



Professional Processors, Ltd. has applied to the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) for issuance of Air Quality Permit No. 35729 to authorize construction of a Feedmill Quality Permit No. 35729 to authorize construction of a Feedmill Facility located on Highway 287 about one-half mile from the intersection of Highway 54 and Highway 287, Stratford, Sherman County, Texas. The proposed facility will emit the following air contaminants: particulate matter and products of combustion (including carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide, nitrogen oxides, and unburned hydrocarbons). A person who may be affected by air contaminants emitted from the proposed facility may request a hearing. emitted from the proposed facility may request a hearing.

Hearing requests of comments on the application must be received in writing at the Chief Clerk's Office, MC-105, TNRCC, P.O. Box 13087, Austin, Texas 78711-3087, within 30 days after the second publication of this notice. This notice is to be published on July 10, 1997 and July 17, 1997.


