hereas it is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor; and whereas both Houses of Congress have, by their joint Committee, requested me to recommend to the people of the United States a day of Public Thanksgiving and Prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many and signal favors of Almighty God, especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness;

"Now therefore, I do recommend and assign Thursday, the twenty-sixth day of November next, to be devoted by the people of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being, who is the Beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be; that we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our sincere and humble thanks for His kind care and protection of the people of this country, previous to their becoming a nation; for the signal and manifold mercies, and the favorable interpositions of His providence, in the course and conclusion of the late war; for the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty, which we have since enjoyed; for the peaceable and rational manner in which we have been enabled to establish Constitutions of Government for our

safety and happiness, and particularly the national one now lately instituted; for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed, and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge; and, in general, for all the great and various favors, which He has been pleased to confer upon us."

"And, also, that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations, and beseech Him to pardon our national and other transgressions; to enable us all, whether in public or private stations, to perform our several and relative duties properly and punctually; to render our National Government a blessing to all the people, by constantly being a government of wise, just, and constitutional laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed; to protect and guide all sovereigns and nations (especially such as have shown kindness to us,) and to bless them with good governments, peace and concord; to promote the knowledge and practice of true religion and virtue, and the increase of science, among them and us; and, generally, to grant unto all mankind such a degree of temporal prosperity as He alone knows to be best."

join with others in the churches and synagogues throughout this great nation to give thanks.

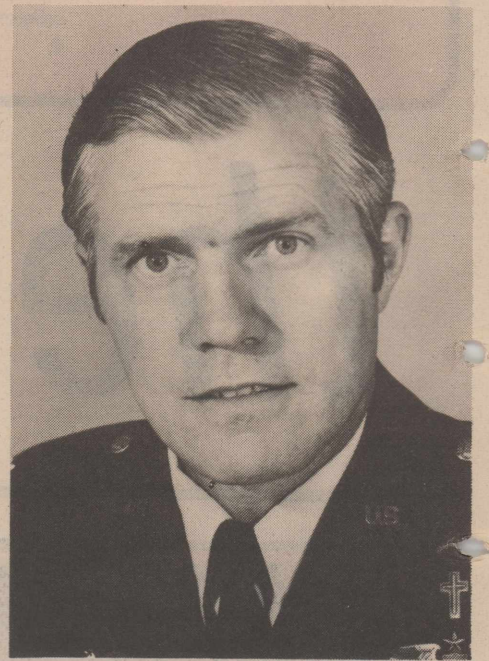

surrounded by danger and would soon face another siege of frigid weather.

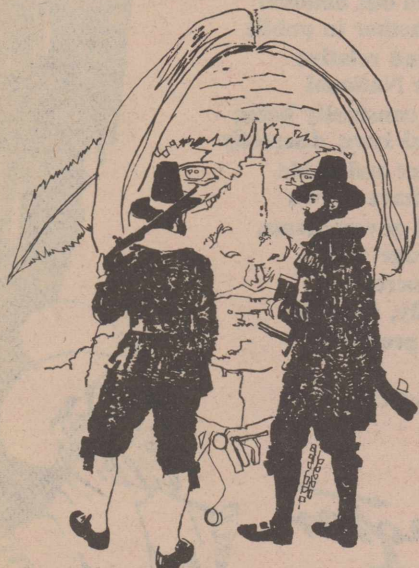
Their reasons were simple: They gave thanks because they had just reaped their first harvest and were alive to enjoy its fruits.

Holiday breaks offer opportunity to register

Along with seeing friends and family during the Thanksgiving and year-end holidays, service members can take an important step that will save time in voting during the 1980 election year.

"While you're home, register to vote," advised Henry Valentino, assistant director of the Federal Voting Assistance Program.

"Although most states now make it easier for members of the armed forces and their families to register and vote absentee, the best method to insure you are on the books is to register in person."

Not all states require prior registration or apply the same registration requirements. But 35 states, along with Puerto Rico, Guam, the District of Columbia and the Virgin Islands, do require registration before voting.

If you are required to register and you will be home during the holidays, call your county or town clerk for details on registration, Mr. Valentino said.

Depending on your state's election laws, you even may be able to request that an absentee

ballot be sent to you for upcoming state primary and general elections.

"Local election officials understand the problems of service people," Mr. Valentino said, "and they will do whatever they can to help you get an absentee ballot."

States which do not require advance registration are: Arkansas, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Wisconsin, Wyoming, Rhode Island, Pennsylvania and Utah.

ADC gives tips on billing errors

In today's world of convenience increased use of catalog sales and credit card purchases contribute to billing problems. How you handle a billing error can either correct the problem simply or lead to legal assistance appointments and increased finance charges.

Protection for the credit customer can be found in the Fair Credit Billing Act. The law gives you up to 60 days to bring a billing error to the attention of the creditor.

Here are some simple rules to follow when writing:

- Read the statement (bill) and instructions on it carefully.
- Do not write on the statement, but write a separate letter.
- Save copies of all bills and correspondence.
- Send your letter to the

address given on the statement.

- Identify yourself by name and account number.
- State clearly and concisely the nature and amount of the billing error.
- State why you think it is an error.

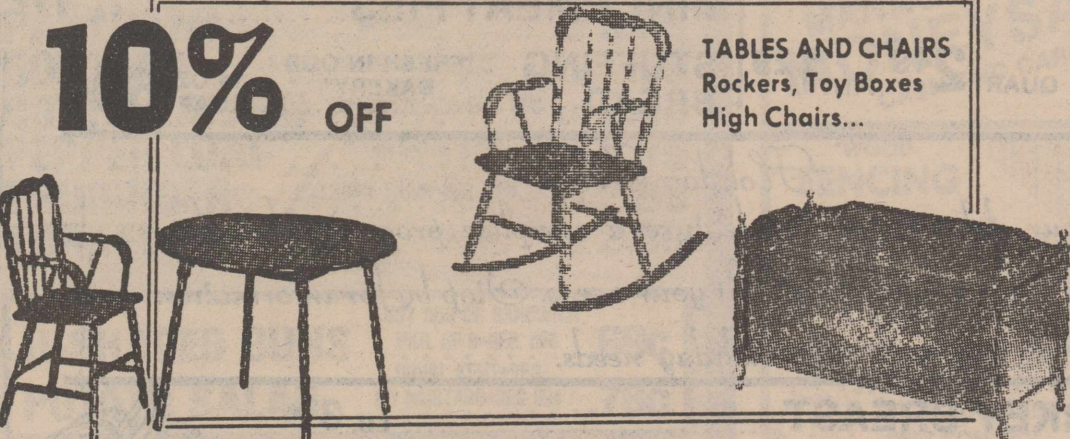
The creditor must acknowledge your letter within 30 days of receipt. Within two billing cycles (no more than 90 days), the creditor must either correct the account and give you notice of the correction or send a written explanation why you are mistaken.

While all this is happening the creditor can and will continue to bill you, but may not close or restrict your account nor may the creditor report or threaten to report your account adversely to a credit bureau.

If there's no response, or if you disagree with the creditor's explanation, call Ext. 3505 for an appointment with a legal assistance attorney.

71 return to duty

Seventy-one Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve officers have been offered the opportunity to return to active duty.

Seventeen lieutenants, 48 captains and six majors were selected by the second fiscal 1980 Voluntary Return to Extended Active Duty Board. Twenty-eight are pilots, nine

are navigators and 34 are in support areas.

To date, 132 have been selected for return to active duty in fiscal 1980. Sixty-one officers were selected by the July board. Air National Guard and Reserve officers who wish to be considered for return to active duty should contact the Air Reserve Personnel Center,

Denver, Colo., at their toll-free number (800) 525-1964 for complete details.

All Guard and Reserve officers are eligible. Greatest needs are for pilots, navigators, engineers and others with technical backgrounds, with less than seven years' service and less than a four-year break since leaving active duty.

To 11.5 percent

VA insures loans

The Veterans Administration has raised the maximum interest rate permitted on home loans it insures to 11.5 percent.

The move, effective immediately, was linked to the same increase by the Federal Housing Administration on loans it insures.

"It's simple economics," a HUD official said. He explained

that the full percentage point increase was necessary to keep these loans attractive to investors in a market where the conventional loan rate is already in the 11.5-to-12-percent range.

Without the increase "people who invest their money would go to other investments," the spokesman said.

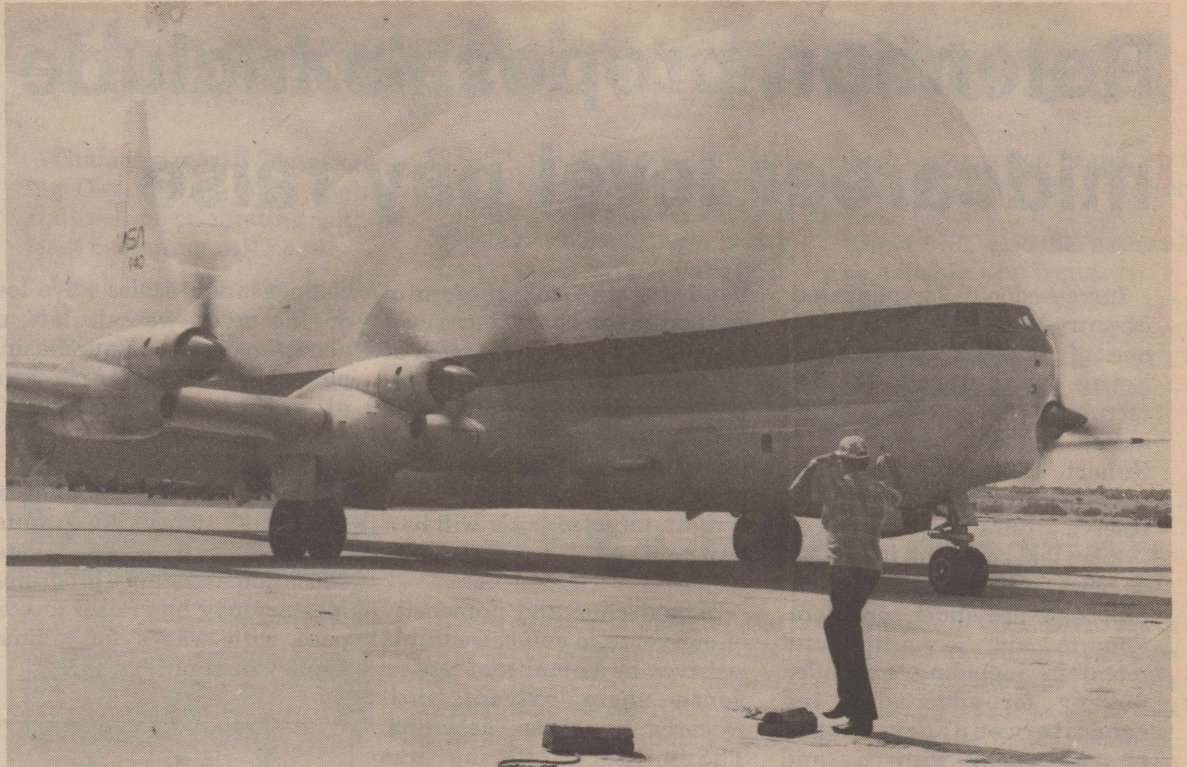

The team, with hopes of matching the tremendous success of "The First Step," the film history of ATC, is working on a 30-minute film commemorating the 50th anniversary of Randolph.

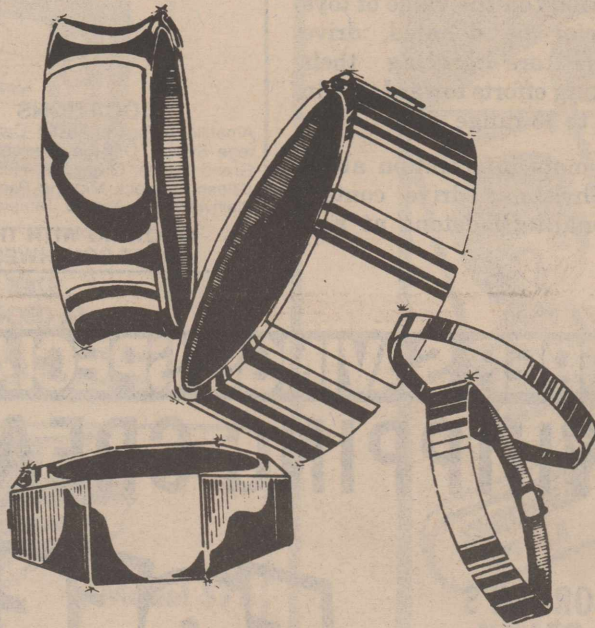

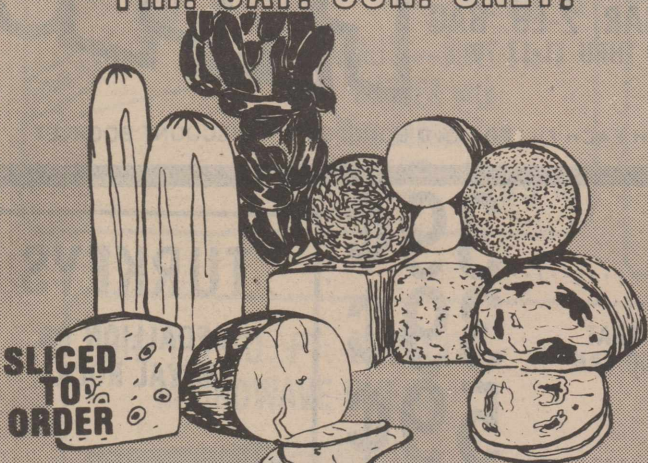

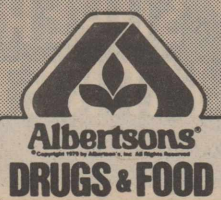

Retention proposals include midcareer level pay raise

Increased pay for midcareer or entry-level service people is one of a series of proposals being considered to aid recruiting and retention in the armed forces, according to Robert B. Pirie, assistant secretary of defense, manpower, reserve affairs and logistics.

Pirie told reporters in an Oct. 25 news conference that several proposals are under consideration to aid recruiting and retention including expanded funding for advertising and recruiter support. Other proposals dealt with pay and benefits for military members.

"We are going to look at a general pay increase, although

it may try not to take the form of an across-the-board increase," he said. "It may be targeted at specific, say, midcareer or entry-level people. At the moment we pay less than minimum wage for entry-level people. It will be, I think if we do it right, targeted but it will be a pay proposal."

"The decline and propensity of our youth to enlist, we think, is driven by a number of causes: youth unemployment until recently has been declining. The military offering has become relatively less attractive.

"By that I mean our

compensation scales have lost on the order, we calculate, of about 7 percent real purchasing power since the beginning of the all-volunteer force. That's across the board.

"Postservicemilitary education benefits available are not as valuable today and must compete with other federal education assistance programs. Military pay has failed to keep pace with wages for civilian employment alternatives."

Annual drive needs new, repairable toys

With the 1958th Communications Squadron again sponsoring the base effort, campaign officials have set up 25 toy drop sites at Reese.

"We are looking for new or used toys in easily repairable

condition," explained 1st Lt. Stephen Gladstone, campaign project officer.

Although there are no limitations on the value of toys that can be donated, drive officials are gearing their recruiting efforts toward toys in the \$2 to \$5 range.

Command honors McIntire

With inflation continuing to diminish purchasing power, every military installation needs a good budget officer. Reese is fortunate to have the best in the Air Training Command.

Last week, Daniel A. McIntire, Reese budget officer, was named as the outstanding budget officer in the Air Training Command for 1979. He was presented the award Nov. 7 by Col. Richard A. Ingram, 64th Flying Training Wing commander.

Before presenting McIntire with the ATC plaque symbolizing his "outstanding" performance, Colonel Ingram lauded the 45-year-old civilian employee for years of dedicated service here.

McIntire has been working at Reese since 1958 when he was an Air Force staff sergeant working in the accounting and finance office. One year later he left the service and started as a civilian employee in the same office.

In the years since, he has worked in the budget office and in Maintenance. McIntire has been Reese's budget officer since January, 1976.

Maj. Roy Markle, Reese comptroller, cited the Portsmouth, N.H. native for his detailed knowledge of the wing mission and his ability to meet mission needs within Reese's budget.

"McIntire's reputation for honesty and the openness of his working relations has been a primary factor in the establishment of a high level of credibility with base financial managers," noted Major Markle.

An example of McIntire's top notch work, noted Major Markle, is the funding analysis report prepared for Reese commanders and Air Training Command headquarters. Recently command Management Effectiveness Team members were so impressed with the report that they sent copies to other ATC bases to be used as models for funding analysis reports there.

Yet another example of McIntire's initiative, is the study he recently completed on the Accelerated Pilot Enrichment Program. If adopted, his recommendations could save an estimated \$100,000 per year at Reese. Even greater savings are anticipated from command wide adoption.
