# Reese 

Each year Reese people, along with other Lubbock-area federal employees, are given an opportunity to participate in a fund-raising campaign that benefits dozens of local, national and international charitable organizations.

That time of year has arrived.
Beginning Wednesday, representatives in each unit will begin canvassing for supporters of the 1981 Combined Federal Campaign. The Reese goal in this year's campaign is $\$ 82,000$, part of the total Lubbock goal of $\$ 123,000$.

CFC offers two major advantages to federal employees. First of all there is only one campaign a year. CFC is the only authorized fundraising drive for voluntary agencies within federal establishments. Secondly, there are three ways to give:
payroll deduction, cash or check and direct billing.

According to Reese committee vice-chairman, Capt. Frank Belote, most federal personnel wish to contribute an amount comparable to the suggested giving level in the voluntary giving guide. Captain Belote says that an estimate of fair share is one hour's wages per month.
Most federal personnel choose to use the payroll deduction to meet their pledge, enabling them to spread it out in small monthly installments. Deductions for those choosing this option will begin on the first pay period in January and stop at the end of one year. Minimum deduction is 50 cents per period.

Designations, though neither encouraged nor discouraged, may be
made. Five spaces are provided on the pledge cards that will be distributed by key workers for code numbers of agencies the giver wishes to designate. Amount to any agency may not be less than one dollar.

Barring any designations, distribution to agencies will be according to a formula based on previous campaign experience from 1975-79. United Way will receive 83.84 percent, National Health Agencies 7.95 percent and International Service Agencies, 5.21 percent. Campaign and administration expenses will use the remaining three percent.

Each squadron will have a group of key workers led by a team chief in order to insure everyone is given the opportunity to contribute. In the event someone is missed, please con-

# CFC provides aid to Reese

Wednesday begins our annual Combined Federal Campaign, a time each year when we are asked to give to help others.
Our goal is $\$ 82,000$ this year, which is a part of the overall Lubbock goal of $\$ 2.01$ million.
Some of you may feel that your donations do little to help us here at Reese. That is why I want to tell you a little of what I know about our CFC.

Last year the American Red Cross spent $\$ 12,299$ in support of Reese personnel for services such as transportation for emergency leave. Their services were used by some 1,293 military personnel last year in Lubbock alone. In 1970, they spent $\$ 750,000$ in Lubbock to help families when the tornado struck.
This year the Reese Youth Center will receive
$\$ 12,000$ to continue its programs for our young people. The Lubbock Area Boy Scouts will receive $\$ 143,000$, the Girl Scouts $\$ 65,000$ and the USO $\$ 4,200$.
The list of direct benefits goes on, but there are indirect benefits as well. Of each dollar you donate, 97 cents goes directly to the 60 CFC agencies which include the Heart Fund, Muscular Dystrophy, Cancer Society, Diabetes Association and Easter Seals. One donation helps each and everyone all year long.
I feel strongly about this campaign and meeting our goal quickly. There is overwhelming evidence that we at Reese are benefited far in excess of what we contribute to the CFC. Therefore, I hope that you will join me in making a "fair share" pledge next week and make this the most successful campaign yet!

## Who goes where

My wife called the Hospital appointment desk for an appointment for my daughter. She has anemic blood and requires periodic check ups. My wife spoke with Mrs. Angeleta Davis and the problem is that instead of Mrs. Davis giving the appointment, she was trying to diagnose the problem herself. I do not feel she should do this. It's not her responsibility, I feel, to determine
whether or not my child needs an appointment.
To assure quality care and maximize utilization of physicians, the central appointments desk personnel screen all incoming calls to help determine if a Nurse Practitioner, Physician Assistant or Doctor should initially see the patient. This practice is not a diagnostic analysis but is rather a quick efficient way of referring the patient to the appropriate health care provider. With a limited
number of apointments the central appointment personnel must attempt to screen routine (coughs, colds, etc.) appointment requests from the urgent (pain, etc.) requests. If this practice were not in effect, then the physicians would be seeing the less serious conditions and the physician assistants would be seeing the more serious conditions. Obviously, this is not in the patient's best interests nor does it efficiently utilize the provider's time.

## Housing maintenance

 system changes handsAlliance Properties Inc. will assume responsibility for all repair and maintenance in the family housing area at Reese Sept. 30.

Until then all service calls for maintenance will continue to be made to the Civil Engineering Service Desk, Ext. 3647. When All-Pro assumes the contract all service calls during normal duty hours will be made to the civilian contractor at 885-4900. After duty hours service calls will be made to 793-7463.
The contract for maintenance restricts emergency calls to correcting failures or deficiences which constitute an immediate danger, health hazard to occupants, or threaten to damage property.

All other service calls are considered routine.
The contract requires the following response time: Plumbing, water and sewage-if the problem will cause structural damage or health hazards, it is considered an emergency and response time must be 30 minutes and must be completed within 24 hours.
Otherwise, urgent, response time must be 24 hours. Units with one functioning comode will not be considered a health hazard.
Heating-No heat is considered emergency and response time must be 30 minutes with completion within 12 hours.
Individual bedroom heater inoperative is considered urgent and requires response time of two days with completion within five days.
Gas-No gas is considered urgent requiring 30 minute response time.

Air Conditioning - considered
urgent, requiring five day response time.
Electrical-Power loss or elec trical short is emergency and re quires 30 minute response time with completion of work in 2 hours.
Minor electrical work is con sidered urgent, requiring five day response time.
Structural-roof leak with wall, ceiling, structural or floor damage is considered emergency with required response time of 24 hours with job completion within two days.
Broken windows are con sidered urgent with a five day re quired response time

Appliances-Refrigerator inoperative is considered emergen cy with a required response time of six hours with completion within two days.
Other appliance problems are considered urgent with a response of 24 hours and completion within five days

All other calls are considered routine with response within two days. If response time cannot be met due to weekend or holiday in terfering, response time shall be extended to the close of business on the next duty day. Routine calls should be completed within 30 days.

If satisfactory response is not obtained, contact the Family Housing Management Office, Ext. 3601.

crease of 9.1 percent proposed by President Carter Aug. 29 should go into effect this fall if not opposed by Congress.
The 9.1 percent increase counters a 13.5 percent raise proposal urged last month by the President's pay agent. By law the pay agent's recommendation would have taken effect if the President had not made a counter proposal by Aug. 31.
The 9.1 percent increase will become effective at the beginning of the first pay period in October unless the Senate or House disapproves the President's request. If either house of Congress

percent increase would take effect automatically in October.
Federal pay is required to be kept comparable with payrates in the private sector. Each year the bureau of labor statistics surveys private-sector pay rates in a variety of occupations to establish a basis for the pay agent's recommendations.

after a mid-year budget review. This year's Bureau of Labor Statistics survey showed a comparable private-sector salary increase of 9.1 percent from March 1979 to March 1980. The additional 4.4 percent the pay agent added to that figure was designed to offset past losses to inflation caused by smaller pay increases in recent years.
"A decision on pay comparability for federal civilian employees necessarily must be made in the broader context of the present economics situation in the country," the President said in proposing the raise.
