Skiing, they say, was invented about 5,000 years ago when some clever cave-dweller came up with a better way of getting downhill than falling. He strapped a couple of modified animal bones to his feet and let the law of gravity take its course. Shortly afterward, someone invented the ski lodge, and civilization was born.
Things have been going downhill ever since
Before the happy inspiration of that Nordic Neanderthal, winter was a season infrequently associated with fun. Being
cold and wet was considered unpleasant. Snow was generally regarded as relatively useless, hills were looked upon as inconvenient at best, and nobody knew what to do with their old animal bones. Then skiing was invented, and suddenly people were frolicking in a winter wonderland.
History has not recorded why that first skier took to the slopes. Perhaps he was addicted to the thrills of high-speed travel, but had discovered that jumping off cliffs has its down side. Perhaps he envisioned making a killing in Alpine real estate. Perhaps he was escaping from a bear. In any case, his idea caught on, and within a few short millenniums it has snowballed into a multimillion-dollar industry. It would be nice to think that some modern-day descendants of the Original Skier have a piece of the action at up $\$ 23$ apiece for lift tickets (discounted to $\$ 21$ per day for three days or more; $\$ 13$ discounted to $\$ 12$ for children 12 and under) to indulge in the modern version of this primitive pastime.
Many also shell out for equipment rental (\$11 for the first day, $\$ 9$ thereafter), not to mention room and board. The resort in northern New Mexico is celebrating its 30th anniversary this winter, a tribute to the enduring appeal of mankind's passion for sliding downhill on modified animal bones - er, skils.
