### Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

- Mayor Reed called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

### Consent Agenda Items

- Accounts Payable for July 2018
- Financial Statements for July 2018
  - o Joe Zak motioned to approve as presented, Ann Johnson seconded, all in favor, motion carried.

### Council Business

- Discuss and consider action re: Livestock Permit Request for 1115 Purnell
  - o Joe Zak motioned to approve, Greg Wright seconded, Kyle Sandvig opposed, all else in favor, motion carried.
- Discuss and consider action re: Reimbursement request from Sherman County Development for Block Party
  - o Kathy Allen is unable to attend. Ann Johnson motioned to table to the next regular meeting, Greg Wright seconded, all in favor, motion carried.
- Discuss and consider action re: Order of Cancellation for November 2018 Election
  - o Ann Johnson motioned to approve, Mike Dominguez seconded, all in favor, motion carried.
- Discuss and consider action re: Zoning changes to zoning map
  - o Mayor Reed stated that he requested for the City Manager to have an alternate zoning map drawn up for consideration. Some areas of town have always had animals and this map reflects those areas. Attorney Rob Elliott commented that he would still recommend issuing animal/livestock permits so that the City can maintain control. After discussion, Ann Johnson motioned to table this item, Kyle Sandvig seconded, all in favor, motion carried.

The participants that were in the hunt for the spurs were Alyssa Ortega, Jonny Martinez, and Bailey Gerrond.



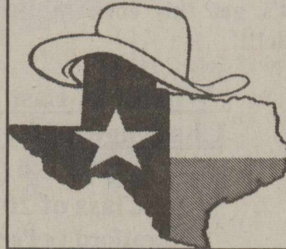
Our top riders for each age group earned a pretty buckle by receiving the highest total of points through the play day series.

Top Pee Wee rider is Maverick Whittington.

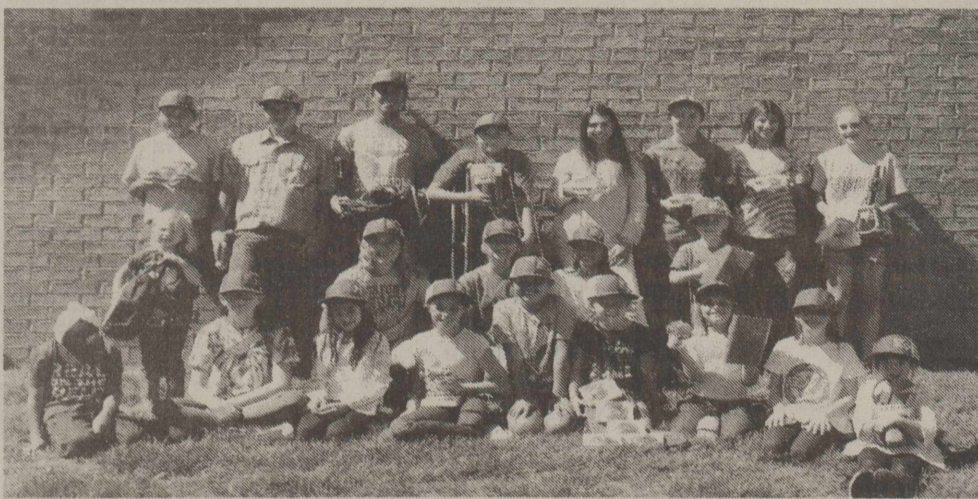

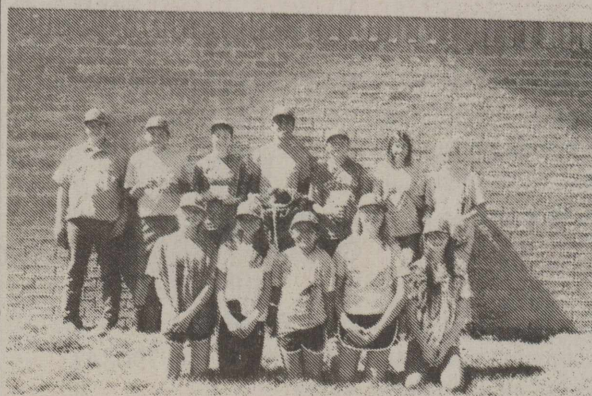

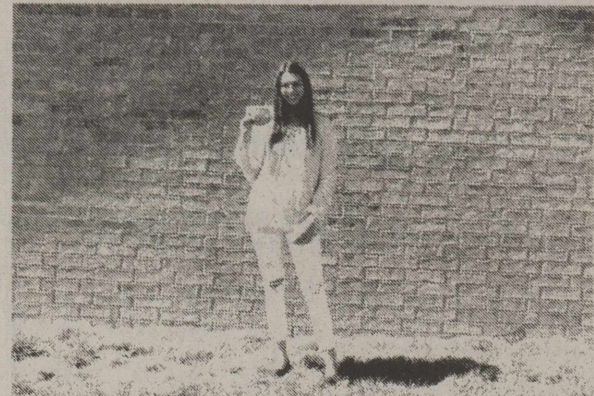
