



Besides knowing what to do in various situations, you should know the difference between a watch and a warning:

A "Tornado Watch" simply means conditions are favorable for tornadoes to develop. Be alert for changing weather--that's what a "watch" is all about. Tornadoes often--but not always--occur in conjunction with a severe thunderstorm producing hail. If you have any indication that a tornado may be approaching, take cover immediately. DO NOT WAIT FOR A WARNING TO

A "Tornado Warning" means a tornado has actually been sighted. Realize that tornadoes can be deadly and devastating storms, with winds up to 260 miles per hour. If a tornado WARNING is issued for your area: Seek shelter immediately! Don't wait until an emergency siren sounds to start grabbing supplies and thinking about what you should do. Plan ahead when it comes to tornadoes. Take responsibility for your own safety. Plan to survive.






