Marcos resigns, flees nation

MANILA, Philippines (AP) — A de-feated Ferdinand E. Marcos resigned as president of the Philippines today, slipping away in the Manila night and setting off an explosion of joyous celebration among his countrymen.

"Cory! Cory!" Filipinos chanted in tribute to new President Corazon Aquino as they demonstrated by the thousands across the capital.

Marcos, heading out of the country via the U.S. Air Force's nearby Clark Air Base, was brought down by a combination of a "people's power" uprising, military revolt and U.S. pressure.

First official word of his resignation came in Washington, where Secretary of State George Shultz said the toppled Philippine leader would be "welcome to come to the United States." But there was no immediate report on his final destination.

Marcos' departure ended four days of uncertainty and political drama in Manila and 20 years of highly personal Marcos rule over this impoverished archipelago nation of 52 million people, an important U.S. ally in the Far East.

Fourteen people were reported slain in violence sparked by the revolt against Marcos.

The longtime president was given a final push Monday by the Reagan administration, which issued a statement calling for a peaceful transition to a new government because of what it said was widespread fraud in rival.

Shultz said the United States had officially recognized the new Aquino government and he anticipated no immediate problem in maintaining the two major U.S. military bases in

the Philippines — Clark and Subic Bay Naval Base.

'We are prepared to confer with the new government...to cooperate fully," he said.

Earlier today, both Marcos and Mrs. Aquino, 53, were inaugurated as president of rival Philippine governments in separate ceremonies. But within hours, both camps reported Marcos, at the president's Malacanang Palace, was engaged in lengthy telephone negotiations over his departure.


Manila radio station DZRH later quoted a Marcos loyalist, Romulo Fontanilla, as saying, "Without our knowledge he (Marcos) left us. Even the soldiers are not here anymore.' The station said only a small protective force was left behind at the palace.

As word of Marcos' departure flashed across this turbulent capital, jubilant throngs of Filipinos set bonfires outside the palace.

"You're hearing the start of the rebirth of democracy!" a radio announcer boomed over the sounds of jubiliation from demonstrators.

More than 10,000 people danced, cheered, applauded and chanted Mrs. Aquino's nickname at the gate of the palace. Marcos loyalists among the palace guards surrendered in single file.

White: Nation on 'brink of emergency'

WASHINGTON (AP) - A tiny 0.1 Food prices rose a slight 0.2 per percent this year - which would be Throughout 1985, the consumer helped hold consumer prices overall to a moderate 0.3 percent increase in January, the government reported today. The Labor Department's consumer price index, after adjustments for seasonal factors, was the lowest since a 0.2 percent increase in September. It follows a 0.4 percent increase December. Gasoline prices had risen 0.5 percent in December. While wholesale gasoline price declines are not reflected in today's calculation, the Labor Department did report a 1.1 percent drop in overall prices for heating oil, coal and bottled gas. The lower gasoline prices, the result of a worldwide collapse in crude oil markets, is expected to show up in the consumer price report for February.

A new round of auto-financing deals by major U.S. automakers, begun last December, held new car prices flat as compared to the month before. Used car prices were up 0.6 percent.

If last month's 0.3 percent increase held steady for 12 months, the yearly advance would be 4.1 percent. The annual rate reported by the department is based on a more precise calculation of price activity than could be obtained by a calculation based on the monthly CPI.

In all, the consumer price index stood at 328.4 in January, meaning that goods costing \$10 in 1967 would have cost \$32.84 last month.

"In February, falling meat prices should prevent grocery store prices from rising at all," said Ratajczak, the Georgia State economist.

At the wholesale level, gasoline prices dropped 5.7 percent in January and heating oil costs plunged 10.8 percent.

The \$10 decline per barrel in crude oil prices, if sustained, could reduce inflation by 1.5 to 2.8 percentage points over the year, according to Allen Sinai, chief economist for Shearson Lehman Bros.

"The lower inflation raises consumer purchasing power by increasing real disposable income and the funds available for discretionary spending," Sinai said.



Haigh was born Jan. 15, 1890, at Los Angeles. During his early years in Buena Park and Elsinore he worked on a farm, at a lumber and fuel yard, as an electrician's helper and for a small town garage. In 1908, after five months of high school, Haigh moved to Los Angeles where he worked in automotive maintenance, repair work, race driving and garage management.

He served in France during World War I and was discharged after in-haling too much poisonous gas. He returned to Los Angeles to work in the automobile industry, but was warned by a physician he had less than 10 years to live if he continued.

# Kent Hance says he expects to be in run-off for Republican primary

Kent Hance is expecting the May Republican primary to be extended into a June run-off, but said it's still too early to tell which of the other two opponents will be on that final ballot.

During a swing through West Tex-as Monday that included a fund-rais-er at the home of Larry Bell in Midland, Hance talked about a proposed oil import fee, the violation of the GOP's 11th commandment, and

problems facing whoever is elected governor for the next four years. Also seeking the Republican nomi-nation for governor are former Gov. Bill Clements and U.S. Rep. Tom oeffler.

Hance said he supports an oil im-port fee but with some reservations "if they start putting an entitle-

ment program with it, and it scares me that Congress would do it." However, if Congress proposed a "straight heads-up fee, such as \$10 a barrel," Hance would support the

"We pay property taxes on oil to the local school districts, severance taxes to the state and Windfall Prof-its Tax to the federal government. We're competing with people (for-eign countries) that don't pay anyth-ing," he added.

Hance is afraid the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries and Saudi Arabia might conspire to drop the price to \$8-10 a barrel and domestic production would decline further. When supplies are used up,

these same countries would hike the price suddenly to \$50 a barrel. "If they do it, it's a matter of na-tional security," said Hance.

White, who is seeking re-election, said Sunday he would press for an emergency tariff on foreign oil when the nation's governors visited the White House Monday. Hance said the Democratic governor doesn't have support of Congress or the White House on this issue and is trained to play "democratic" against trying to play ' ,qemaloline,

"I can see the president's concern" bout a fee, said Hance. "It would set onal trade barriers.

"They're defecting to the people's side so we don't hurt them," said The Rev. Joe Dison. But he said 200 Mar-"fanatics" remained holed up inside the compound.

Long lines of cars and public transportation "jeepneys," packed with cheering Filipinos, inched along Manila's boulevards with horns blaring and flags waving.

"It's liberation day! It's liberation day!" chanted one group. Gen. Fidel V. Ramos, a leader of

the military mutiny, said he was going to the palace to protect it. Mrs. Aquino's whereabouts could not immediately be learned. A guard at her home said she was not there.

Juan Ponce Enrile, the defense minister who led the revolt against Marcos, told reporters earlier his forces could provide protection to the departing president and his family

"We have no intention of harming anybody," Enrile said. "Our only interest is that we can settle this so we can now start working to serve the interests of the people.

Mrs. Aquino's vice presidential running-mate, former Sen. Salvador H. Laurel, speaking on NBC's "To-day" show, said Enrile and Ramos had spoken to Marcos for almost two hours about his resignation. In Washington, Shultz praised

Marcos' decision and said of the Phil-ippine people, "They have resolved this issue non-violently and in a way that does them honor.'

The secretary of state said that "basically, this is not something the United States has done."

But he also acknowledged that U.S. officials had "a great deal of interaction" with Marcos in recent days as he pondered his decision.

Marcos' inauguration ceremony was not televised because the private station over which he had been broadcasting went dead.

Ceremonies inaugurating Mrs. Aquino were broadcast several times on a station taken over from Marcos' government.

Faced with a mutiny in the armed forces and giant street protests calling for him to step down, Marcos had told supporters gathered at Malacanang Palace for his inauguration, "We

will overcome these obstacles...we will advance for the future." Mrs. Aquino said her administra-tion would be dedicated to "morality and decency in government, freedom and democracy." As the two rivals took their oaths,

fighting broke out at a Manila area police station and a television transmitting tower held by pro-Marcos forces. A police general said nine people were killed in fighting at the police station, and pro-Aquino forces killed three pro-Marcos soldiers at the television tower.

Aquino and Marcos supporters threw stones at each other outside the palace following Marcos' inauguration when the rivals began taunting each other as palace soldiers, arms linked, tried to get the approximately 300 banner-waving Marcos supporters safely off palace grounds. Members of both sides scampered after the rock-throwing began. Soldiers lay on the ground with guns pointed, and one shot was fired in

the air. Most of the Marcos supporters fled, but the pro-Aquino demonstrators regrouped.

Marcos' running mate in the spe-cial election, Arthur Tolentino, was not present as Marcos took the oath for a new six-year term from Su-preme Court Chief Justice Ramon Aquino, but no explanation was

More than 500 people attended Marcos' inauguration, brandishing fists and chanting, "Marcos! Marcos!" About 3,000 Marcos supporters were outside the palace at the time, and some of them shouted, "Capture the snakes! Capture the snakes! Martial law! Martial law!" Marcos ruled

under martial law regulations from 1972-1980. Through most of today, Marcos re-mained in the palace with his family as loyal troops kept jeering pro-Aquino supporters at a distance. Earlier in the day, soldiers fired on rebel supporters near Malacanang, and hospital officials said eight people were hit by gunfire and five injured while trying to flee.

Mrs. Aquino was sworn in as head of the rebels' provisional government at a country club ringed by troops who rallied to the insurgency declared Saturday by the former defense minister and Ramos, deputy armed forces commander.

Mrs. Aquino said Laurel would be her vice president and prime minis-ter, Enrile her defense minister and Ramos, promoted to full general from lieutenant general, would be come military chief of staff. Marcos' New Society Movement party controls the 190-member Na-

tional Assembly which on Feb. 15 de-clared him re-elected by a 1.5-mil-lion-vote margin. Mrs. Aquino's supporters and growing numbers of military, business, religious and po-litical leaders say the decision was based on rigged vote tallies.

Nine people were killed in the shootout in suburban Makati between police officers and a sergeant claiming to support Mrs. Aquino.

Police Gen. Ruben Escarcha said Sgt. Esteban Bandai entered Makati station with eight to 10 men, disarmed officers and claimed he was taking over the station on Mrs. Aquino's orders. A spokesman for Mrs. Aquino denied any connection with the group.

Escarcha said his men persuaded Bandai to leave but that the sergeant

grabbed a policewoman as a hostage. As Bandai's group fled, someone in his group shot and killed the police-woman, police said. A shootout ensued in which eight of Bandai's men were slain, police said. Hospital officials said nine peo-ple were wounded ple were wounded.

In suburban Quezon City, pro-Aquino forces battled Marcos loyalists occupying a Channel 9 television transmitter tower and a building near the government broadcast com-plex seized Monday by rebels. The rebels shot and killed three

# Aquino rises from reluctant candidate to president

MANILA, Philippines (AP) - Corazon Aquino started her political ca-reer as a reluctant candidate but became a determined campaigner who rallied millions of her countrymen behind a drive to end Ferdinand E. Marcos' 20 years as president.

To the suprise of many Filipinos and many foreigners, the petite, 53year-old woman managed to channel widespread dissatisfaction with Marcos into a powerful stream of opposition that swept him from power.

She became well known only after her husband was assassinated in 1983, a slaying that started the chain of events that brought down Marcos.

Today, Mrs. Aquino swore an oath of office as provisional president and said she was "taking power in the name of the Filipino people."

An hour later Marcos took the oath as president at a palace ceremony. As an indication of how his power had crumbled, the broadcast of the ceremony was knocked off the air by rebels who took control of the station. They substituted a John Wayne film.

Several hours later, the man who dominated the country for two decades resigned.

Mrs. Aquino is a daughter of the wealthy Cojuangco family of Tarlac province, which has sprawling sugar plantations. Her first cousin, Eduardo Cojuangco, is a close business associate of Marcos and believed to be one of the wealthiest men in the Philippines, controlling a coconut monopoly granted him under the Marcos administration.

Stepping forward after her husband was assassinated, Mrs. Aquino waged an emotion-laden campaign in the Feb. 7 presidental election and made a strong showing in balloting that was tainted by fraud, according to her supporters and to independent election observers.

She campaigned throughout the country, always smiling and always wearing yellow. The color symbolizes the yellow-ribbon homecoming planned for her husband when he returned from self-exile in the United States, only to be assassinated at Manila airport.

When the Marcos-controlled National Assembly on Feb. 15 completed the count and announced that Marcos had won, Mrs. Aquino refused to accept that verdict and pledged a campaign to bring down boycotts and Marcos by demonstrations

Then, two military leaders of the Marcos establishment announced on Saturday that they had broken with the president. They demanded he resign and allow Mrs. Aquino to lead the nation. Their action provoked widespread sympathy from the pub-lic, and thousands of people poured into the streets to support the rebels. By Monday, the rebels had taken

over a government television station and proclaimed a provisional government headed by Mrs. Aquino. Crowds in the streets chanted her nickname, "Cory, Cory!"

Her only training in politics came from her family and as the wife of a man who was considered Marcos' main political rival. Mrs. Aquino's campaign biography listed no previous accomplishments or jobs other



When martial law was decreed in 1972, Aquino was jailed for eight

years. Mrs. Aquino has described those years as among the most traumatic in her life.

She was her husband's "eyes, ears and voice in the stifling environment of martial law," according to a biography provided by her campaign staff.

Some people tell me I did not have any formal education in politics," she told The Associated Press in an interview. "But I was living with one of the best teachers in politics.

In addition, her grandfather, father and brother were congressmen. Her other grandfather and an uncle were senators, and another uncle is a member of the National Assembly. But she has said most of her political ideas come from her late husband.

Aquino was allowed to travel to the United States for heart surgery in 1980 and spent the next three years in voluntary exile.

Aquino decided to return to rally the opposition. He was slain as he got off the plane at Manila airport on

Aug. 21, 1983. Mrs. Aquino and thousands of other Filipinos accused Marcos of being behind the slaying. An investigation pointed to a military conspiracy to assassinate Aquino.

Although those charged with conspiracy were acquitted after a long trial, the slaying of Aquino ignited the opposition to Marcos. Protest marches, often with Mrs. Aquino a prominent participant, occurred almost daily and swept across all segments of society, from farmers to stockbrokers.

She called Marcos the "No. 1 suspect" in the assassination and led many of the demonstrations against him

Seeking to show his hold on the country, Marcos considered a special election. Mrs. Aquino laughed off suggestions in 1985 that she be a candidate, saying, "I don't know any-thing about the presidency."

But when Marcos set the election for Feb. 7 she declared she would run and waged a vigorous campaign that attracted hundreds of thou sands of cheering supporters.

# Rocket engineer says he 'felt pressure' from NASA officials

WASHINGTON (AP) - A presidential commission heard testimony today that one key industry engineer "felt pressure" from space agency officials when his firm initially recommended against the launch of the shuttle Challenger for safety reasons.

Allan McDonald, booster rocket manager for Morton Thiokol, told the investigating panel that at one point in a long discussion on the eve of launch, he "made the direct statement that if anything happened to ing he resisted the decision to launch the ill-fated shuttle even after his company superiors approved it. He said others might not consider the remarks he heard from NASA officials as pressure, and he said he wasn't "overruled" by his company. But he said he refused to sign a

company memo approving the decision to launch. The shuttle blew up eight miles above the launch pad, killing all seven crew members.

David Wyss, chief economist for Data Resources Inc., a private forecasting firm based in Lexington, Mass., said that gasoline prices will drop close to 15 cents a gallon before they level off, perhaps several months from now.

Lawrence Chimerine, president of Chase Econometrics of Bala Cynwyd, Pa., said he does not believe the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries can quickly restore higher prices.

The key issue is the long-term issue," he said. In the short term, he said, "unless they are willing to make sharp production cuts, there is no way that prices can go back up (suddenly).'

There are clouds on the horizon. Although the recent decline in the value of the U.S. dollar against major foreign currencies hasn't yet had a major impact on consumer prices, any further devaluation could rekindle inflation by making imports far more expensive, Federal Reserve Board Chairman Paul Volcker warned House and Senate banking committees last week.

Volcker said that the dollar, which has dropped in value 30 percent since a year ago, had "fallen enough." However, Treasury Secretary James Baker said a further decrease in the dollar's value, so long as it is orderly, can help the U.S. trade pic-ture further without refueling inflation significantly.

## NAACP leader blasts paper

CHICAGO (AP) - A top official of the NAACP's Chicago chapter says he'll stay chained in front of the city's only black-owned daily newspaper until it retracts an editorial criticizing Mayor Harold Washington.

"As long as it takes, that's how long I'll be out here," the Rev. Herbert Martin said late Monday as he adjusted the 200-pound logging chain attached to his waist and a pillar of the building housing the Chicago Defender.





# The Rolling Stones to be awarded Grammy for lifetime achievement

LOS ANGELES (AP) - The Rolling Stones, which for 24 years has failed to win a Grammy, will finally receive one - a lifetime achievement award to be presented at tonight's 28th annual ceremony.

The Stones were not considered Grammy material when they were spinning out their sexy, threatening and downright raunchy music of the late 1960s and early 1970s. That was the time of "Honky Tonk Woman," "Sympathy for the Devil," "Gimme Shelter," "Midnight Rambler," and the "Let It Bleed" and "Sticky Fingers" albums. Mick Jagger was rock energy incarnate. The Rolling Stones will accept the award in a live

satellite broadcast from London during the awards show

Tonight's show, with Kenny Rogers as host, will be televised live and in stereo starting at 7 p.m. CST on CBS. Presentation of 14 of 71 awards will be shown, with the others given earlier. The nominees are songs released from Oct. 1, 1984, through October 1985.

Besides the Rolling Stones, the academy's trustees have voted lifetime achievement awards to clarinetist-bandleader Benny Goodman and classical guitarist Andre Segovia. The late George and Ira Gershwin will receive an achievement award, with Ira Gerswhin's widow, Leonore, accepting.



BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (AP) - Hernando Courtright, internationally famed hotelier who until recently owned the Beverly Wilshire Hotel, died Monday. He was 81.

Courtright's first venture into the hotel business was his purchase of the Beverly Hills Hotel in the 1930s. He sold that hotel in 1955, spent some time heiping to develop Century City and then took on the Beverly Wilshire. Courtight, who gained fame with his Beverly Wilshire Hotel at the foot of fashionable Rodeo Drive, sold the hotel Dec. 30 to Regent International for \$125 million. He had owned it since October 1961 and was credited with inspiring the growth of Rodeo Drive as a shopping area for the rich.



# Forget the 'fox'

ithout a doubt any number of people hoping the various leaders of warring factions in the Middle East can find the key to the peace padlock were heartened by Jordan's King Hussein dropping his effort to woo the PLO's Yasir Arafat. Hussein had every reason to take that step.

For the past year while Hussein has been seeking the support of the leader of the controversial and troublesome Palestine Liberation Organization, Arafat has stubbornly refused to recognize Israel as a legitimate state. The PLO chief, who once appeared at a United Nations assembly in New York with a gun on his hip, never was to be trusted as an intermediary.

In deciding to drop his effort to get Arafat to the peace table, Hussein remarked:

"We are unable to continue to coordinate with the PLO leadership until such time as their word becomes their bond.

That certainly hasn't been the case and it's little wonder the Middle East monarch became fed up. Arafat's departure from the peace-making scene is good riddance. Not that the Middle East doesn't need to quieten the PLO's radical attitude, but it was obvious the peacemaking proeight cess would not work with the organization involved. That would have been akin to inviting the fox into the henhouse.

Israel and Egypt, who exchanged ambassadors six years ago this month after 30 years of war, can with the help of the United States continue to work things out their own way. The presence of an anti-Israeli Arafat in the negotiations only would have been a destructive rather than a positive factor.

King Hussein deserves credit for trying to get the various factions together. Today he deserves credit for ditching a PLO leader whose word can't be trusted

ASHINGTON — Serious dif-ferences of professional opinion have split the team of forensic experts who traveled to Brazil last June to determine whether skeletal remains exhumed there were, in fact, those of Dr. Josef Mengele, the Nazi war criminal.

In its preliminary verlast dict summer, the team expressed confidence that the remains – a skull, bones and seven teeth were Mengele's. But in the

If the discovery of the bones was simply a hoax planned by the old Nazi and his accomplices, it has already achieved at least partial success. The concerted worldwide search for Mengele was called off when the experts proclaimed their "scientific certainty" that Mengele

was dead. If he's alive, the trail is now eight months colder. The principal sticking point - the most serious doubt that will not die

- involves the lack of any evidence of osteomyelitis, a bone-marrow disease that Mengele's S.S. records show he had suffered from as a teenager. Osteomyelitis, caused by infection,

can be treated today with antibiotics. But in the 1920s, when Mengele claimed to have had it, the disease was treated by surgery and there would have been some traces that would be detectable even half a cen-

Furthermore, he had told friends for years that he had once suffered from the disease The Justice Department's Office of Special Investigations was concerned by the team's inability to find any evidence of osteomyelitis in the

bones dug up last June, and it sent a Smithsonian Institution anthropolo-gist, Dr. Donald Ortner, to Brazil for an independent investigation. He had specific instructions to check for the disease, taking his own X-rays of the skeletal remains.

Ortner found no obvious trace of osteomyelitis.

What it boils down to is a matter of choice. Either you believe the remains in Brazil are Mengele's and therefore his S.S. records were wrong, or you believe the S.S. records were correct and the bones may not be Mengele's.

Professional reputations and egos are involved. The experts ducked the osteomyelitis mystery the first time around by making no reference to it in their preliminary report. But the final report is a different matter. Coupled with the bone disease question, enough other doubts have arisen to make some members of the team leery of a rush to judgment that could allow the Auschwitz "Angel of Death" to cheat the hangman.

BOMBS AWAY: Neighbors of the Naval Air Station at Fallon, Nev., are putting in their earplugs again. The Navy's F-18s have resumed practice bombing in their back yards. It had stopped for awhile following complaints of building damage and ruptured water lines. In addition, the Bureau of Land Management has been squabbling with the Navy for 15 years about the land. # Another View:

# Let the cameras roll

o you remember how much handwringing and worrying went on when the House Judiciary Committee decided to allow television coverage of impeachment proceedings in 1974? Even some politically knowledgeable people were concerned that members would grandstand, hog the camera and destroy the decorum of these extremely serious meetings. Instead, committee members rose to the occasion and brought credit to themselves and the House in allowing the American public to observe every step of the process. By 1979, the House had begun televising proceedings on the floor.

The Senate, meanwhile, has been relatively camera shy. Television coverage of committee hearings is allowed, but cameras are barred from the floor. After years of wrangling over whether to amend this rule, it now appears that senators are ready to take the big step. Some worry, though, that many Senate rules, devised in a more leisurely era, will make them look anachronistic, even foolish. Plans are being made to change some of these rules in preparation for television — to "clean up our act," says Sen. Robert Byrd — and that's fine.

There's no reason for lengthy, delaying quorum calls, for example, and more disciplined scheduling could be instituted. Nongermane amendments might have to go and electronic vote counting be adopted.

Hesitant legislators should have more faith in the viewing public. The people who would sit for hours watching the Senate debate are likely to be intelligent, involved citizens and fans of the legislative process. Within a single session many will be second-guessing the parliamentarian and futilely trying to prompt the debaters. They may be horrifled by arcane rituals, inefficiency and bluster, but they will understand and accept the rules that make sense.

As for the lense-louse factor the fear on the part of some senators that others will pose and pontificate - the public will not be fooled. In years of watching televised committee hearings we all remember certain senators whose very appearance on the screen caused millions of viewers to rush to the bathroom, head for the refrigerator or go downstairs to move the laundry from the washer to the dryer. Television enables us to separate the wits from the windbags, and it is the former who have the most to gain by allowing coverage. Let the cameras roll.

the number one concern in Pennsylvania. You know that when the main argument between Republicans and Democrats is which party can do it best. Even such things as education and a clean environment are talked about in terms of how they will impact economic development.

If you are a collector of fundamental shifts in the flow of American politics, this is one of them. Nationaly, as well as in places like Pennsylvania, the framework of the political debate has shifted from the people vs. business to how can we best help American business. Politicians have finally realized that if you cook the goose, you won't get any more eggs. This probably explains in part the

technology. On the other hand, Democrats claim more than 150 businesses have left the state in the last 18 months. # Hussein taking necessary risks in Mideast

MMAN, Jordan - King Hussein's disaffiliation from the PLO's Yasir Arafat was the first step in a daring strategy to move the deadlocked West Bank issue into negotiations before the hard-line Likud Party, with its expansionist territorial designs, takes command late this year in Israel. Arafat was

But certainly even the king himself does not foresee any careful predetermined stepby-step tactical path toward his objective. He is now open-field running, a treacherous course in the Middle East.

It may not be clear for many weeks whether Hussein's modulated attack on Arafat knocked him out. Instead, using his powerful weapons of massive financial support from Arab states, his ambiguous formulations and his automatic access to the media, Arafat might be able to exploit Hussein's attack and turn the West Bank's stateless 1.3 million Palestinians against him.

**Quick West Bank reactions were** sharply to the contrary. In an exclusive interview with us in his palace here, the king quietly noted that he had received "hundreds" of congratulatory messages from Palestinians. They came from the West Bank, from refugee camps and from Jor-dan's own Palestinian citizens forced out of the West Bank by Israel's occupation. An aide to the king said that delegations from the West Bank were planning to cross the Jordan River early this week to come and see him here.

But even if such reports are whol-ly accurate, their pro-Hussein impli-cations could be a mixed blessing:

They would raise unredeemable expectations among West Bankers who have waited vainly for relief from Arafat and the PLO high command for more than a decade.

Hussein is nowhere near ready to satisfy such expectations, and could not be. As of today, he has no recognizable negotiating partner with which to submit peace proposals that could lead to direct negotiations with Israel. He will never go alone. The proposals Hussein thought Arafat had accepted were all tied to the present "PLO leadership" - the Arafat-led "leadership" denounced as untrustworthy in Hussein's Feb. 19 speech.

Moreover, powerful enemies seek to torpedo Hussein's valiant effort to build a new negotiating bridge between a Jordanian-Palestinian team and Israel. The unreported machinations of one of these enemies - the Soviet Union - illustrate the case.

Mikhail Gorbachev, in an unusual intercession, personally warned Hussein in a message from Moscow that his Feb. 11, 1985, Accord with Arafat was against Soviet interests. Gorbachev had also worked hard to turn Arafat away from the "confederated Arab states of Jordan and Palestine, as set forth in the Hussein-Arafat Accord, and back to the Soviet-spon sored idea of an independent Pales tinian state.

Another enemy, as seen by the

king, is the pro-Israel lobby in the United States. He told us the power of the American-Israel Public Affairs Committee (AIPAC), Israel's main American lobby, was responsible for 'a great deal of procrastination" in the Reagan administration during the tortuous deliberations toward agreement on a negotiating framework.

Hussein fears that hard-liners inside the Likud Party, and extreme nationalists in smaller parties, will push a far more activist Israeli settlements policy on the West Bank when Likud takes over the prime ministership this fall.

Asked whether the U.S. could reverse such policy if it led to the eviction of Palestinians from the West Bank, the king told us he had doubts because of "the influence of AIPAC on the domestic (political) scene."

Hussein regrets such intrusions but will not be deflected by them. He knows he has already taken more risks in seeking peace with Israel than any other Arab leader except the assassinated Anwar Sadat. But he also knows this: The risks he takes are small compared to the dangers his country will soon confront if he takes no risks at all.

# Lousiana's pelican can flourish once more

GRAND CHENIERE, La. (AP) -The Louisiana state flag whips from the staff in front of the Rockefeller Wildlife Refuge, a reminder of what was once an embarrassment

The flag depicts the official symbol of the state - the brown pelican, which ceased to exist along Louisiana's teeming marshes in 1963.

"They just disappeared," said David Richard, a biologist for the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries. "The exact reason has not been proven but the theory is that pesticides was a reason, as was the subsidence of nesting colonies on the barrier islands due to severe hurricanes and weather changes.

Beginning in 1968, Louisiana asked Florida for help and the pelican was reintroduced. After a few setbacks, the population took hold and now the birds are thriving.

The pelican, with its white head and brownish-white body, was originally so common that the Legislature made it the official state bird more than 50 years ago. When Huey Long built the state Capitol, he had the bird's bigbeaked profiled emblazoned throughout on doors and murals. Biologists had estimated that Louisiana had 50,000 breeding pairs in the 1940s, but by 1950 the

population began decreasing until, in 1963, a check by department teams found not a single bird. Richard said he was concerned

late last year after the coast and barrier islands were battered by three hurricanes. We did have erosion at all sites

but found that the islands were

still suitable for nesting and seemed to have fared well," said Richard. "In fact, one colony is already nesting and another will be nesting shortly. We'll be flying over the areas in a few weeks to check on the results."

Colonies have been established at North Island in the Chandeleur Island chain and at Queen Bess-Camp Island in Barataria Bay.

"We think it has been an as-tounding success story," said Richard, "and it's getting bigger and bigger, re-establishing them in their original range."

Now, he said, the department is studying a way to transplant birds to the western part of the Louisiana coast. Historically, the birds ranged only in the eastern portion of the coastal area, leaving a gap of several hundred miles from central Louisiana to near Galveston, Texas.

The only setbacks came in 1973 and 1974, when many birds died and autopsies found lethal doses

of pesticides. The Mississippi River has been a mixed blessing," Richard said,. 'originally giving us the lush delta and the marshes, but at the same time it's the drainage area of the nation's farms. Pesticide runoffs gather in the Mississippi and are dumped into the Gulf of Mexico.

"In the brown pelican there was a magnification of the pesticides. The fish will eat the smaller fish, picking up the pesticide."

The pesticide problem hasn't been as great in recent years and biologists aren't positive just why, other than that there are more controls on the use of pesticides.



# Forecast calls for sunny skies

Wednesday in the Midland-Odessa area should be picture perfect. The National Weather Service at Mid-land Regional Airport is calling for sunny skies to accompany near 90 degree temperatures and light winds.

## STATE

Dense fog covered portions of the Lower Rio Grande Valley early today, dropping visibility to about one fourth of a mile.

Some high clouds drifted over portions of the western High Plains at dawn today, but clear skies were reported over the rest of Texas.

Forecasts called for sunny days and fair skies at night through Wednesday. Dense fog was also expected at dawn Wednesday along mid and upper sections of the Texas coast.

Lows tonight will be mostly in the 40s and 50s. Highs Wednesday will be slightly warmer, mostly in the 80s except for the 90s in Southwest Texas, ra upward into the mid 90s in the Big Bend area.

#### NATION

Snow spread across the mid-Atlantic Coast today while the Washington coast had rain and high winds, and much of the nation had abovenormal temperatures.

Snow-prompted travelers' advisories extended from southern New Jersey across Maryland, Delaware, northern Virginia and northeastern + West Virginia. Snowfall totals were expected to be 4 inches or less, the National Weather Service said.

Snowshowers extended from Lake Ontario across Vermont and south across eastern Virginia.

Rain spread along the Washington coast and gale-force winds lashed the Hood Canal of western Washington.

Partly cloudy skies prevailed across the rest of the nation and temperatures generally were above

Today's forecast called for snow scattered over Maine; rain widely scattered across the remainder of the northern half of the Atlantic Coast and across Washington; and strong and gusty winds from west-ern Wyoming across western Montana.

# Chaps 'fight' way to 29th consecutive win

Unbeaten Midland College made it 29 in a row, tying the Chaparrals' longest winning streak, with a free-wheeling 101-90 win over Western **Texas** College at Langford Chaparral Center Monday night. And it was a crowd-pleasing show even without the bench-clearing free-for-all.

It was an emotionally charged situation right from the start. WTC not only was taking dead aim at No. 3 ranked MC's unbeaten season, but as a result of Odessa College's upset of South Plains College Saturday night, "We can take second place in the conference," said Western Coach Phil Spradling before the game.

When trouble broke out, WTC indeed was leading 21-20 with 9:21 left in the first half and the brawl resulted in the loss of "our two best players" for the game, and one, it developed, for the rest of the year. "He was boning me so I boned him

right back," MC's Bruce Nix said in explaining the fight that began after he exchanged elbows with WTC's 6-9 Cliff Langford.

"He got me pretty good before that," said Chap center Eddie Frazier, who again had another big night.


Both Nix and Langford were ejected from the game, but the real loser was Alvin Hicks, who was knocked out when the benches emptied, and had to have stitches taken in his scalp and his jaw, broken on both sides, wired.

"He's out for the season," Spra-dling said after the game. "It was unfortunate the whole thing happened. But the intensity of the teams was too great. As a result there was a lot of pushing, and you've got to call that stuff early to keep things under control.'

AS FOR the blow that ended Hicks' season, the MC player admitted it was unfortunate and he was sorry it happened, "but he was the one who threw the ball at the back of Bruce's head. You can't let someone do that to a teammate."

MC Coach Jerry Stone was no less upset over the incident than Spradling, "People will say that's just junior college ball. They can't control their players, but this was one of those things. These were two intense teams and things got too rough out there and it happened.'

"They lost two players, but, like us,



the team is their strong point." The loss of the 6-9 Langford should have killed the Westerners. He had eight points in the first 10 minutes and MC's Tony Wright, Eddie Frazier, and Derrick Lewis had all picked up two fouls trying to keep the big Baton Rouge, La., sophomore under control.

'No doubt about it," said Spradling, "Langford was having his best game of the season. But we lost our two best players and still hung in there close. We are looking forward to playing them again in the Region V tournament at Snyder. We lost but I'm happy with our effort.

"I'm not blaming anyone for what happened. Things just got too physi-cal and when people came off the bench, that's when things really got bad.

Spradling added, "I'm glad Alvin isn't hurt bad. And we came out of the game knowing we can play with them.

WTC FINISHES at Levelland against South Plains Thursday. "If we win, we take second. If we lose, we finish third and will be in the same bracket as Midland.

As it turned out, 6-1 Alvin Lee kept the Westerners' in the game almost single-handedly, scoring 34 points with a 15-for-24 shooting clinic. James Dawn had 17.

"They've got more offensive talent than any one in the conference," said Coach Stone. "They all can shoot.

Blaylock, who scored 14 of his points in the last half, had as many assists as he did baskets.



# lo pass, no play' stands

HOUSTON (AP) — The U.S. Supreme Court's decision that Texas' "no pass, no play" law raises no federal questions clears the way for further attacks on the rule in state court, says a lawyer for students challenging the law.

The high court on Monday let stand the rule that bars failing students from extracurricular activities for six weeks. The rule was a major part of a 1984 education reform package approved by Texas legislators.

It became the most controversial part of the package after failing grades made about 15 percent of the state's varsity football players ineligible

HOUSTON ATTORNEY Anthony Sheppard said his clients will raise new issues when the case returns to state court

"This clarifies that we have not had any federal issues in the case yet," he said of the U.S. Supreme Court decisions. "The appeal was entirely based on Texas law and did not involve the U.S. Constitution. This is something we had to do to foreclose an argument in the state

Sheppard said when the case goes back to the state district court in Houston, the issue of the rule's effect on minorities and the handicapped will be included in his arguments. Those issues fall under federal jurisdiction, he said

Gov. Mark White, who pushed the reform bill in 1984 and has rejected efforts to make changes, said he was pleased by the decision.

"That's a state issue and we won," he said. State Education Commissioner W.N. Kirby said the

decision could end judicial scrutiny of no pass, no play. "I hope we will now be able to get this issue out of the

courthouse and get emphasis on academic achievement back into the classroom, where it rightly belongs," he said

Kirby said he believes the rule is working well. "However, at the request of the State Board of Educa-

tion we will be studying the overall impact of the no pass, no play rule very carefully after the first full year of implementaion has been completed," he said.

Texas Attorney General Jim Mattox said he had been confident the U.S. Supreme Court would uphold the law. The decision means Texans should "now know this is the law unless the Texas Legislature changes it."

Students who challenged the law for the most part were prevented from participating on interscholastic athletic teams.

But in their appeal to the Supreme Court, they said the penalty affects the right of free expression because students, for example, could be denied a spot on the school newspaper or in school government.

"The case patently does not involve the media favorite, 'academics vs. athletics,'" lawyers for the students said. "The undisputed evidence has revealed that the law works to deprive all public school children in Texas, falling within its purview, from participation in all extracurricular activities."

THE LAW also is arbitrary and capricious, the appeal said, because it may single out students who flunk one course and get straight "As" in all other courses. On the other hand, a student with all "Ds" - a poor but passing grade - is not prevented from taking part in extracurricular activities.

At an earlier stage in the suit challenging the law, lawyers argued that it discriminates against black and Hispanic students. That argument was not raised in the appeal acted on Monday.

The Texas Supreme Court, overruling a lower state court, reinstated the law last July.

The state Supreme Court said the right to take part in extracurricular activities is not guaranteed by either the Texas or federal Constitution.

Earnhardt was fined \$5,000, put under a \$10,000 bond and placed on probation for the remainder of the 1986 season, Gazaway said.


# Peterson snubs Pokes

# Gold soars

LONDON (AP) - The U.S. dollar fell against all major currencies in early trading today. Gold prices soared, boosted by political turmoil in the Philippines and the continuing economic troubles of heavily indebted Mexico.

Gold opened in London at a bid of \$348.75 a troy ounce, leaping \$7.50 from late Monday's \$341.25, and continued rising. At midmorning, the city's five major bullion dealers fixed a recommended price of \$351.40.

In Zurich, the bid was \$350 an ounce, an even sharper rise from \$341.50 late Monday. Earlier, in Hong Kong, gold rose \$6.13 an ounce to close at a bid \$348.34. Later, in London, the dollar was quoted at 181.05 yen.

The cost of living in Midland declined 0.7 percent during the month of January, according to figures released by ClayDesta National Bank this morning. Medical and housing expenses increased, but were offset by decreases in clothing, transportation, taxes, food at home, and utilities. The cost of eating out remained stable.

Over the last 11 months, according to ClayDesta's figures, the cost of goods and services in Midland rose 1.1 percent, due to increases in utilities, food at and away from home, clothing, medical and housing expenses. The only category to show a decrease was transportation.

Following three months of increases, the city of Odessa's cost of living rose 0.4 percent for the month, and showed a 1.9 percent increase during the last 11 months.

Reversing a December decrease, medical expenses in Midland rose 1.2 percent, due to higher prices for non-prescription drugs. Lower costs for doctor's care were offset by higher prices for over-the-counter drugs, resulting in a 1.6 increase for the year

Midlanders began paying higher rents during the month of January, resulting in a 0.5 percent increase in housing expenses. Although mainte-


nance costs slipped some, Midlers paid 1.3 percent more in housing costs during 1985.

Slightly higher prices for women's apparel were offset by lower price tags on children's clothing, resulting in a 2.3 percent decrease in the cost of buying clothes. The category showed a 3.3 percent increase for 1985, due to higher price tags for children's and men's clothing.

Midlanders paid less in transportation costs during the month of January, continuing December's downward trend. Transportation costs fell 2.4 percent, due to lower maintenance costs and gasoline prices, and a drop in automobile insurance rates. The taxes that Midlanders have to

pay decreased 1.4 percent during January as the new Federal rates took effect. The Social Security tax rose 1.4 percent while the Witholding decreased 2.7 percent.

Grocery prices decreased 0.8 percent in January, due to decreases in produce, alcohol and meat prices, which were offset by higher prices for shelf items. Increases in shelf items, produce and alcohol offset decreases in meat prices, leading to a yearly increase of 3.9 percent in grocery prices. The lowest prices were recorded in June, and the highest were seen in December.

# MidCon to sell profitable unit to clear way for Occidental merger

LOS ANGELES (AP) - MidCon Corp., the natural-gas pipeline concern that Occidental Petroleum Corp. is acquiring, said Monday it has agreed to sell its Mississippi River Transmission Corp. to Arkansas-based Arkla Inc. for \$305 million cash.

The sale will trim MidCon's revenues and earnings by about one-sixth.

The Federal Trade Commission, in giving its blessing earlier this month to the \$3 billion Occidental-MidCon merger, did so only on condition that Mississippi River Transmission be shed within a year

The FTC contended that that unless the division were sold, the merger would lessen competition in the pipeline transport and sale of natural gas in the St. Louis area

Sale of the division is expected to be completed in April after completion of the Occidental-MidCon merger, the companies said. Meantime, Los Angeles-based Occidental and Lom

bard, Ill.-based MidCon set shareholder meetings March 27 to vote on the second stage of the merger - a stockswap deal valued at about \$69.75 per share, or \$1.43

billion, for the remaining 49 percent of MidCon's stock Last week, Occidental completed the first stage of the merger by buying 21 million shares, or 51 percent, of MidCon's stock for \$75 each, or about or \$1.57 billion.

Mississippi River Transmission, which was purchased by MidCon in 1983, has about 2,200 miles of natural-gas pipelines in Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas, Missouri and Illinois.

That is about 7.3 percent of MidCon's 30,000 miles of pipeline. But last year the division accounted for about 16 percent of MidCon's revenues and earnings.

In fiscal 1985 ended Sept. 30, it earned \$26.5 million on revenues of \$625.1 million. MidCon earned \$156 million on sales of \$4.1 billion

Arkla, with offices in Little Rock, Ark., and Shreveport, La, operates about 9,600 miles of natural-gas pipelines, primarily in Kansas, Louisiana, Arkansas, Texas and Oklahoma

For fiscal 1985, Arkla earned \$69.5 million on revenues of \$993.4 million.

The merger of Occidental and MidCon would create the nation's 12th largest industrial company. Currently, Occidental ranks 18th

# Champlin Petroleum plans to cut work force

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) - Champlin Petroleum Co. of Fort Worth plans to cuts its salaried work force 10 percent by April 1 because of the recent plunge in oil prices, a company spokesman says.



# Airline merger faces obstacles, questions

MIAMI (AP) - The last-minute takeover of Eastern Airlines by Frank Lorenzo's Texas Air Corp. still faces many obstacles, and the 41,000 employees of the nation's No. 3 carrier are waiting to learn what it will mean for them.

Chief among their concerns is the anti-union reputation of Lorenzo, a former Eastern employee who founded Texas Air six years ago and since has taken over Continental Airlines and New York Air.

The \$606 million deal also must meet with the approval of Eastern's creditors, who earlier set a Feb. 28 deadline by which Eastern must have a firm business plan for a return to profitability or default on \$2.5 billion in debt.

The creditors could decide the agreement with Texas Air satisfied their requirements or they could decide that Eastern still must obtain concessionary contracts from unionized attendants, ground workers and pilots

Lorenzo flew to Miami from Houston on Monday and met with Eastern chairman Frank Borman and president Joe Leonard. Before leaving, he told KPRC-TV that "we're companybuilders, not union-busters."






# INVESTOR'S GUIDE Start investment Amer-lesues Chg. program with IRA

Q. What advice would you give to a young man, age 27, who seems anxious to get a modest investment program started? My son has about \$16,000 in a bank at 5.5 percent interest and a steady job paying about \$30,000 a year. Finan-cially, he has only himself to worry about, for the present.

Should he look for income, growth or both? About how much of the \$16,000 should he invest?

A. The first thing your son should do is pull his \$16,000 out of that 5.5 percent account obviously an old-fashioned savings account — and put all that money in a money market deposit account, where it will earn higher interest and be just as safe. It's a constant amazement to



Doyle counts. Banks love people who do that. In effect, your son has

been making a gift to his bank of the higher inter-est he could have been earning.

If he doesn't have an individual retirement account, he should open one - immediately. He has until April 15 to make a \$2,000 IRA contribution for 1985. And he should tuck another \$2,000 into the IRA for 1986.

He'll have to decide whether to look for high income or high growth. He can't expect to get the best of both from the same investment. For a young person, my recommendation would be to invest for growth in common stocks or mutual funds holding common stocks.

He should be aware that investments aiming for growth carry risk. If he doesn't want to take on risk, he should put most of his money in bank certificates of deposit or U.S. Treasury securities. How much to invest is another decision only he can make. I'd suggest keeping about \$3,000 in a money market deposit account, for emergency purposes, and investing the rest.

Q. My bank is offering "capital notes" in \$2,500 minimum denominations. The notes pay 12.25 percent interest and mature in seven, eight, nine and ten years. I have \$20,000 from a recently matured certificate of deposit and the 12.25 percent is higher than I can get on new CDs. I asked the bank teller if these notes are federally insured. He said they aren't but that they are backed by the bank. When I asked what would happen if the bank is taken over by another bank, he said the notes would be paid off before the takeover.

How safe are these capital notes?

A. Unlike various types of accounts and CDs, those capital notes are not deposits and, therefore, are not covered by federal deposit insurance. By buying those notes, you would become a creditor of the bank. If the bank fails, you might get nothing for your investment. My advice is to read the offering circular for

those notes very carefully. The teller's statement about the notes being paid off in the event of that bank being merged into another bank might not be true, unless there's a definite provision for that in the note offering.

All this is not intended to scare you. Banks frequently raise money by selling notes and other debt securities and, almost always, meet the inter est payments and maturity obligations It boils down to the fact that the notes are as safe as the bank. Because the notes do not have federal insurance, the bank naturally has to pay higher interest on them than on insured CDs

On my last trip, I received \$1.31 Canadian per U.S. dollar. On that very day, the exchange rate in the paper was \$1.40 Canadian per U.S. dollar. Where can U.S. investors get the full exchange rate?

A. Unless you deal in very large numbers, you can't. The foreign exchange rates in newspapers are for transactions of \$1 million and up. Those are the rates at which banks, brokerage houses and other institutional investors trade currencies. When you exchange smaller amounts of money you receive less foreign currency for U.S. dollars

This applies to all foreign currencies - not just Canadian dollars.

Since going into effect in October 1984, a Texas law requiring that young children be protected by seatbelts or car seats has cut the number of children killed in traffic accidents by almost a third, according to the Texas Department of Health.

"I think it's been very effective," said Highway Patrol Capt. Coy Clanton of the Department of Public Safety's Midland headquarters. "There's no question that the deaths have gone down."

From January through October

as auto accidents, according to statis-tics released by the Health Department. For the same period in 1984, 63 children were killed.

To celebrate the law's success and encourage better compliance, Gov. Mark White has declared this week Child Passenger Safety Week, which coincides with National Child Pas-senger Safety Week.

Laws are in effect now in all 50 states and the District of Columbia," said Carol Kendall of the Midland

Memorial Hospital Auxiliary's Kids 'n' Cars program.

The Texas law requires that all

years must ride in safety seats or be buckled in seat belts.

A more recent law requires that all front seat passengers in cars or light trucks wear seatbelts.

Clanton estimates that compliance with the child-safety law is about 80 percent. According to the Health Department, if all children up to 4 years old were properly restrained while on the road, 90 percent of child traffic deaths and 85 percent of injuries could be prevented.

Convert-ible seats (\$40 to \$100) are designed for children from infancy up to about 43 pounds, and toddler seats (also \$40 to \$100) are intended for children weighing between 20 and 43 pounds. Booster seats, which can be used with seat belts, are for children weighing between 30 and 60 pounds,

ed 65 percent of all child-safety seats are incorrectly used, and emphasized the importance of following manufacturers' instructions to ensure the full safety benefit for the child.

She cautioned against using older seats made before federal standards went into effect in 1981; seats that have no instruction booklets with them; or seats which have been put through the strain of an accident.

The hospital auxiliary's Kids 'n' Cars program provides information and short-term rentals on car seats

(infant seats can be rented for as long as needed).

For lower-income families, the Department of Public Safety has a federal grant to loan car seats for sixmonth periods, according to Clanton. But supplies are limited, and all the seats are currently in circulation, he said.

Before the law was passed, "Texas was one of the states that led the nation" in child traffic deaths, Clanton said.

"Our greatest asset is our people," he said. "If we can keep those youngsters alive, they may be the ones who solve all our problems."

# dessa's `streams of living water' not just for Catholics

ODESSA (AP) - No crucifixes adorn the walls at the Manatial de Vida - streams of living water Hispanic Christian bookstore

No votive candles line the racks Rosary beads do not clutter the tables

Gone are the trappings of Catholicism That absence, said the operators of the store on West Eighth Street in Odessa, is one of the more obvious signs of their reborn faith Manatial de Vida, in other words,

is a store not just for those of the Catholic faith - the religion embraced by many of the world's Hispanics - but for Hispanic Christians of all denominations, say operators Joe and Nelida "Nellie" Arana.

The 30-year-old Joe Arana, an Alpine native who earns his living selling insurance, said that, like most Hispanics, he was brought up in the Catholic church.

Today, he attends the First Assembly of God Church along with his wife. Both teach a Sunday School class for 14 to 17-year-olds.

The Aranas say they are among a growing number of Hispanics to turn from traditional religion toward what they consider a "person-

"It's just Christian," Mrs. Arana said. She said it is a misconception that all Hispanics are Catholic.

People are hungry for the word of God." Arana added. He was quick to point out that he's not trying to say Catholics don't embrace God's word

"It's just that (many Hispanics are) looking for something different, and that's when they have a personal encounter with Christ," he said.

Spanish-language Bibles and Spanish-language plaques bearing wellknown Bible quotations take the

place in the Aranas' store of medicinal herbs and votive candles found in many other Hispanic religious

bookstores. The books written in Spanish. bear titles familiar to many Christian readers: "Las Cruz y el Punal," or "The Cross and the Switchblade, for example, and "Corre! Nicky, Corre!" or "Run! Nicky, Run!"

Spanish translations of books by James Dobson, a minister who produced a film series on family life, elbow for space with books by evangelist Billy Graham.

In a sunlit back room, Spanish rec

ords and tapes fill cabinets and spill over into several racks.

In a black dress and black heels, Mrs. Aranas smiles wryly as she recalls phone calls from Odessans who obviously misunderstood the 2-yearold store's purpose.

A sign in front bears both the store's name, Manatial de Vida, and the explanation, "Libreria Y Discoteco Cristiana," or Christian book and record store, Mrs. Arana pointed out.

Some passers-by must miss reading the word "Cristiana," Mrs. Arana speculated, because she has received calls asking whether the store sold the Spanish-language edition of "Playboy" magazine.

Other would-be customers walked inside the store for a quick survey before walking back outside. Those people may have wanted "hiervas," or medicinal herbs traditionally found in Spanish bookstores, the Aranas speculated.

The Aranas said they noticed a need for the store after talking to other Hispanic Christians, who were driving to Lubbock and San Antonio in order to buy the same books now sold by the Aranas.

# Bentsen introduces bill to set up border health program

WASHINGTON - Sen Lloyd Bentsen, D-Texas, Monday introduced legislation to set up an education and training program for health workers on the U.S. Mexico border.

Similar legislation was introduced last week by Rep. Jack Brooks, D-Beaumont. Rep. Albert Bustamante, D-San Antonio, is a co-sponsor of the House bill.

The health needs of border area

residents far exceed the ability of the existing network of providers to meet those needs," said Bentsen, quoting from a report from the 1985 U.S.-Mexico Border Health Conference.

Training programs envisioned by the proposal would be carried out in cooperation with similar programs in communities on the Mexican side of the border, but the bill specifies

> "Rapid and profound changes on the border in recent years - such as the peso's devaluation from 20 to 400 pesos per dollar since 1980 - have overwhelmed the existing border health care network," Bentsen said.

A successful, small-scale program aimed at increasing the number of health professionals in South Texas has been carried out by the University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston for the past 12 years. Brooks, chairman of the House Government **Operations** Committee, represents Galveston.

UTMB worked closely with South Texas colleges and health care providers to allow physicians to spend part of their residency there. More than 1,600 South Texas students were recruited for training in nursing, dental and allied health careers and 83 percent of them remained to practice in the region.

# Employees union suggests corporate income tax

AUSTIN - A state employee hiring freeze will disproportionately affect front-line workers because direct care positions have such a high turnover rate, the Texas State Employees Union said Monday.

At a Capitol press conference, union leaders again suggested a corporate income tax to raise more money for the state. The organization, which has about 10,000 members, also urged lawmakers to con-sider a state lottery and pari-mutuel betting as alternative sources of mone

Gov. Mark White ordered the freeze on state employee hiring as part of his plan to offset a \$1.3 billion revenue shortfall Comptroller Bob Bullock predicted two weeks ago. Bullock named declining oil prices and federal budget cuts as the reason for his revenue adjustment.

The governor's austerity plan calls for 13 percent cuts in all state agen-



cies, colleges and universities. White said agencies could achieve that goal without layoffs, across-the-board cuts or the elimination of "essential ervices

White also said the reductions could be made without jeopardizing a 3-percent yearly pay raise legisla-

Wayne Smith, spokesman for the Texas State Employees Union, says, at a Monday press

conference in Austin, that employees will help find ways to cut the state budget.

tors approved for state employees. Wayne Smith, a state fire safety inspector who is a lobbyist for the employees union, said he expects "massive layoffs" of state workers, if agency heads do not make the 13rcent cut

While we believe that the budget

cuts will hamper the delivery of services," Smith said, "we will do our part to assure that the impact is not placed solely on the recipients of our services and the employees who provide them.

Smith said he is afraid that if the union does not get involved in the budget-cutting process, agency man-agers "will insulate themselves and not protect the front-line employees that we represent." He said the union has planned a

"grassroots efficiency campaign" to determine where cuts can be made without jeopardizing the delivery of services. A series of committees will review agencies' operations and de-velop recommendations for the govrnor and the Legislature.

"We are confident that, given the opportunity, state employees, who are the state's best resource, will come up with viable and productive cost-saving measures," Smith said.

# Cuts won't save enough money, state report says

AUSTIN (AP) - Gov. Mark White is being unrealistic to hope that freezing hiring and cutting spending will save \$1.3 billion, according to an aide to Comptroller Bob Bullock. In a report titled "The New Math of the Governor's Budget Plan," the

aide said White's plan to meet a pro-jected budget shortfall this budget cycle could save as little as \$100 million to \$200 million.

The Austin American-Statesman received the report on the condition the author would remain unidentified.

White ordered state agencies and universities last week to cut spending by 13 percent by imposing moratoriums on hiring and merit pay raises, restricting travel and halting purchases of non-essential supplies. The action was spurred by falling oil revenues caused by a collapse in oil prices.

The report said White's plan will save \$557 million "under the most optimistic assumptions."

While it does appear possible that it will save some money, holding out the hope that it will even come close to filling the full \$1.3 billion budget hole is completely unrealistic," the aide wrote, adding that layoffs would almost certainly be necessary in order to reach the goal.

White promised that no state employees would be laid off, nor would critical services be cut.

A spokeswoman for White, who was in Washington Monday, said White never said the suggested cuts would add up to \$1.3 billion.

Janis Monger of White's press office said White "never said that money.

these are the only options open to state agencies to trim their budgets. They were offered as starting points

White, in Washington for the National Governors' Association meeting, told The Associated Press there "always a Chicken Little out there who says that something can't be done.

The governor disagreed with the report's contention that his cost-cutting figures are unrealistic. "I want to suggest to you that our numbers are accurate," he said.

"Just attrition alone, we should save \$400 million in Texas just by not replacing everyone who quits or resigns.

White also said he did not believe that Bullock had leaked the report to embarrass him.

"Not at all," White said. "He wouldn't dare."

Bullock projects state revenue and certifies that the state will not spend more than it collects.

White said \$10.2 billion could be cut without affecting public schools, highways and retirement programs, but the report said only \$4.2 billion is available for cuts.

White's executive assistant, Clif Drummond, said, "We feel pretty confident of the \$10.2 (billion) as the budget base from which it is possible to effect savings.

"We don't have to see cuts in agency budgets totaling \$1.3 billion by this coming Saturday night, but we have got to have in place a savings plan that reduces the rate of spending such that we won't run out of

# Woman claims innocence in federal judge's murder

AUSTIN (AP) — Elizabeth Chagra says she is still convinced she is innocent of conspiracy in the murder of San Antonio Federal Judge John Wood in 1979.

"I know they will never convict me but it's the long months in jail," the 32-year-old defendant said in a tape played Monday for the jury of seven men and five women.

She testified on cross-examination the recording was made by FBI agents while she visited her husband, Jimmy Chagra, in a federal prison in 1981.

Throughout extensive cross exami-nation, she maintained that she did not know a payoff for the judge's murder was in a briefcase she delivered to a Las Vegas hotel room, a main contention of the government.

Mrs. Chagra is charged with conspiracy to commit murder in the slaying of Wood on May 29, 1979, outside his San Antonio home. If found guilty, she faces up to 30 years in prison.

Wood, called "Maximum John" for the stiff sentences he gave drug dealers, had been scheduled to preside at a narcotics trafficking trial of Jimmy Chagra.

The lengthy questioning of Mrs. Chagra, the last defense witness, caused attorneys to predict the case might not go to the jury until Thursday morning. Final arguments are tentatively set for Wednesday, three hours each side.

U.S. District Judge William Sessions refused late Monday to grant a defense motion for a mistrial because government attorneys brought up Mrs. Chagra's previous convictions as a means of questioning her credibility as a witness. After the motion was denied, Defense Attorney Warren Burnett had Mrs. Chagra testify she had completed serving the sentences given in three felonies — a cocaine possession charge in California, an Internal Revenue tax charge and a 1982 charge of obstructing justice in the assassination of Wood.

Much of Monday was spent replaying wiretaps of conversations between Mrs. Chagra and her husband while he was in federal prison in 1979 and 1980.

"I didn't believe that was what it was for," Mrs. Chagra said again Monday on cross-examination when asked about the briefcase containing \$250,000 she took to a Jockey Club Hotel room in 1979.

"I would not have taken it if I had thought that," she said.

Earlier, she testified her husband told her to deliver the money. She said he at first said it was for the slaying of U.S. District Judge John Wood, then told her he was only "joking" and she assumed it was for a gambling debt.

"I always agreed with what my husband had to say and what my husband told me to do," she said. She said Monday, as she had testified earlier, that she first learned she made the payoff in September 1980 when her brother-in-law, Joe Chagra, said it went to Charles Harrelson. Harrelson is now serving a life sentence for killing Wood.

Mrs. Chagra said she asked her husband about the payoff when she visited him in the federal prison at Leavenworth, Kan.

# Final arguments scheduled in principal's murder trial

LIVINGSTON (AP) - Final arguments were scheduled today in the trial of former junior high school principal Hurley Fontenot, charged with murder in the death of a football coach.

Fontenot, 48, former principal at Hull-Daisetta Woodson Junior High School, is accused in the April 12 shooting death of coach Billy Mac Fleming, whose body was found 10 days later in a densely forested area southwest of Livingston.

Fleming, 36, had been shot twice in the back of the head with a 22caliber weapon

Prosecutors contend Fontenot and Fleming were rivals for the affections of Laura Nugent, 36, a school secretary. Fleming and Mrs. Nugent planned to marry last summer.

Testimony showed blood was found in Fontenot's pickup truck. But a state Department of Public Safety forensic chemist testified he could not match the samples to Fleming's blood type.

Defense attorney Dick DeGuerin suggested someone else killed Fleming, possibly a former business associate who was "a big-time drug dealer" or the coach's estranged wife who collected \$55,000 from three insurance policies.

> Fontenot, who has steadfastly maintained his innocence, acknowledged he gave Fleming a ride to the school field house on the last day the coach was seen alive.

Afterward, Fontenot said he drove to a Houston airport to meet his daughter. When she never arrived, a drove to a Louisiana horse race track. He said he kept a weapon for personal protection because he frequently went to the race track late at night.

Fontenot also told jurors he "occasionally" dated Mrs. Nugent for about two years, beginning in late 1982. However, he denied he ever seriously proposed marriage.



# Gorbachev attacks 'stiffness' of Soviet bureaucracy

MOSCOW (AP) - Mikhail S. Gorba-chev today opened the 27th Soviet chev today opened the 27th Soviet Communist Party congress with an attack on the "stiffness and escala-tion" of Soviet bureaucracy — a clear reference to the legacy of for-mer party leader Leonid I. Brezhnev. Speaking to 5,000 party members and foreign guests, Gorbachev, the party's general secretary, also pre-dicted the "moral and political isola-tion of U.S. imperialism " and called

tion of U.S. imperialism," and called on Communists to abandon "habitual but already outdated notions" in their approach to world and domes-tic problems.

Delegates to the congress, the nominally supreme party body that meets every five years, will elect a new Central Committee, approve a policy program and changes in party rules, and formally endorse a new five-year plan and economic targets in line with Gorbachev's reform efforts.

At today's session, Gorbachev said the Soviet leadership commends the country's achievements but also considers it to be its duty to tell the party and the people honestly and frankly about the deficiencies in our

political and practical activities, the unfavorable tendencies in the economy and the social and moral sphere,

and about the reasons for them." He told party delegates assembled at the Kremlin Palace of Congresses that party and government bodies had "tailed behind the needs of the times and of life."

"The inertness and stiffness of the forms and methods of administration, the decline of dynamism in our work, and an escalation of bureaucracy - all this was doing no small damage," Gorbachev said. Gorbachev did not refer to Brezh-

nev by name, but his remarks clearly referred to the Kremlin leader who headed the Soviet Communist Party from 1964 until his death in 1982. The final years of Brezhnev's 18-year reign were characterized by bureaucratic stagnation and the occupation of numerous posts by aging bureaucrats.

Gorbachev criticized the United States for what he said was manipulation of the dollar's value and interest rates to "fatten its economy" at the expense U.S. allies, and for allegedly exploiting developing countries.

He said capitalism will have to choose between "shameless force



and plunder" and criticized "bourgeois corruption and vandalization" worldwide.

The U.S. ruling circles are clearly losing their realistic bearings," Gorbachev said, predicting "the inevitable moral and political isolation of U.S. imperialism.

In contrast to the opening of the last party congress held in 1981 un-der Brezhnev, Gorbachev dispensed with a conditional sectors of the se with a reading of the 100-plus names of foreign delegates, a time-consuming process. Applause from the party delegates was brief as Gorbachev and the 10 other members of the ruling Politburo took their places at the podium, with President Andrei A. Gromyko and Kremlin ideologist Yegor Ligachev flanking the Soviet

leader The session was nationally tele vised and made available worldwide by satellite. The official Soviet news agency Tass began running a text of Gorbachev's speech, said to be nearly 200 pages long, and Radio Moscow provided a simultaneous English-language translation.

Gorbachev will turn 55 on Sunday, and nine days later will mark the first anniversary of his rise to the post of party leader following the death of Konstantin U. Chernenko. Chernenko held the post briefly after the death of Yuri V Andropov, who had been chosen to succeed Brezhnev

Gorbachev's year of leadership has aiready has brought widespread per-

sonnel changes in party and govern-ment. Only three of the 11 members of the Politburo were appointed un-der Brezhnev and are reminders of

nearly two decades of gerontocracy. In his speech, Gorbachev quoted extensively from Karl Marx and Friedrich Engels, who developed the theory of communism, and from Vladimir I. Lenin, the leader of the 1917 Bolshevik revolution that brought the Communists to power in Russia.

His references appeared to be a call for a return to the basics of communism, but he also said, "any attempt at turning the theory by which we are guided into an assortment of ossified schemes and pre-scriptions valid everywhere and in all contingencies is most definitely contrary to the essence and spirit of Marxism-Leninism.

About half of the Central Committee seated at the 1981 congress have died, retired or been removed from the local office that gave them the seat on the committee. Additional changes at this congress will give Gorbachev a new slate of deputies to carry out his policies at regional levels

Iran protests U.N. Security Council resolution

NICOSIA, Cyprus (AP) - Iran night was "ineffective and shallow, launched a new offensive in the mountains of northeast Iraq today to protest a U.N. Security Council reso-lution calling for a cease-fire in the two nations' 51/2-year-old war.

man bones, large pieces of aircraft, and at least one set of dog tags have been found at a crash site in southern Laos where a U.S.-Laotian team is searching for remains of American MIAs, a spokesman said today.

Lt Col. Terry McCann, a spokes-man for the U.S. Pacific Command, said the bones were found with "limited personal effects" and large pieces of aircraft at the site in Savannakhet province where an AC-130 gunship carrying 14 American airmen crashed almost 14 years ago.

Today is the ninth day of excavation at the site. The search is expected to last several more days and the remains will be flown to the Honolulu-based Joint Casualty Resolution Center for analysis, McCann said.

This is the second such joint project allowed by the Laos government. The remains of 13 missing U.S. airmen were uncovered in the first excavation a year ago in Pakse Province south of Savannakhet.

## Israel to buy Mexico oil

MEXICO CTTY (AP) - Israel will continue buying petroleum from Mexico despite the uncertainty in the world market, an official of that nation's embassy said.

Mijail Eligol, the embassy's counselor for economic affairs, told the government newspaper El Nacional that Israel was not interested in promoting the further fall of oil prices but rather in seeing the market stabilize.

Mexico provides about 40 percent of Israel's demand of 50,000 barrels a day.

# China airline to add jets

PEKING (AP) - China's national airline, CAAC, plans to add another 30 jets to its fleet this year, bringing its total fleet to 490 aircraft, the official Xinhua news agency said today. The report quoted CAAC Director Hu Yizhou as tellling an aviation conference in Peking that over the

past five years, CAAC has acquired nearly 100 imported jetliners. The new airplanes are to include Boeing 747s and 737s, according to

Xinhua. CAAC, which stands for Civil Aviation Administration of China, is also the nation's civil aeronautics ministry.

## Six killed in bus crash

DHAKA, Bangladesh (AP) — Six people were killed and 50 injured when a bus plunged off a 40-foot-high bridge near Manikganj, 62 miles northwest of Dhaka, police said today.

The drill bits don't meet. To complete the hole, she pushes the left drill to the right until it opens the channel all the way through. In another room, workers line up the pearls and string them onto threads of nylon.

Nishioka is not accustomed to talking with reporters, but he is self-assured and friendly. Visits by foreigners are discouraged and rare. Perhaps that accounts for the fact

> Why haven't other countries been able to duplicate Japan's success in producing cultured pearls?

Several reasons, Nishioka says. They don't have as ready a supply of the mussels from the Mississippi River, for one. They have different varieties of oysters, for another. But the biggest reason is security, he says. A Japanese man tried to start a cultured-pearl business in Malaysia, and he was killed by the underworld. Nishioka says. That would not happen in Japan, he says.
