State officials approved $\$ 1,934,274$ for the Stratford Main Street project today. The project is one of 10 transportation enhancement projects totaling nearly $\$ 12$ million selected by the Texas Transportation transportation enhancement projects.
The Statewide Transportation Enhancement Program funds non-rraditional transportation projects such
as as those involving bicycle and pedestrian facilities, landscaping and scenic beautification, historical
preservation and environmental mitigation. All the approved projects were selected from 315 eligible projects, totaling more than $\$ 500$ million,
nominated last year by local authorities across the state. Projects are evaluated for quality, transporlation nominated last year by local authorities across the state. Projectis are evaluated for quality, transportation
value and benefits. alue and benefits.
Enhancement projects are eligible for federal reimbursement of up to 80 percent of allowable cost administrative expenses. Preliminary project work must be authorized in advance by the Federal Highwa Administration for eligible cost reimbursement.

"As a general rule, a farmer
must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency oan," Mr. Lathem said. Farmers participating is the Federal Crop
Insurana program will have to figure in proceeds from those programs in determining their
loss.
"Applications for loans under
this emergency designation will be accepted until October 1, 2002, but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying
could create backlogs in processing and possibly over into the new farming season," Mr. athem said.

FSA is a credit agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. It is authorized to provide disaster farmers who work at and rely on farming for a substantial part of their living. Eligibility is extended citizens and to farming partnerships, corporations or cooperatives in which U.S. citizens hold a majority interest.
