

The results of the Texas Department of Transportation's (TxDOT's) route study to connect nterstate 27 in Amarillo with the Texas state line to the north and Interstate 27 in Lubbock to Interstate 10 will be the topic of an open house and public meeting in Lubbock May 14, 1996. The open house begins at 4 p.m. with the public meeting following at 7 p.m. Both events


will be at the Lubbock Memorial Civic Center, 1501 Sixth Street in Lubbock. The study team will present the analysis process for corridor feasibility and the results of the process. A recommendation for either a single freeway or two highways north of Amarillo and either a single freeway or three highways south of Lubbock will be presented.

Exhibits and maps will be displayed at the open house and members of the study team will be available to discuss the project leisurely with members of the public from 4:00 to 7:00. minutes, you will be allowed to submit a more comprehensive written statement to supplement your verbal comments. There will be no responses to comments at the public meeting. Citizens with questions for the project team are encouraged to attend the open house prior to the public meeting.







Fertilizing a garden is a must..there are new products on the market that fertilize and controls weeds at the same time. Information printed on the side of fertilizers or an accompanying leaflets should be read carefully, not all plants will tolerate these fertilizers with weed control.

Garden pests...always be on the lookout for these pesky garden invaders. Certain plants such as allysum, kale, cabbage and other plants are very susceptible to these garden pests. Periodic treatment is necessary in almost any garden. FOLLOW THE DIRECTIONS ON THE CHEMICAL LEAFLET...if it says to use 3 tablespoonfuls, 6 will NOT work any better. As you stroll through your garden, watch for any change in your plants; leaf changes, powdery substances on leaves, aphids, mites, caterpillars, grasshoppers, etc. Any of these garden pests can wreak havoc in your garden, be alert at all times.

The most enjoyable aspect of gardening is watching your plants flourish under your care. You'll soon find yourself partaking in a daily ritual of strolling through the garden, pruning a plant here and there and making mental notes on changes for next year's garden. Enjoy yourself, it can be relaxing and so rewarding.

this dry spell can be linked to several different theories, but the most basic reason is that there just has not been any moisture for the storm systems that pass through the region to work with. One of the reasons for the lack of moisture over the area in recent months is explained by Ed Andrade, lead forecaster at Weather Forecast Office in Amarillo, TX. According to Ed, a major contributing factor to our current dry spell here in the Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles is the cooler than normal sea surface temperatures in the equatorial waters of the Pacific Ocean. Sea surface temperatures in this region been averaging have approximately one degree Celsius below normal since late fall of 1995. This trend has persisted into April 1996.

Such a phenomenon has temporally altered the prevailing flow in the upper levels of the atmosphere. The net result is that throughout the fall of 1995 into early spring 1996, the northwest United States has been wetter than normal. The southwestern states extending into the southern high plains, including the Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles have been drier than normal, while the northern and central plains have been colder than normal. Finally, the eastern United States has been colder and wetter than normal. This type of weather pattern is fairly typical for the United States during periods when sea surface temperatures in the equatorial Pacific Ocean are significantly cooler than normal, says Andrade.

The latest official sea surface temperature forecasts for the equatorial Pacific Ocean issued by the national Climatic Prediction Center in Washington D.C. On April 18, 1996, calls for slightly below normal sea surface temperatures in that region into at least early June, with slowly

moderating temperatures into the upcoming fall, and a return to near normal conditions by the end of this year. Should this forecast vefify, then a trend towards more "normalized" weather patterns may begin to evolve over the United States starting late this spring or during the summer. Only time will tell.


