Numerous reports of beet armyworms infesting corn has been
received from corn growing areas north of the Canadian River. Beet armyorm typically is more prevalant under drice conditions later

time of year. Small corn can take considerable leaf damage so time of year. Small corn can take considerabic lear amage, so
would be reluctant to treat for bect armyworm now. Continue to would
monitor crop for larvae and eggs to see if this is just a brief flurry of
beet beet armyworm activity or perhaps an extended infestation. Continue to monitor wheat for true armyworm. Armyworm
moths have been positively identified in the area, so the potential exists for infestations to develop in wheat.
