Attention: Taxpayers

At a time when people are concerned about the tax increases, everyone should make an effort to be better informed about the Texas property tax system and how it functions.

Main divisions of the property tax system are:

- 1. APPRAISAL DISTRICT which sets the value of property based on procedures established by state laws. These values are checked each year by the Property Tax Division of the State Comptroller's Office for accuracy. An Agricultural Advisory Committee of three local farmers reviews farm and ranch land values. The Chief Appraiser operates the Appraisal District office and is employed by an eight-member board. This board is elected by the taxing units.
- APPRAISAL REVIEW BOARD is a board of seven local 2. citizens who settle any disagreements between the taxpayer and the Appraisal District concerning value.
- LOCAL TAXING UNITS (county, city, school, hospital, other governments) decide how much revenue will be needed to operate for the coming year. They then set the tax rate, which determines how much tax liability each taxpayer will have. Each taxing unit has an elected governing body.

Through the checks and balances of the system, no one person has total responsibility for your tax bill. The State Comptroller's Office annually issues "A Taxpayers Guide to Rights, Remedies, Responsibilities". Free copies are available at the Appraisal District office.

The work of locating and placing value on property is completed for the 2004 tax roll. On May 28, taxpayers were mailed a notice or proposed value on their property. Now is your opportunity to respond if you have questions or difference of opinion in regard to this value. After the Appraisal Review Board meets and approves the records, the Appraisal District has no more authority over the value. The values then go to the taxing units in the form of an appraisal roll. At that time, the taxing units are preparing budgets and setting rates.

Most taxing units have contracted with the Appraisal District to do collection of taxes. The County Tax Assessor/Collector collects the County's taxes.

Project ChildSafe **Comes To Stratford**, TX: 500 Firearms Safety Kits To Be **Distributed Locally**

Stratford, TX. - The Stratford Police Dept. will provide500 free firearm safety kits to local residents through a partnership with Project ChildSafe, the nationwide firearms safety education program. The safety kits, which include a gun lock, will be distributed at the Stratford Police Dept. or from any patrolman while on patrol.

Project ChildSafe, a program developed by the National Shooting Sports Foundation (NSSF), will distribute millions of firearms safety kits throughout the country over the next year. The program is funded by a U.S. Department of Justice grant, with additional funding provided by the firearms industry.

"We encourage residents to pick up a Project ChildSafe safety kit so they can securely store their firearm," said Chief Dennis. "Each kit contains a safety curriculum and a cablestyle gun lock. The locks fit on most types of handguns, rifles and shotguns. The goal is to prevent a child or any other unauthorized person from accessing a firearm in your home."

By partnering with Project ChildSafe, Stratford Police Dept. is participating in a growing national effort to promote firearms safety education to all gun owners. Project ChildSafe will distribute gun lock safety kits to all 50 states and the five U.S. territories. "We are pleased to have the Stratford Police Dept. as a Project ChildSafe partner," said Dee Dee Dockins, spokesperson for the program. "Project ChildSafe is an important step forward in helping ensure that all firearm owners fully understand

History of Mourning Button

Several wars, but particularly the Civil War, left many female mourners in America, including mothers, widows, grandmothers, sisters, cousins and aunts. Foreign **Investors Must Report U.S.** Holdings

Foreign investors with an interest in agricultural lands in the United States are required to report their holdings and any transactions to the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture, according to the Sherman County Farm Service Agency.

"Any foreign person who acquires or transfers any interest, other than a security interest, in agricultural land in the United States is required by law to report the transaction no later than 90 days after the date of the transaction," said Rebecca Hemphill, County Executive Director of the Sherman County Farm Service Agency.

Foreign investors must file Agricultural Foreign Investment Disclosure Act (AFIDA) Reports with the Farm Service Agency county office in which the land is located.

.Hemphill said failure to file a report, filing a late report or filing an inaccurate report can result in a penalty with fines up to 25 percent of the fair market value of the agricultural land.

For AFIDA purposes, agricultural land is defined as any land used for farming, ranching or timber production, if the tracts total 10 acres or more.

Disclosure reports are also required when there are changes in land use. For example, reports are required when land changes from use nonagricultural to agricultural or from agricultural to


