This may be pleasurable for people who have lots of time on their hands, but when your idle hours are limited to weekends, the pleasures㲘 however. Mulch controls weeds by smothering them, traps moisture in the soil by keeping it cool, and attracts earthworms, those great unpaid garden workers. Dense planting is another important strategy. Space flower closer together than recommended. Without water there will be
no garden..which may be a problem for gardeners who are not there to man the hose. Fortunately, there are several helpful gadgets on the market to do the work for you. Soaker hoses or a drip irrigation system delivers water exactly where it it needed--the roots of plants. By keeping
leaves dry, either system helps control the sread of leaves dry, either system helps control the spread of diseases and conserve water as well, because they do not drench paths and
driveways. Soaker hoses work best when placed beneath a layer of mulch. Battery-operated timers connecting the tap to a watering system
help to keep soil moisture at an optimum level. help to keep soil moisture at an optimum level.
Don't be afraid to remove the first flowers of annuals either store-
bought or home-grown. Fuller plants will be bought or home-grown. Fuller plants will be your reward. Plants
develop better root systems if they are not trying to put out flowers the same time.
Before you prune flowering shrubs and vines, find out whether
hey're blooming on new wood or last year's branches. If the latter, they're blooming on new wood or last year's branches. If the latter,
pruning could destroy the following years blooms.

Don't cut foliage from bulbs that have flowered, but do remove the spent flowers. Allow foliage to wither and die naturally, restoring energy
to the bulbs which will produce next year's flowers. If yeu dind look of ripening foliage, plant perennials such as daylillies and hostas nearby. Their foliage will emerge and hide the dying bulbs.
Don't wait to place supports around newly planted (or emerging)
perennials like peonies and other potential "floppers" if you want them perennials like peonies and other potential "floppers" if you want them
to look natural. The new shoots will trow through the to look natural. The new shoots will grow through the supports and mechanics.
Fertilizing a garden is a must..there are new products on the market
that fertilize and controls weeds at the same time on the side of fertilizers or an accompanying leaflets should be read carefully, not all plants will tolerate these fertilizers with weed control.
Garden pests....always be on the lookout for these pesky garden
invaders. Certain plants such as allysum, kale, cabbage and other plants are very susceptible to these garden pests. Periodic treatment is necessary in almost any garden. FOLLOW THE DIRECTIONS ON THE CHEMICAL LEAFLET...if it says to use 3 tablespoonfuls, 6 will NOT work any better. As you stroll through your garden, watch for any

Just How Dry Is It?
Editors Note: This article wa ken out of "The Dryline" publication published by the
National Weather Service, NWSO Amarillo, Texas Texas and Oklahoma Pa
Unlike other forms of sever eather, drought lasts for a much longer period of time. This can make it more difficult to cope with for area residents. The cause of this dry spell can be linked to
several different theories, but the most basic reason is that there jus has not been any moisture for the storm systems that pass through the region to work with. One o moisture over the area in recen months is explained by Ed Andrade, lead forecaster a Weather Forecast Office in
Amarillo, TX. According to Ed, a major contributing factor to our current dry spell here in the Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles is the cooler than normal sea surface waters of the Pacific Ocean. Sea surface temperatures in this region have been averaging approximately one degree Celsius
below normal since late fall of 1995. This trend has persisted into April 1996.
Such a phenomenon has temporally altered the prevailing
flow in the upper levels of the low in the upper levels of the
tmosphere. The net result is that throughout the fall of 1995 into early spring 1996, the northwest Uned siates has been wetter tates extending into the southern? high plains, including the Texas nd Oklahoma Panhandles have een drier than normal, while the een colder than normal. Finally, he eastern United States has een colder and wetter than normal. This type of weather United States during periods when sea surface temperatures in the equatorial Pacific Ocean are ignificantly cooler than normal, ays Andrade. The latest official sea surface equatorial Pacific Ocean issued by the national Climatic Prediction Center in Washington D.C. On
April 18, 1996, calls for slightly below normal sea surface emperatures in that region into at moderating temperatures into the pcoming fall and return near normal conditions by the end of this year. Should this forecast etify, then a trend towards more may begin to evolve over the United States starting late this spring or during
