were Thomas Geffert and Billy E. Jackson.

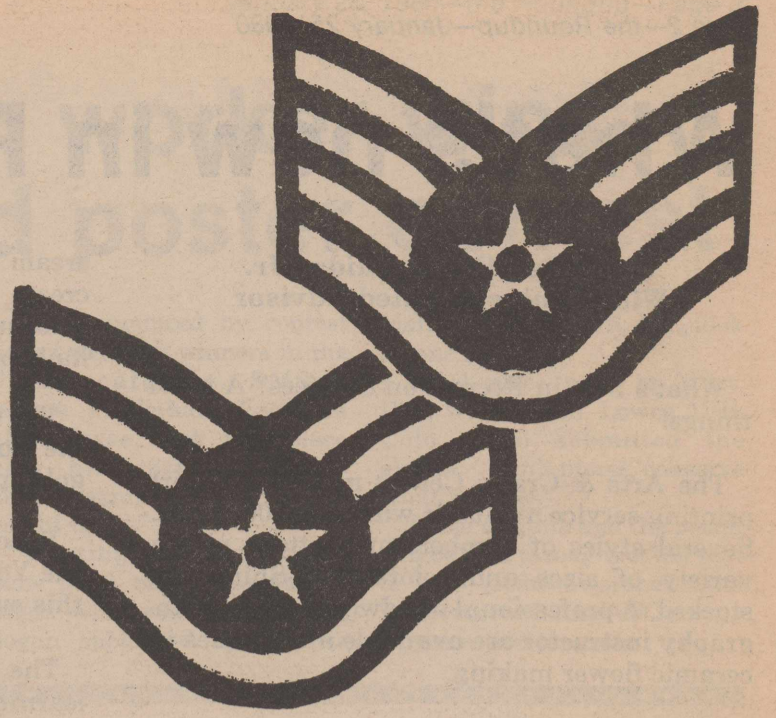

## Carter tabs Ingram for star

Col. Richard A. Ingram, 64th Flying Training Wing commander, has been nominated by President Carter for promotion to brigadier general.

Colonel Ingram becomes the sixth of eight commanders at Reese during the past decade to be selected for the star grade. He was officially notified Tuesday by General Bennie L. Davis, commander of the Air Training Command. Colonel Ingram, who is the 22nd commander of

Reese, was among 56 Air Force colonels nominated for promotion to brigadier general. Confirmation of the promotion by the United States Senate is expected soon.

Colonel Ingram became the commander of the 64th Flying Training Wing on February 24, 1979. He is responsible for the activities of more than 3,300 military and civilian personnel who train and support the

training of nearly 450 new Air Force pilots annually.

Prior to his assignment to Reese, Colonel Ingram served as the Director of Information for Air Training Command headquarters at Randolph AFB, Texas. His current assignment here marks the second time he has been stationed at Reese. From August 1972 through September 1976, he served as the commander of the 54th Flying

Training Squadron; the commander of the 64th Air Base Group, and as the Deputy Commander for Operations.

Colonel Ingram was born 160 miles north of Lubbock at McLean, Texas. He attended high school in Phillips, Texas, a few miles north of Amarillo. He received his B.A. degree in economics from Park College in Missouri, and his M.A. degree in psychology from Troy State University in Alabama. He is a

graduate of both the Armed Forces Staff College, Norfolk, Va., and the Air War College, Maxwell AFB, Ala.

Colonel Ingram enlisted in the Air Force in 1950. As a private, he served as a personnel and administrative specialist. From 1955 to 1958 he served as a first sergeant at Amarillo AFB, Texas, and Goose Air Base, Labrador, Canada.

# Make sure you're ready to vote

Although the presidential election is still more than 10 months away, the election year will get underway in February when Puerto Rico and New Hampshire hold the first presidential primaries.

The Puerto Rico test, for Republicans only, will be on Feb. 17. New Hampshire's presidential primary on Feb. 26 will be for members of both parties.

Nine other states will hold presidential primaries in March.

In addition to these, all states, territories and the District of Columbia will hold state primary elections. Illinois will hold the first on March 18.

Voting by absentee ballot is the right of military members wherever stationed and of government employees overseas. Federal post card registration and absentee ballot request forms are available from all unit voting officers. The forms, a revised version of the familiar federal post card application, have been coordinated with each state to serve as

both registration application and request for absentee ballot.

State requirements for absentee voting differ in many cases. New Hampshire, for example, does not require absentee voters to register and will send an absentee ballot upon request. Alabama, on the other hand, requires absentee voters to register by federal post card application and then send a second application for an absentee ballot.

Absentee voters should check specific state requirements with their unit voting officers.

States with presidential primaries in March are Vermont and Massachusetts, March 4; South Carolina, March 8; Alabama, Florida and Georgia, March 11; Illinois, March 18; and New York and Connecticut, March 25. Puerto Rico will hold a Democratic presidential primary on March 16.

Voting officials recommend absentee voters forward their applications for registration or ballot as soon as possible in order to insure on-time delivery.



# Preventive dentistry works!

The most wide spread disease in the United States is dental caries. It is estimated that 90 to 95 percent of the American population has or has had dental decay.

The advent of modern dental techniques, the emphasis on preventive dentistry, and the introduction of flouride regulation in the water supply of many municipalities have decreased the prevalence of caries, but the condition is still a major health concern.

As in most other human activities, the patterns set in childhood have a great influence on later adult behavior.

The prescription for good oral health, for children as well as adults, is proper home care, good nutrition, and regular visits to the dentist. Dental neglect as a child often leads to the same situation as an adult.

In an effort to help safeguard the oral health of the children, the Reese Dental Clinic offers a yearly exam, cleaning, and flouride treatment for children between the ages of 5 and 18-years-old (22 if the child is still in school) of active duty and retired personnell. If your child is not already enrolled in this program, you may register him by calling the dental clinic at Ext. 3711 or 3321.

The first week of February has been designated as National Children's Dental Health Week. Keep your child's smile bright. Use the programs that are available to you here.

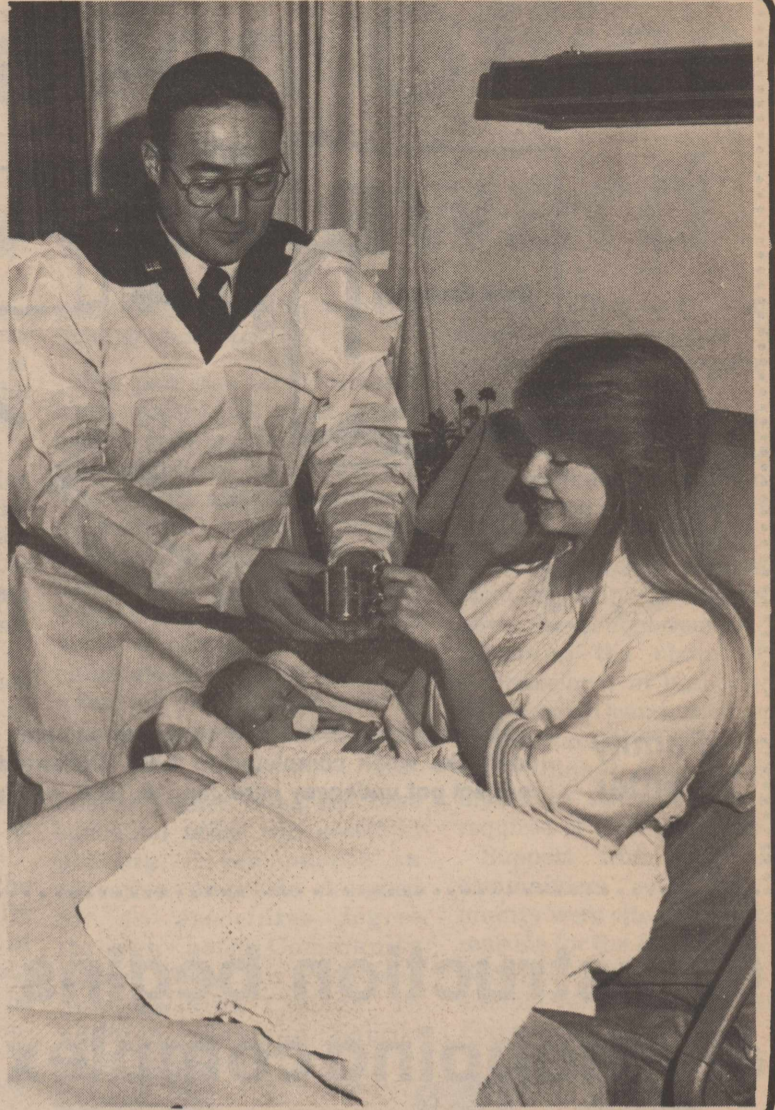

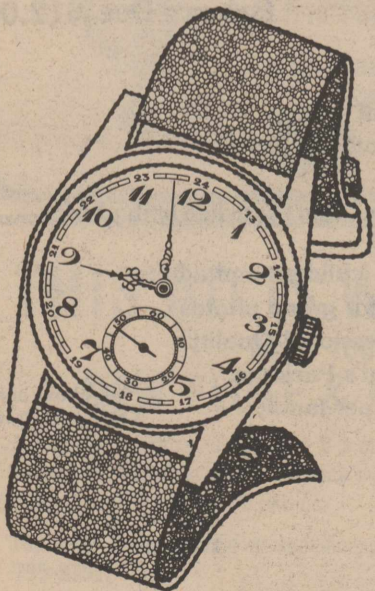

Lobby hours will remain the same, 0900-1500 hours, Monday through Friday.

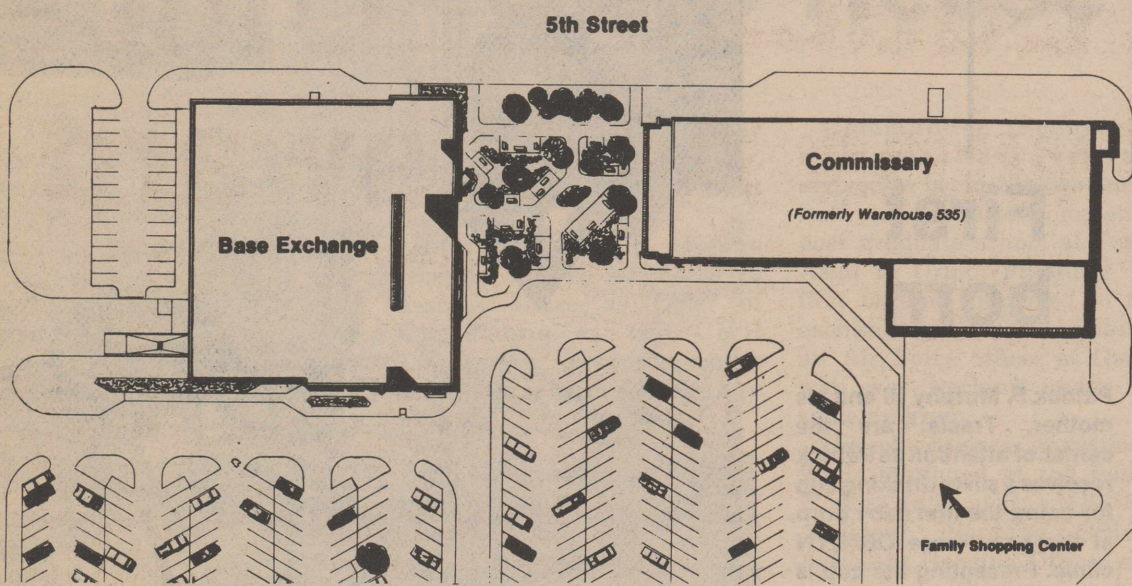

# Construction begins on shopping complex

Ground-breaking ceremonies for Reese's multi-million dollar family shopping complex were held here Jan. 18, launching a sixteen-month project designed to improve the "quality of life" at Reese.

The center will house a new Main Exchange, several Exchange concessions and a renovated Commissary. Base officials estimate that the entire project should be completed around April of next year.

**Exchange facilities**

Included in the \$1,600,000 Exchange, paid for by the Army and Air Force Exchange Service, will be the Main Sales, Garden Shop, Beauty Shop, Optical Shop, Watch Repair Shop, Floral Shop and a Reesette type store and the administrative offices. Also included in the six-building exchange complex will be a Pastry Shop, Snack Bar and laundry and dry cleaning services. Only Military Clothing Sales will remain in its present location.

**Commissary project**

Construction on the Commissary project, funded by the Air Force Commissary Service, still a couple of months away, say base officials. The new commissary will be housed in Warehouse 535. When renovated, the facility will expand the sales area of the Commissary from 8,467 to 15,400 square feet.

In addition, the new facility will have an adjoining warehouse with 23,600 square feet of storage space. Presently, storage area for the Commissary is divided among several different buildings.

The renovated Commissary will feature a Delicatessen and Bakery in addition to the regular grocery, produce, meat and dairy sections.

**Parking problem**

Although the new shopping complex will greatly improve services here when completed, until that time Reese shoppers will have to live with parking problem.

As construction on the

facility gets underway, the main parking lot by the Commissary will be closed. The Civil Engineers are already constructing a temporary parking site between the Garden Shop and the Commissary.

Since the temporary parking site is about a block away from the Commissary, a grocery pick-up area will be designated in front of the store. The grocery pick-up plan will not go into effect until actual construction begins on the Commissary project. That's expected in March.

Base officials advise Reese shoppers to watch for update's on the shopping complex progress and the parking situation in future issues of the Roundup and the Daily Bulletin.

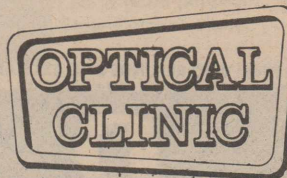

# Education Office wins ATC award

The moment one walks into the office of Bill Trafton, it is easy to see why he is chief of the best Education Office in Air Training Command.

Each wall is lined with pictures of people he calls his "success stories." His conversation is a unique combination of tense; always talking about today, with an eye toward tomorrow.

Regardless of what one comes in to talk about, Bill Trafton is going to have them straining at the bit to get into school and finish that final few hours for their bachelors, or masters, or even a doctorate.

Quoting requirements off the top of his head, or occasionally referring to one of an array of reference books, he can line out in minutes what would be expected of the new or continuing student.

His success rate is impressive: commissioning program selection was 100 percent for the four Airman Education and Commissioning Program applicants and 100 percent for the 14 Officer Training School applicants. Reese people have an above-average 68.3 percent enrollment rate in Community College of the Air Force, due in large part to the effort of Bill Trafton.

Trafton refuses to take full credit for the recent command level award, however. According to the chief, a great deal of credit goes to his second in command, Kenneth McGuire. McGuire, who came into civil service after retiring as an Air Force lieutenant colonel, will retire next month with a total of 40 years of government service. Trafton characterized McGuire as a "stabilizing influence" and went on to explain that his calm attitude and easy going demeanor greatly com-

plemented Trafton's hard-driving character.

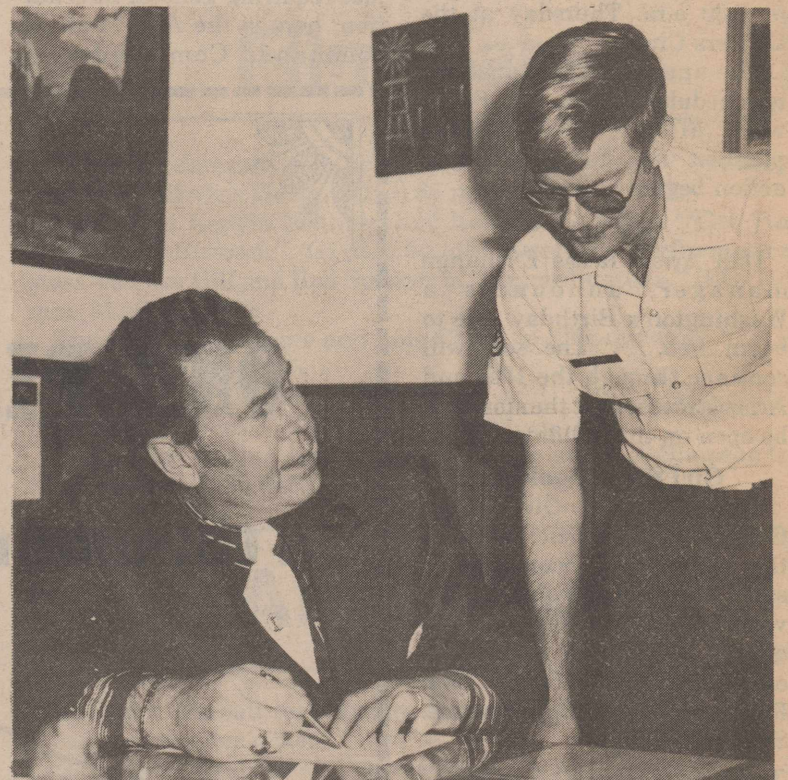
The pair has an impressive track record in other areas besides getting commissions for their customers. Part of their job is to identify and place students in the IDEA program (Individualized Developmental and Educational Achievement). Bill Trafton explained the program as one designed to "help eliminate deficiencies that may affect job performance, such as improving reading or language skills."

At a higher level, the base education office can assist in placing Reese people in education programs designed for an associates degree through both Community College of the Air Force and South Plains College. In addition, Wayland Baptist

College offers an extensive array of courses at Reese designed for students seeking a bachelors degree.

Trafton, who was originally the motivator in bringing the post graduate programs of the University of Northern Colorado to Texas, is now fighting a battle against the state coordinating board to have the school remain here. Disputing the claim of the commissioner of higher education that off campus education is sub-standard, he stated, "I don't think I could discipline myself to the intensive study required of UNC students."

Support from both Reese commanders and the community were cited as additional reasons for the ATC award. The Reese Education Office is now eligible for competition at Air Force level.

In 1958 he entered Officer Candidate School and by July 1959, he had completed training in the T-28 and T-34 and earned his pilot wings. He spent the next six months in special-

ized T-33 training at Vance AFB, Okla.

Through the early 1960s Colonel Ingram was assigned to Craig AFB, Ala., where he served as a T-33 and T-37 instructor pilot and member of the wing standardization and evaluation team. In December 1964, the colonel attended air-ground operations school and went through A1E aircraft transition at Hurlburt Field, Fla. before being assigned to Southeast Asia. From July 1965 to July 1966, he was assigned to the 602d Tactical Fighter Squadron as an A1E fighter pilot in Vietnam. During his tour there, he flew 280 combat missions of which more than 60 were over North Vietnam. In all he logged 503 hours of combat flying time.

Colonel Ingram is married to the former Phyllis June Toyne of Glidden, Iowa. They have four children.

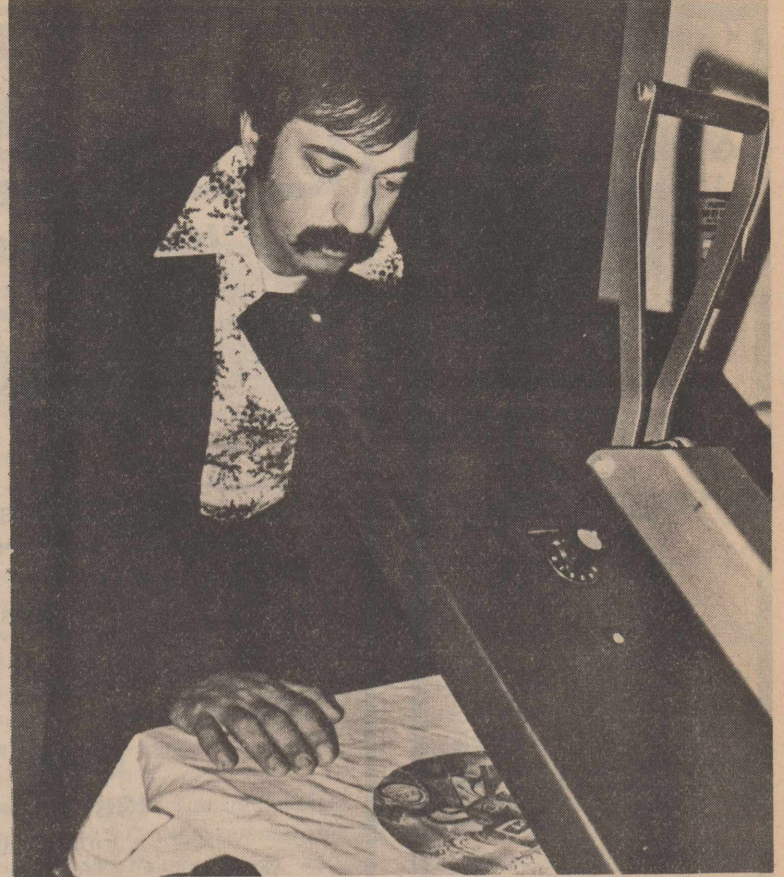
## Shirt shop joins Arts and Crafts
