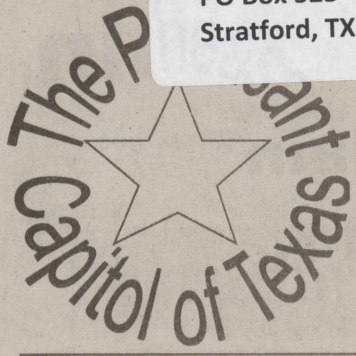

Trailblazer Coming to Panhandle

The Sherman County Public Library is pleased to announce that it is one of thirty-six libraries in the state to receive the Trailblazer TAME mobile science museum grant. The Trailblazer is a 40ft, traveling STEM museum. It has 5 exhibit areas on board, each with several hands-on activities and STEM career information: Aerodynamics; Biotechnology; Energy; Weather; and Space. TAME is the Texas Alliance for Minorities in Engineering. TAME is a non-profit organization based out of the state office in Austin, Texas. TAME is its own individual organization, but is supported by many partners, sponsors and organizations.

In 2018, the Tocker Foundation has sponsored 36 summer library visits to rural libraries (libraries who serve fewer than 12,000 people in their service area) one of which is the Sherman County Public Library located at 719 N Main Street in Stratford, TX.

The TAME Trailblazer visit for Stratford is scheduled for Monday, June 18, 2018 from 9:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m. The program is free and open to the public.
