Forty-eight fledgling aviators are scheduled to officially join the ranks of Air Force pilots when the members Undergraduate Pilot Training Class 80-05 pin on their pilot wings today.

Guest speaker for today's graduation is Brig. Gen. William E. Lindman, deputy chief of staff for Plans, Policy, Programs and Requirements, Aerospace Defense Command, Peterson AFB, Colo.

A native of Cincinnati, General Lindman entered active military service as an aviation cadet in 1951 and was commissioned in 1952 as a radar observer. He later completed pilot training, earning his wings in 1954.

A command pilot with more than 3,900 total flying hours, General Lindman has flown the F-4 Phantom, F-86 Sabre, F-102 Delta Dagger, F-106 Delta Dart, T-33 Shooting Star, T-39 Sabreliner and RF-4. He logged 152 combat missions in Southeast Asia in the RF-4.

Class leaders for UPT Class 80-05 are Capt. James McDonald, T-37 phase, and Capt. Wayne Lutz, T-38 phase. The section-one leader is Capt. Lee J. Doret while Capt. Charles D. Means is the section-two leader.

Training for Class 80-05 began on June 6, 1979.

Graduation is set for 10 a.m. in the base theater. Following the graduation will be a luncheon at the Officers Club. A dinner-dance in honor of the graduates is also planned. The affair is scheduled to start at 6:30 p.m. in the Officers Club.

Food Service has a monthly menu planning board which reviews menu items and makes appropriate adjustments based on patron's preferences. All base personnel are invited to attend these meetings and to offer constructive suggestions. The next meeting is scheduled for 9 a.m., May 28 in the Wing Dining Hall.

Consolidated Base Personnel Office work centers have been able to do their jobs much more efficiently since the inception of the CBPO appointment system.

For those unfamiliar with the appointment system, the policy is

All active duty members must be in uniform and have an appointment with the work unit they wish to do business with before proceeding past the Customer Service Unit. The CSU is the single focal point of contact between the customer and CBPO.

Customer Service will receive and respond to queries concerning any aspect of the military personnel system. They will answer immediately all inquiries of a general nature that require minimum research. In addition, the CSU will refer, by appointment, unusual or complicated actions to the responsible CBPO work center. Finally, they will serve as the initial contact point for each CBPO customer who does not have an established appointment with another work center.

Air Force Forum 99, Personnel Inquiry, is designed to provide the customer a single point of contact with CBPO concerning any personnel problem, question, complaint or suggestion. Inquiries submitted on these forms will be answered within 48 hours.

Davis talks retention

(Editor's note: During a recent visit to Reese Gen. Bennie L. Davis, commander of Air training Command, held a press conference which was attended by local press and radio and television stations, in addition to a Roundup reporter. Following are selected statements from the general's answers).

When asked about recruitment and rentention of pilots, General Davis responded, "(Although) recruitment of pilots is one of our easier programs, we still have a three or four-to-one ratio of applicants for every vacancy in pilot training, retention of those pilots has certainly become a problem, particularly over the last three years.

"We lose about 40 percent at the end of the sixth year, which is about what we are programmed to lose. Our problem comes with that group between six and eleven years. The reason that's a problem is because that's the very heart of our experience level.

Employable people

"One of the principal (causes) has been the hue and cry over pay and compensation. (The pilots who leave the Air Force) are very employable people. A lot of them are engineers and, of course, all of them have baccalaureate degrees and at least 40 percent of them have master's degrees. They literally feel they cannot afford to serve the Air Force."

Funding played a key part in nearly all of the general's remarks to the local media. For instance, when asked if the number of people in uniform is dangerously low, he replied, "No. We have about 2.01 million in uniform . . . That force is adequate to provide for our defense. What it needs in addition to pay and compensation is more operational maintenance dollars. We've been terribly underfunded for the last five years . . . I think the force is adequate and the readiness is adequate, but in order to sustain yourself over

the long term, additional dollars need to be spent."

Further, when questioned about the effect of the world situation on recruiting, General Davis remarked, "I don't see it stimulating recruiting. I see it helping somewhat with retention. There has been, over the last year, a recognition in the national press of the effect that successive pay caps have had. I'll give you one concrete example. An E-6, technical sergeant, crew chief on an F-15, makes \$300 less a month than a unionized grocery clerk in California.

"The significant step that we must take to increase retention is pay. Our people don't expect to make a million dollars, they just want an adequate standard of living."


Brighter picture

General Davis painted a somewhat brighter picture in

responding to a Roundup question concerning the Nunn-Warner amendment, a package of benefits now under consideration by Congress.

"The Nunn-Warner is the brightest package of compensation reforms on the horizon at this time. It consists basically of . . . a variable housing allowance, which gives those living in high cost . . . areas additional compensation for housing. It increases flying pay be 25 percent. It increases travel allowances from (approximately) 11 to 12 cents a mile to around 18 and gives a 10 percent increase for subsistence

. . . That package has been passed by the Senate and is now being considered by the House. I am very confident that it will be passed by the House and by the full Congress. Then it will be up to the President to accept that increase or veto it.

Reese carpools receive reserved parking slots

Reese carpoolers will soon qualify for a parking slot, each have reserved parking spaces. carpool must designate one of

According to Capt. Bob Blankenship, reserved parking spaces will be designated to bring Reese into compliance with Department of Defense regulations still in draft.

"Although the regulations are still in draft," explained Captain Blankenship. "Reese is going ahead with the parking program as are all other Air Force units."

To determine where and how many parking spaces will be reserved for carpoolers a questionnaire has been sent to all unit orderly rooms. To qualify for a parking slot, each carpool must designate one of its members as the carpool chief. The chief must pick up one of the questionnaires, complete it and return it to 3500 RMS/CC Stop 17 by June 15.

Once processed, carpool chiefs will be instructed to go to Pass and Registration to pick up their official Reese carpool parking sign. This sign, which should be displayed in the front windshield, will let Security Police know that the vehicle is authorized to park in a carpool slot. People without carpool signs will be ticketed by the Security Police.

Captain Blankenship noted that it may be mid to late summer before the program gets running. He also said that carpool chiefs are responsible for reporting any changes in the carpool membership and for passing the carpool chief duties on to other members if reassigned.

The captain added that the carpooling spaces will be reserved as close to the duty sections of carpool members as possible.

President's program calls for gasoline cut

President Jimmy Carter has unveiled a new national energy conservation program, hoping to reduce gasoline use by 12.5 percent during the spring and summer.

Secretary of Commerce Phillip M. Klutznick appealed to motorists to join the president's program. "Each weekday about 73 million Americans commute to work in some type of vehicle, public or private. About 50 million Americans drive to work alone, carrying with them more than 150 million empty seats."

Secretary Klutznick praised last year's 5 percent reduction in gasoline consumption but noted there is still room for improvement. "Privately-owned motor vehicles consume more than five million barrels of oil a day in this country—an amount equal to more than half of our nation's daily oil imports."

He pointed out, "If each person who commutes to work by car were to carry one additional passenger who now drives to work alone, we could save 500,000 barrels of oil a day." This would more than meet the president's goal of saving 400,000 barrels daily. (AFNS)


