The Board of Trustees Stratford ISD

A Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Stratford ISD was held Tuesday, October 9, 2018, beginning at 7:00 PM in the High School Library.

1. OPEN THE MEETING

President Brad McBryde established a quorum of members present and called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Members present were Brad McBryde, Tim Hudson, Kevin Braden, Jo Hinds, Walt Berry and Dan Law. Bryan Clift was absent. Guest present were Dean Hauser. Staff present were Ashly Lavake.

2. OPEN FORUM

There was no one present for open forum.

3. REPORTS

Mrs. Lavake gave the TELPAS and Title III report. ESSA legislation requires an annual report concerning the progress of the district's LEP students. SEE ATTACHMENT #1

A. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Mr. Rawlins thanked the board for their support during the "implementation" time at the Mary Allen. He passed out and explained reports over additional targeted support training and activities to meet standards in Closing the Gaps.

Mr. Seward reported on the first round of reports from the NWEA testing. He showed the board some tools and reports that the staff is using with the students. The individual reports went home in the students report cards.

Mr. Hanna reported on the high school's growth in their NWEA testing.

B. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Dominguez reported a district enrollment of 579. He updated the board on the construction project. He gave the maintenance report, the transportation report and tax report.






