

Half-Cent Sales Tax Proposition Slated For August Election

On August 10, 1996, the registered voters in the City of Stratford will have the opportunity to vote on a proposition to increase the city sales tax one-half cent to be used for economic development purposes. The proposition will read as the following:

"The adoption of an additional one-half of one percent sales and use tax to be used for any purpose authorized by Section 4B, Article 5190.6 V.T.C.S. as amended (The Development Corporation Act of 1979), including, but not limited to, projects for the promotion and development of new or expanded business enterprises; land, buildings, and equipment; related roads, streets, water, and sewer facilities; demolition of existing structures; drainage and related improvements, and other projects that is determined as directly contributing to the promotion or development of new or expanded business enterprises."

Why do we need the Economic Development Tax?

*Because we are outgrowing our existing infrastructure. New sewer and water lines, streets, drainage, etc. are not free. The increased sales tax takes the burden off of the property owners to provide the needed infrastructure and passes it to the person buying taxable items.

*Other communities who have the tax have a competitive edge over Stratford when structuring new and expanding development.

*The tax will be used to assist in the expansion of existing local businesses as well as new industry. *Let our high traffic numbers pay for close to half of our sales tax

*We are already supporting other communities economic

development efforts, why not support our own? *We need to create and retain new jobs, increase the tax base, and increase our business opportunities. By doing this, we increase the population, increase property tax values, and improve overall living

self-confidence and 19, 1996. **Phase 1 Nearing** Completion

Phase I of the TxDOT Route Study is nearing completion. Phase I consisted of numerous analyses which resulted in the selection of five transportation corridors. These corridors were then evaluated for the feasibility of freeway construction. results from the Phase I study concluded that these corridors should not be reviewed further for freeway construction. However, roadway improvements should be evaluated along specific segments to improve travel efficiency in these areas.

TxDOT presented these conclusions at a public meeting held in Lubbock last month. Public comments received at that meeting are currently being considered by the study team, as well as, comments voiced on the telephone hotline and received by mail. After all comments are reviewed, a recommendation for Phase I will be presented to the Texas Transportation Commission in Austin on August 29th. Shortly after that date, Phase 2 of the study will begin. This phase will evaluate specific routes within selected corridors and prioritize p ased construction.

The first set of public meetings taining to Phase 2 are scheduled for this fall. The meetings will be held in several cities within the region.
