Tornado-Plan To Survive

You are at home for the evening with your family and brewing, so you turn on the

tornado warning has been issued for your area. You and your Everyone knows where to go; they

in the basement to wait out the This is a textbook scenario
But we all know that most times simply doesn't work that way Your home may not have
basement, or you may not even be
at home. In fact, your family may at home. In fact, your family may
be scattered in several locations.
Even if you are Even if you are at home, you can't
always rely on weather reports to warn you of an approaching
tornado, because conditions lornado, because conditions
change so quickly. Tornadoes can
occur without watning occur without warning, or you may
be out or range of emergency be out or range of emergency
sirens. That's why it is important
to be alert to changing weather, to be alert to changing weather,
using broadcast information along using broadcast information along
with your own senses and
experience to know when to take cover. That's why you should
know the basics of tornado safety know the basics of tornado safety
so that you can plan to survive! so that you can plan to survive!
The safest place to be during a
tornado is tornado is underground,
preferably under something sturdy preierabiy a werk bench. If there's no
like
basement or cellar in your home basement or cellar in your home, a
small room in the middle of small room in the middle of the closet-is best. The more walls between you and the outside, the
better. Residents in mobile homes,
even those with tiedowns, should seek safe shelter elsewhere at the first sign of severe weather. While
mobile homes can be attractive alternatives to traditional homes,
they also may be more vulnerable they also may be more vulnerable
to damage from high winds. Go to damage from high winds. Go to friend or relative ahead of time to see if you can go to their house
when the weather turns bad when the weather turns bad. As a
last resort, go outside and lie flat last resort, go outside and lie flat
on the ground with your hands
over your head and neck. Be alert over your head and neck. Be alert
for flash floods that often
accompany such storms. accompany such storms. Tarnadoes can toss cars-even Never try to outrun a tornado. If you see a funnel cloud or hear a
tornado WARNING issued tornado WARNING issued on the
radio or by siren, get out of your radio or by siren, get out of your
vehicle and seek a safe structure or lie down in a low area with your hands covering the back of your flash floods.
Be aware of emergency shelter
plans in office buildines, plans in office buildings, shopping
malls, and schools you and your family frequent. If a specific
shelter area does not exis. shelter area does not exist, move
into interior hallways or into interior hallways or small
rooms on the building's lowest level. Avoid areas with glass and wide, freespan roofs. If you can't
get into a basement or designated get into a basement or designated
shelter, move to the center of the shelter, move to the center of the
lowest level of the building, away from windows, and lie flat.
Besides knowing what to do in
various situations, you should know the difference between a
watch and a warning. A "Tornado Watch" simply
means conditions are favorable means conditions are favorable
for tornadoes to develop. Be alert for changing weather--that's what a "watch" is all about. Tornadoes
often--but not always-occur conjunction with a severe thunderstorm producing hail. If
you have any indication that a you have any indication that a
tornado may be approaching, take cover immediately. DO NOT
WAT FOR A WARNING TO BE ISSUED.
A "Tornado Warning" means a tornado has actually been sighted.
Realize that tornadoes can be Realize that tornadoes can be
deadly and devastating storms, with wind up to to 260 miles per
hour. If a tornado WARNING is issued for your area: Seek shelter emergency siren sounds to start grabbing supplies and thinking about what you should do. Plan
ahead when it comes to tornadoes. Take responsibility for your own safety. Plan to survive.
