The Chamber of Commerce needs more huntable land!! The Chamber is seeking land to lease for the annual Pheasant Hunt. Huntable land is defined as ground covered in stalks or with sufficient coverage (CRP, grass) and grain to attract pheasants.

The opening weekend of pheasant season, December 13-14, has a waiting list of more than 40 hunters in the event that more land is made available. There are also hunters scheduled for the remainder of the season ((thru December 28).

The landowners or operators are reimbursed for the use of their land. Fifty percent of the Pheasant Hunt profits will be distributed to the landowners/operators and the Chamber will retain the other fifty percent as the year's largest fund

United Methodist Church, located at the corner of Foster and Ballard (across from the Post Office) is host church. A a.m. reception provided by the church will follow the evening of music.


There is no admission charge. Donations, however, will be accepted to help defray costs of the event, such as printing, postage, and travel expenses for the out of town participants.

A Cheery Treat Made With Tasty Cherries



(NAPS)—A dessert likely to deliver holiday cheer is light and luscious Cherry Angels.

These very special treats are similar to a light macaroon, but feature the added flavor of delectable, canned cherries. Besides tasting terrific, the colorfully topped cookies can brighten any holiday table.

CHERRY ANGELS

- 1 can (16 oz.) dark sweet cherries
- 2 teaspoons butter
- 3 egg whites
- 1 cup sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 2 cups shredded or flaked coconut
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch

Drain cherries; reserve liquid. Bring cherries, 1/4 cup reserved liquid and butter to boil in skillet; simmer over medium heat until liquid evaporates. In mixer bowl, beat egg whites until soft peaks form. Gradually add sugar, while beating, until stiff peaks form. Beat in vanilla and salt.

Toss coconut and cornstarch together; fold into egg whites. Drop by heaping teaspoonfuls onto greased cookie sheet. Make an indentation on mound with back of spoon large enough to hold one or two cherries. Bake at 325°F about 20 minutes or until edges are browned. Cool cookies on a wire rack. Store in airtight container. When ready to serve, place 1 or 2 cherries in indentation on top of each macaroon. Makes 3 dozen.

Storage Tips:
• Cooked filling may be

stored in airtight container 3 to 4 days in refrigerator.

· Top macaroons with cherries 1 to 2 hours before serving for best results.

 Bake a batch of macaroons and pack them in an airtight container. Give the macaroons, a can of dark sweet cherries and the recipe as a gift. The recipient of the gift can prepare the filling and serve Cherry Angels to guests at a

TEKS-What IS TEKS?

By Larry B. Norris **High School Math Teacher**

Accountability. We are all living in the age of accountability. We must stand accountable for our actions and our work performance. This is nowhere more evident than in the public schools. Enter such terms as "Essential Elements, Assessment of Academic Skills, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills, End of Course Exams" and

Essential Elements have been around for over a decade. For those who may not know, the Essential Elements are merely lists of the skills the state says should be learned in a given subject. They are extensive in each subject area and are grade-specific. They have forced the schools to focus the classroom instruction toward the EE's. Accountability.

Okay, the schools have their goals established by the state, now how do you measure a school's success at effectively teaching the EE's?---the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills (TAAS), that's how. For years students in various grade levels have taken the TAAS test in Readin,' Ritin", and Rithmetic. The Exit-Level TAAS test was given to Juniors preparing to graduate the following year. All graduating Seniors have to pass all three parts of the TAAS to receive their diploma. Beyond the three TAAS is gradually implementing social studies and science into the testing regime. Statewide, so many students failed at least one option of the test that the state had to reevaluate their thinking and the test was then given to the Juniors at the start of their junior year instead of the last of their junior year as previously done. Still too many failed so now we give the TAAS to the Sophomores as they will have more opportunities to retake the test if they fail. The state is testing Sophomores over everything they are expected to know by the end of their senior year. Strange idea. Very strange.

Stratford students traditionally have done very well on the Exit-Level TAAS tests. For example, last year's Sophomores scored 97% in Reading, 97% in Writing, and 94% in Mathematics, WELL above the state norms. Being a math teacher I am acquainted with the math norms; the average passing rate in mathematics statewide was only 68%.

The teachers of the various grades and/or subject areas being tested have recently gone to Amarillo for workshops and have been briefed on the newest state accountability instrument--the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS). It goes into effect in selected subject areas next
