




SPIRIT/54 Transportation Conference Report Continued



Point of Sale Sticker Printing introduced in **Sherman County**

Point of Sale Sticker Printing (POSSP) and a new vehicle registration sticker design are being introduced in Sherman County. The new registration feature

improvements to deter sticker misuse and eliminate the need for state inventory control.

The new process was piloted in Caldwell and Bastrop Counties and was implemented in 185 counties across the state beginning August 25. This initial phase involves counties that do not process transactions through subcontractor stations (e.g. grocery stores) or automobile dealerships. These latter types of transactions will be piloted in McLennan, Williamson, Angelina and Harris Counties over the next full months, with full statewide implementation expected to be completed by early 2005.

Registration stickers will now be printed at the point of sale. Information specific to the registered vehicle will be printed directly on the sticker, which will help deter. TxDOT switched from license plate stickers to windshield stickers for most passenger vehicles about a decade ago to cut down on theft, and the new method will enhance these efforts. (Plate stickers are still used for motorcycles, trailers and some other types of vehicles.) Each sticker will show the last eight the vehicle digits of identification number, the license plate number, county of registration, and registration month and year.

Because each windshield and plate sticker is vehicle-specific, it is important for customers who own more than one vehicle to be sure they apply the sticker to the correct one. Also, customers should carefully follow instructions for peeling and applying the stickers. The new windshield stickers must be peeled from the back of the form; otherwise, it could be damaged and replacement be." Mr. stickers would be necessary



This also eliminates the manufacturing and storage of 400,000 pre-printed sticker books annually for the current

In the past, yearly windshield stickers were printed in mass quantities based on projections of annual vehicle registrations. POSSP will eliminate the waste of excess stickers resulting from this process each year. As each stickers is printed "on demand" for a specific vehicle rather than pre-printed and later assigned to vehicle, any internal used for the POSSP is now optional rather than required. Registration transactions will be tracked through the state's automated Registration and Title System in much the same way as the precious method.

The Patience of God

Human beings are notoriously impatient. We want things done right now or yesterday. We often become impatient with our children, our husband or wife, the boss at work, our fellow workers or those who work for us. We then pray, "Lord, give me patience, right now!" It's a good thing God isn't like that. Even though we neglect our duty to God, even though we neglect things like Sunday worship, Bible reading and prayer, God is patient with us. To put it on a more personal level, the Bible says, "The Lord is....patient toward you, not wishing for any to perish but for all to come to repentance"(2 Peter 3:9 In other words, God is exceedingly patient with you; and you should be very grateful for God's patience. Do you realize God is patient with you for a very special reason? God is patient with you because He wants you to repent. In the end you know that refusal to live your life by God's rules is sin. You also know your neglect of Sunday worship, Bible reading and prayer displeases God. In response, God is patient with you. He wants you to turn back to Him. God is giving you time, time to repent. Hank The Cowdog Program Held

"Hank the Cowdog In Concert" is a 60-minute program of innocent fun and wholesome family entertainment. Through songs and readings, John R. Erickson brings to life the characters from his awardwinning "Hank the Cowdog' series of books and audio books.

John R. Erickson is a fifth generation Texan, raised in the small Panhandle town of Perryton. He has a degree from the University of Texas, studied two years at Harvard Divinity School, and left Harvard three hours short of a master's degree in theology. After marrying Kristine Dykema in 1967, he spent 15 years writing in the early morning hours and working at odd jobs, including eight years as a ranch cowboy. After receiving many rejection slips, he started his own publishing company in his garage and selfpublished the first ten Hank the Cowdog stories.

Hank the Cowdog is now a national character and his books and tapes have sold in the millions. Hank appeared in a thirty minute animated episode on "CBS Storybreak" and the stories on tape were named the best children's audio books of 1993 by the American Audiobook Sellers Association.

Erickson has also established a reputation as a speaker and performer. He has appeared at

conventions, conferences, and banquets in 17 states and provinces; has been a keynote speaker at conventions attended by librarians, teachers of English, reading, special education and drama; and has spoken at the Library of Congress, the Institute of Texas Cultures, the Houston Children's Museum, and the Witte Museum in San Antonio.

Since he began performing his work in schools in 1984, he has left a trail of Hank the Cowdog in hundreds communities, from the Texas Gulf Coast to Fairbanks, Alaska and has appeared before more than 1.75 million people.

Recently, Hank the Cowdog books have found a new home at Penguin Putnam, the nation's largest publisher of children's books. Rights have also been purchased by Nickelodeon to produce an animated movie.
