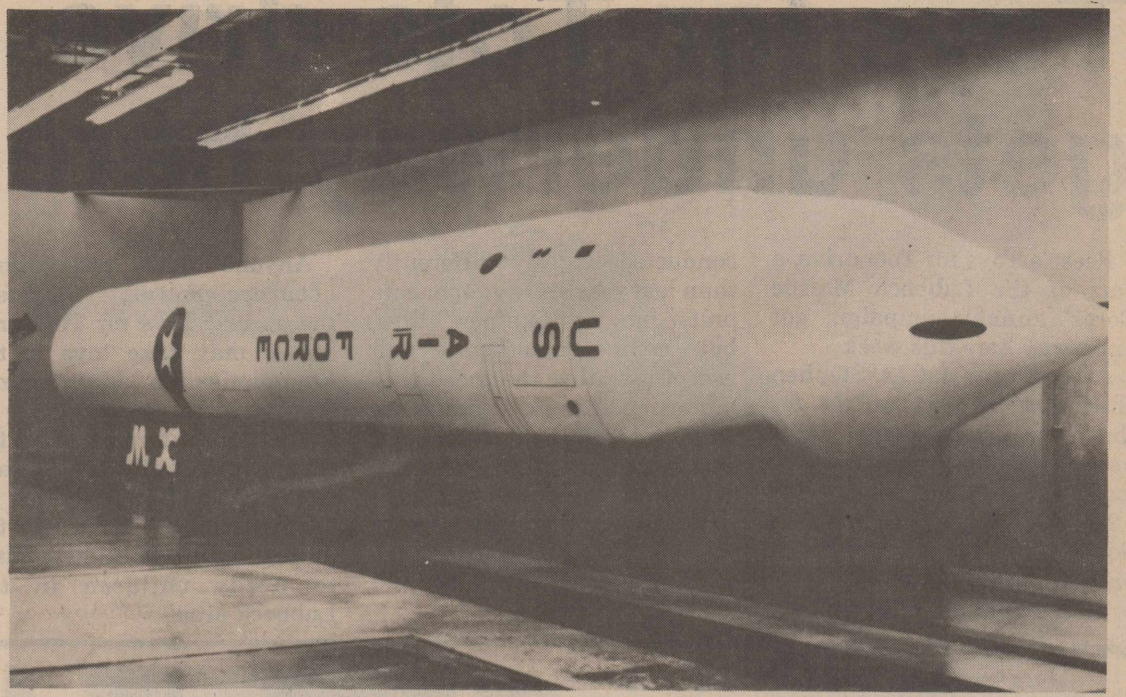

This year's campaign is being

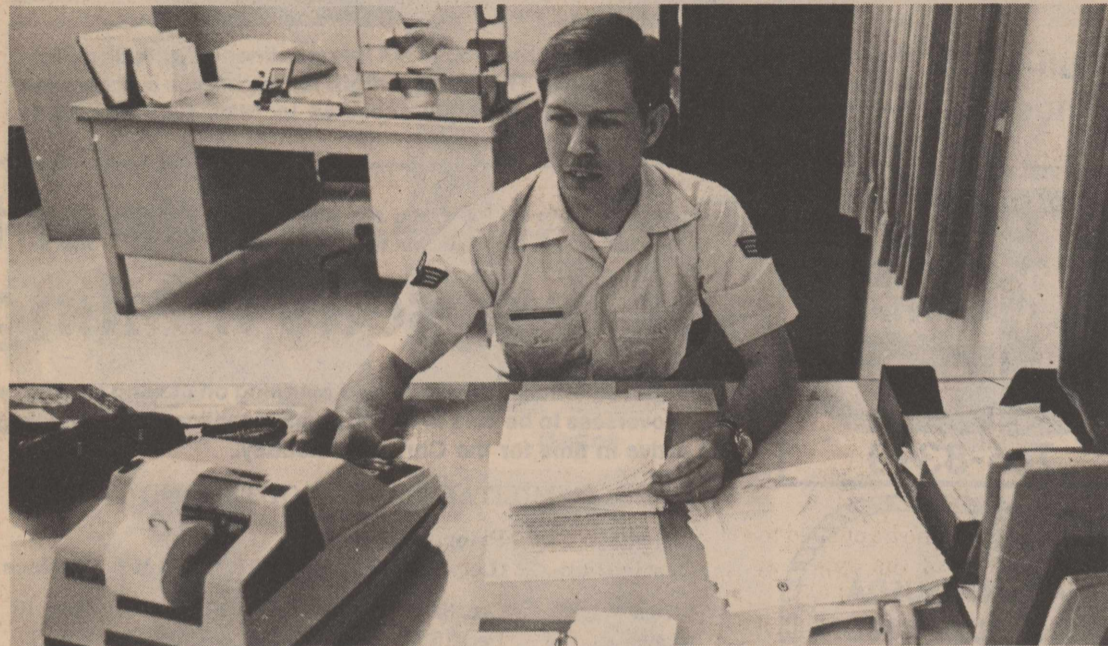
