Anyone wishing to nominate a student believed to be an intellectually or creatively gifted learner is encouraged to go to the principals office and complete a nomination form. The deadline for nomination forms is February 26, 2001.

Those students nominated will then go through a screening procedure that requires special testing. Parents will be requested to grant permission for the testing.

Mathews Invited To Park Royal Down Under International Games In Australia



We will be carrying all our present lines plus expanding into some new and different areas of gifts and home decor with maybe a couple of surprises.


