## Surveys From Plains

Fort Worth-Post Line Latest Development in Extensive Mappings for Possible Rail Connections

Another angle to the railroad tangle of proposed routes from the Plains to Fort Worth, giving direct connections between the central and southern sections and Texas markets, developed last week when confirmed reports were made that the Santa Fe was surveying a line eastward from Post. Out of the maze of plans and surveys Floydada, apparently at least to its citizens, has an even opportunity with other cities of receiving the new road when construc-tion grants are given by the Interstate Commerce Commission within the next

few months. While there is no authority at present for the probable routes, it is generally understood that two lines have been mapped out, one running east from Floydada to Benjamin in Knox county connecting at Seymour with the Gulf Texas and Western and thence to Fort Worth, the second proposed route is for the building of a line eastward from Post, touching at Clairemount, Stamford, Breckenridge and probably passing through Weatherford in Par-ker county to a terminal at Fort Worth or Dallas. 



This concern, with a modern plant, will enter its fifth season under the present management this fall. Bought in August of 1920 from J. F. Blanton & Company, the gin was one of the best that money could construct and has been added to constantly as new and practical devices for better ginning were invented. It is an independent company gin with two stockholders. Lon M. Davis, the manager, has as his partner, L. T. Lewis, of Roswell, N. Mex. These two men have been sole owners since August of 1920.

The equipment of the gin is a regular five eighty-saw stand of Continental design, and has the Murray air-line cleaner, the Hart 6-cylinder cleaner and boll breaker, five-eighty double saw Allsop burr extractors, and 6-cylinder Williams cleaners and duo-feeder cleaners, with large screen capacity for eliminating the dirt and burrs from the cotton after it is beaten loose by the cleaners and extractors.

A considerable portion of this equipment has been added the past few months in connection with the gin's annual cleaning and over-hauling. Nearly six thous-
