C. R. Houston of Houston Dry Goods Co: "The coming of the proposed railroad extension from McBain will mean a direct route to St. Louis and New York and will mean a great saving in time and money on freight and also on passenger travel.

George T. Moore, of Kansas City: "The coming of the Q. A. & P. Railroad will be the greatest boon since the building of the pioneer road, the Santa Fe. It will greatly stimulate prices of both farm lands and city property and will help to vercome, to a great extent, the present depression, the result of the low price of cotton.
