Motivated Texans engaged in classroom teaching or actively involved in 4-H youth youth involved in development programs are encouraged to enroll. Those involved in youth programs other than 4-H or the Texas education system (i.e. public or private schools) may also apply, but will be considered for participation on a space available basis. Since enrollment is limited, early sign up is recommended. The registration deadline is May 24, 1996 or at such time the enrollment limit is reached, whichever comes first.
