"Best Practices in Home Economics Education" offered sessions conducted by teachers sharing successful approaches to planning, teaching and management which have proven to be especially successful in their home Economics

Gay Nell McGinnis, Texas Education Agency's State Director for Home Economics Education said, "Implementation of the newly adopted Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills for Home Economics Education will provide a unique opportunity for educators. Adjustments in local programming and instruction reflecting the updated, redirected content will enable optimal student preparation for future family, community and workforce roles. Conference participants have positioned themselves for the training necessary to most effectively capitalize on this opportunity."

The percentage increase as listed in the required public notices are a result of increased values in the District. The proposed tax rate is well below the 1996-97 tax rate.

In general, the values of most homes have remained constant which in most cases holds the line on an individual's tax liability to the district. The increase listed in the public notice is due to increased royalty values and irrigated farm land.

The "Effective Tax Rate" is computed by applying a formula to the values for the upcoming year and the levy for the preceding year rather than using the actual tax rate approved by the Board.
